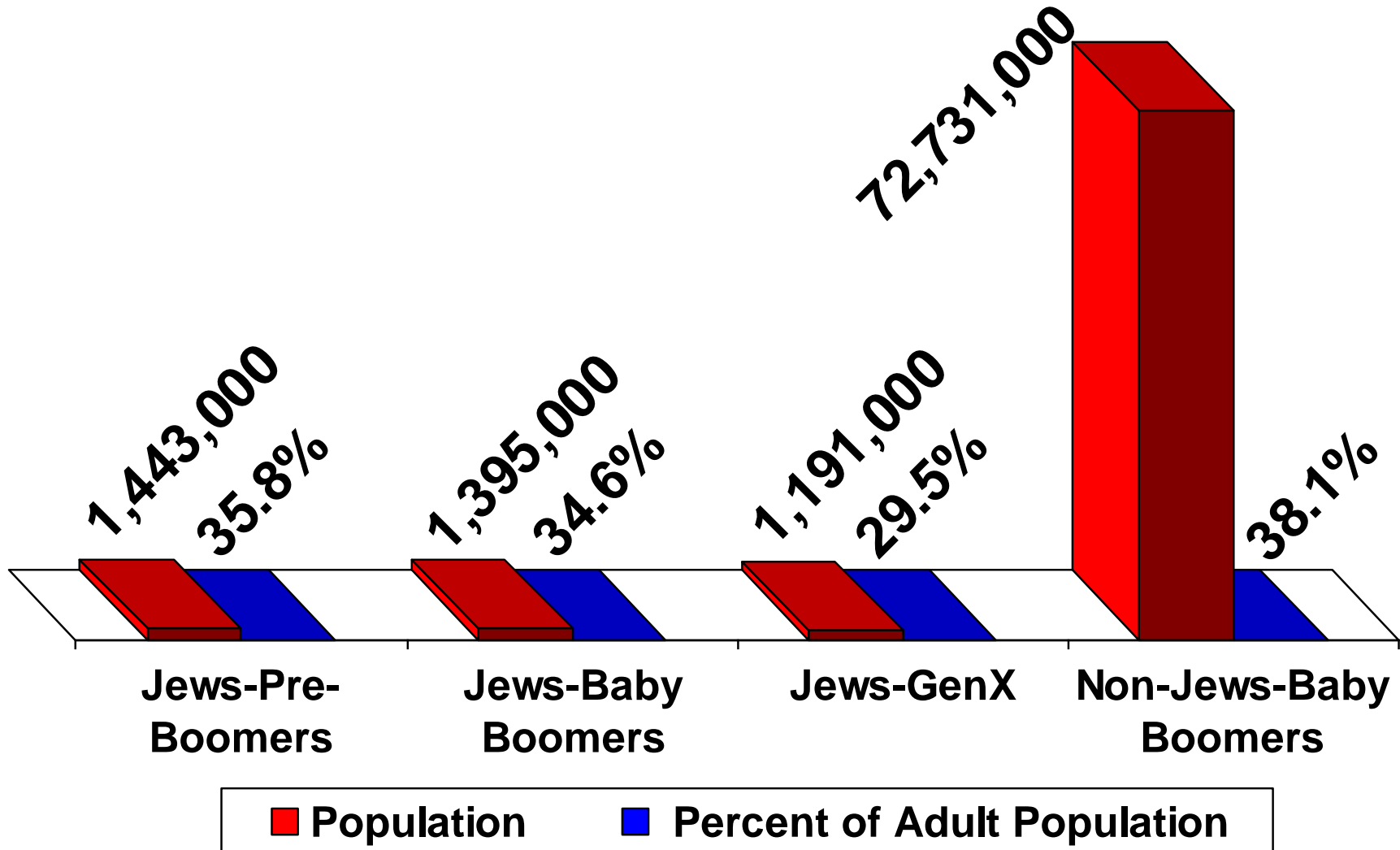

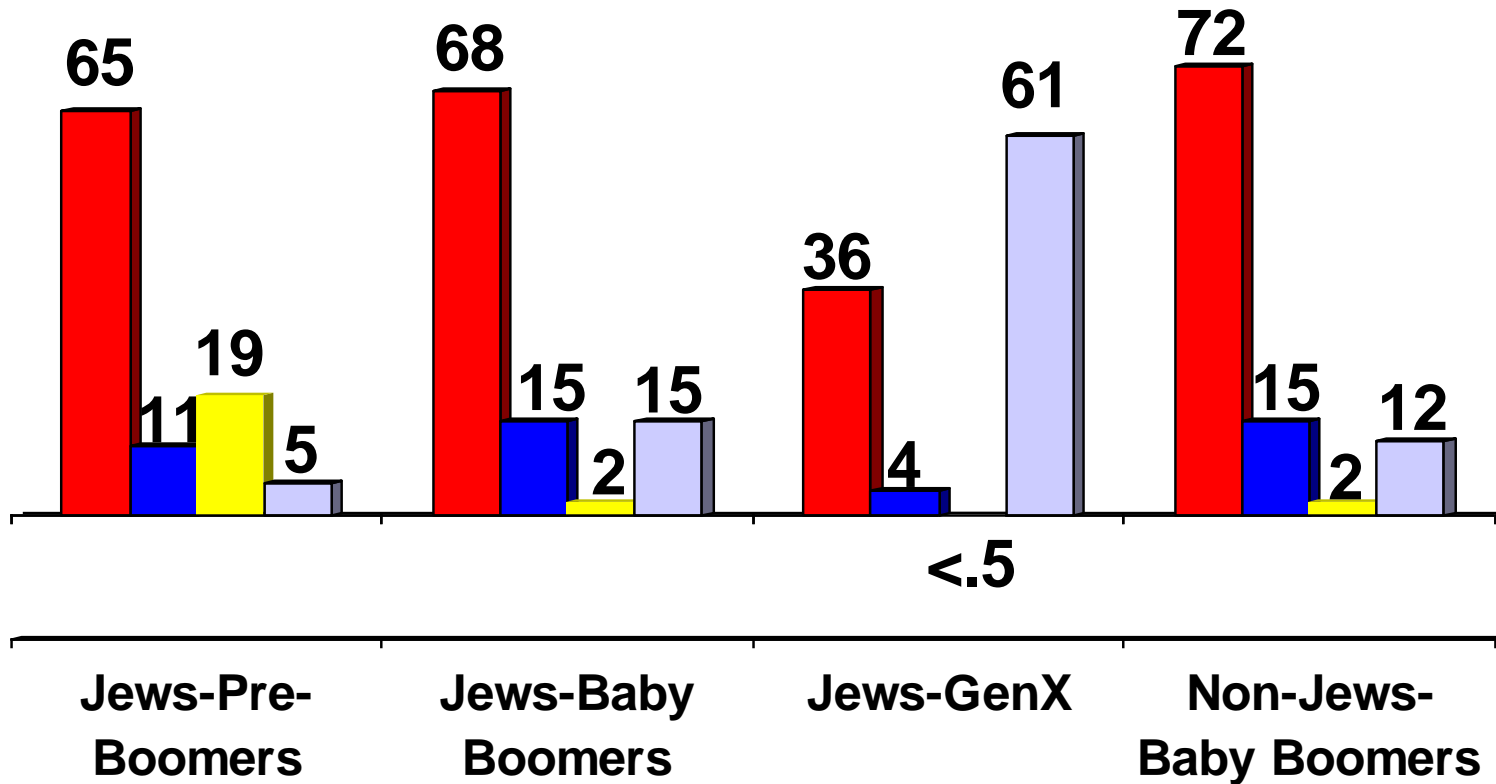

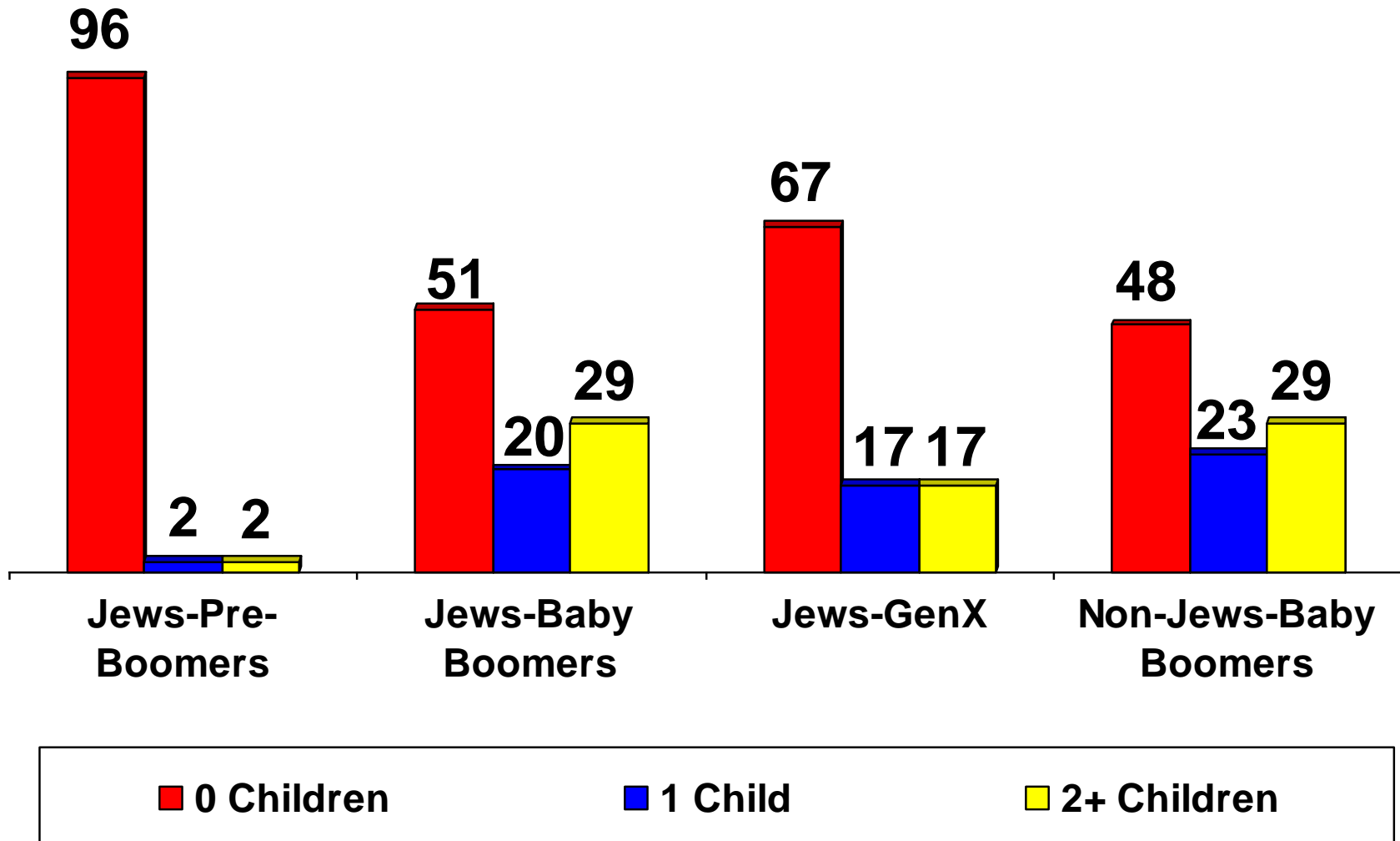
MARITAL STATUS

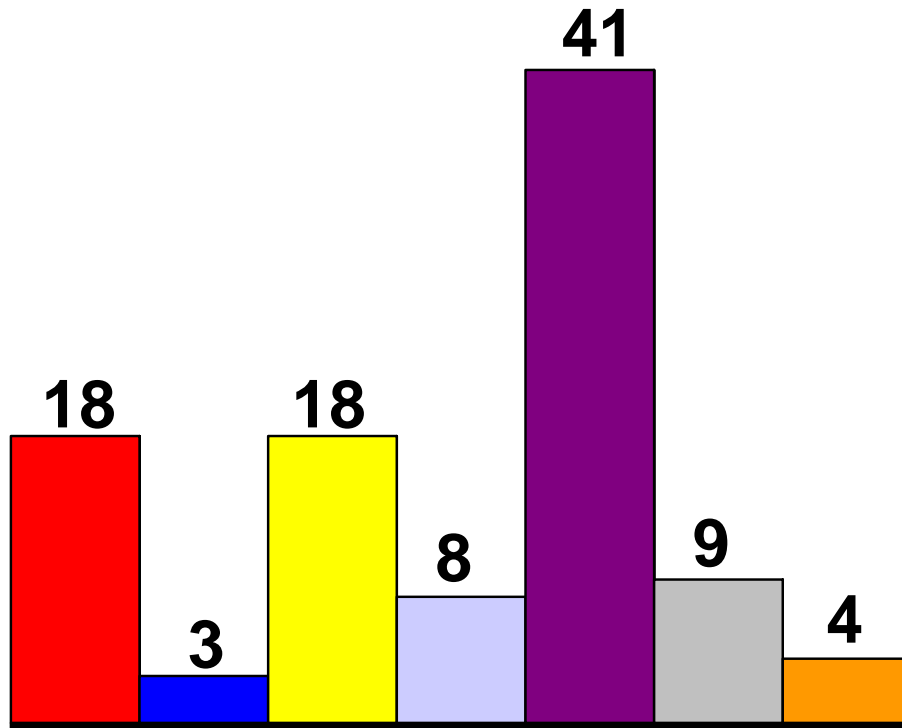

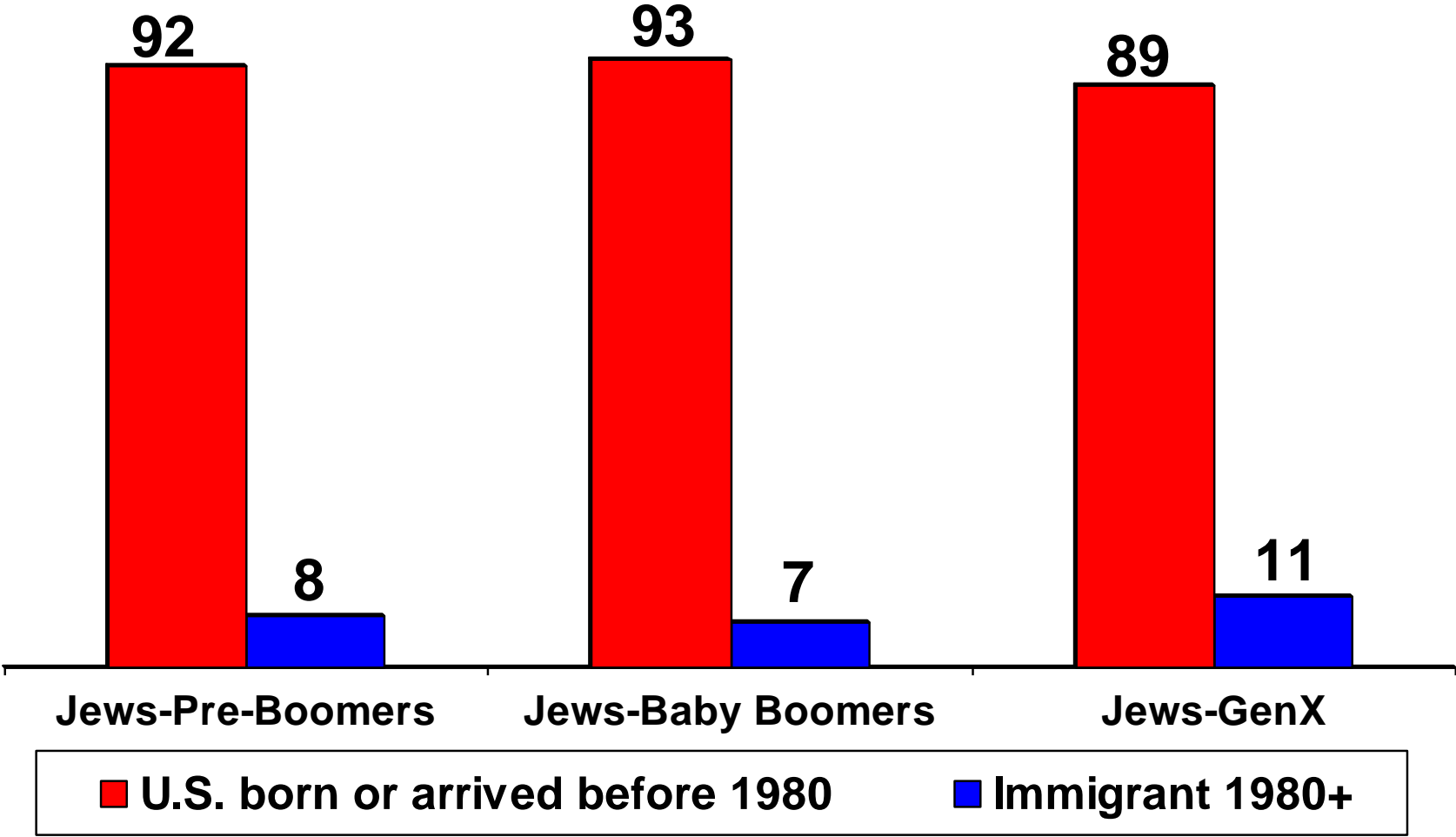

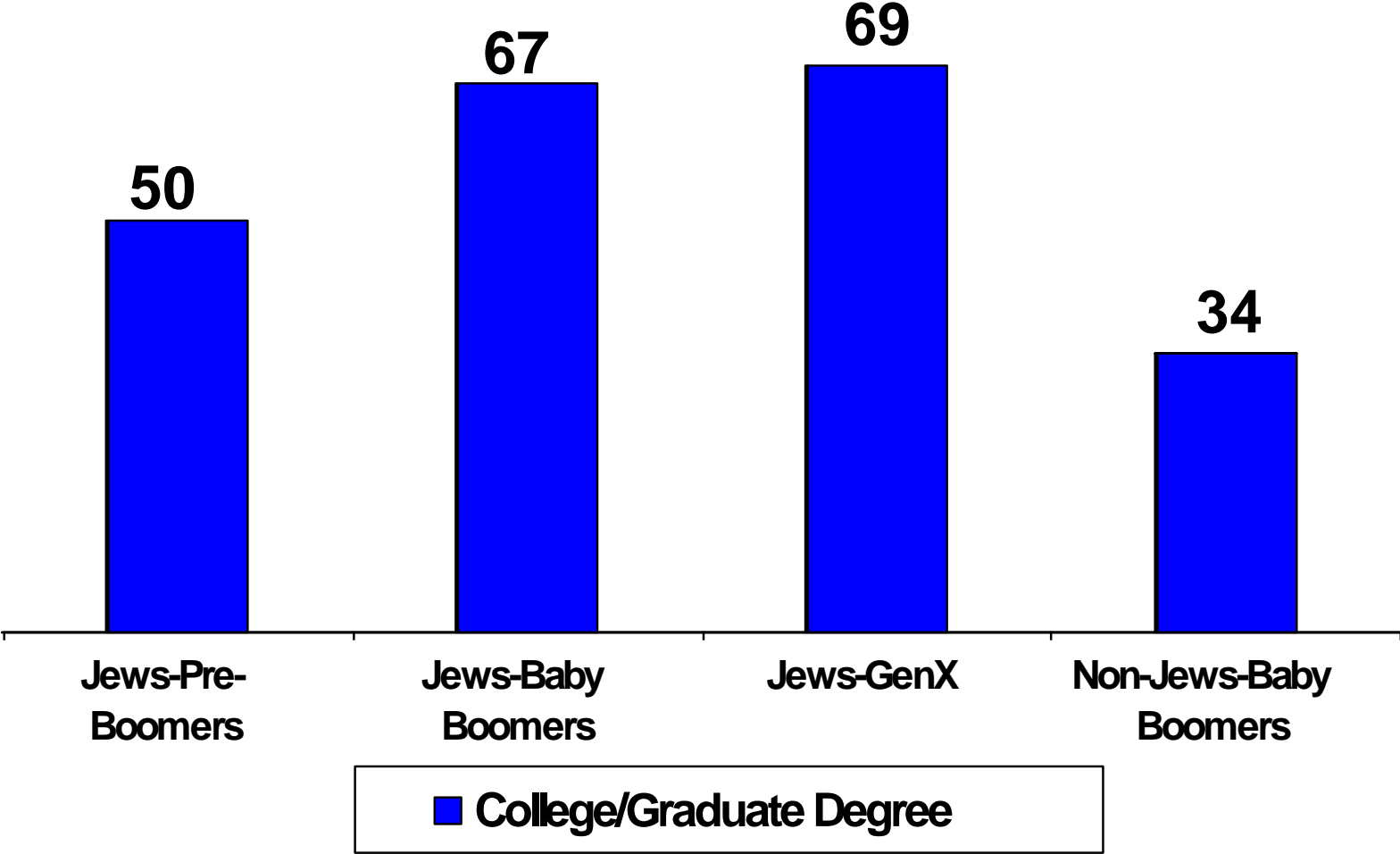

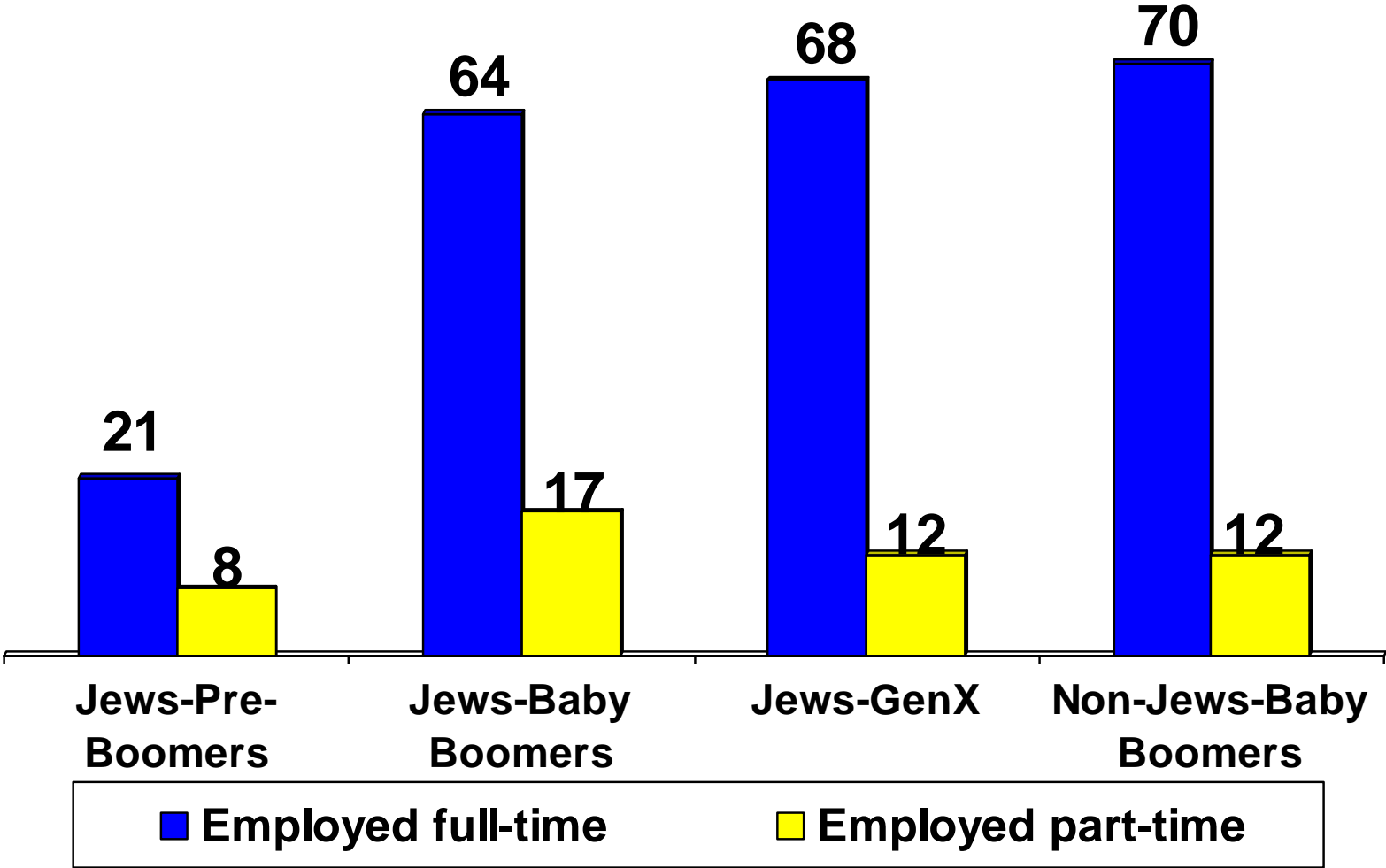

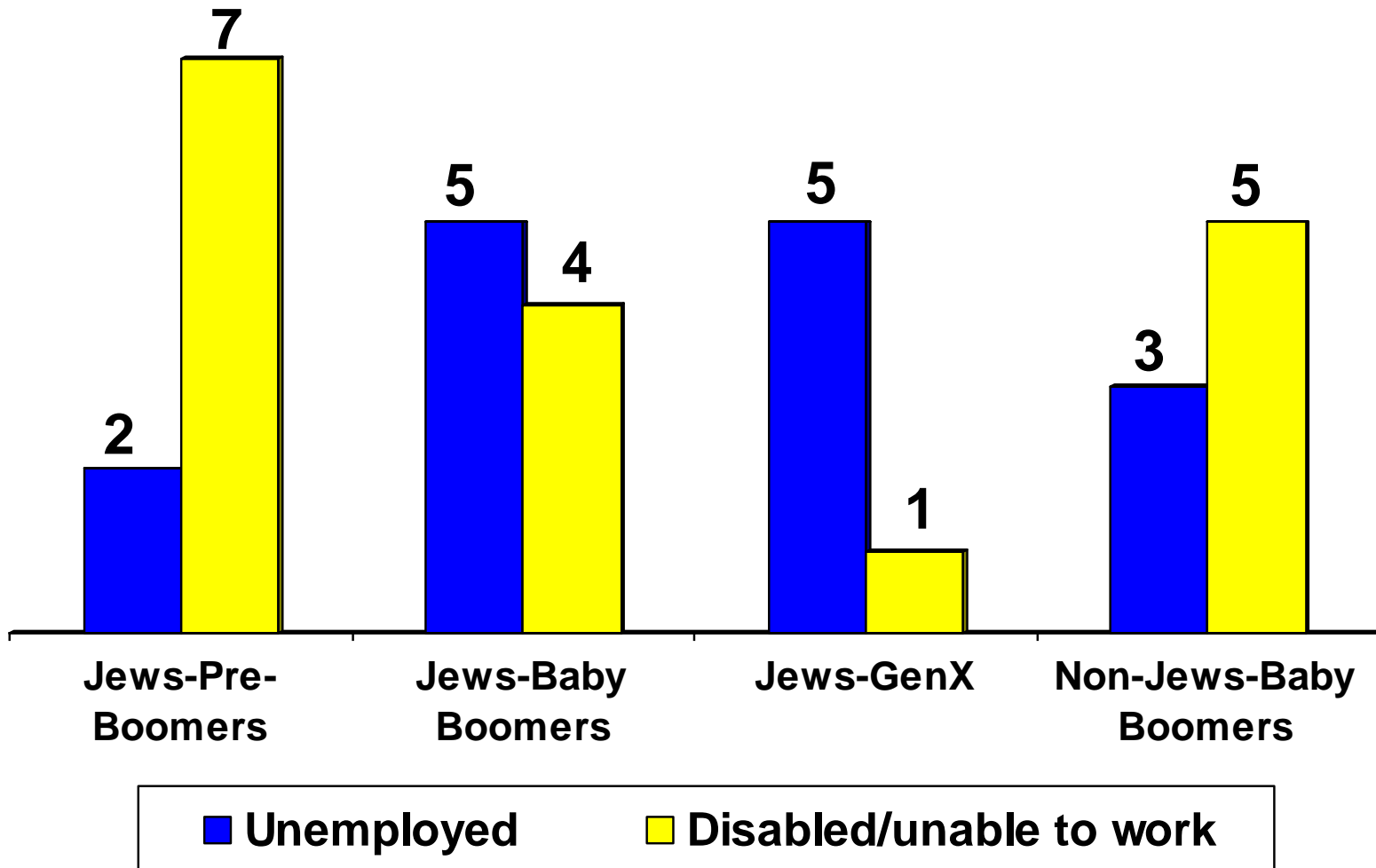

EMPLOYMENT STATUS



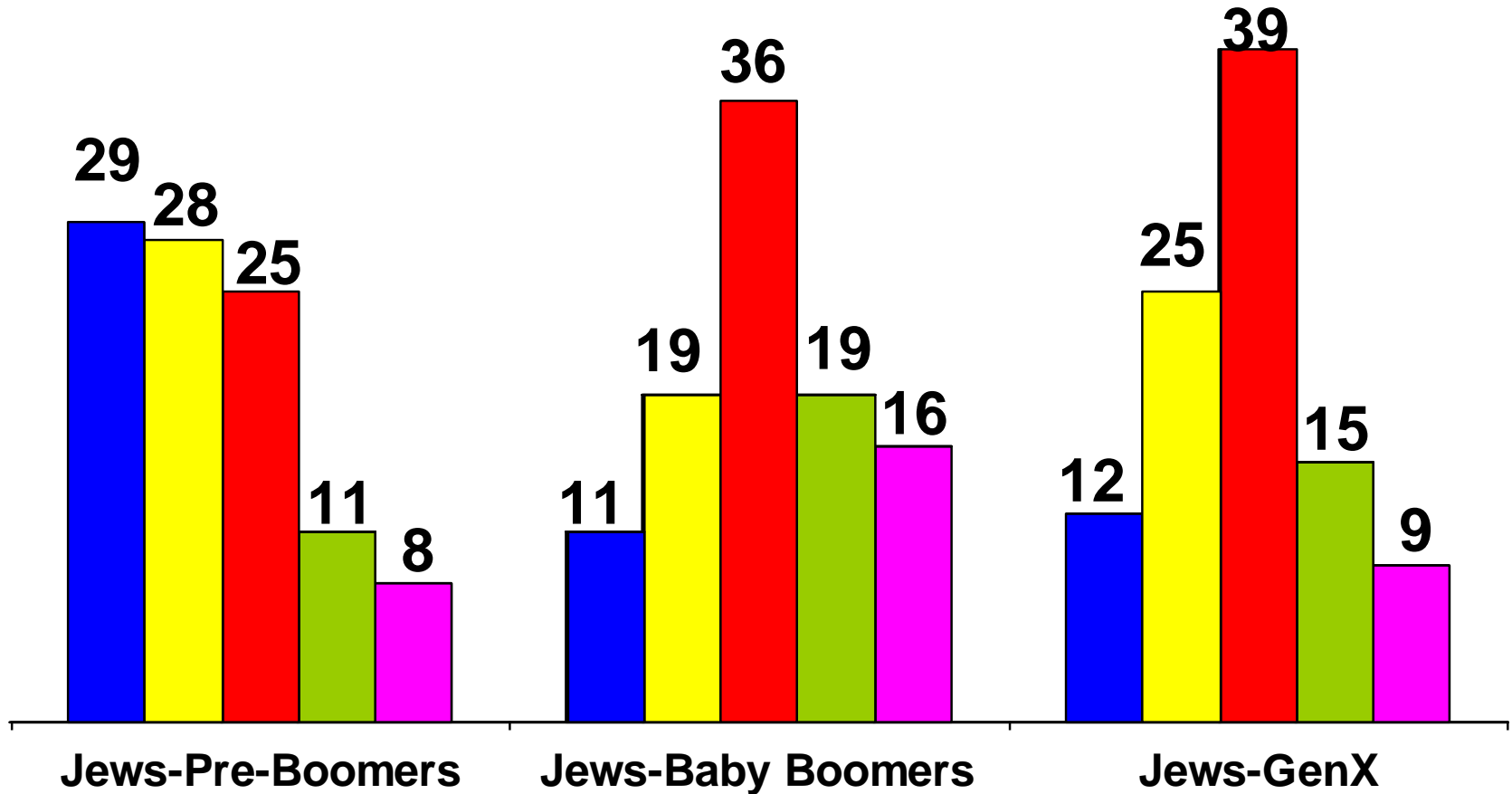

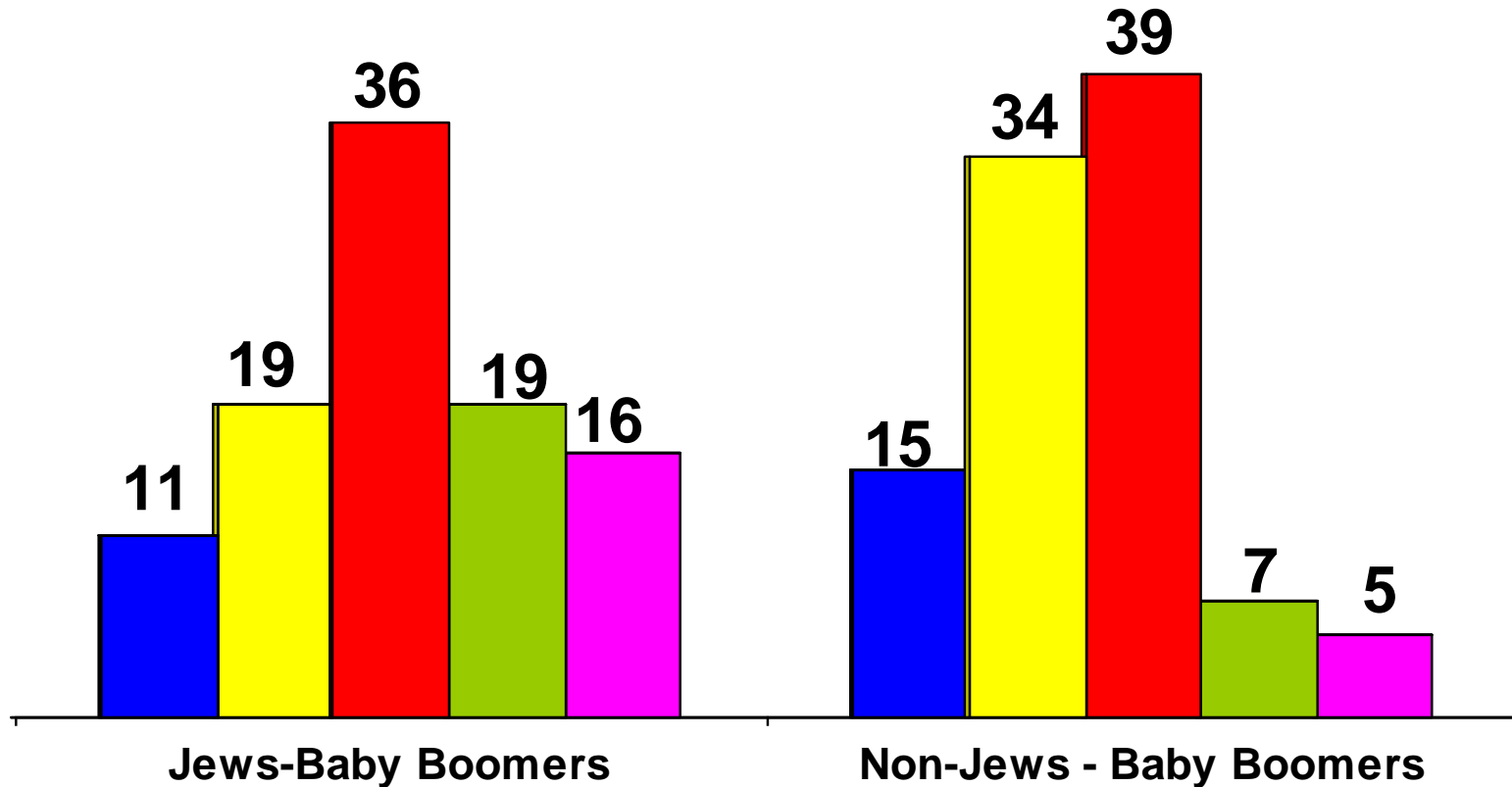

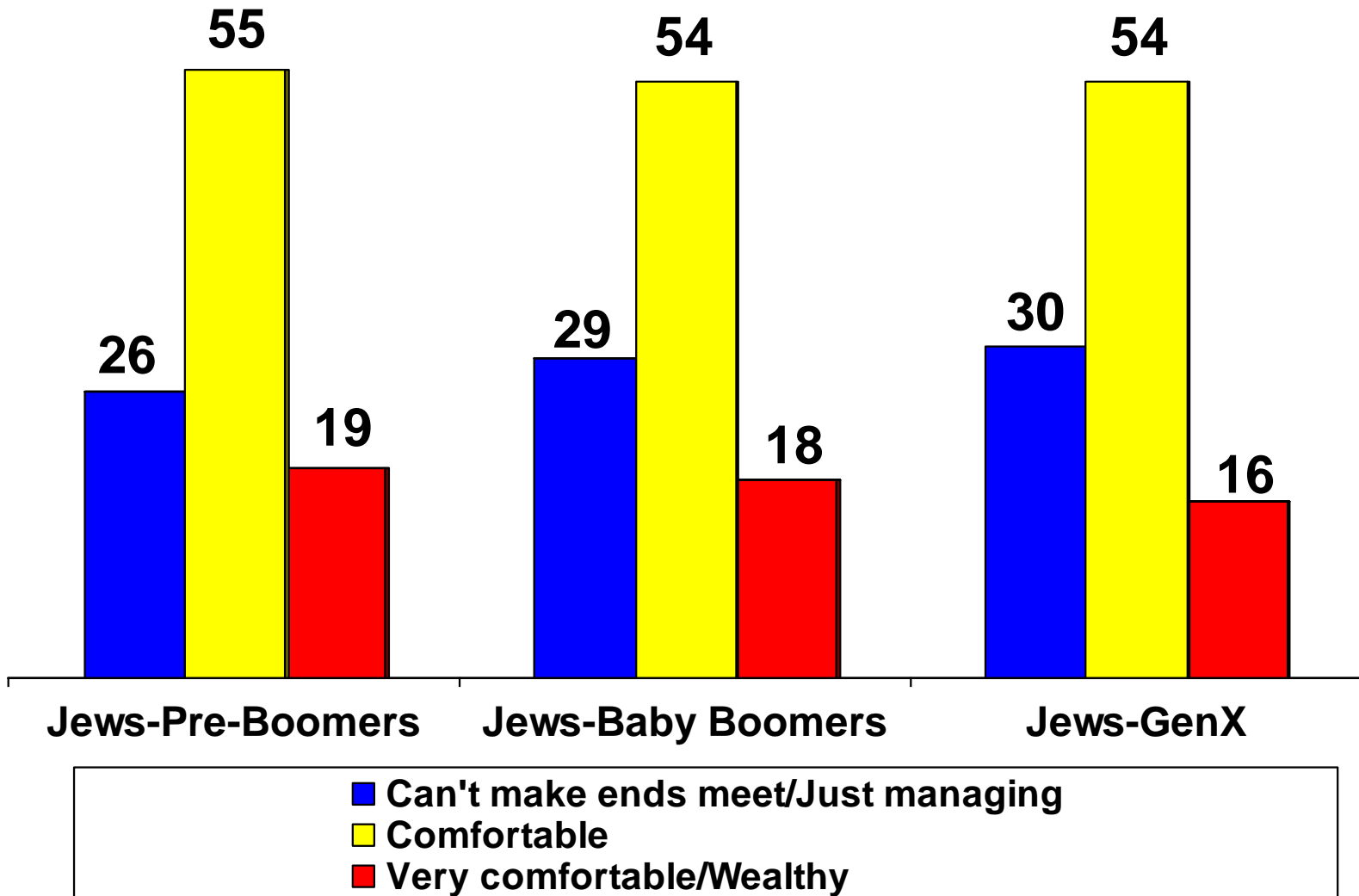

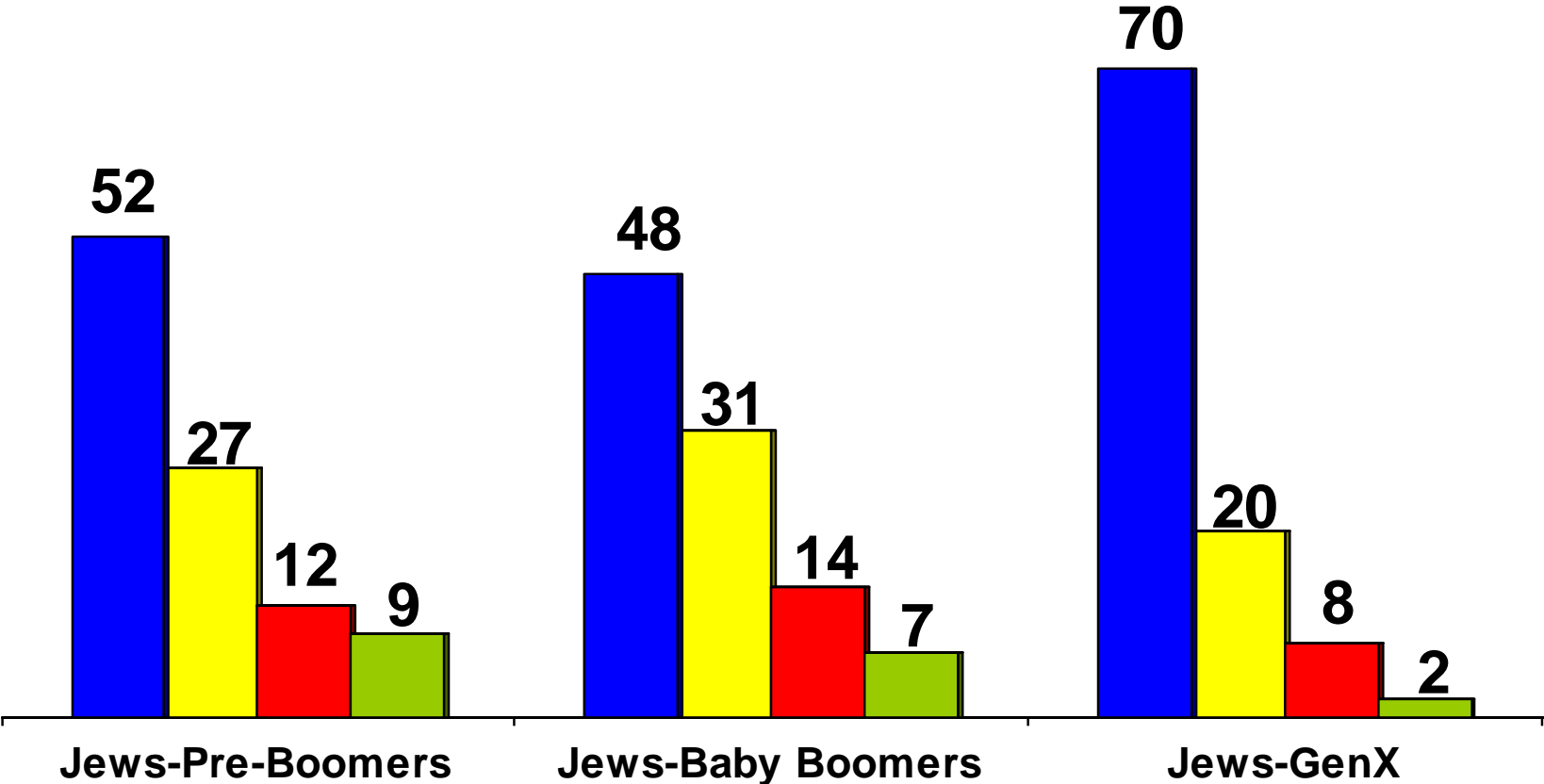

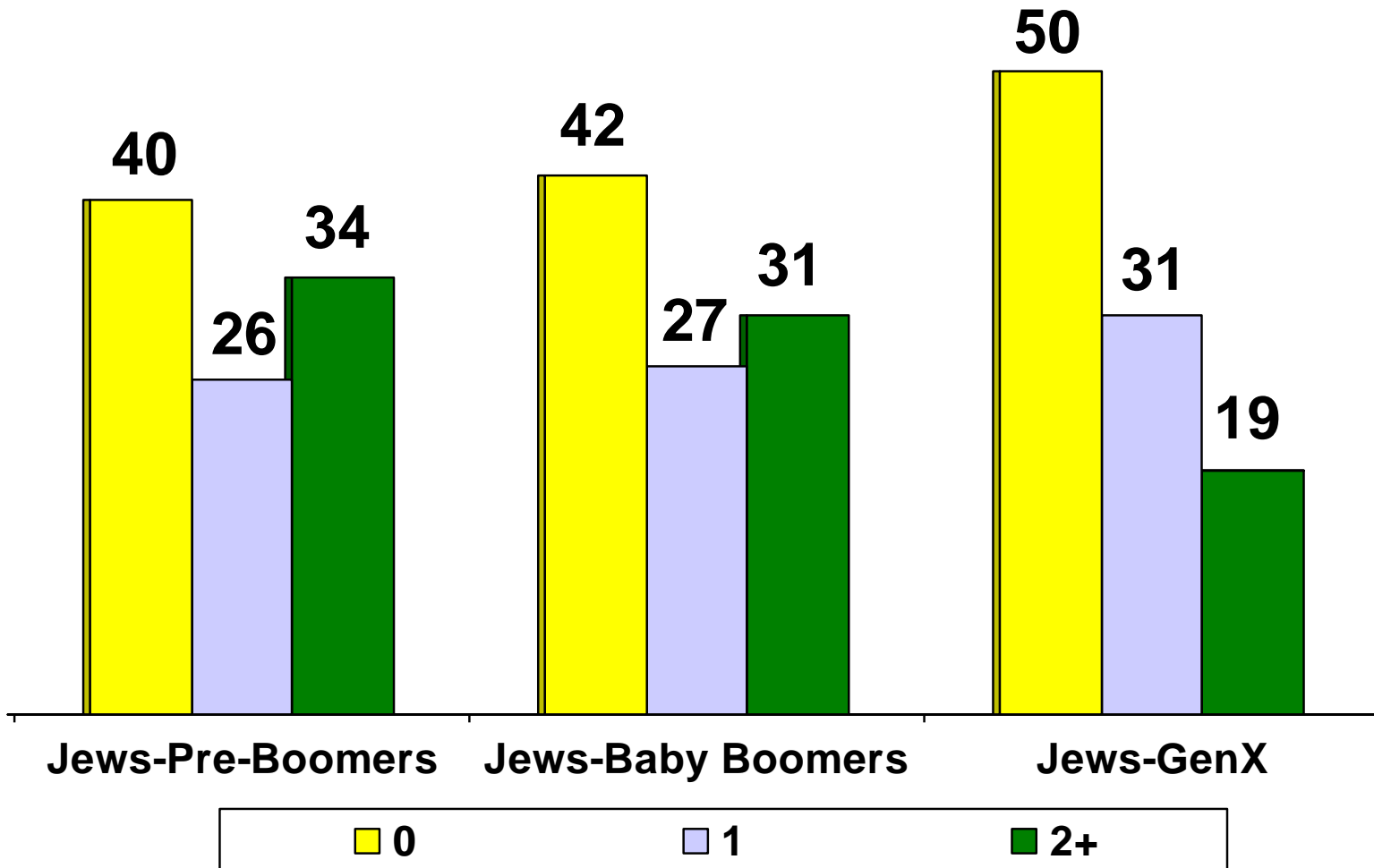

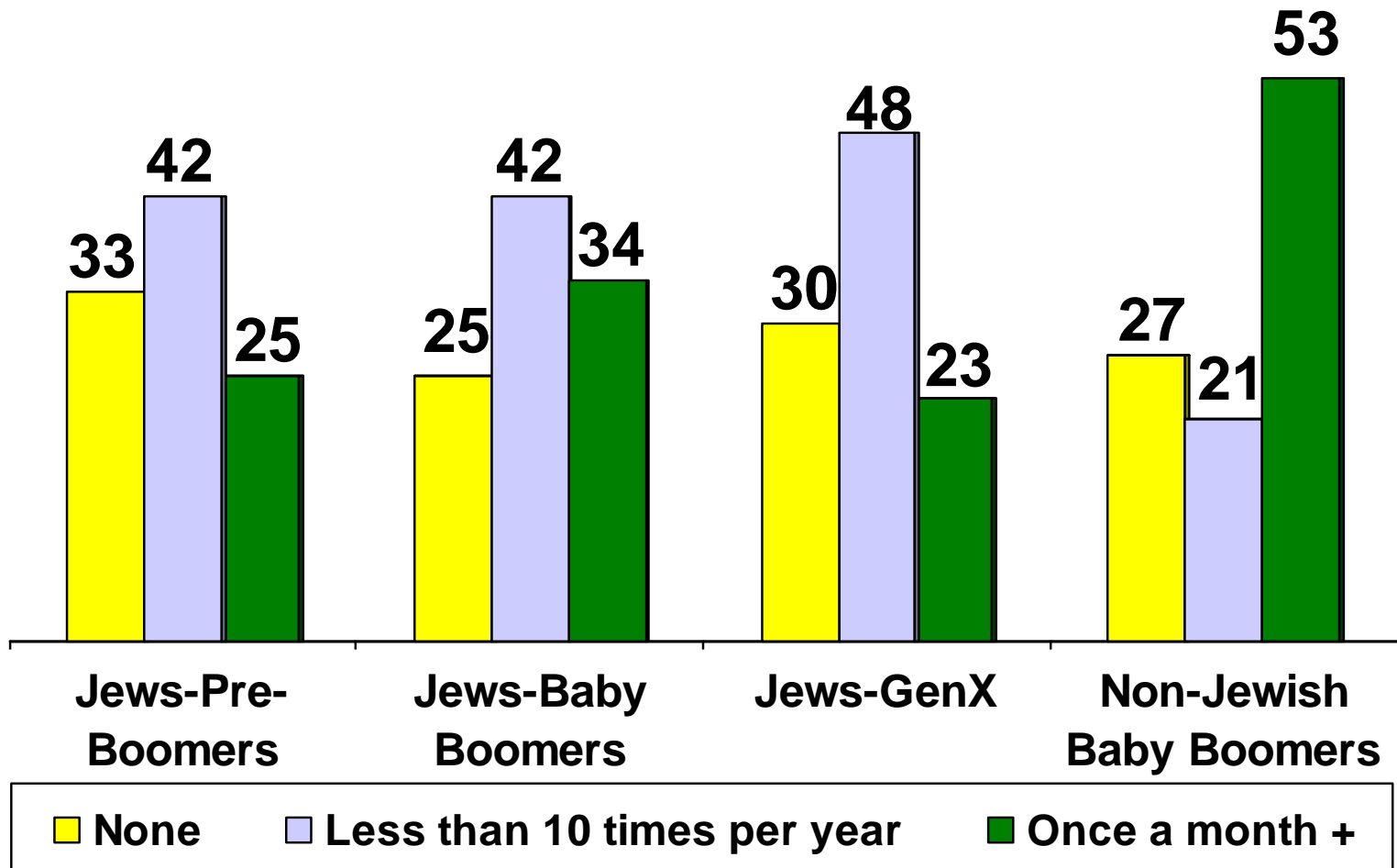

TOTAL JEWISH ORGANIZATIONAL MEMBERSHIPS



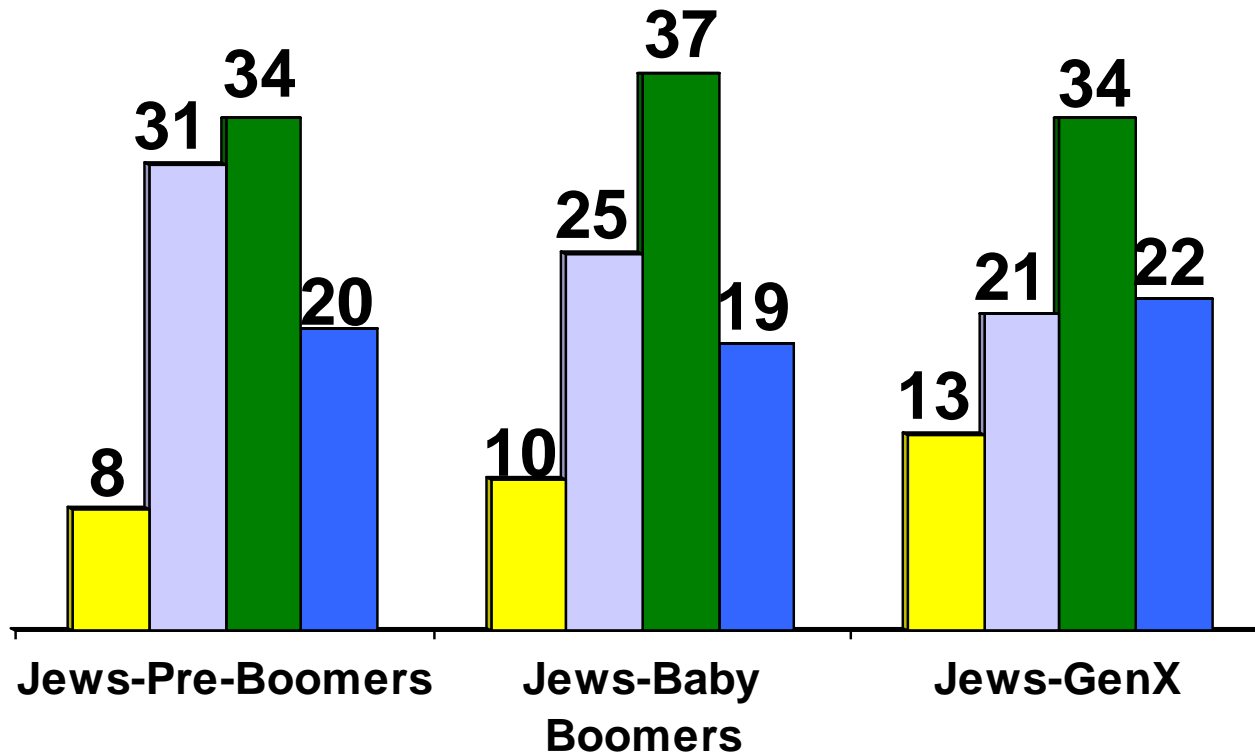

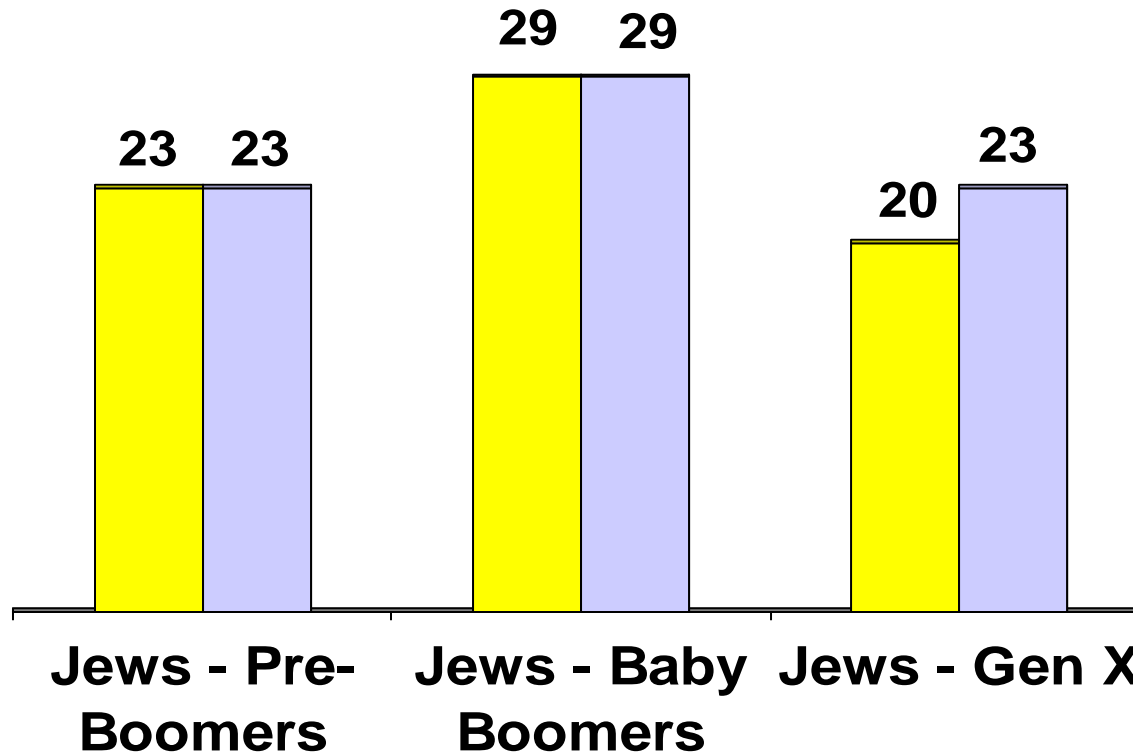

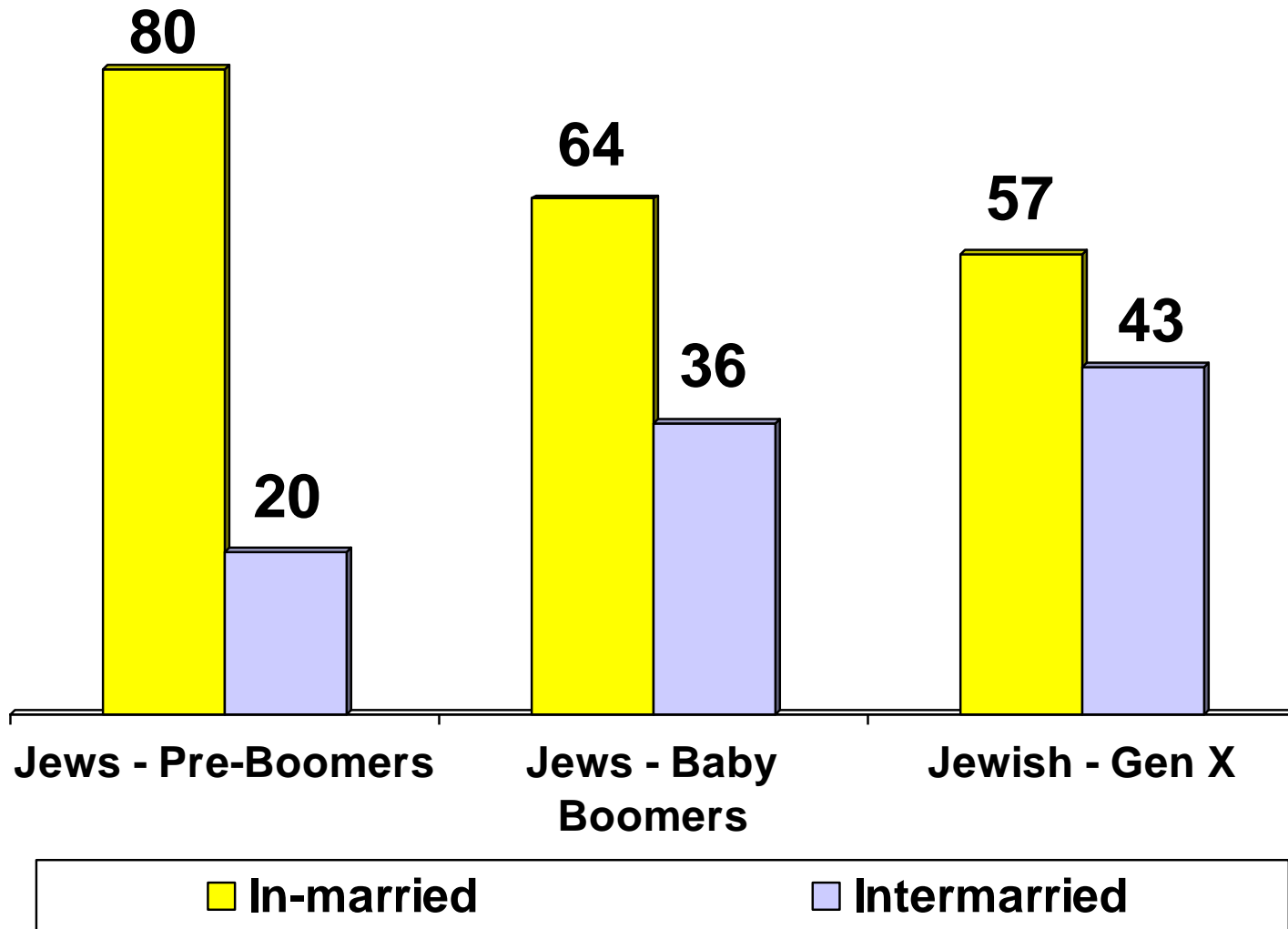
ADULT JEWISH EDUCATION AND VOLUNTEERISM

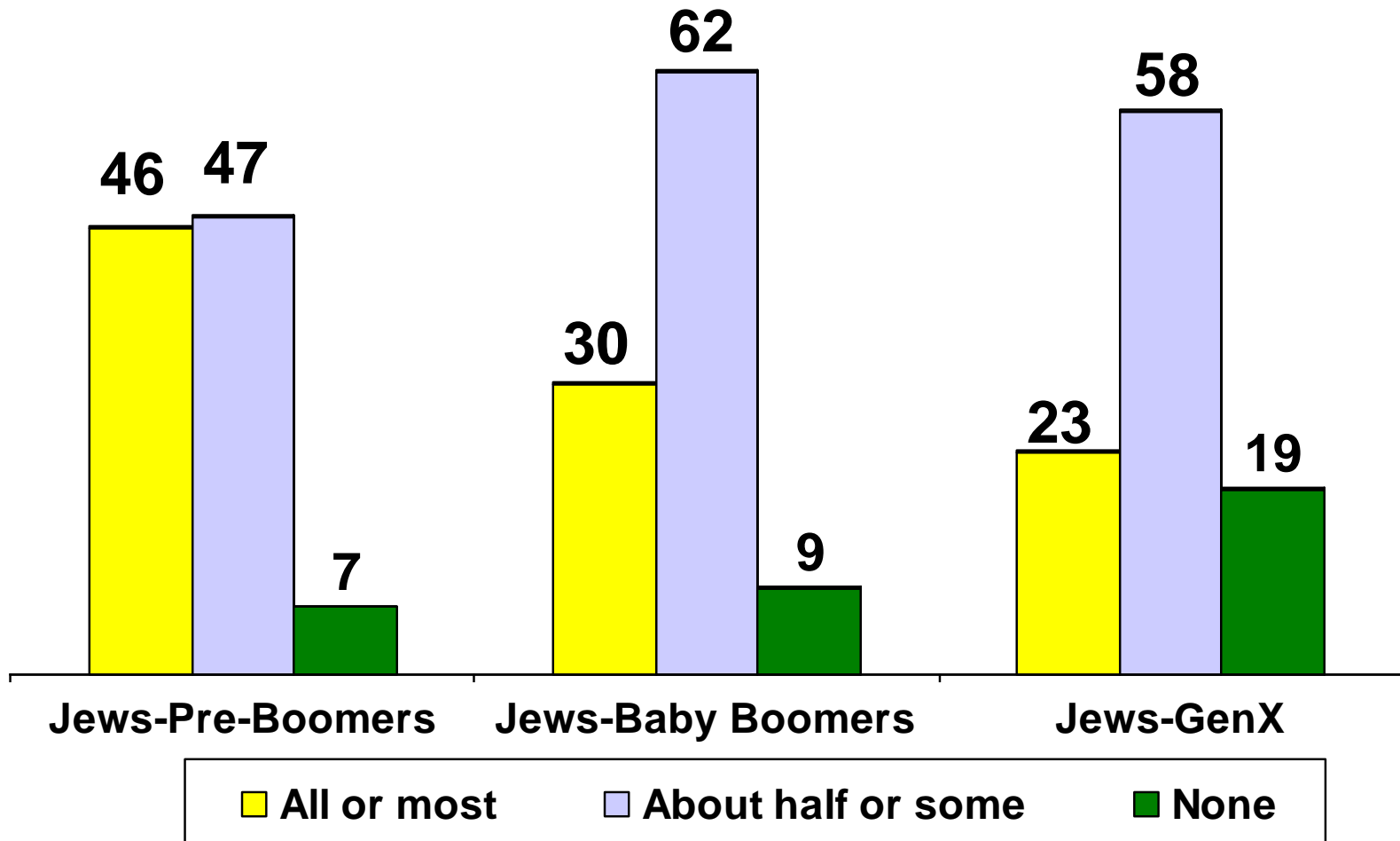

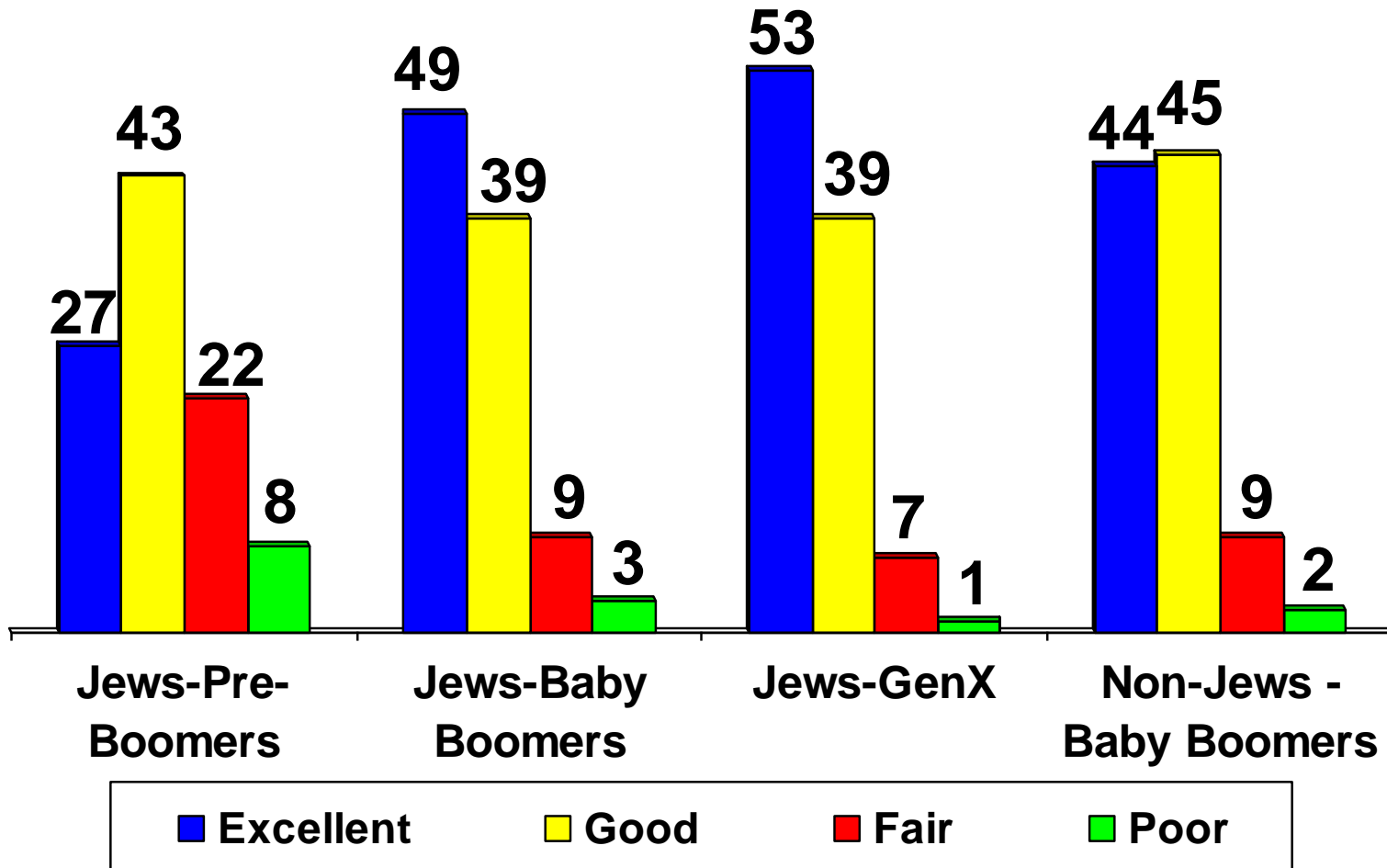
PROPORTION OF CLOSEST FRIENDS WHO ARE JEWISH

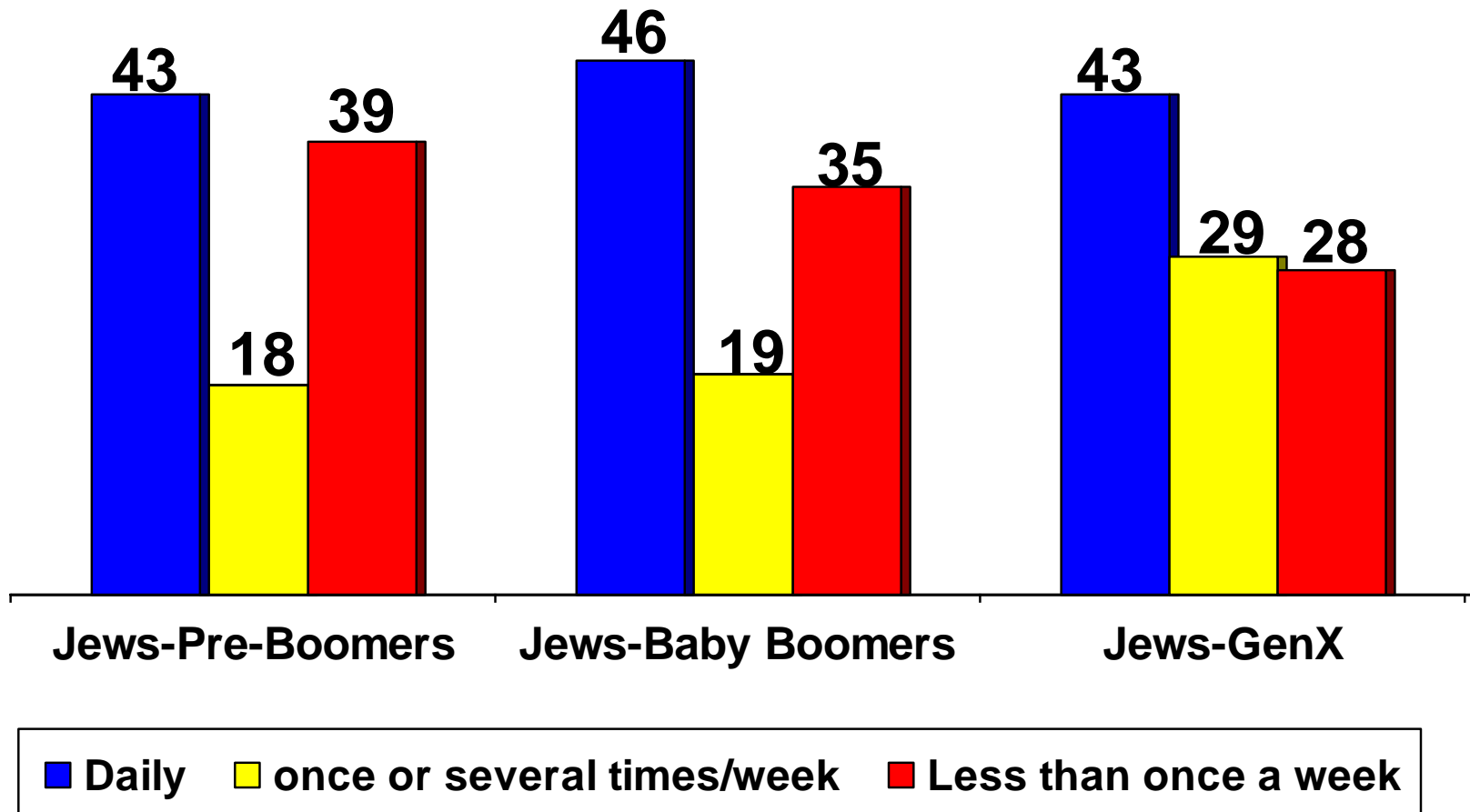

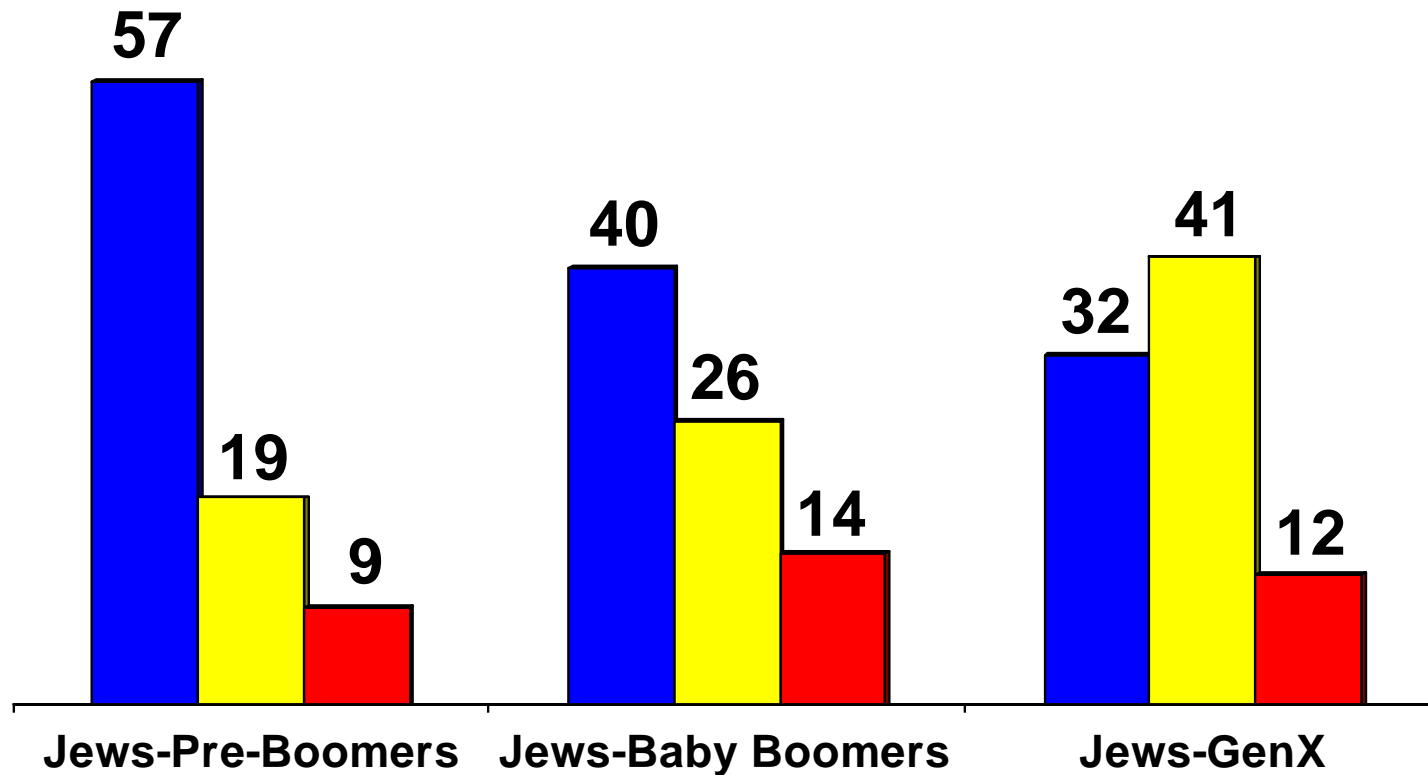

PRIMARY FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR SUPERVISION/ ASSISTANCE (AMONG THOSE WITH CONDITION)



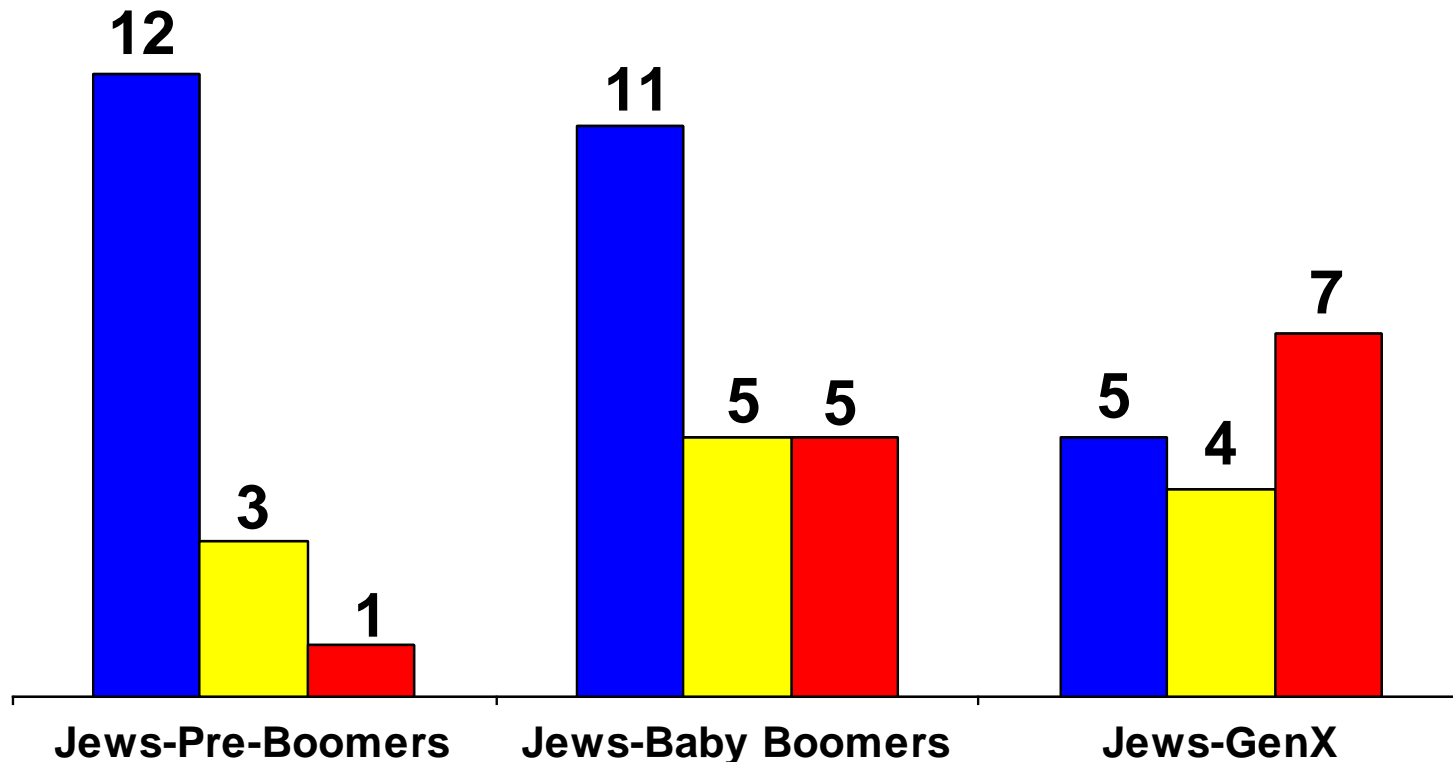

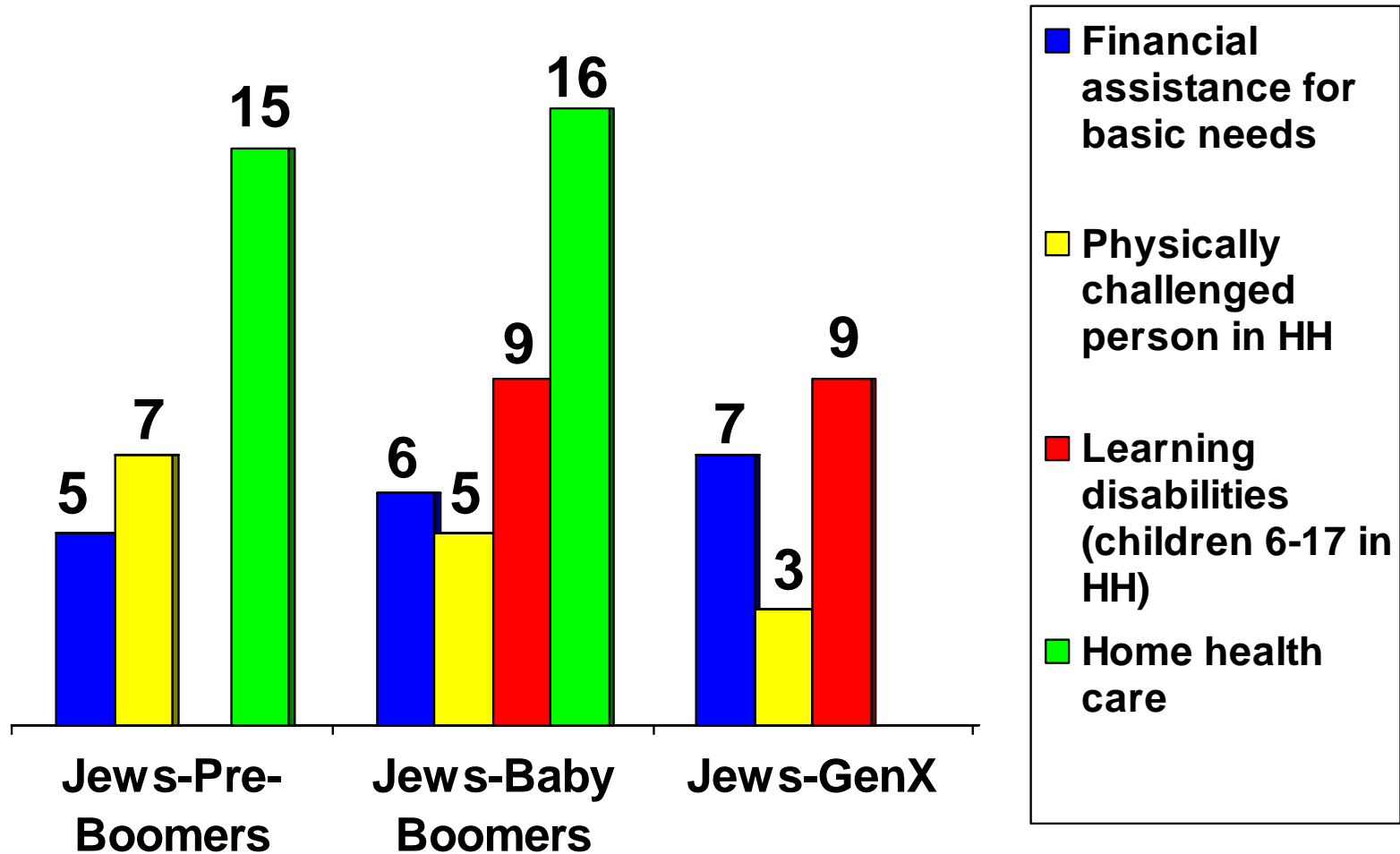

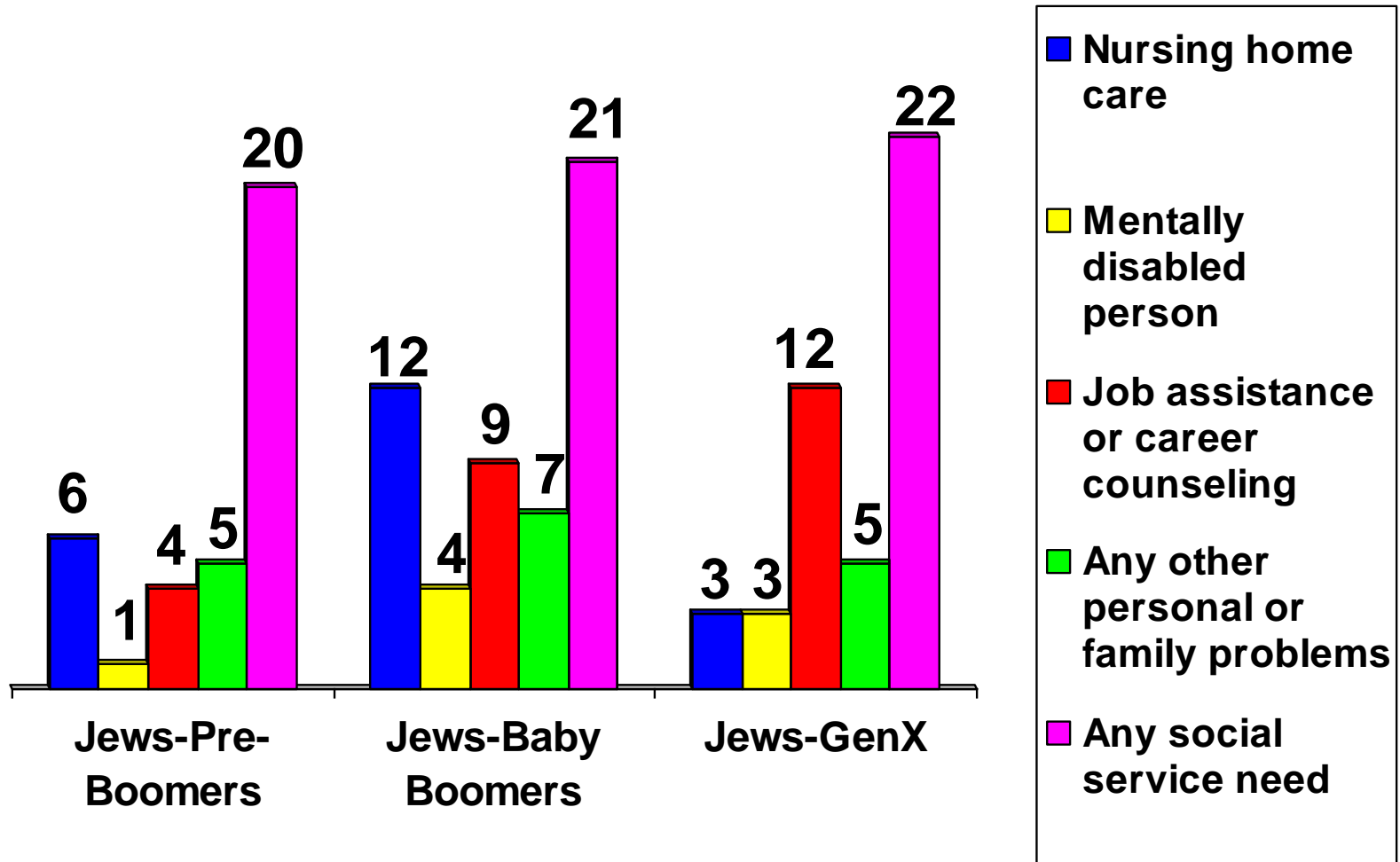
