

This survey relates to a random digit-dialled telephone survey of 113,000 American households in the continental U.S.A. (48 states).

The data was collected over a 13-month period, April 1989-April 1990 at the rate of 2,000 interviews a week by ICR Survey Research Group of Media, PA as part of their omnibus market research (EXCEL) survey. The prime question on the file is: What is your religion? If the initial answer was Protestant there was a further question as to which denomination. The respondent is a randomly chosen (last birthday) adult over 18 years. Nineteen other socio-demographic questions are attached to this. They are:

The data which are weighted by ICR using the latest Census Bureau statistics, reflect the known composition of U.S. households and the total population. The weighting, which is incorporated into each record takes into account the disproportionate probabilities of household selection due to the number of separate telephone lines and the probability associated with the random selection of an individual household member. Following application of the above weights, the sample is post-stratified and balanced by key demographics such as age, sex, region and education. However, weighting cannot compensate for characteristics that are neither geographic nor demographic in nature. The most obvious is an inability to communicate in English or Spanish, the interview languages. This means there may be a tendency to underestimate some of the smaller religious groups that contain a high proportion of recent immigrants. Nevertheless, the range of error will not be enormous even in these cases. The overall sampling error for the survey is 0.4% at the 95% confidence level.

The overall refusal rate for the question on religion is very low, only 2.2 per cent. The response categories to this question include a "None/No religion" option (7.7%) as well as generic "Christian" (4.7%) and a residual "Protestant" (10.3%) category.

The remaining 76.1 per cent of respondents distribute themselves among the following denominations and religions on which we can report:

Catholic, Baptist, Methodist, Lutheran, Presbyterian, Episcopalian, Latter Day Saints/Mormon, Pentecostal, Church of Christ, Jehovah's Witness, Evangelical/Born Again Christian, Seventh Day Adventist, Assembly of God, Unitarian, Quaker/Mennonite, Congregational, Nazarene, Holiness/Holy, Greek Orthodox, Church of God, Worldwide Church of God, Christian Science, Disciples of Christ, Russian Orthodox, New Apostolic, Charismatic, Wesleyan, Fundamentalist, Independent Church, Eastern Orthodox, Dutch Reformed, Christian Reform, Four Square, Covenant/Covenant Mission, Church of God in Christ, Church of America, Open Bible.

Jewish, Muslim, Buddhist, Hindu, Bahai, Taoist, Shintoist, Rastafarian.

The above standard errors were computed with an estimated Design Effect computed using a within sample replication procedure. This replication process incorporates the effects of the sample selection procedure and final weighting procedure on the actual estimates derived from the survey.

If one were examining a sample characteristic of 5% on a sample of 125,000 respondents, the estimated standard error (95%) would be +/- 0.14%. Or, expressed as a range: 4.86% to 5.14%.


