Demographic

Jewish Population in the United States, 1974

THE ESTIMATE of the United States "Jewish population" for 1974 is 5,732,000, the same as reported in the previous year (AJYB, 1974-75 [Vol. 75], p. 295). This estimate is essentially a composite of individual community estimates, with only minor changes from the year before. The method of compilation is consistent with that of previous years.¹ The difference between this estimate (and last year's) and previous estimates which exceeded 6,000,000 is largely due to the change in the New York City estimate, which had remained the same from 1962 to 1973. The figures for New York City and its suburbs are derived from the National Jewish Population Study² conducted in 1970-71. For details, see the accompanying article by Dr. Fred Massarik.

¹State estimates (Appendix, Table 1) are based on estimates for each community, after known duplications were eliminated and adjustments made for "unlisted" Jews. Individual community estimates (Appendix, Table 3) were generally obtained from member federations of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds and from the files of the National United Jewish Appeal (NUJA). However, the latter agency no longer updates its population estimates on a consistent basis, and this may be a source of bias on a cumulative basis. Communities with fewer than 100 Jews were omitted from the listing in Appendix, Table 3; they were included in the state totals and are the base for estimating unknowns (generally three times the number of Jews in communities with fewer than 100).

²The NJPS was a national survey conducted under the auspices of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds.
