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## **Introduction**

The data reported here are from the 2004 Annual Survey of American Jewish Opinion, sponsored by the American Jewish Committee, detailing the views of American Jews about a broad range of subjects. Among the topics covered in the present survey are the campaign against terrorism and the war in Iraq, the Israel-Arab conflict, the attachment of American Jews to Israel, transatlantic relations, political and social issues in the United States, Jewish perceptions of anti-Semitism, Jewish opinion about various countries, and Jewish identity concerns. Some of the questions appearing in the survey are new; others are drawn from previous American Jewish Committee surveys, including the Annual Survey of American Jewish Opinion carried out in 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, and 2003.

The 2004 survey was conducted for the American Jewish Committee by Market Facts, Inc., a leading survey-research organization. Respondents were interviewed by telephone between August 18–September 1, 2004; no interviewing took place on the Sabbath. The sample consisted of 1,000 self-identifying Jewish respondents selected from the Market Facts consumer mail panel. The respondents are demographically representative of the United States adult Jewish population on a variety of measures. The margin of error for the sample as a whole is plus or minus 3 percentage points.

## **Key Findings**

In the run-up to the 2004 presidential election, more than two-thirds of American Jews -- 69 percent -- indicated that they would pull the lever for Senator John Kerry, while 24 percent backed President George W. Bush. (In the 2000 presidential election, Bush received 19 percent of the Jewish vote.)

Sixty-six percent of American Jews disapproved, and 30 percent approved, of how President Bush was conducting the war in Iraq. The survey also found that 52 percent of American Jews disapproved, and 41 percent approved, of how the U.S. government was conducting the campaign against terrorism. Fifty-seven percent of American Jews believed that the threat of terrorism had increased as a result of the war in

Iraq, 35 percent thought it remained the same, and 7 percent believed that it had decreased.

American Jews showed strong support for Israeli policy decisions. Sixty-three percent of American Jews supported, and 28 percent opposed, the Israeli government's handling of relations with the Palestinian Authority. In addition, 65 percent of American Jews supported, and 28 percent opposed, the Israeli government's decision to unilaterally withdraw from the Gaza Strip. Yet again, 69 percent of American Jews supported, and 28 percent opposed, the Israeli government's decision to build a security fence separating Israelis and Palestinians.

Anti-Semitism in the United States and around the world remained a major concern for American Jews. Twenty-seven percent of American Jews thought that anti-Semitism in the United States was a very serious problem, while 67 percent believed that it was somewhat of a problem; only 6 percent indicated that anti-Semitism in the United States was not a problem. In addition, 24 percent of American Jews felt that anti-Semitism on U.S. college campuses was a very serious problem, 56 percent that it was somewhat of a problem, and 12 percent that it was not a problem. Looking ahead over the next several years, only 11 percent maintained that anti-Semitism would decrease, while 45 percent thought that it would stay the same, and 9 percent believed that it would increase.

American Jews showed far greater concern about anti-Semitism in Europe and in the Muslim world. Asked about anti-Semitism in eight European countries, the survey found that American Jews considered France the most problematic – 64 percent of American Jews maintained that anti-Semitism in France was a very serious problem, 29 percent that it was somewhat of a problem, and 5 percent that it was not a problem. Regarding the Muslim world, 74 percent of American Jews believed that anti-Semitism was a very serious problem, 22 percent that it was somewhat of a problem, and 2 percent that it was not a problem.
