Until 2012, the Jewish Federation of MetroWest (MW) served Essex, Morris, Sussex and northern Union Counties.

Until 2012, the Jewish Federation of Central New Jersey served southern Union and northern Somerset Counties.

In 2012, the two Federations merged to form the Jewish Federation of Greater MetroWest NJ (GMW).

DJN METHODOLOGY

- ◆ Distinctive Jewish Names (DJNs) can be used to provide an historical perspective on the number of Jewish households.
- ◆ The 31 DJNs used: Berman, Caplan, Cohen, Epstein, Feldman, Freedman, Friedman, Goldberg, Goldman, Goldstein, Greenberg, Grossman, Jaffe, Kahn, Kaplan, Katz, Kohn, Levin, Levine, Levinson, Levy, Lieberman, Rosen, Rosenberg, Rosenthal, Rubin, Schwartz, Shapiro, Siegel, Silverman, Weinstein.
- ◆ Count the number of households in each geographic area with a DJN in 1998. Develop a ratio (DJN ratio) between the number of DJN households in 1998 and the number of Jewish households found by RDD in 1998.
- ◆ Count the number of households with a DJN in 2008 and 2012 and apply the DJN ratio to estimate the number of Jewish households in 2008 and 2012.

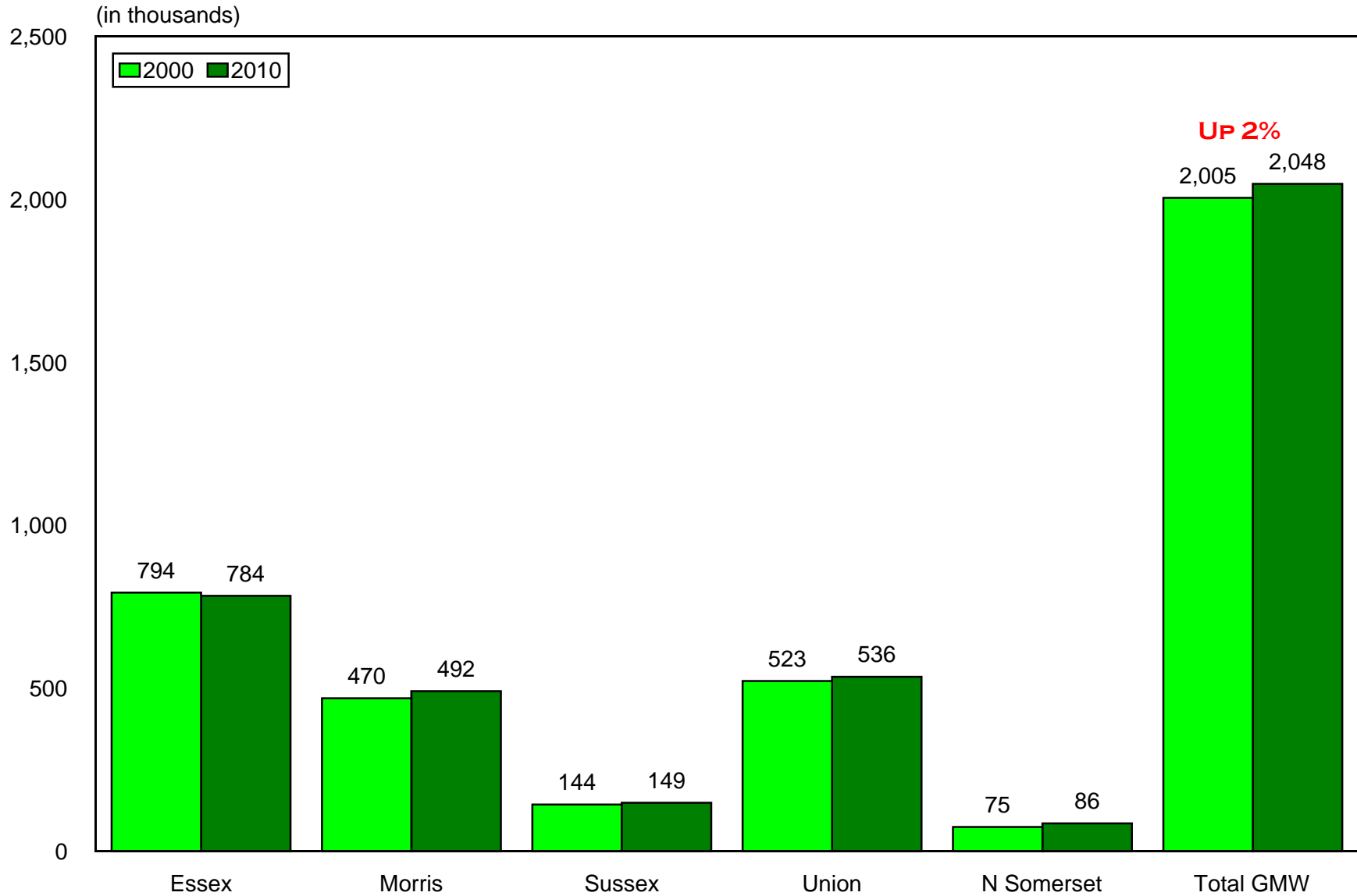

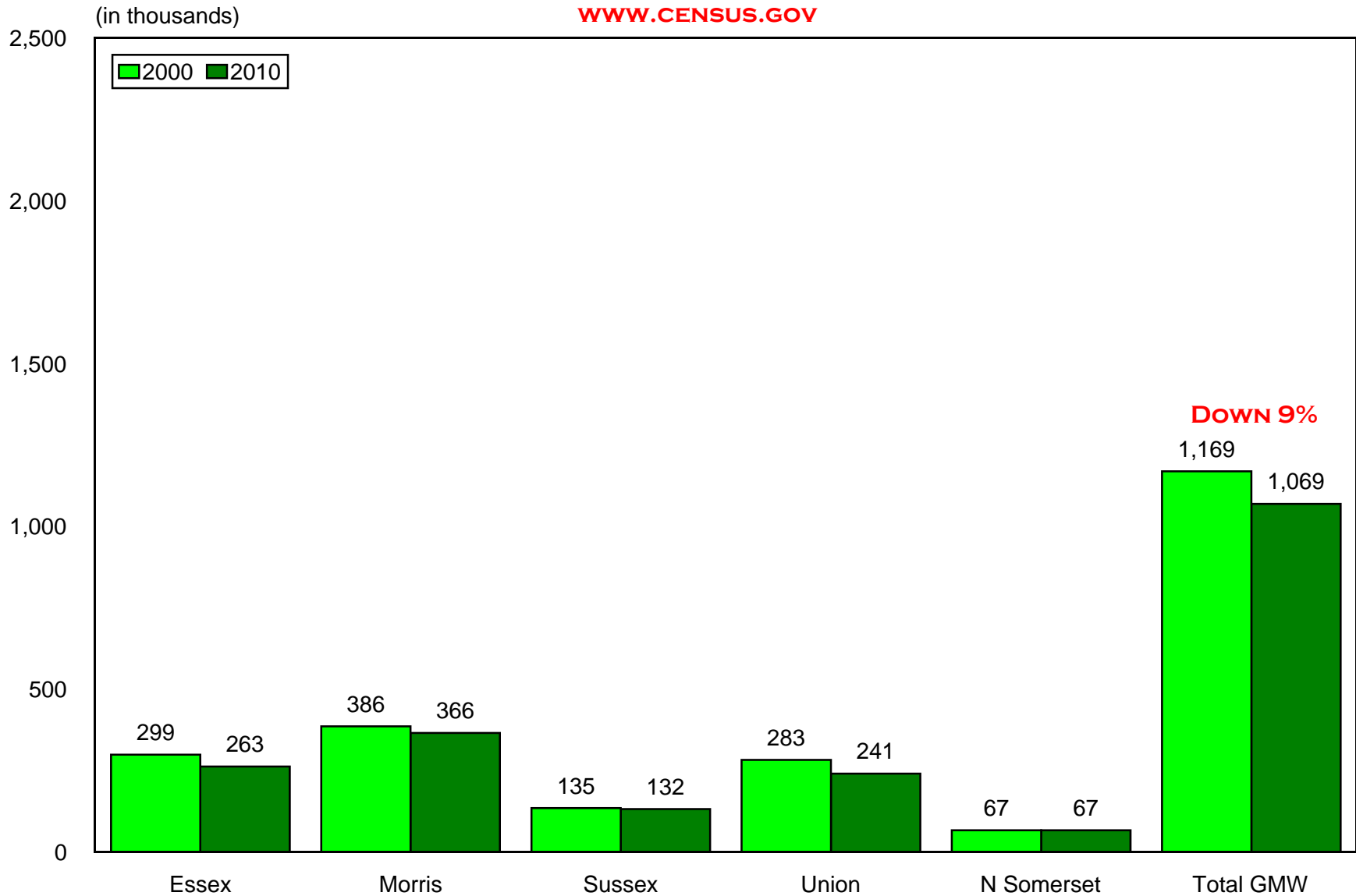
TOTAL POPULATION OF GMW BY COUNTY, 2000 - 2010

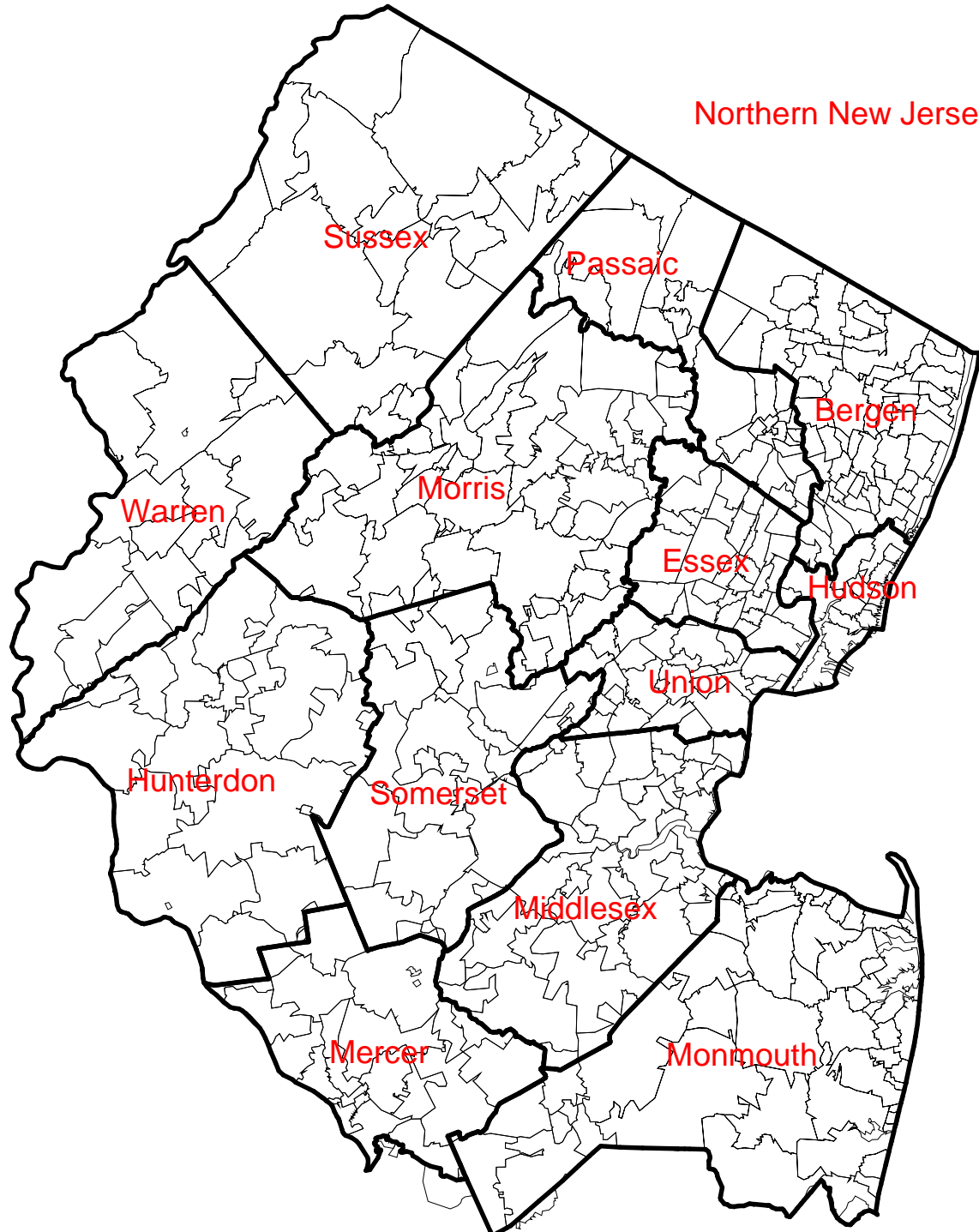

Northern New Jersey Reference Map

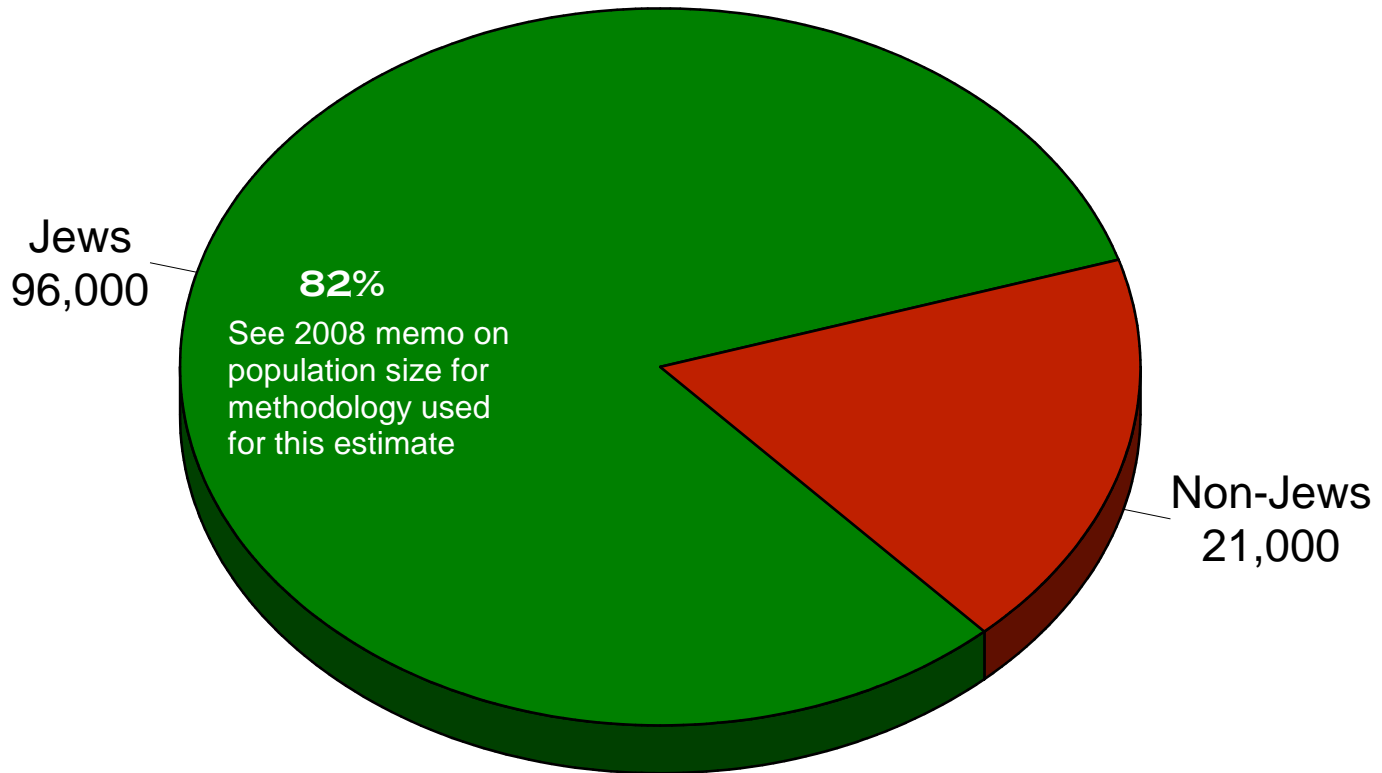

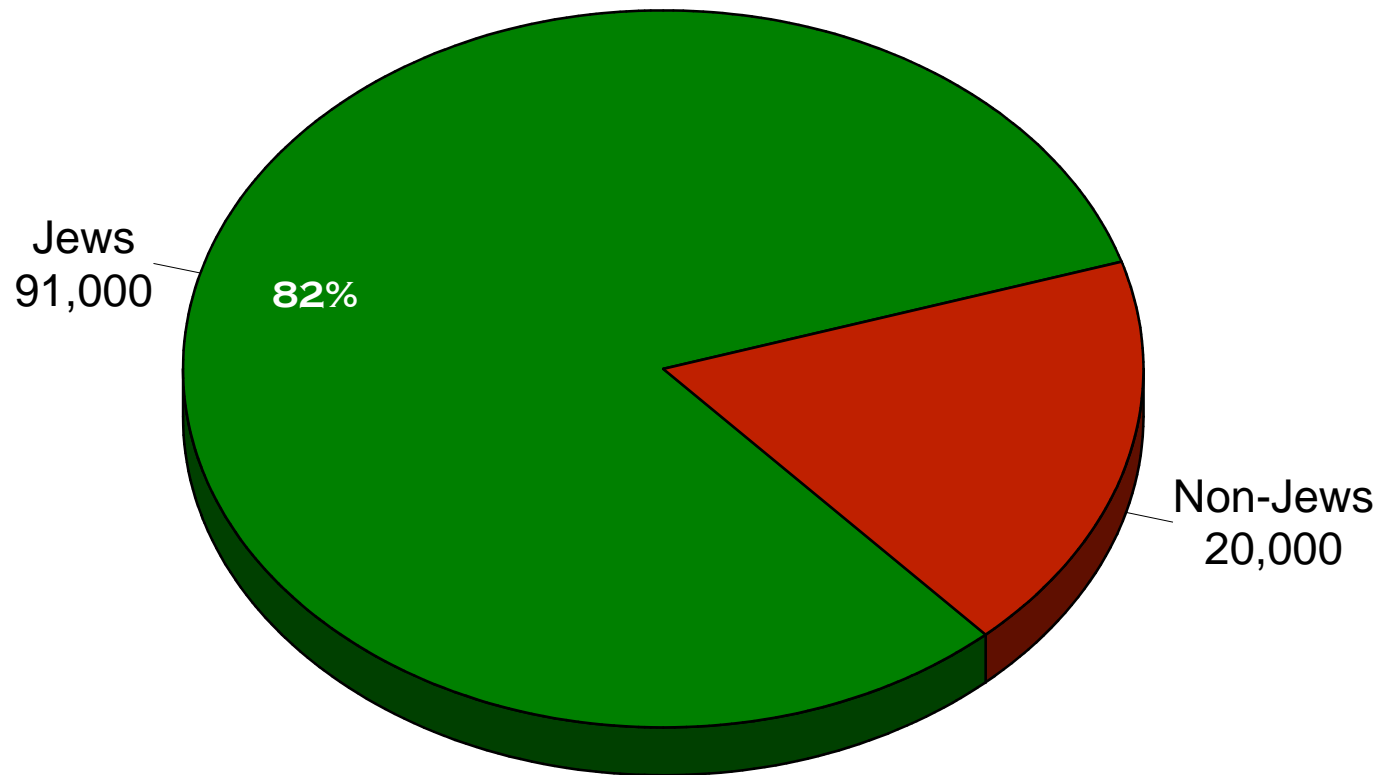

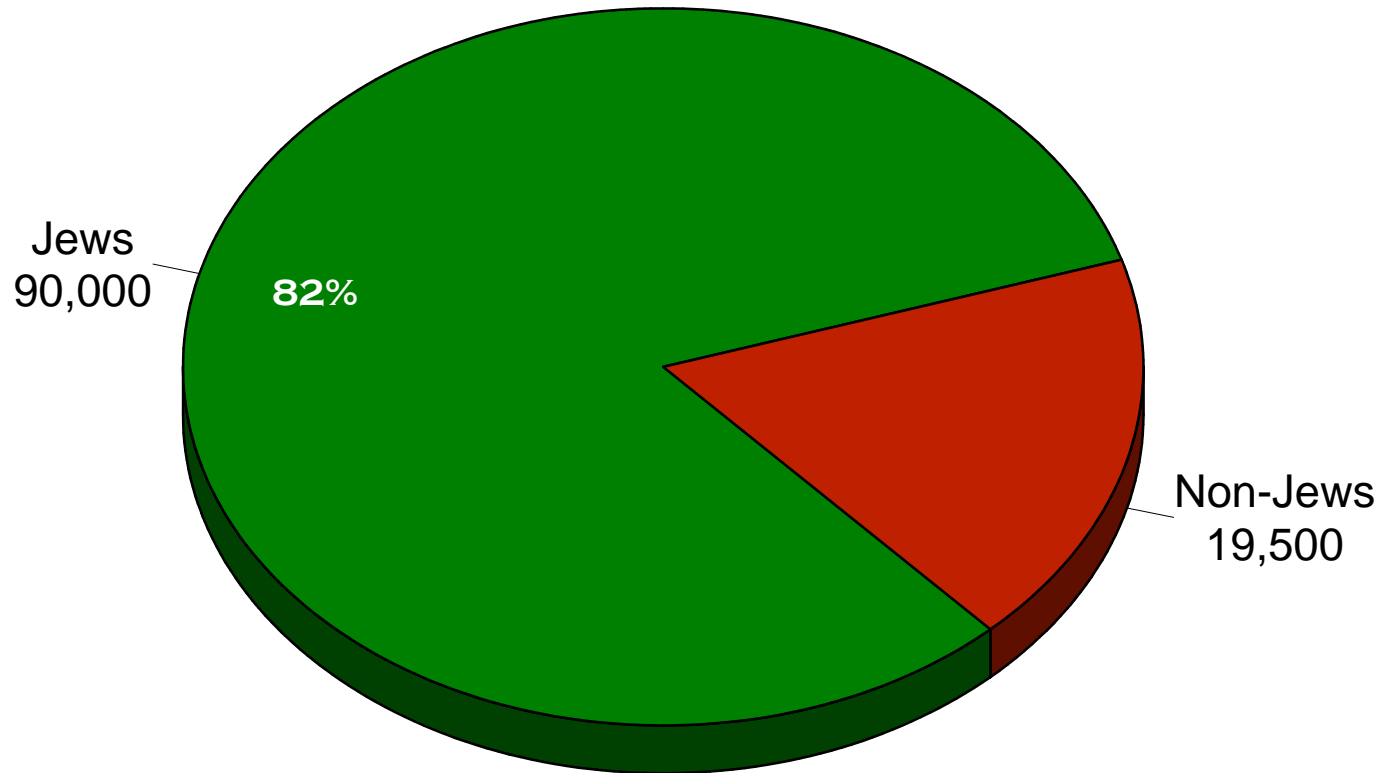

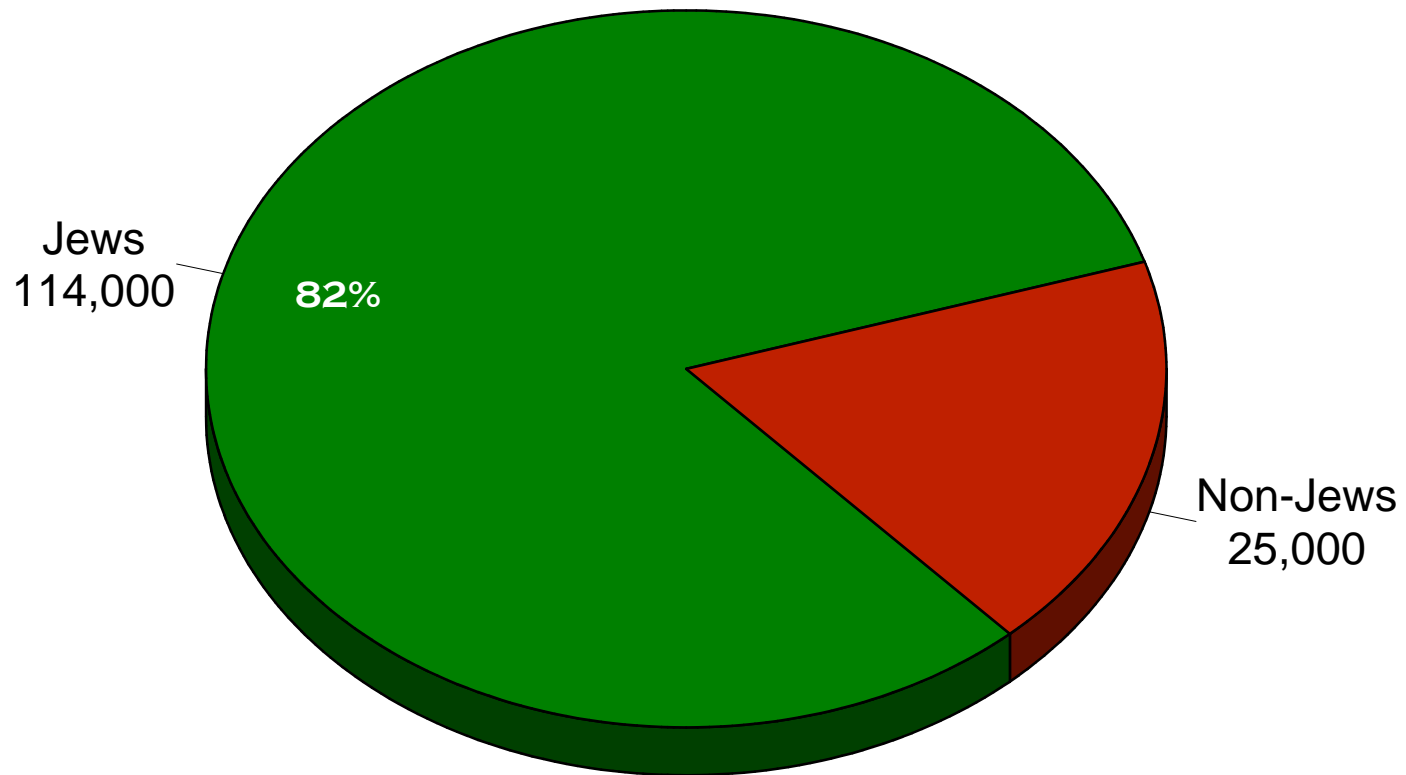

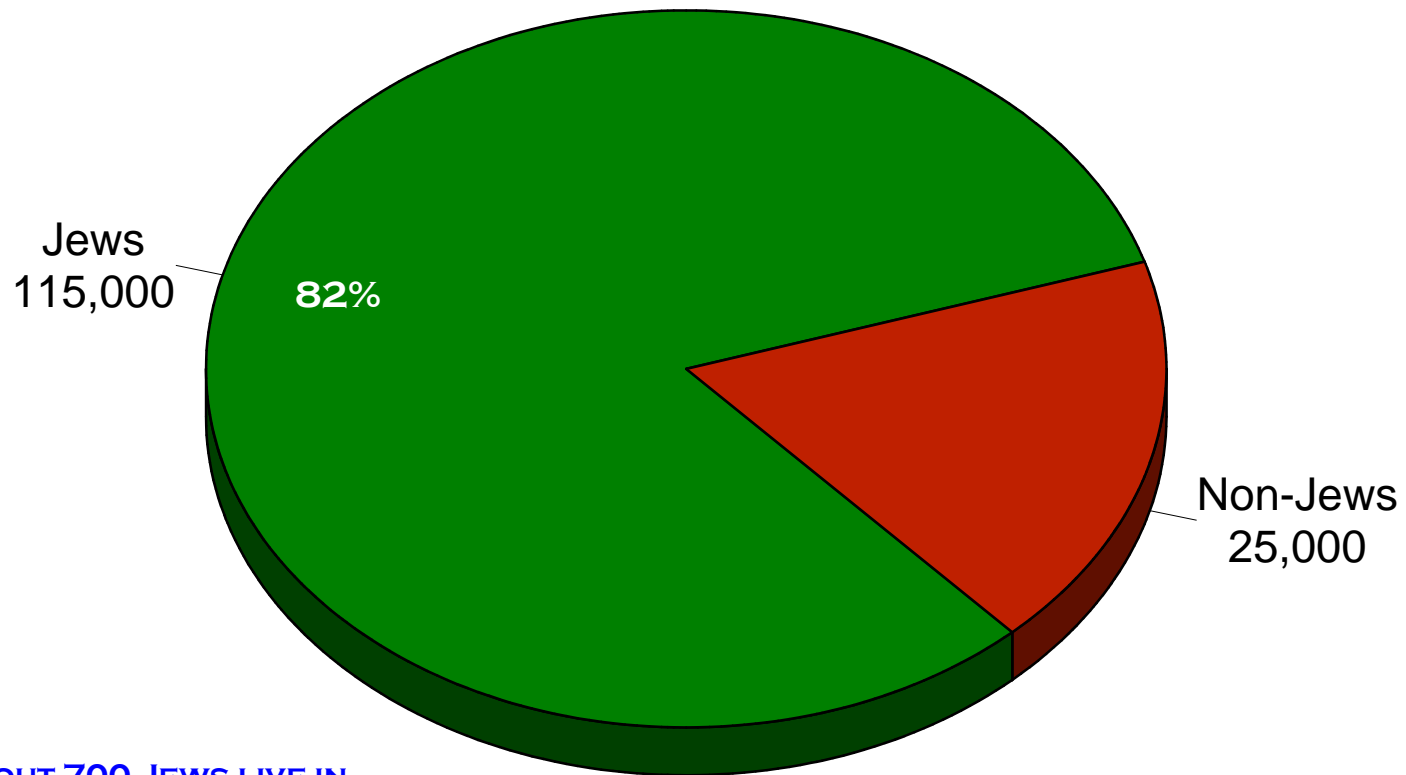

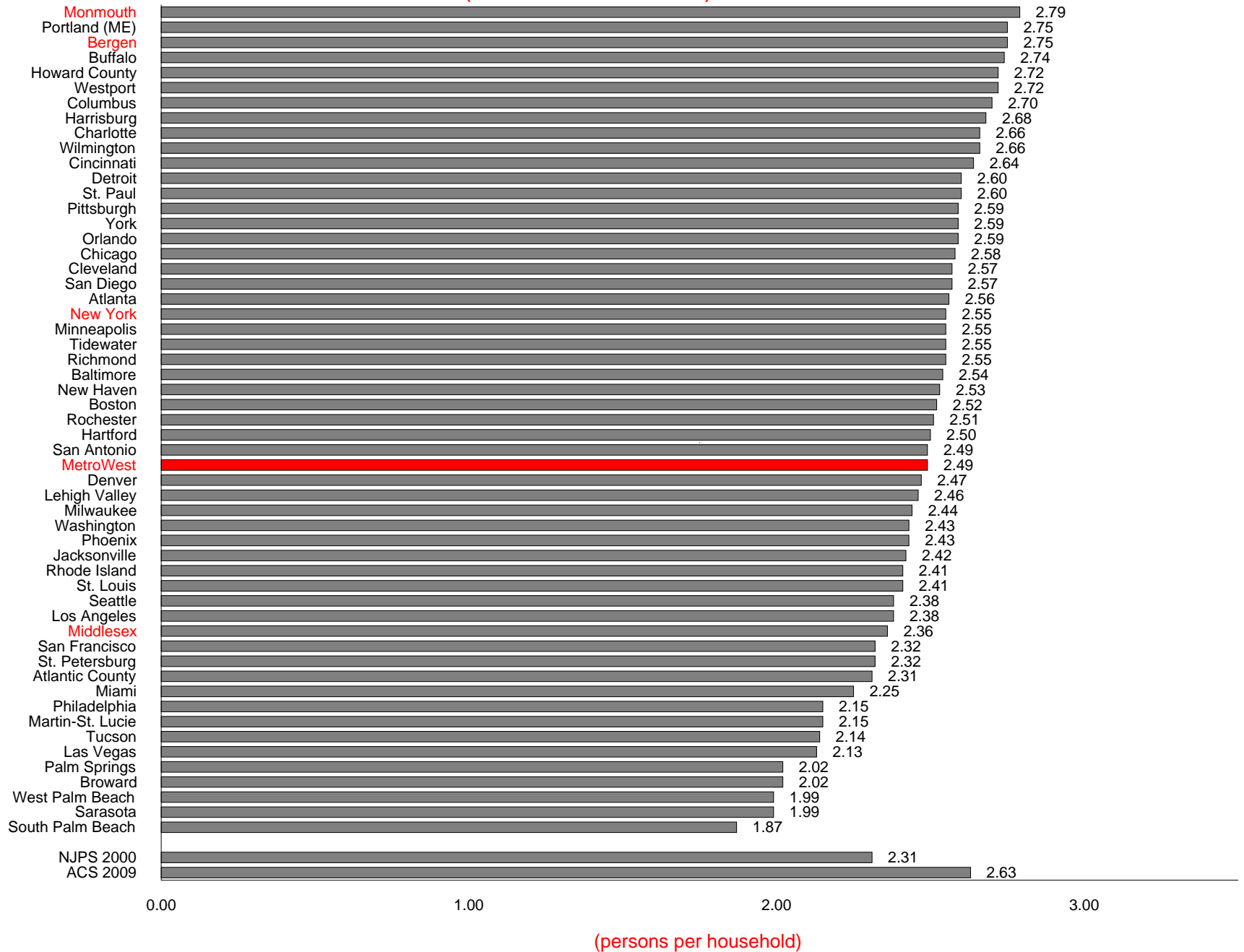

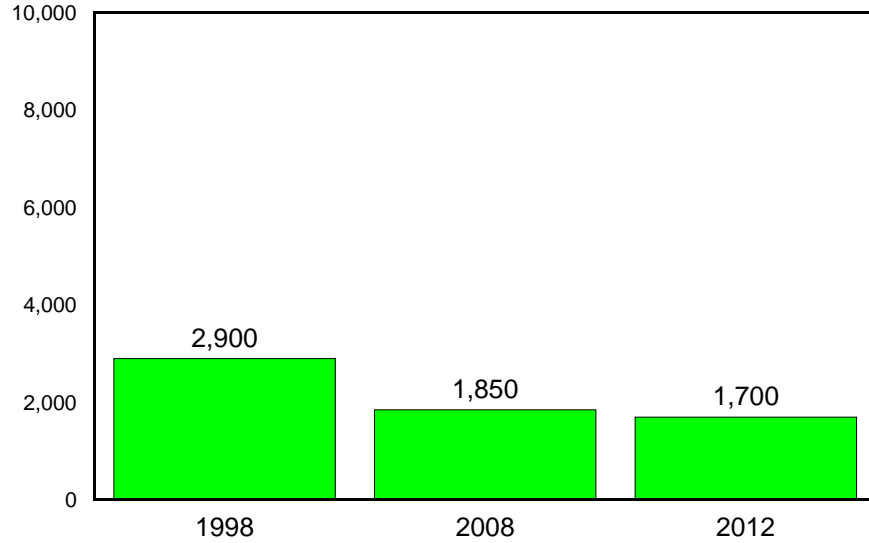

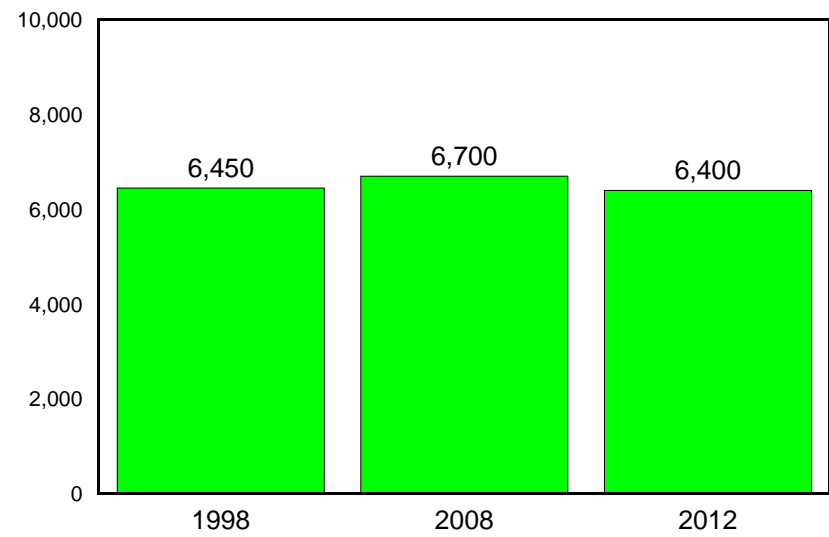

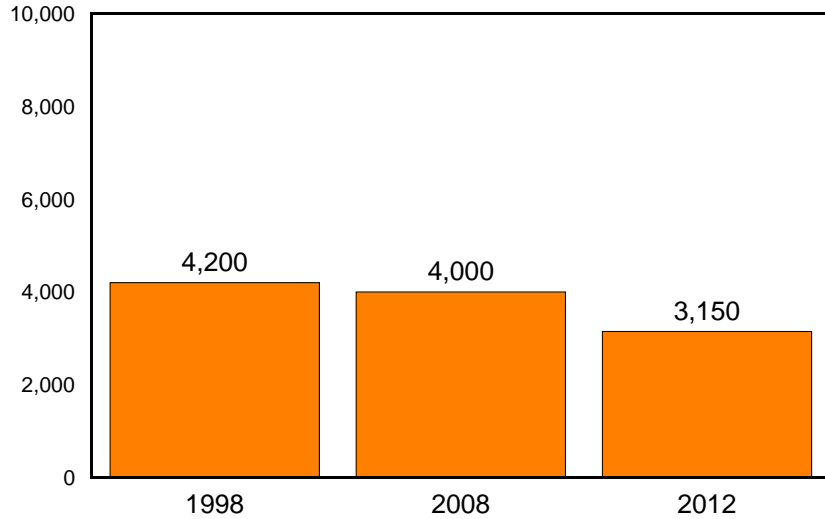


CHANGE IN NUMBER OF JEWISH HOUSEHOLDS 1998-2012

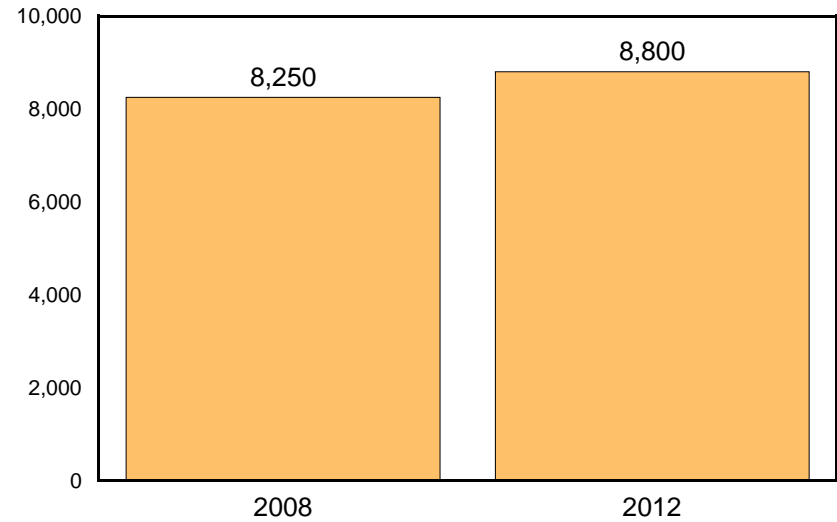


CHANGE IN NUMBER OF JEWISH HOUSEHOLDS 1998-2012

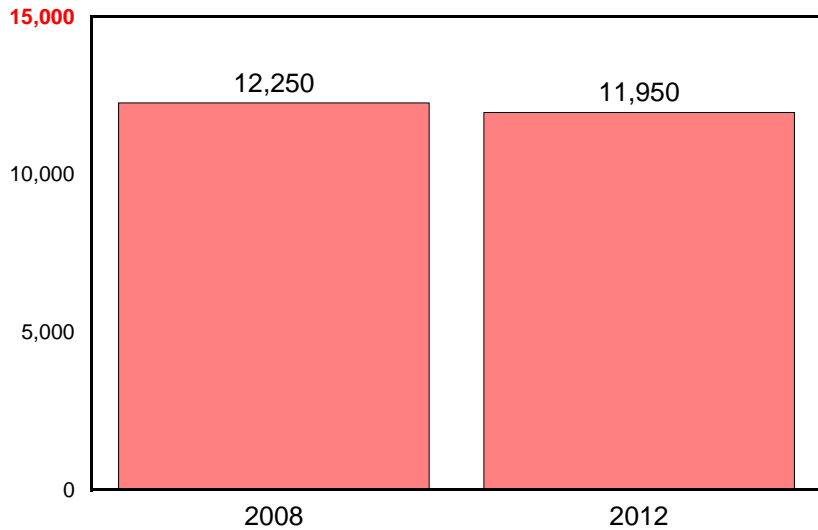

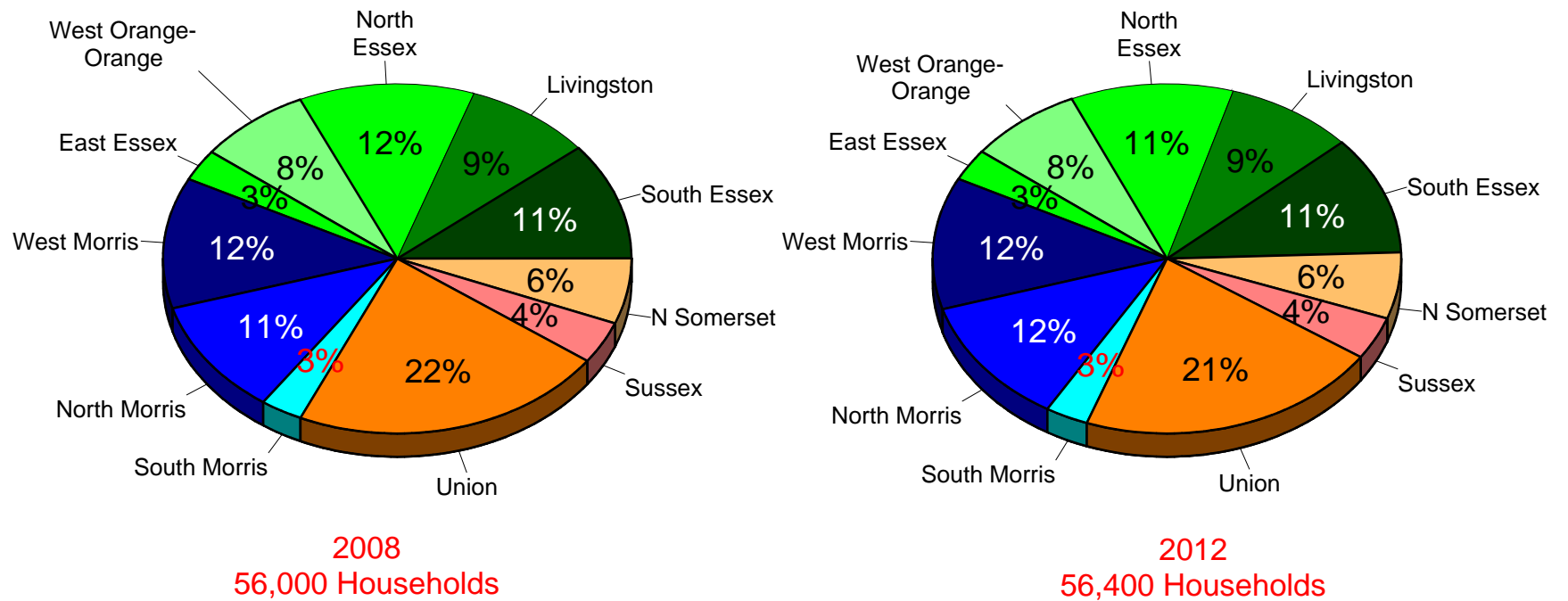
CHANGE IN NUMBER OF JEWISH HOUSEHOLDS 1998-2012



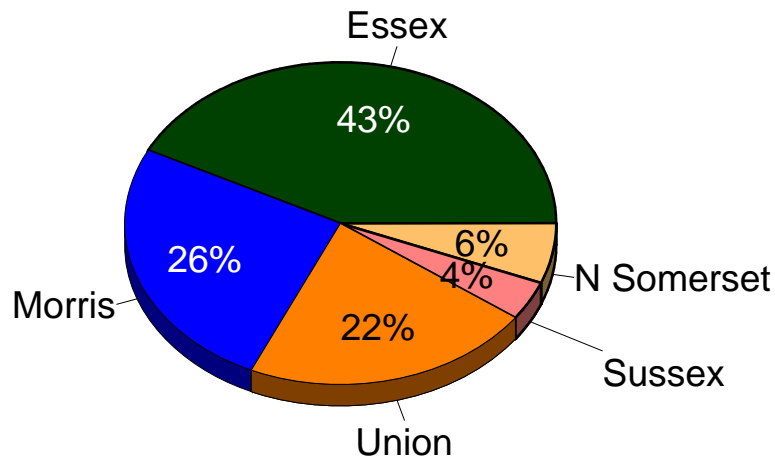

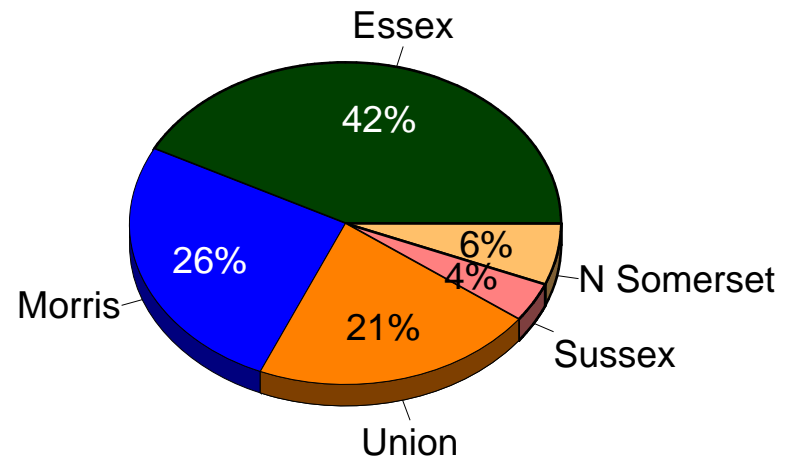
DISTRIBUTION OF JEWISH HOUSEHOLDS BY GEOGRAPHIC AREA GMW



DISTRIBUTION OF JEWISH HOUSEHOLDS BY COUNTY GMW

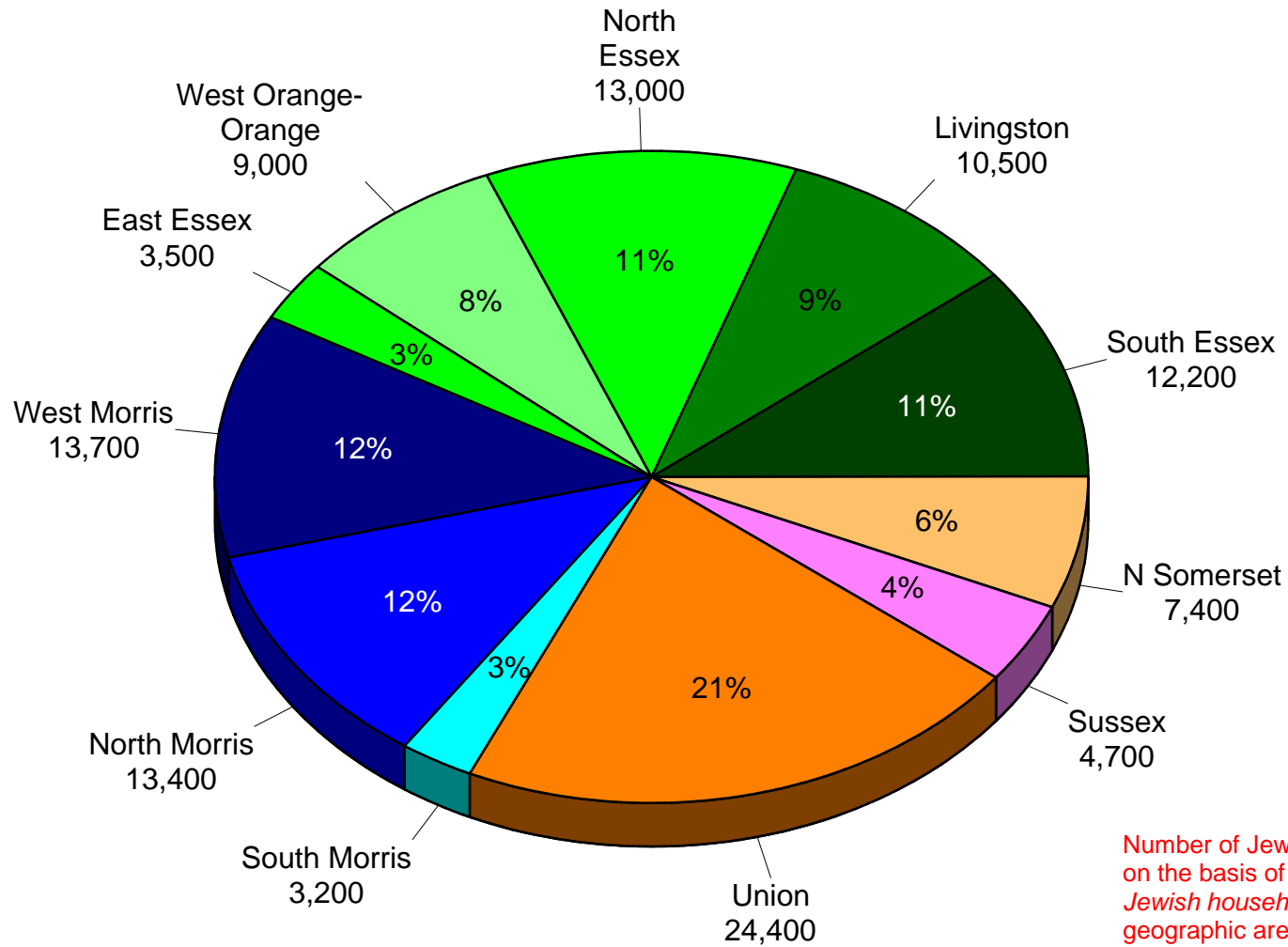

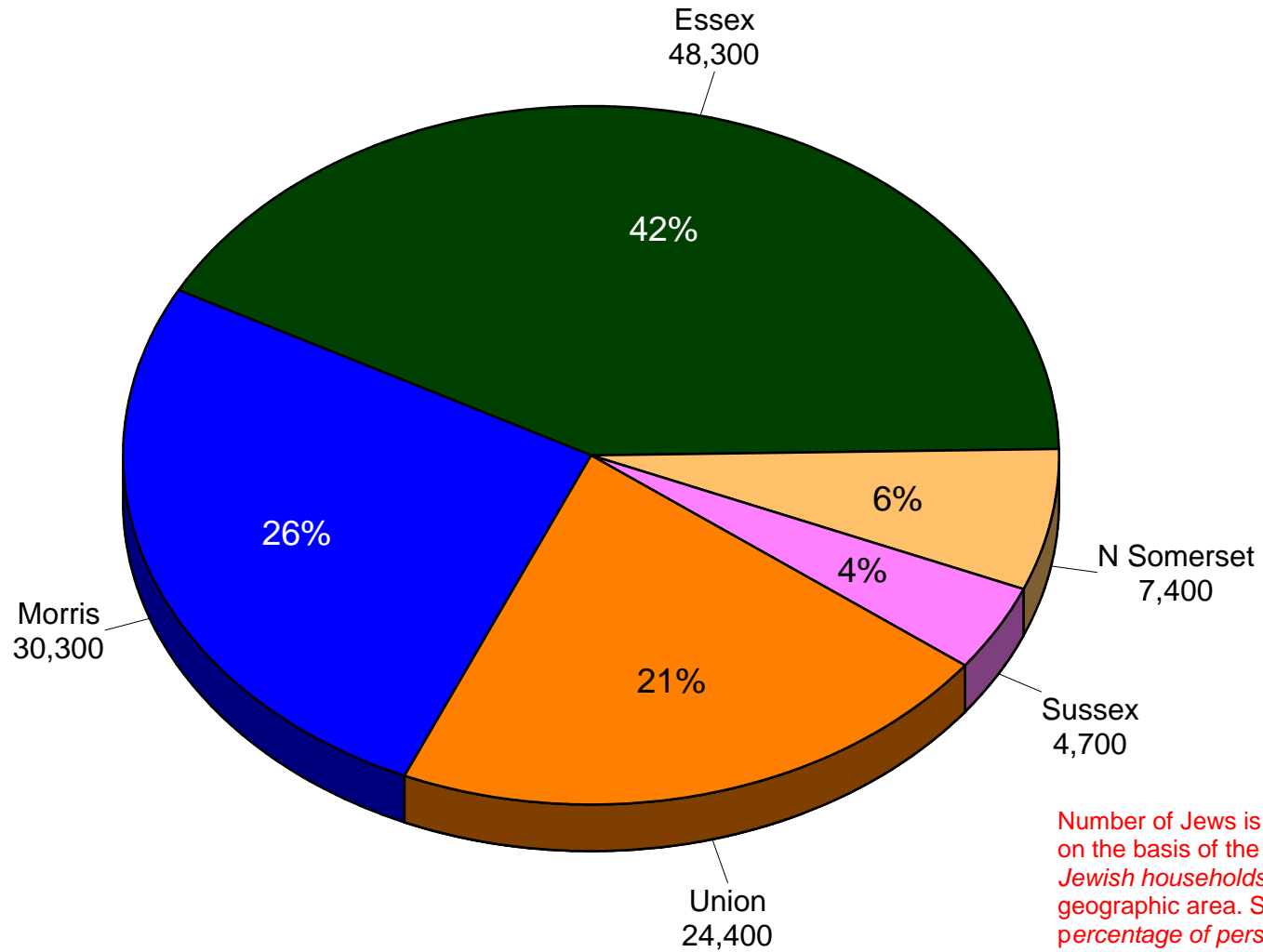

DISTRIBUTION OF 115,000 GMW JEWS BY COUNTY 2012

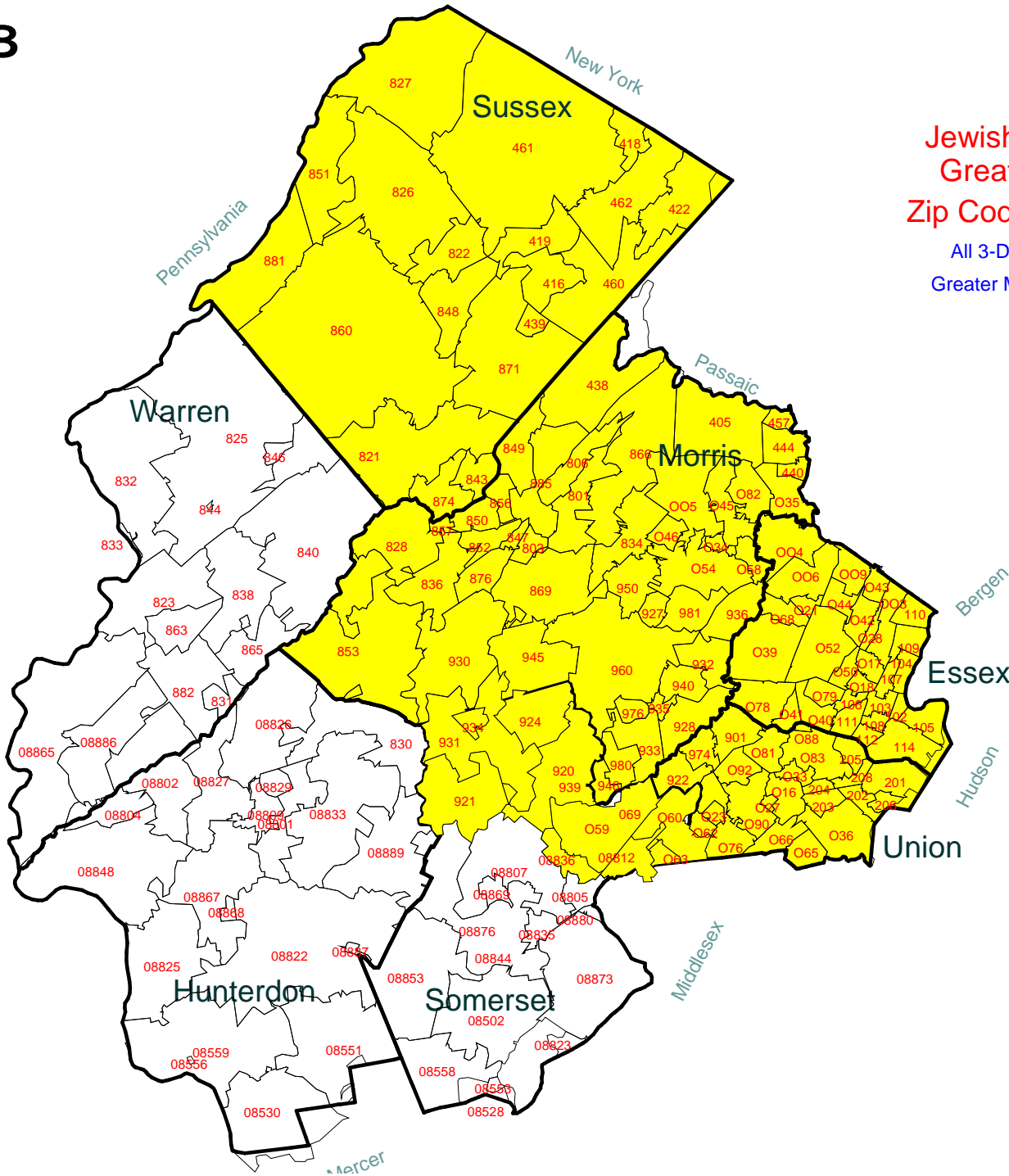

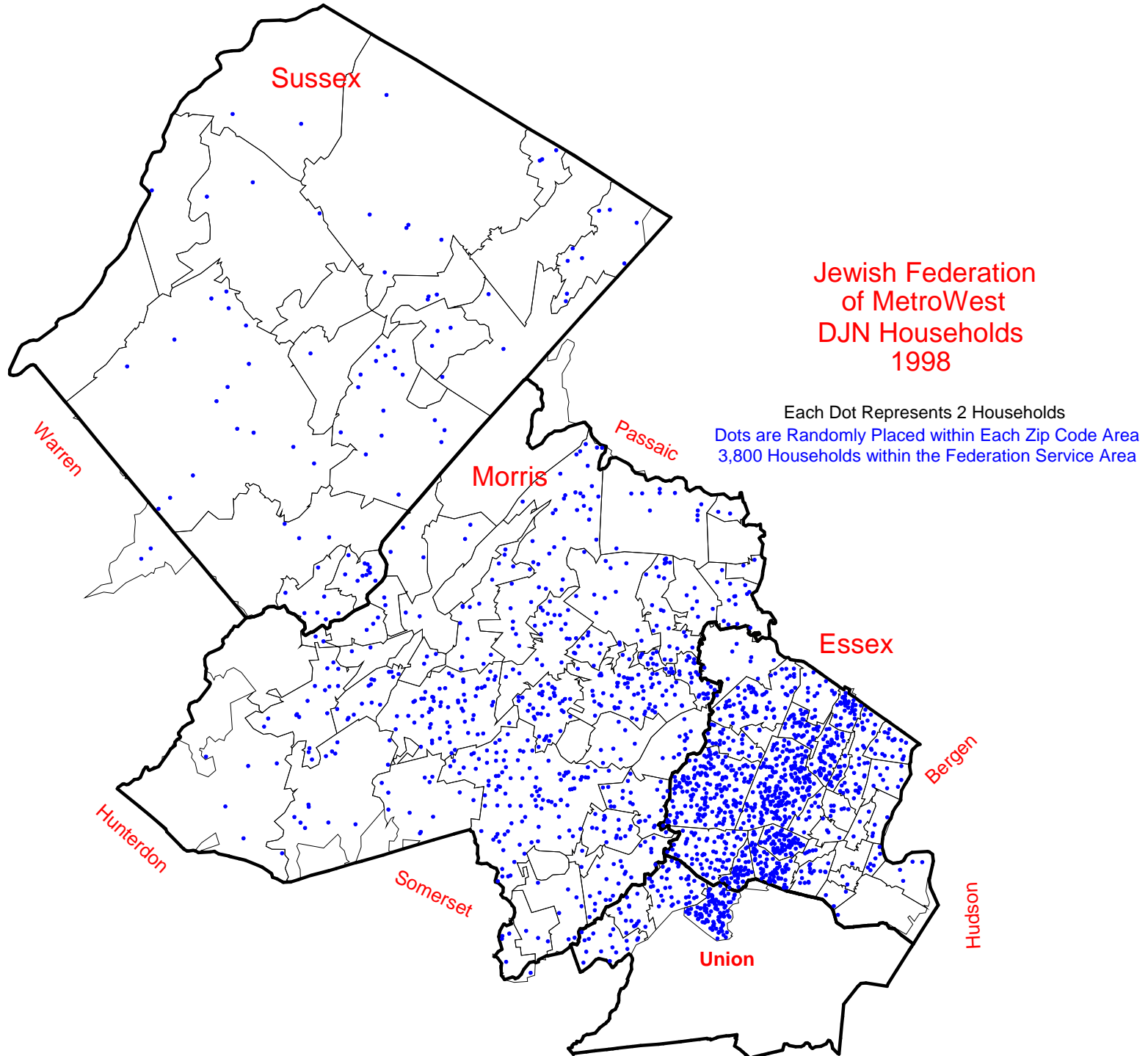

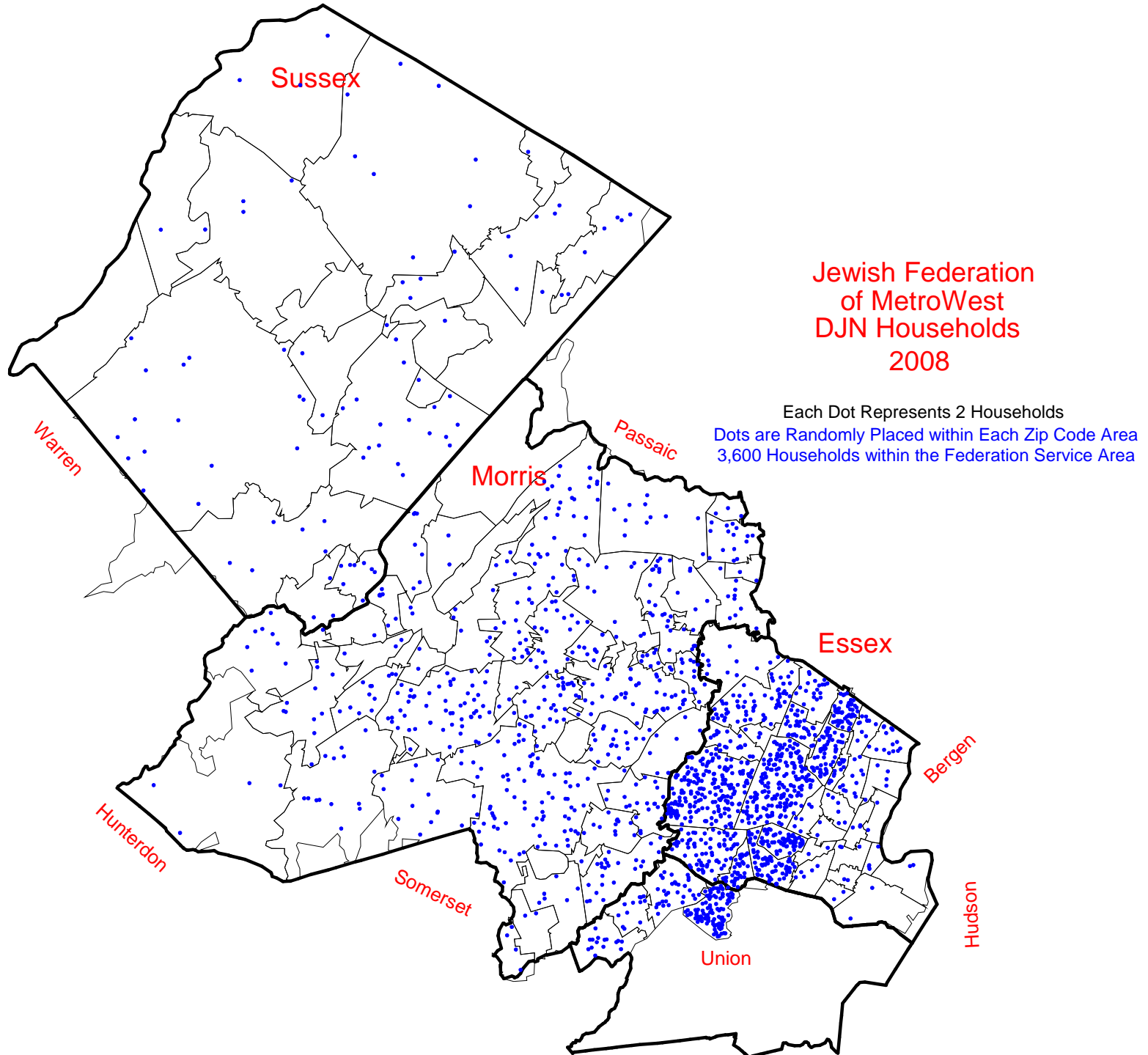

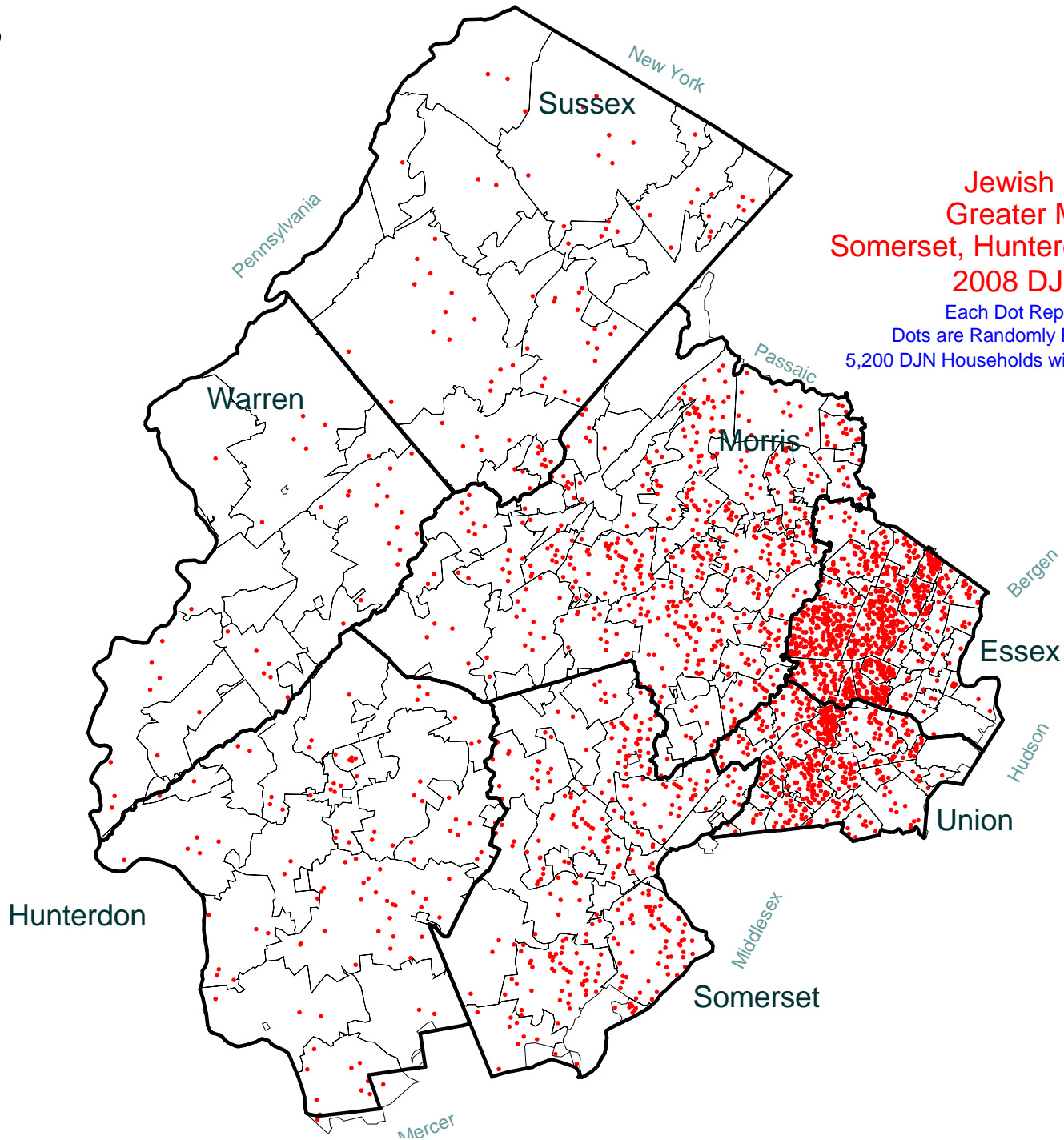

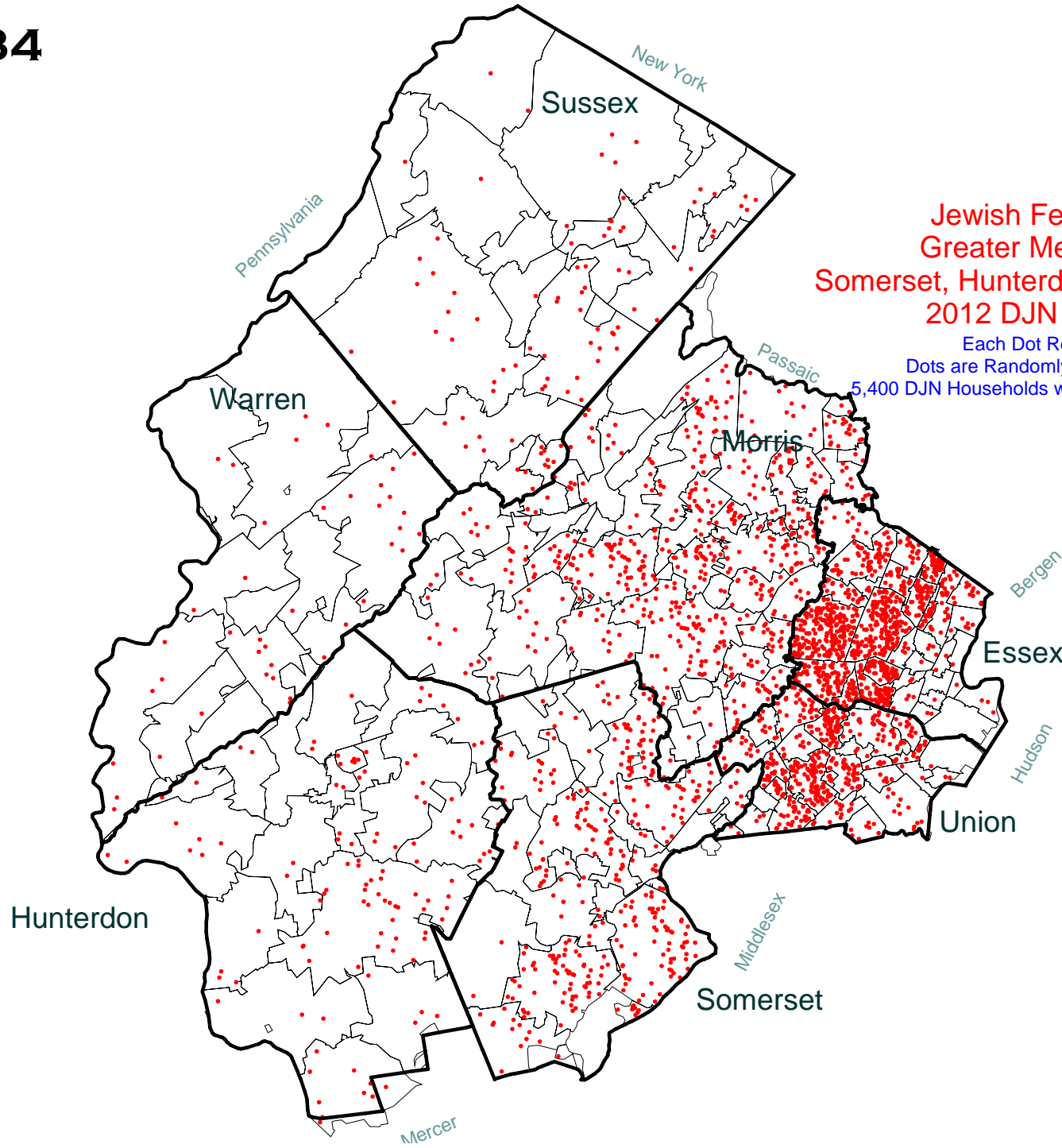

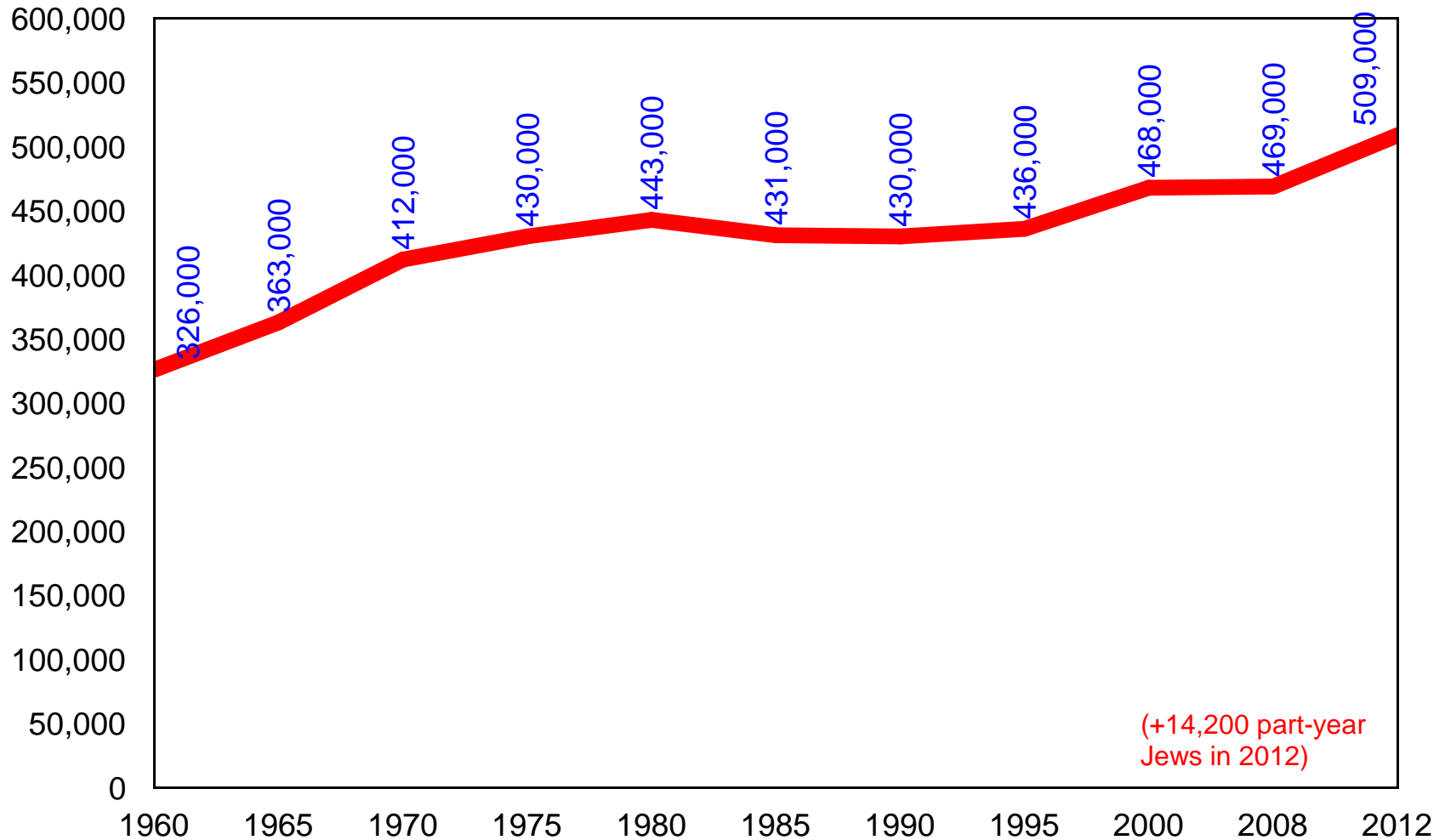

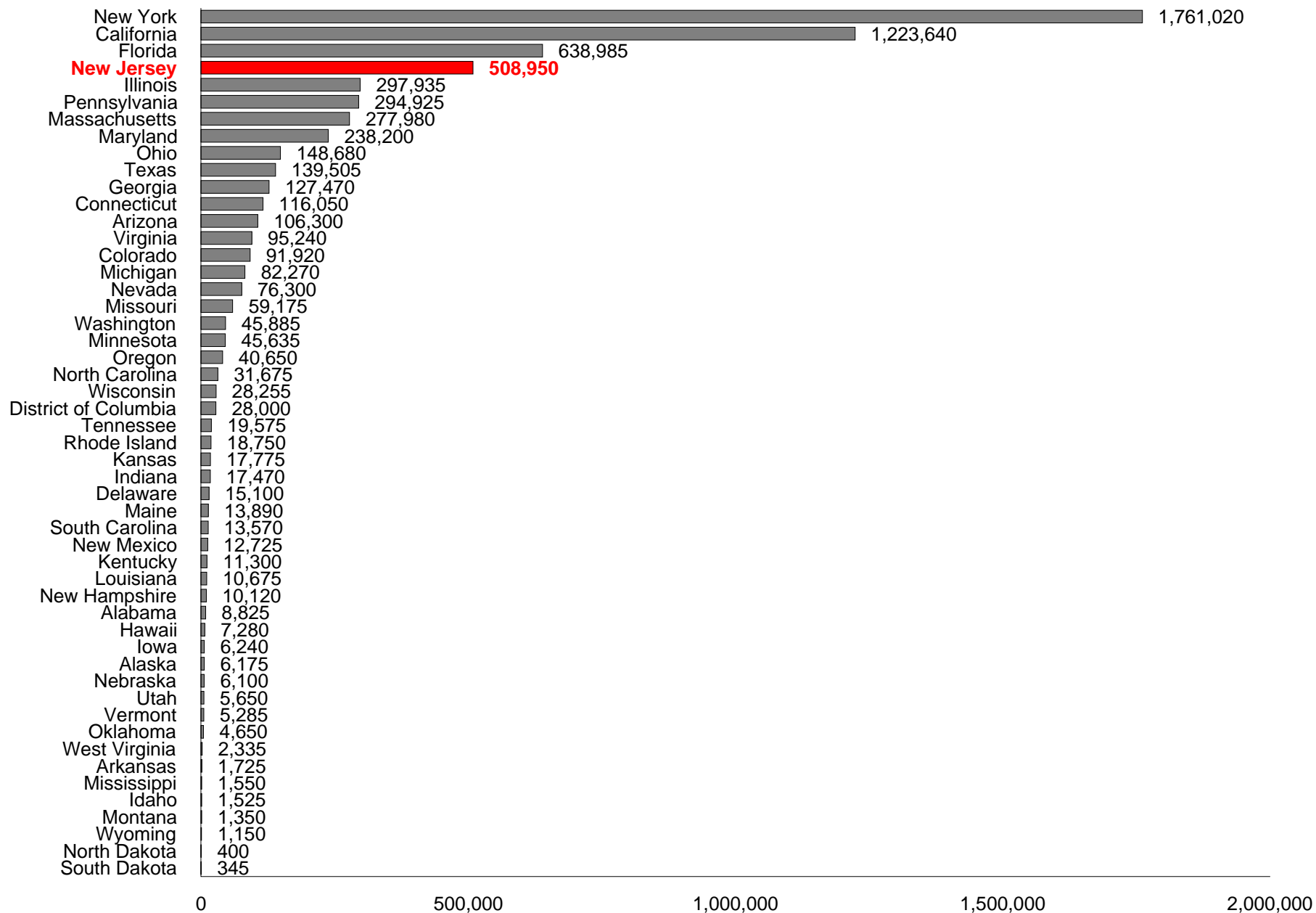

GROWTH OF THE JEWISH POPULATION OF NEW JERSEY



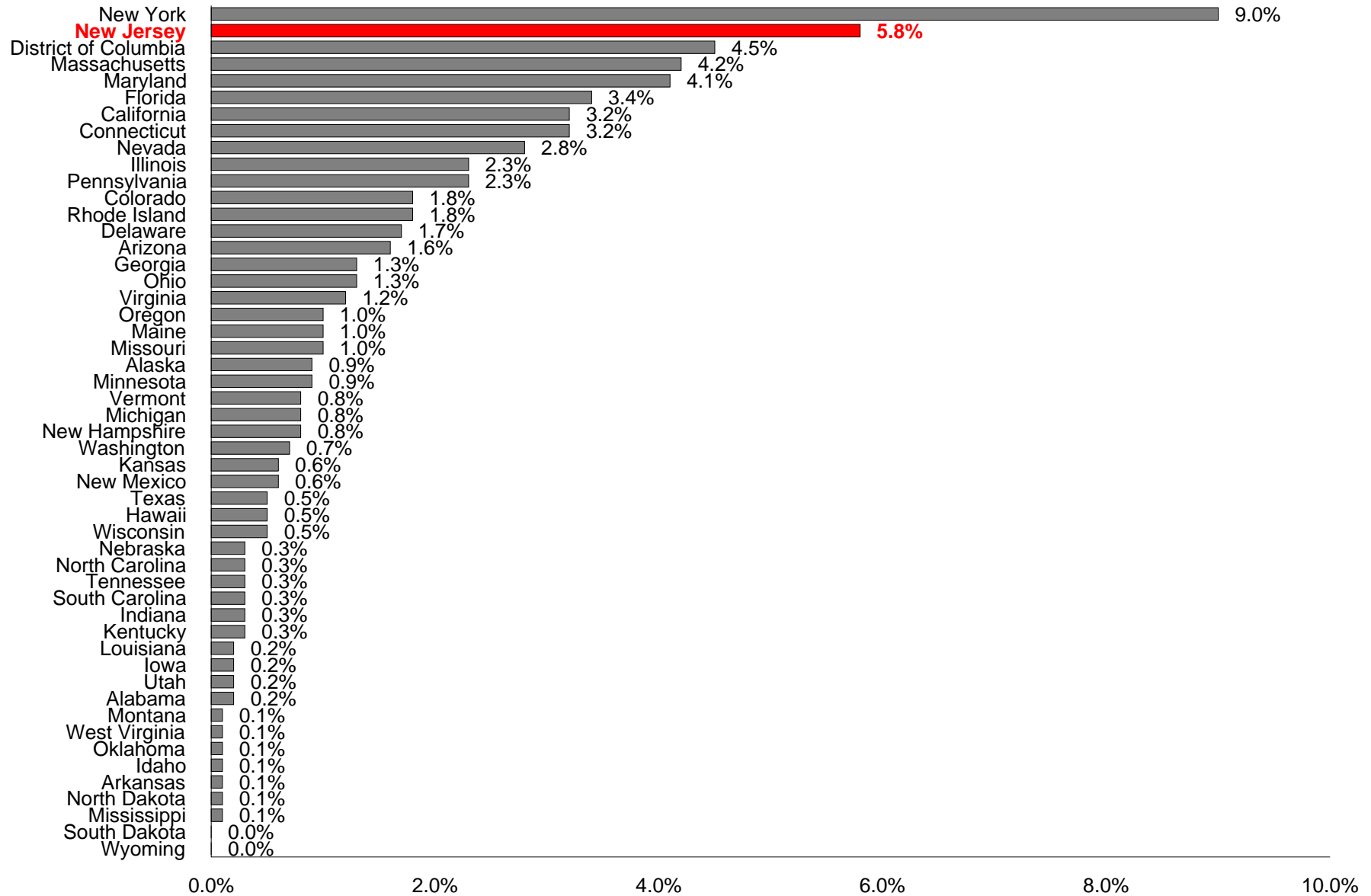

37 STATES WITH THE LARGEST JEWISH POPULATION, 2012



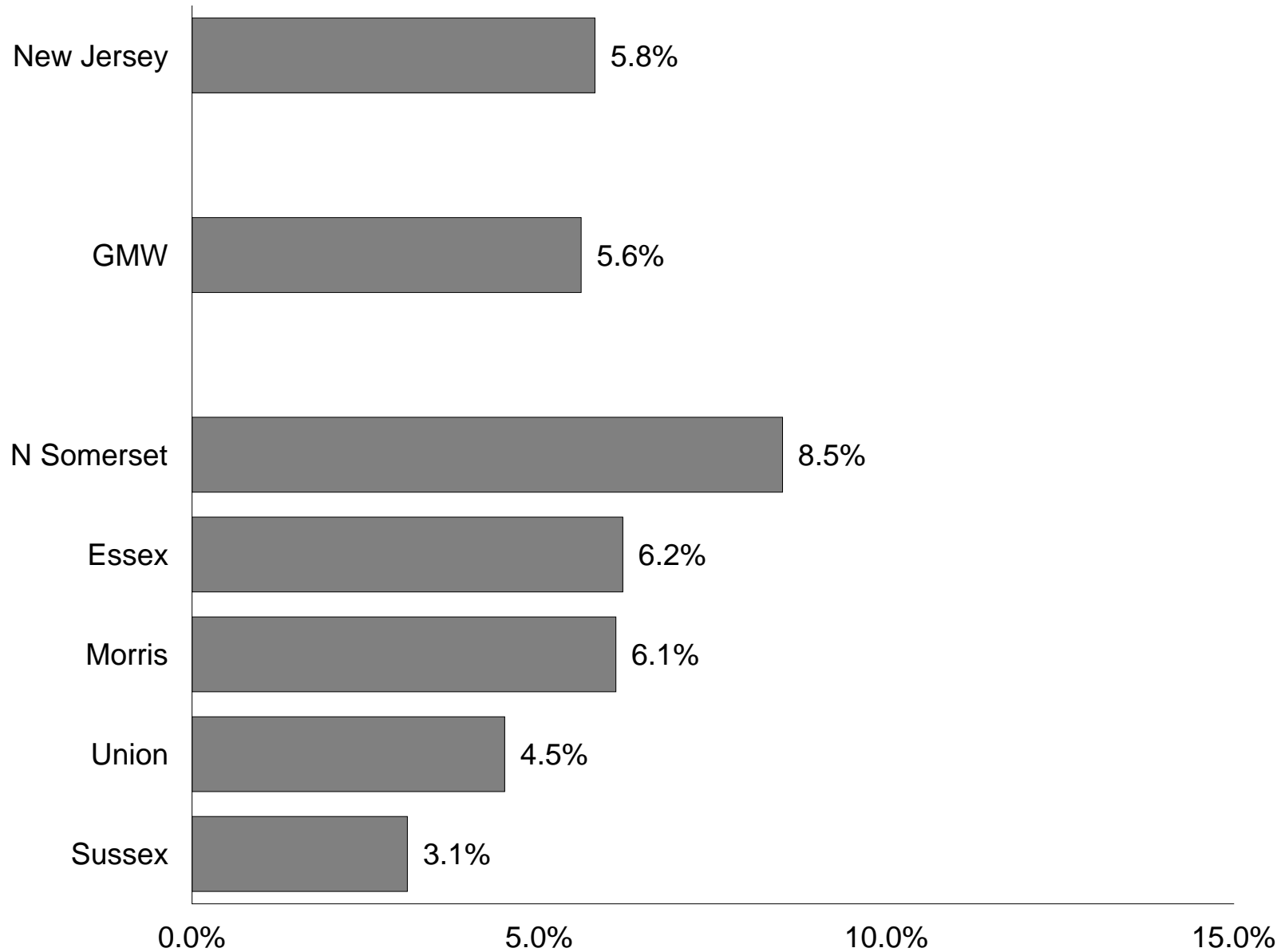

STATES WITH THE HIGHEST PERCENTAGE OF ITS RESIDENTS WHO ARE JEWISH, 2012



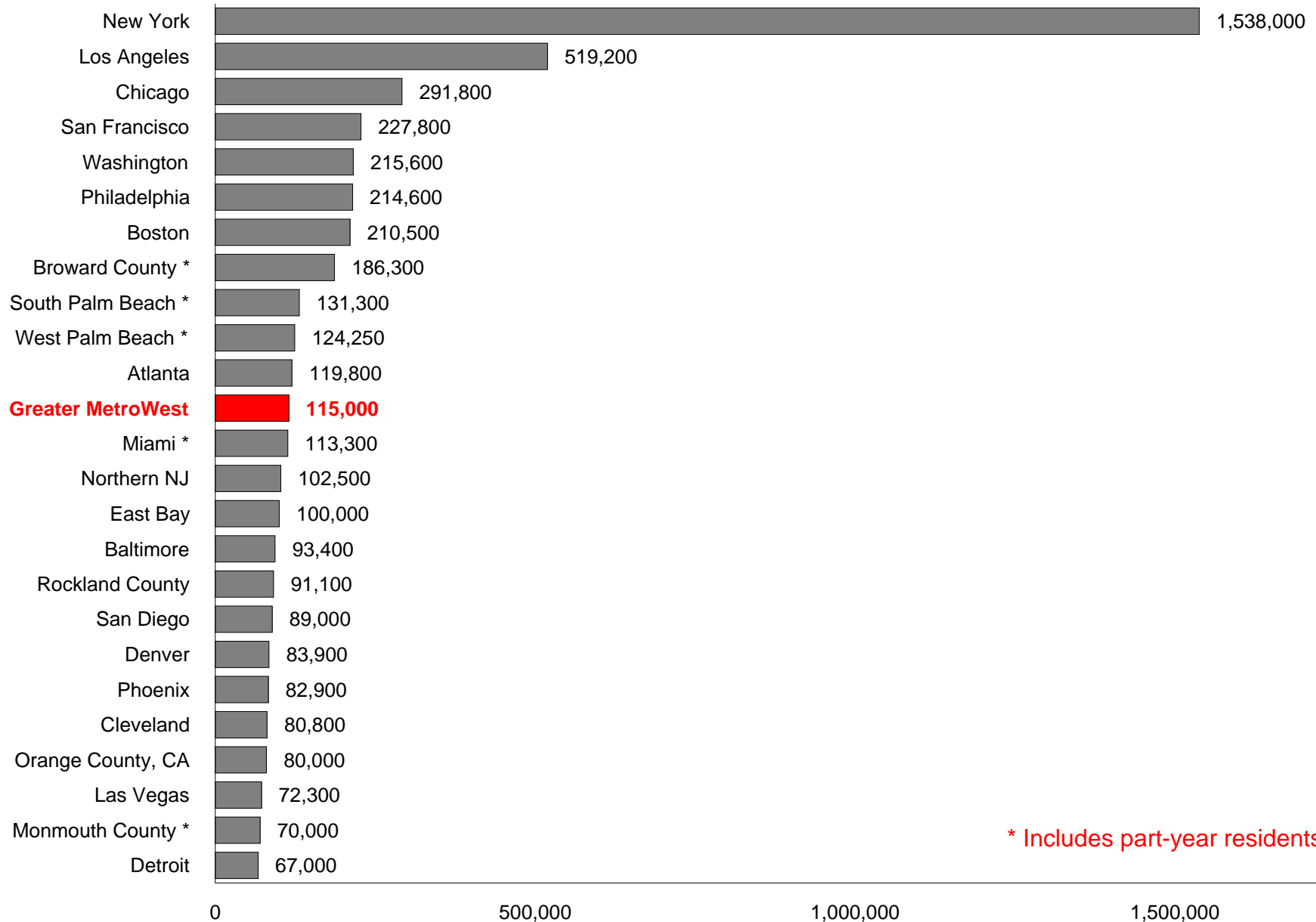

LARGEST AMERICAN JEWISH COMMUNITIES, 2012

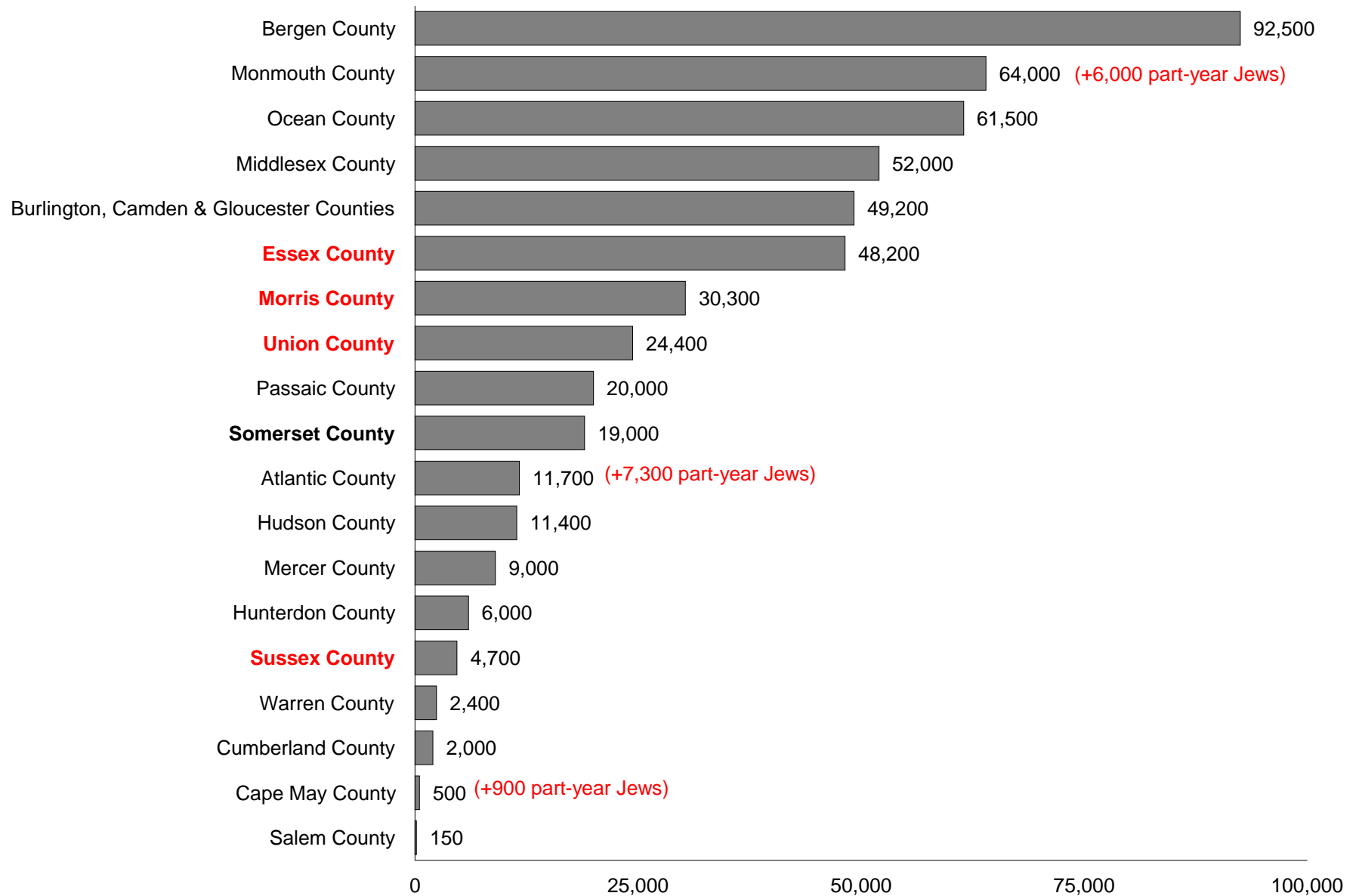
(Number of Jews in Each Jewish Federation Service Area)

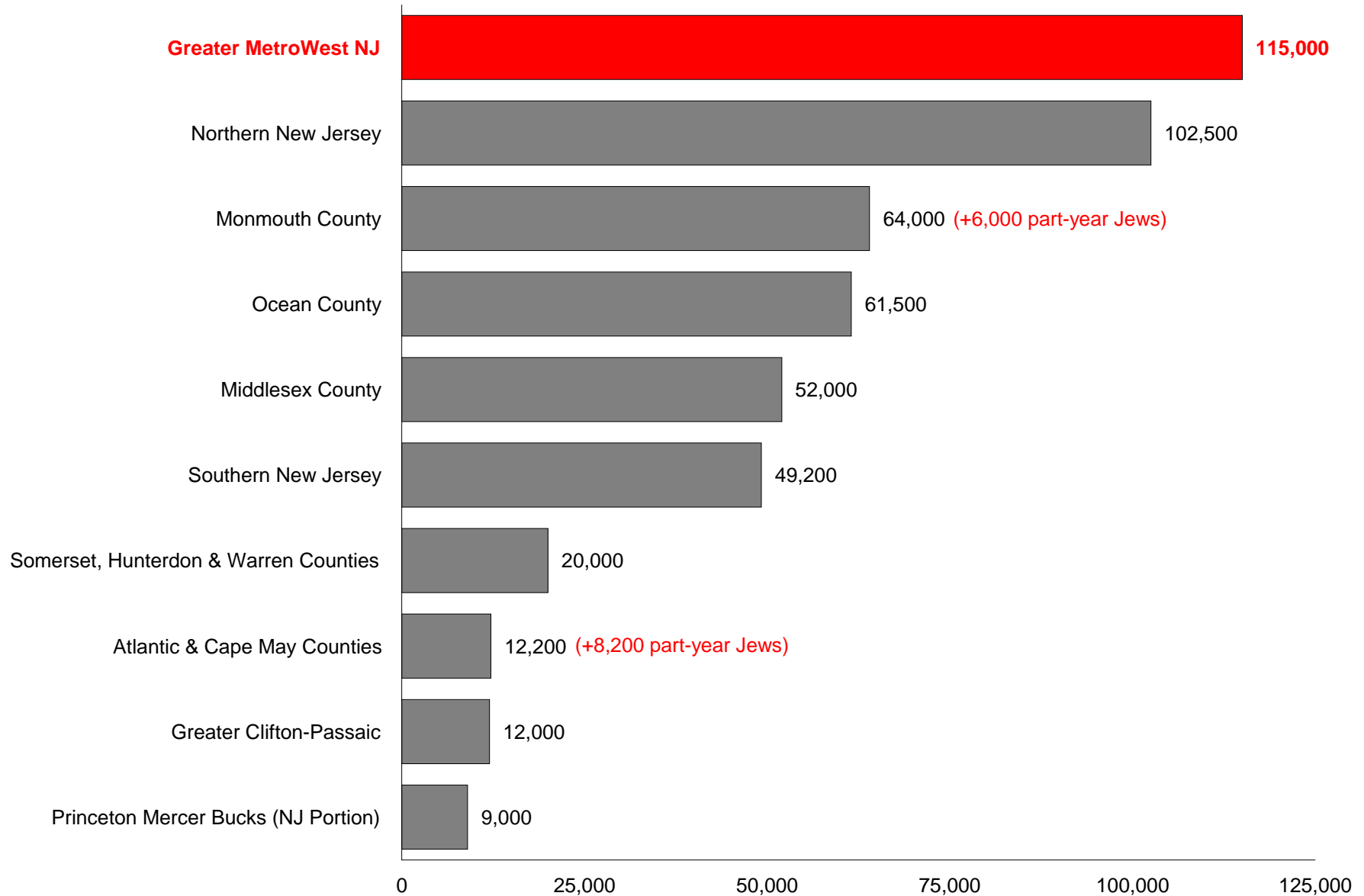

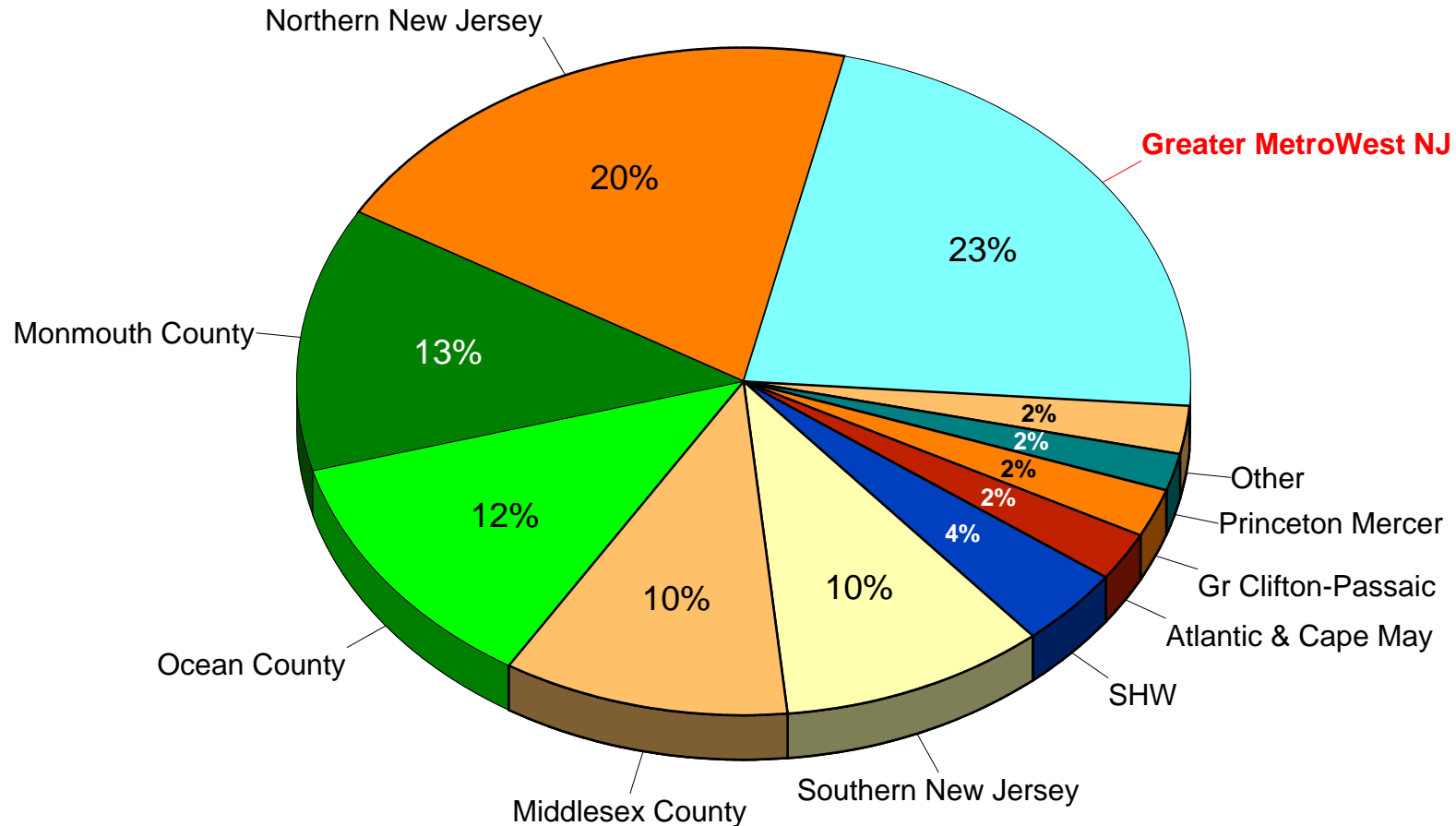

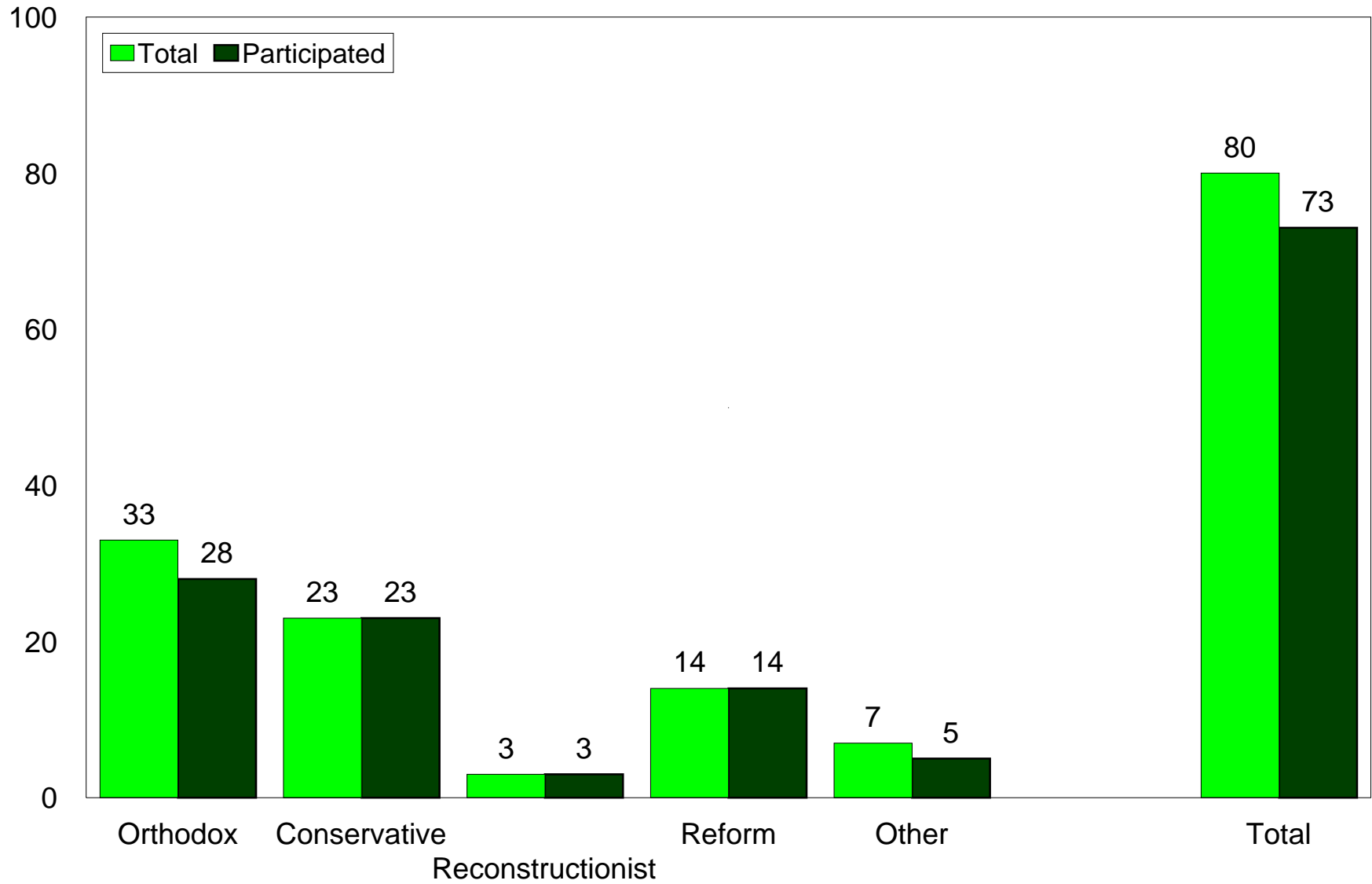

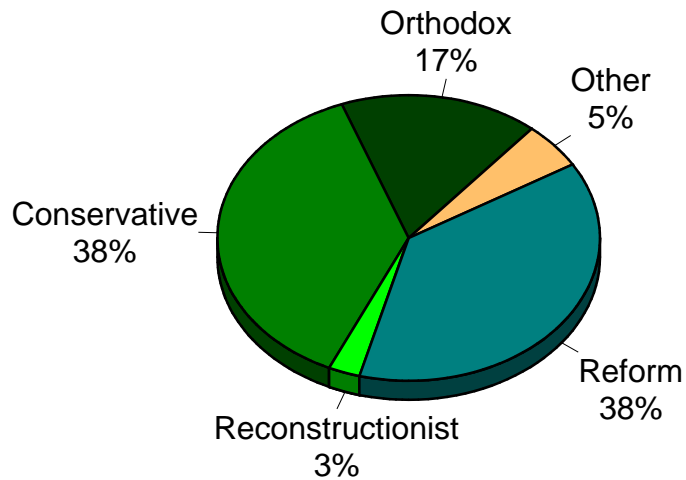

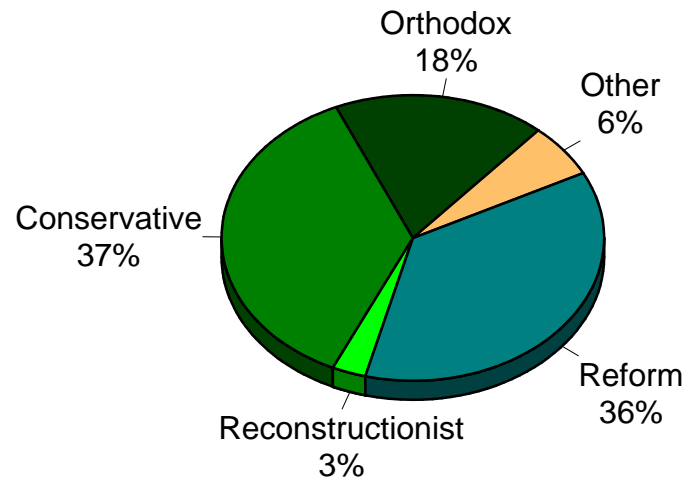


DENOMINATION OF SYNAGOGUE MEMBERSHIP 2008 AND 2012

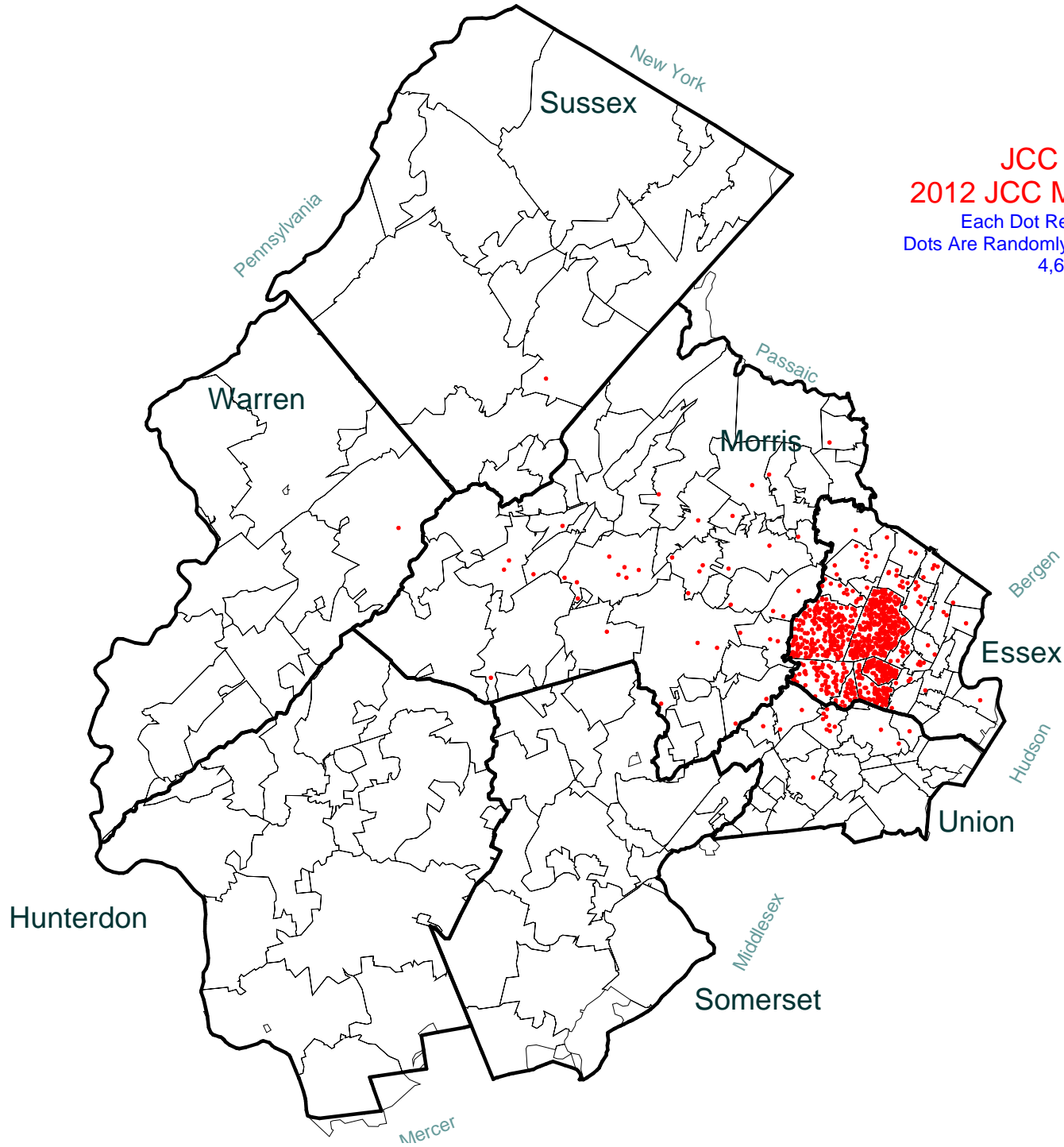

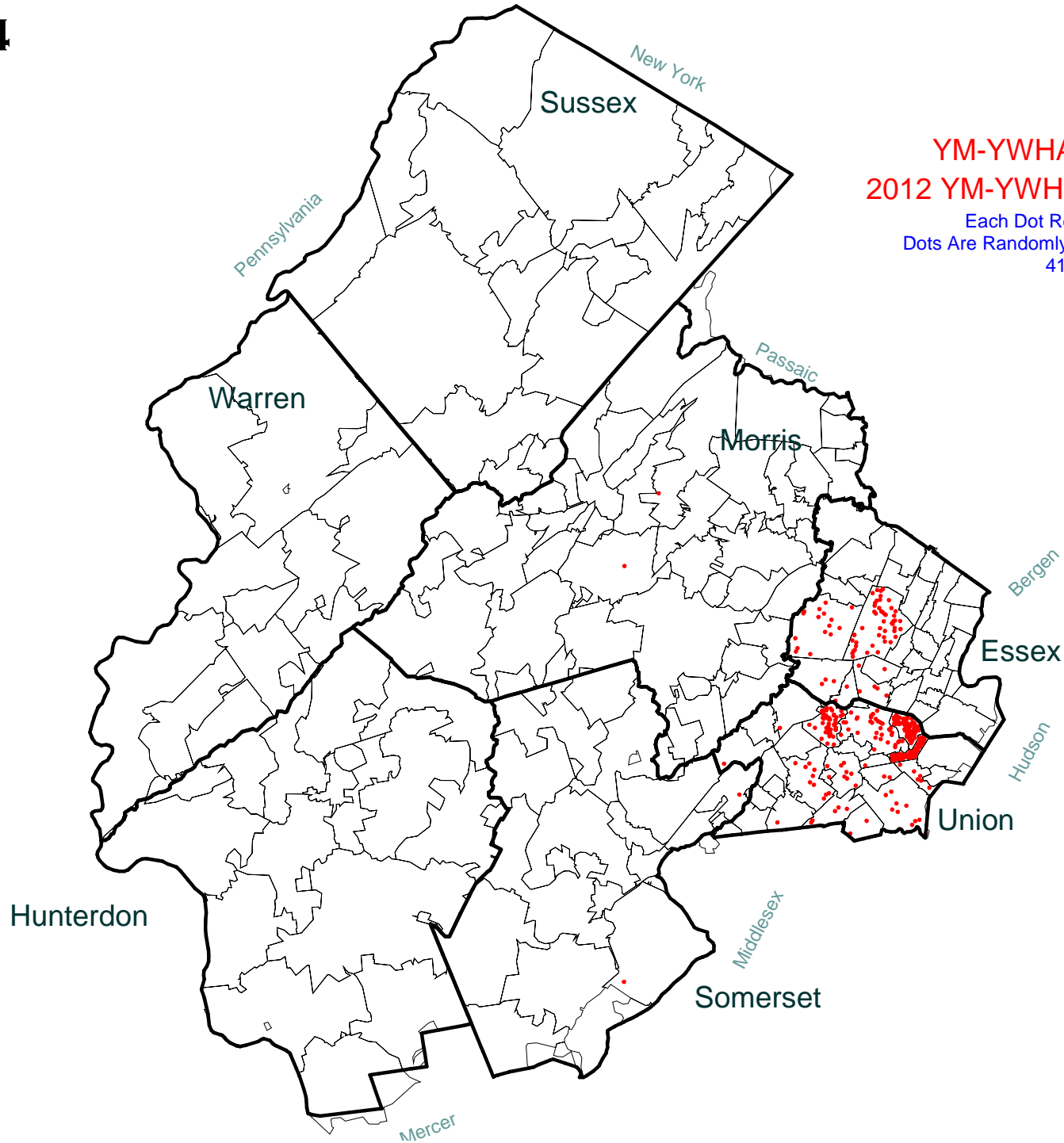

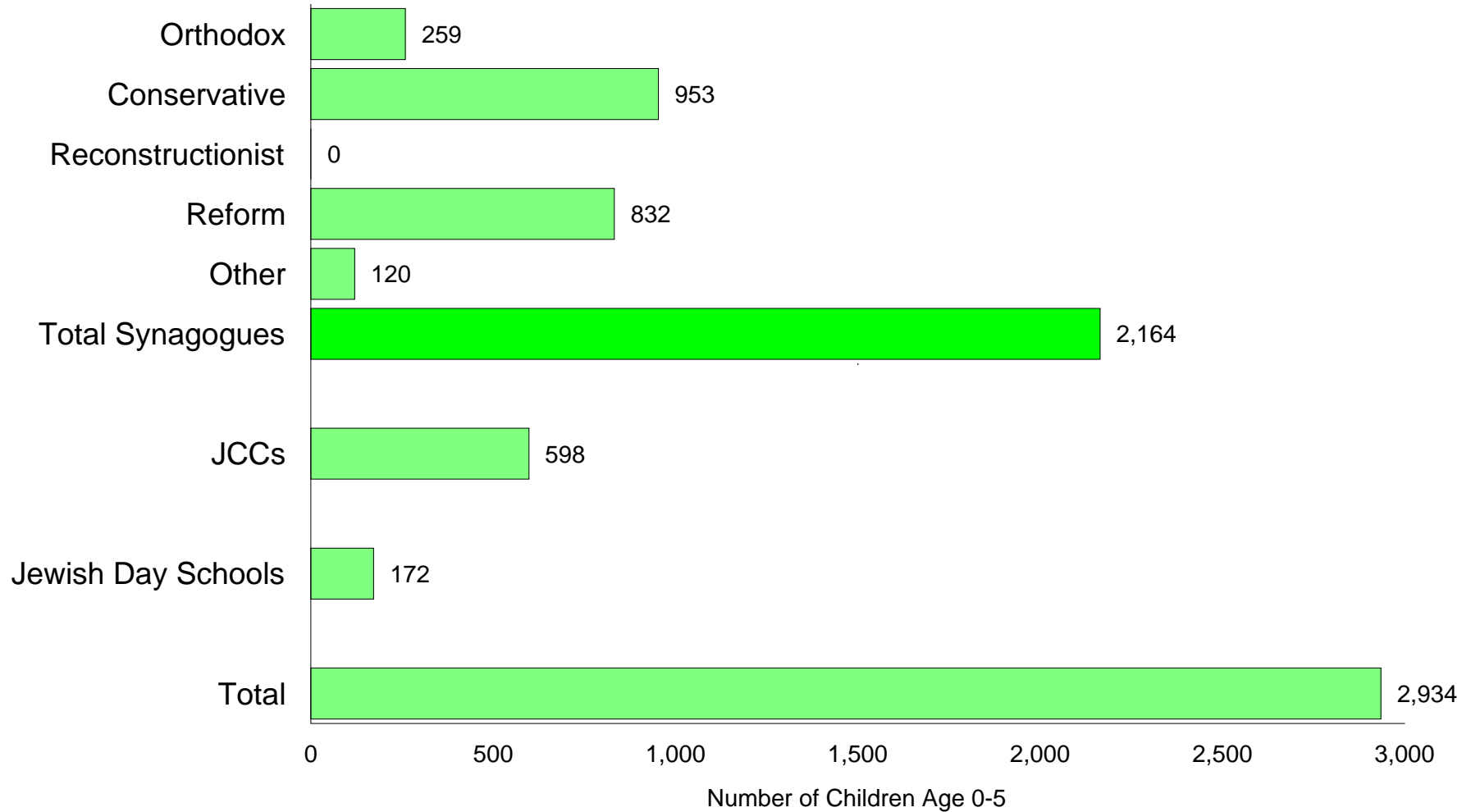

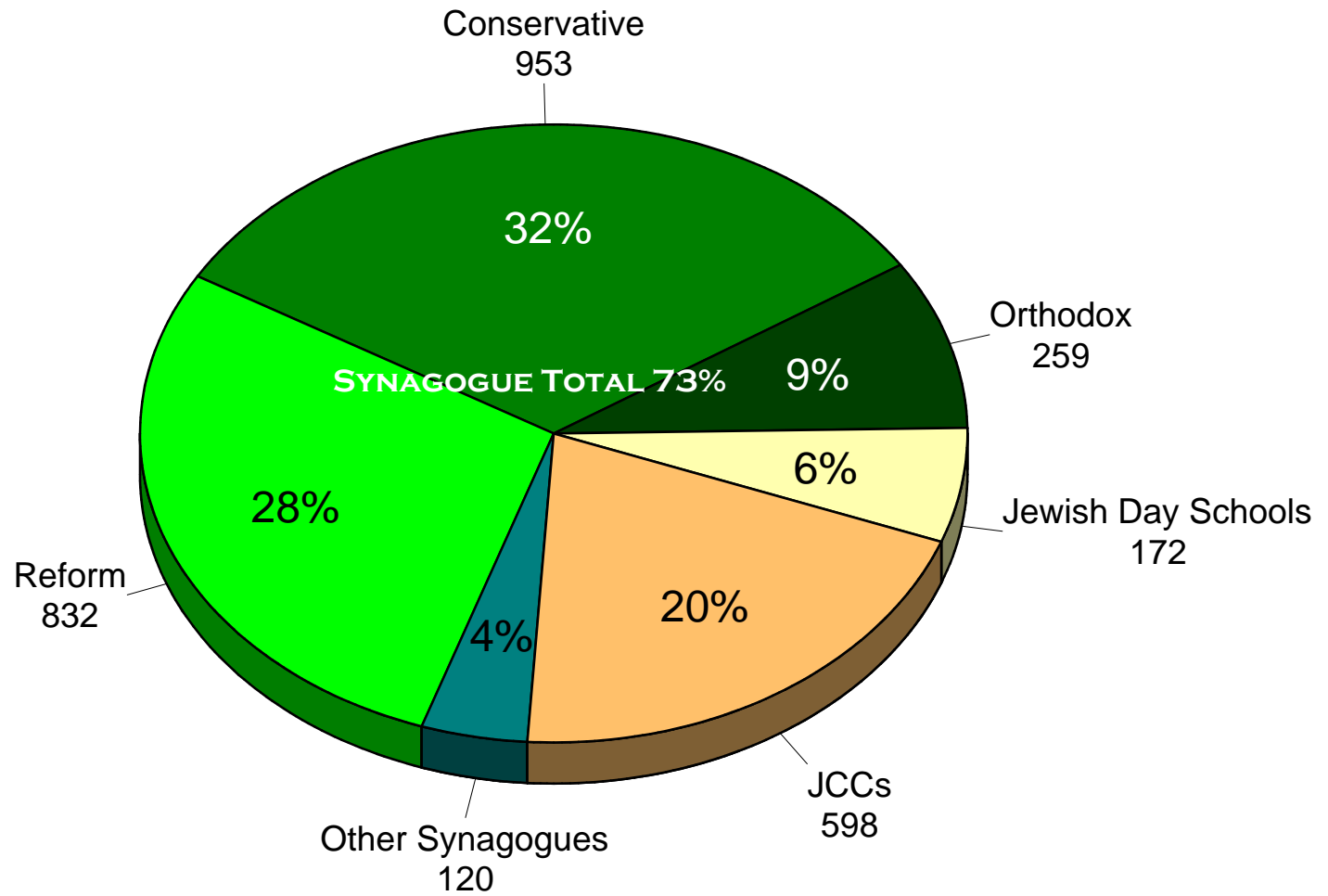
JEWISH CHILDREN WHO CURRENTLY ATTEND JEWISH PRESCHOOL/CHILD CARE, 2012

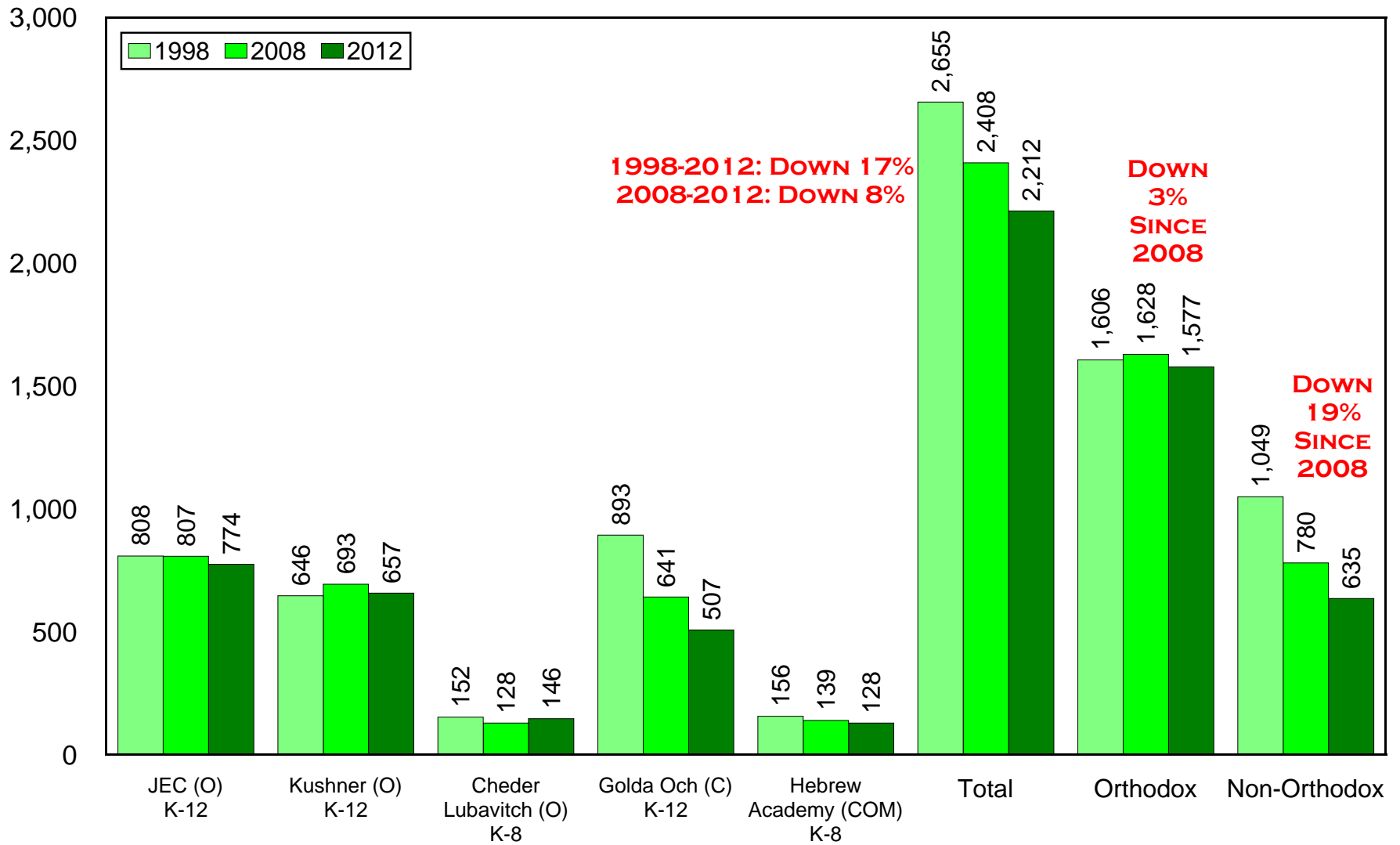

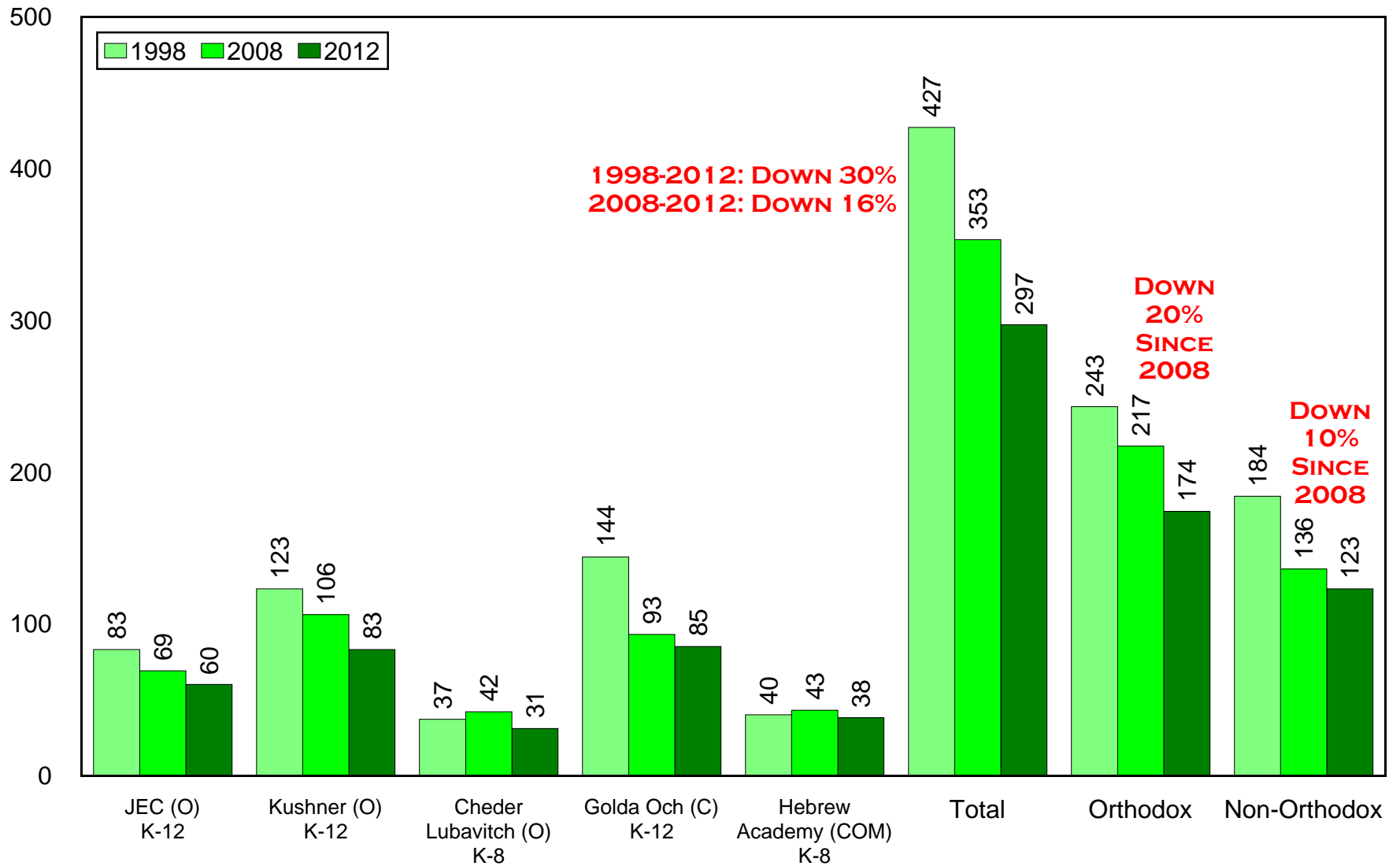

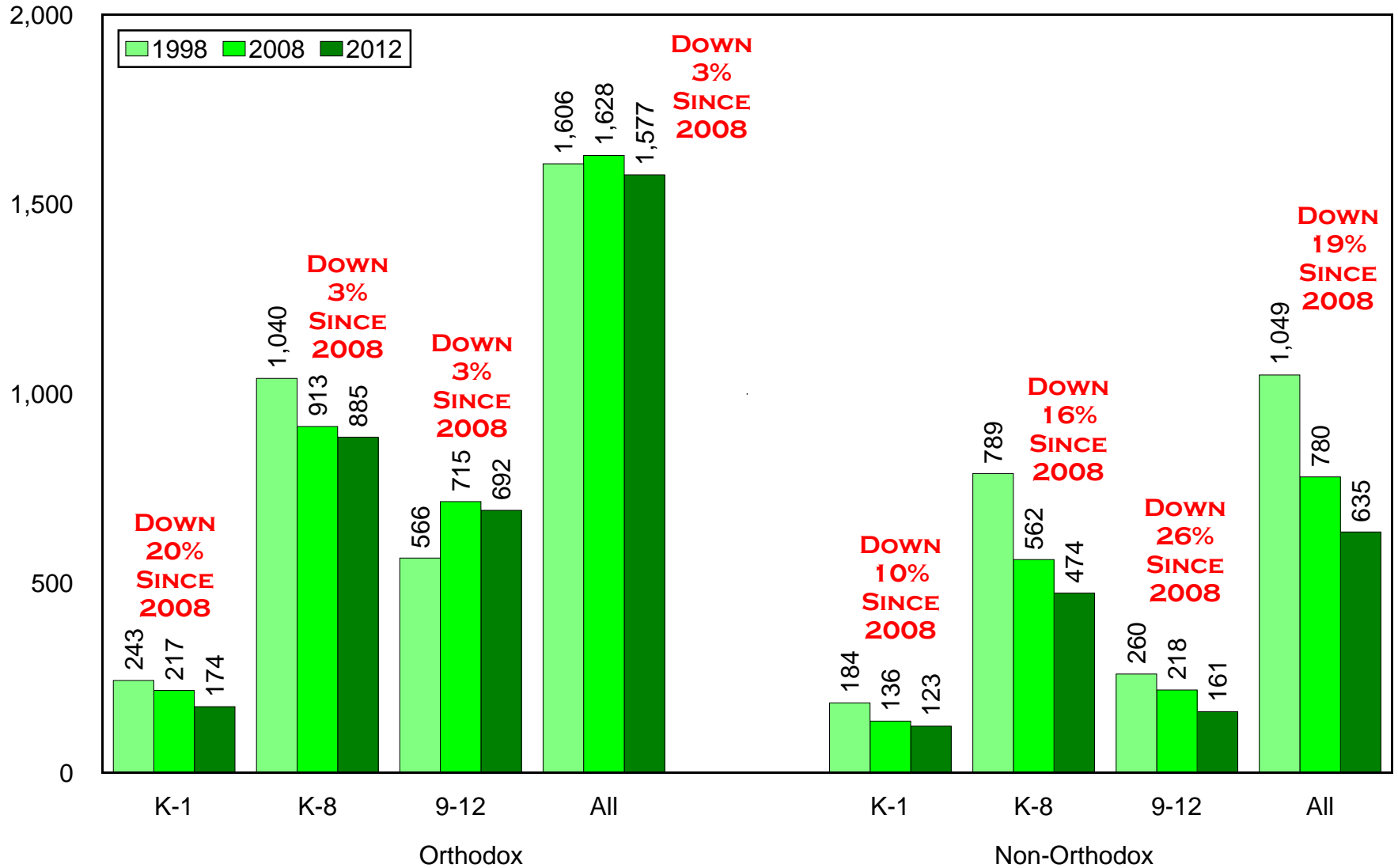

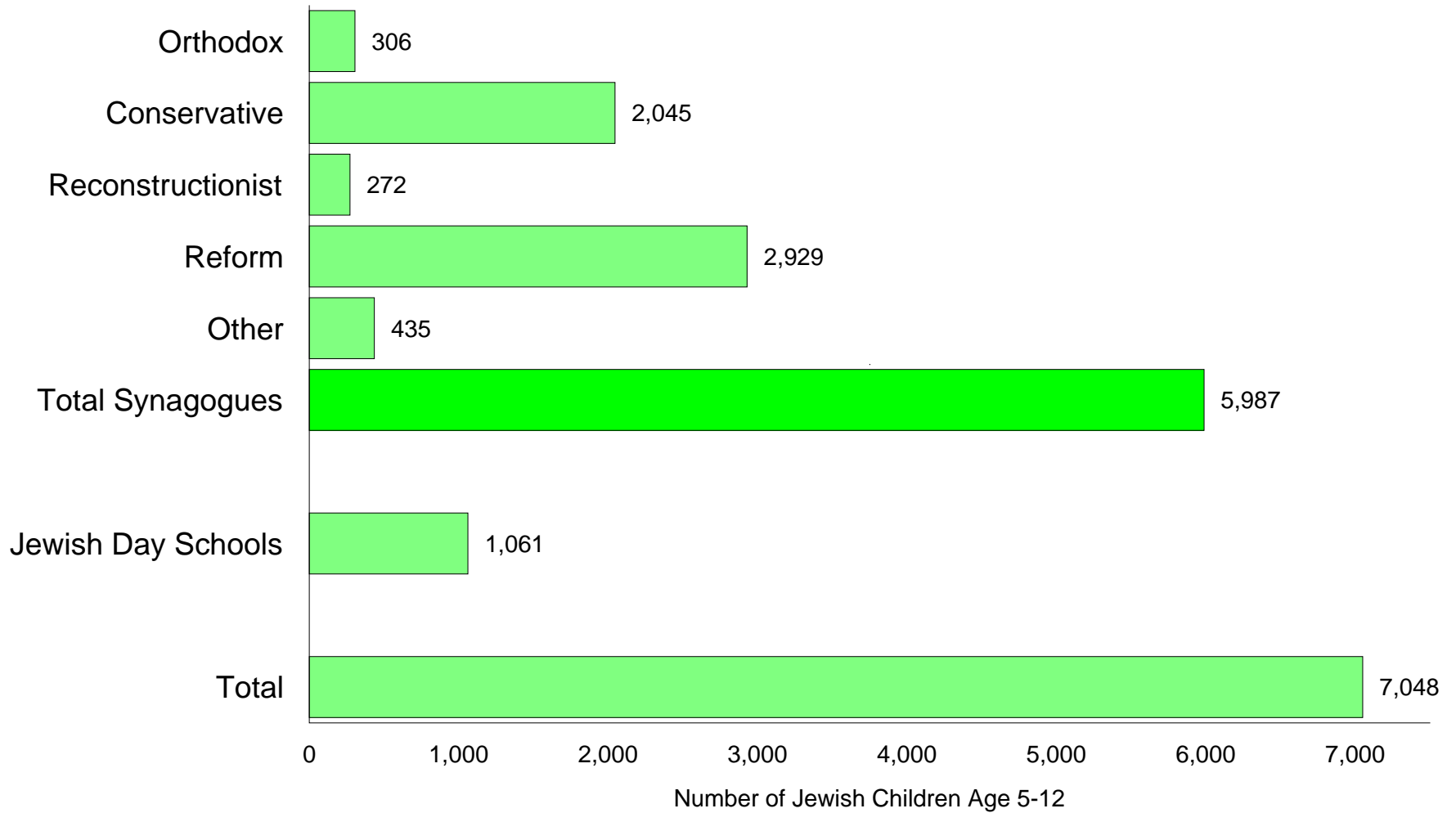

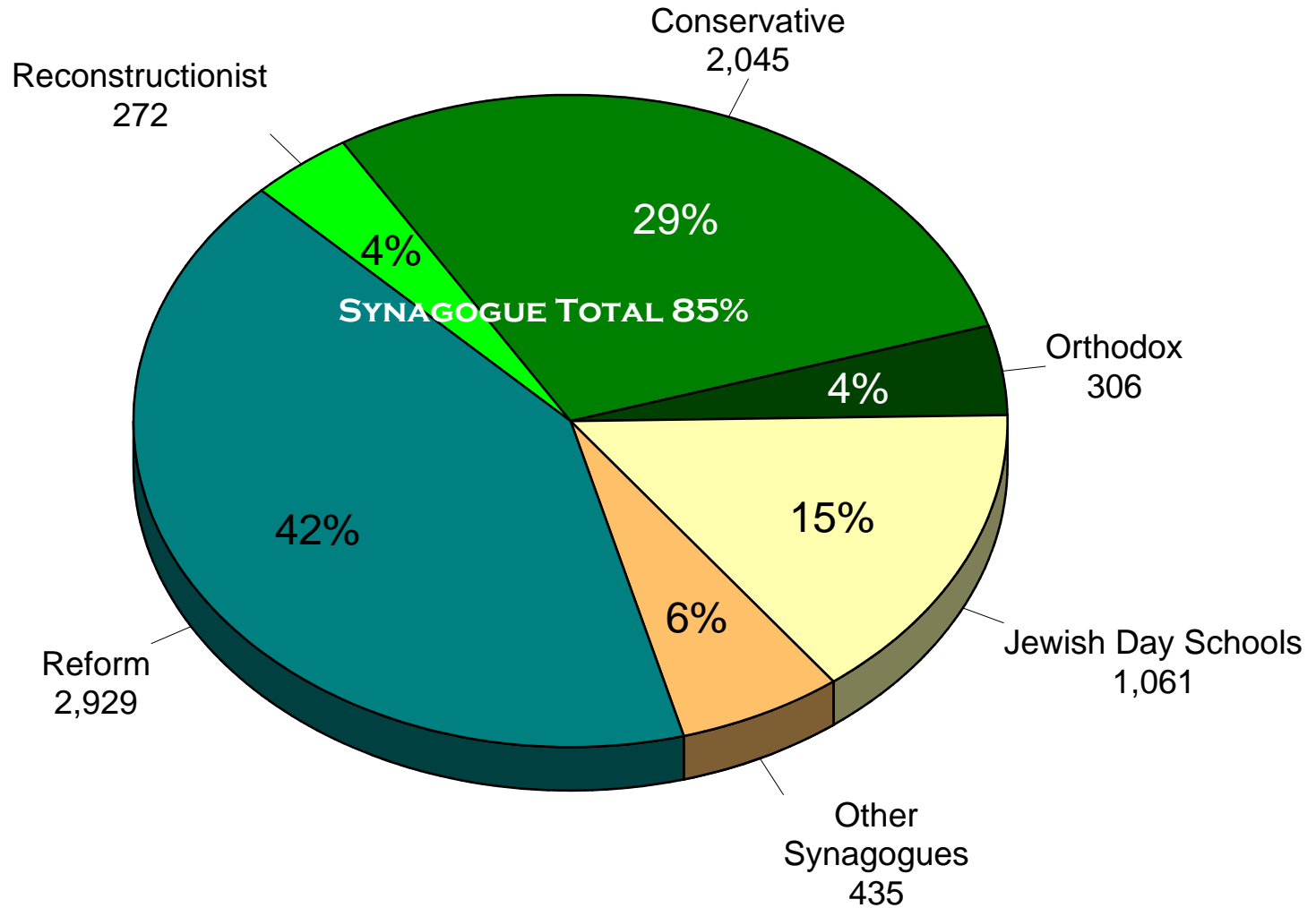

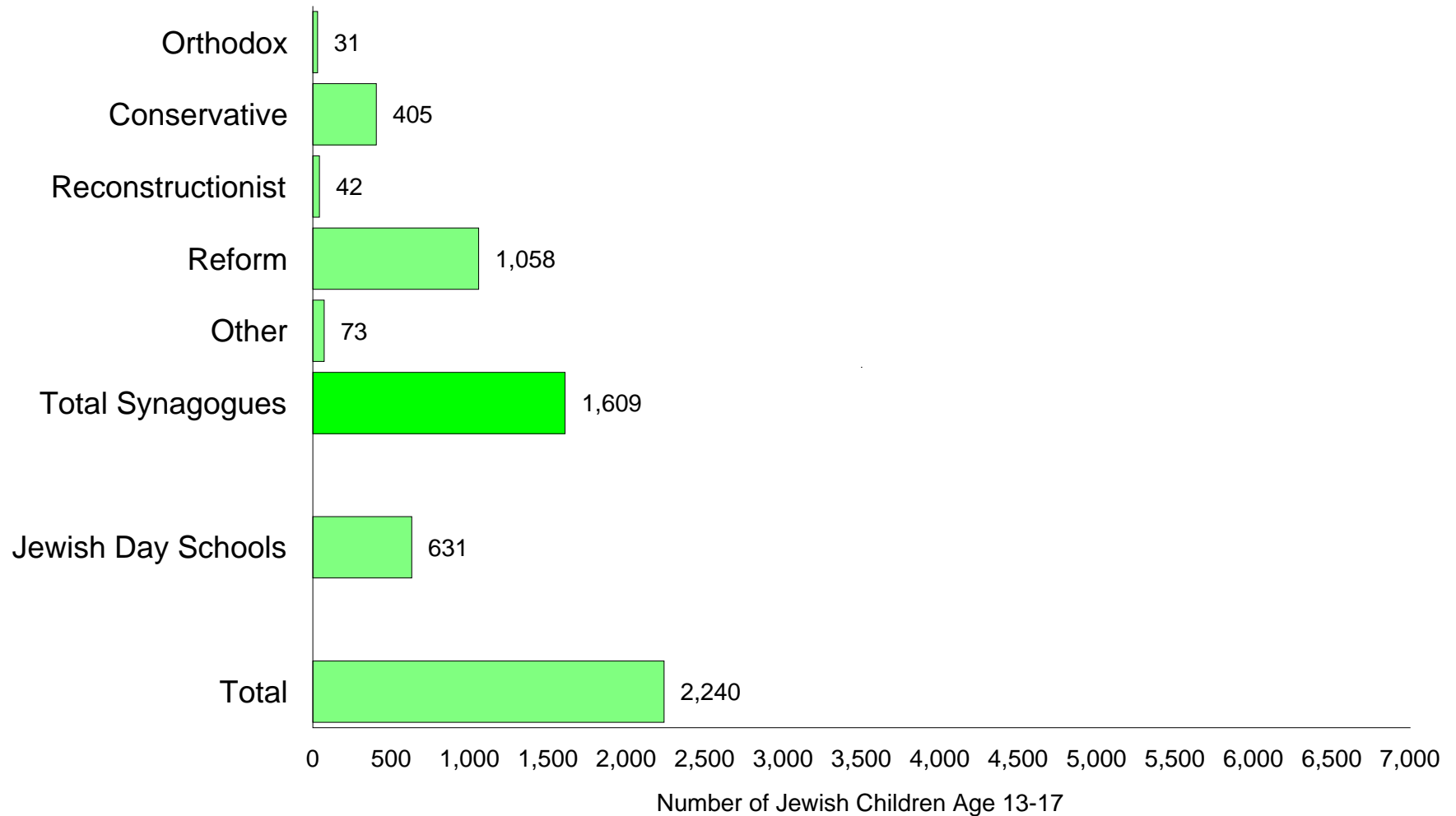

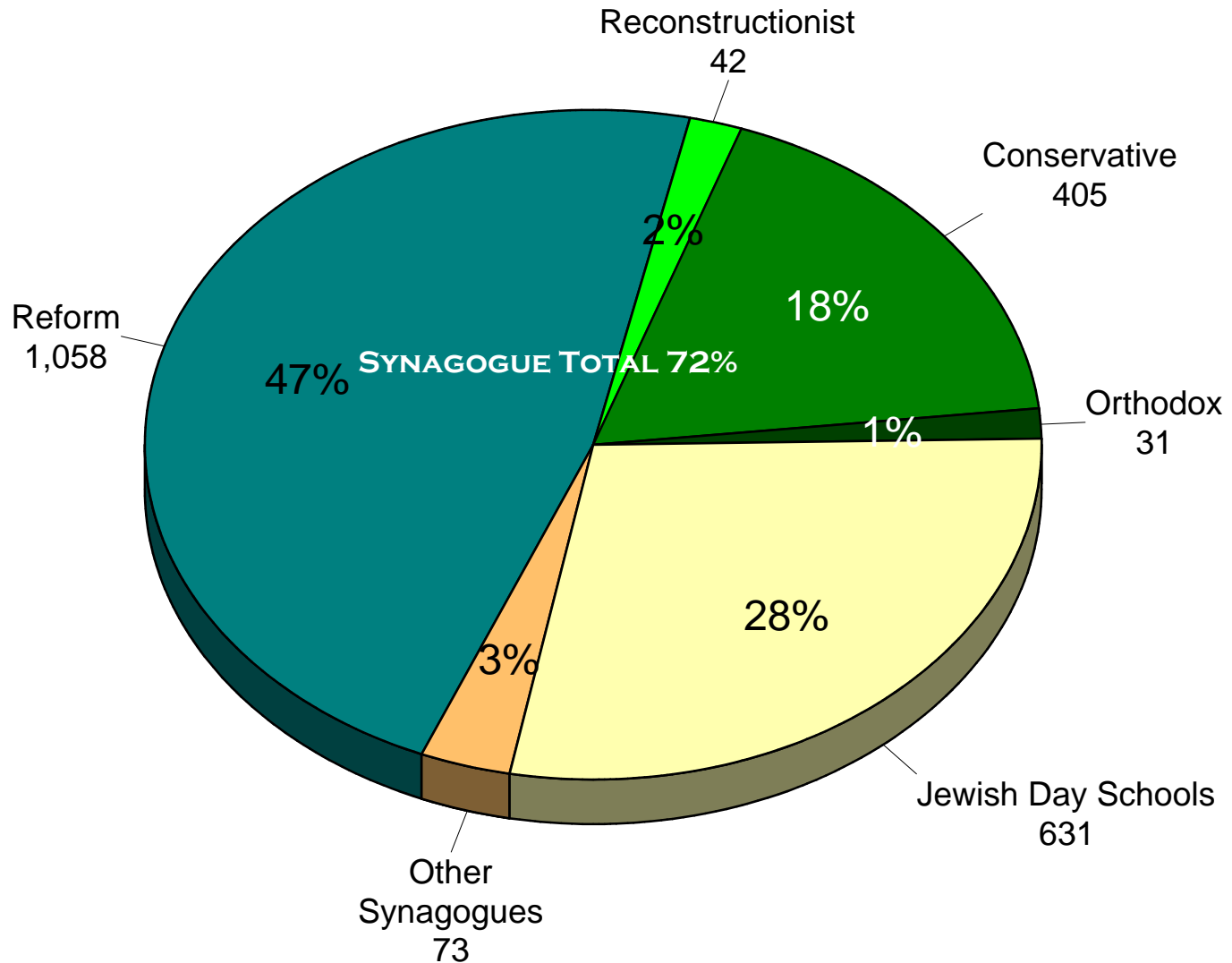
POST-B'NAI MITZVAH

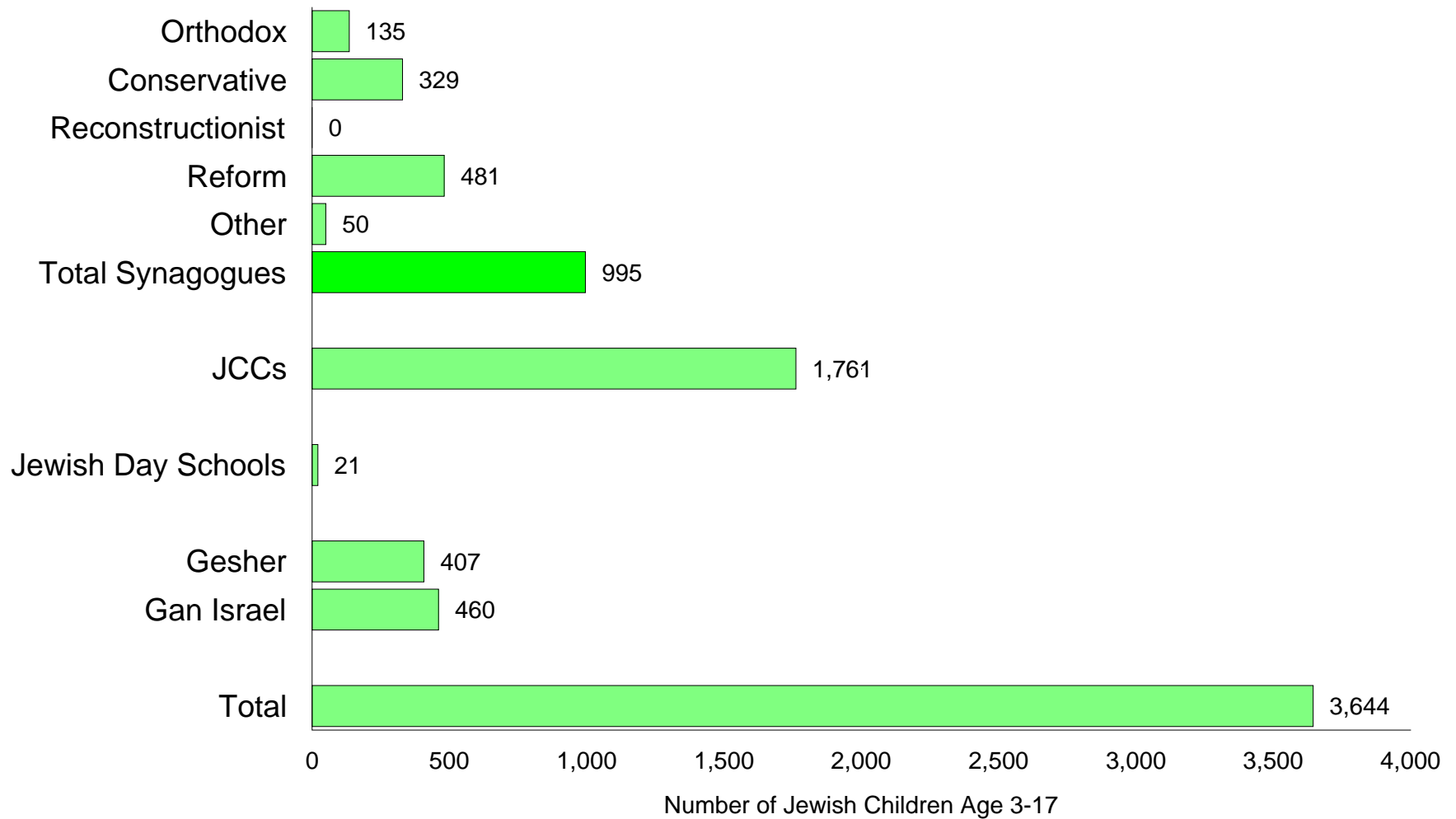

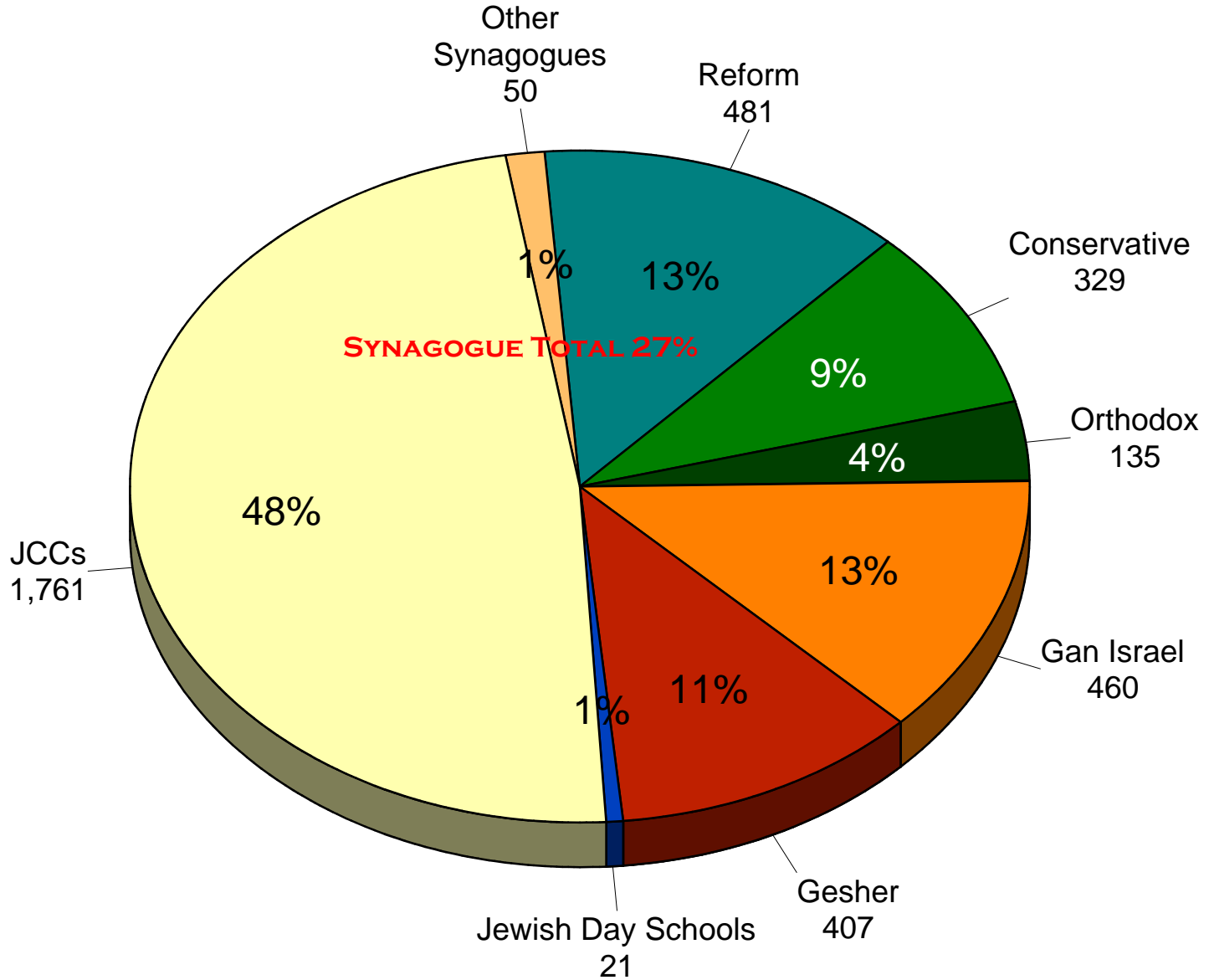

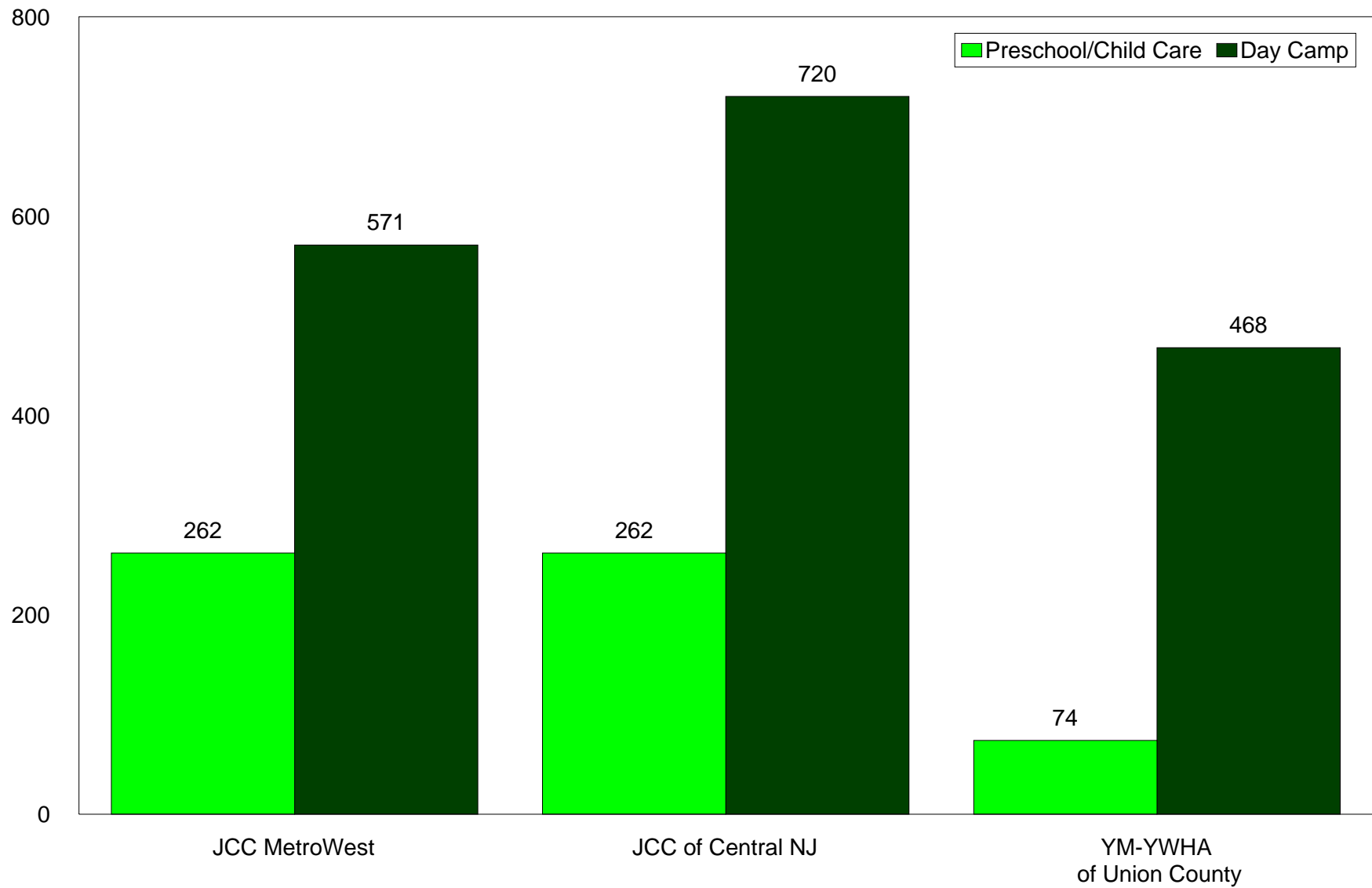
LOCATION OF JEWISH DAY CAMP 2012

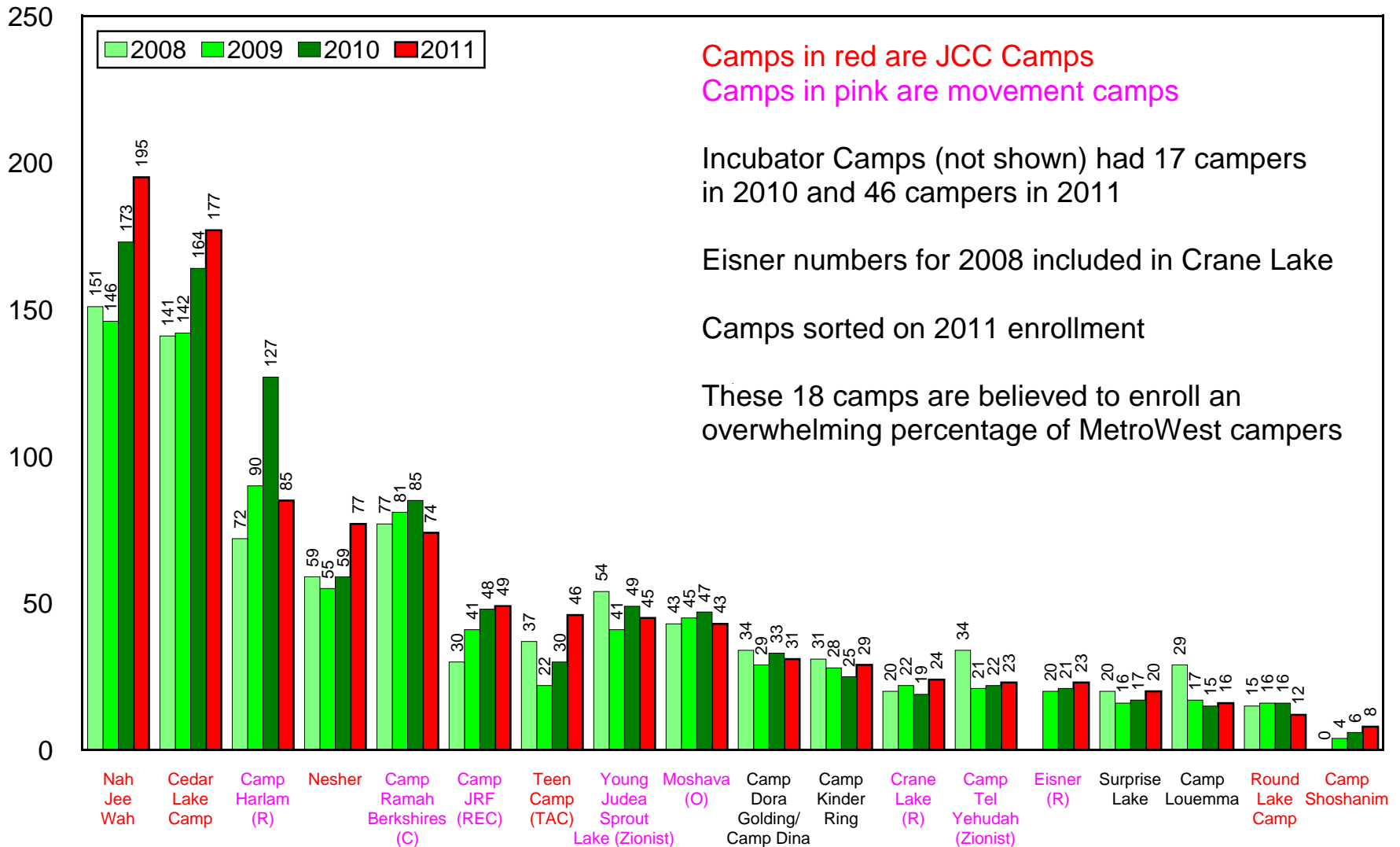

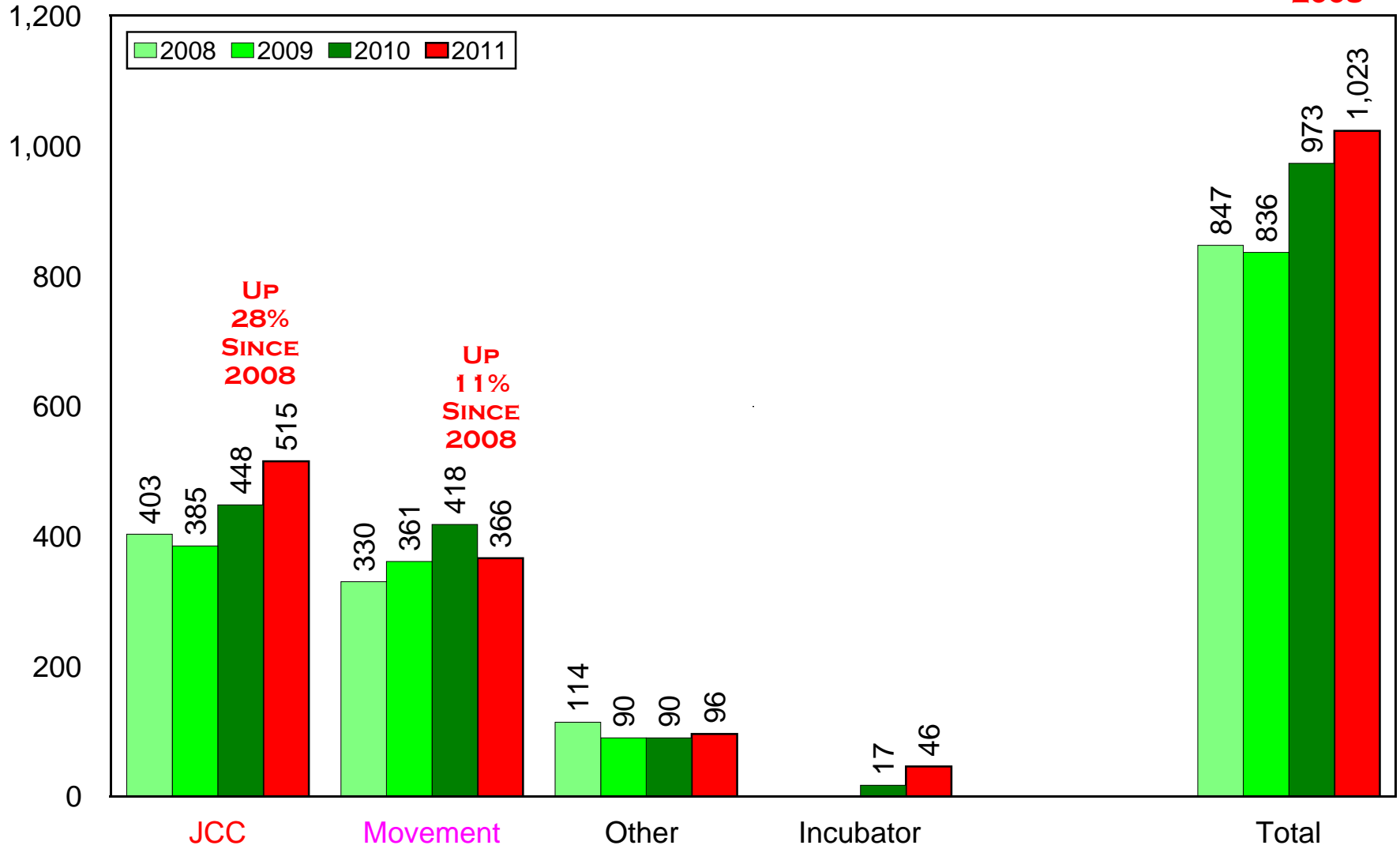

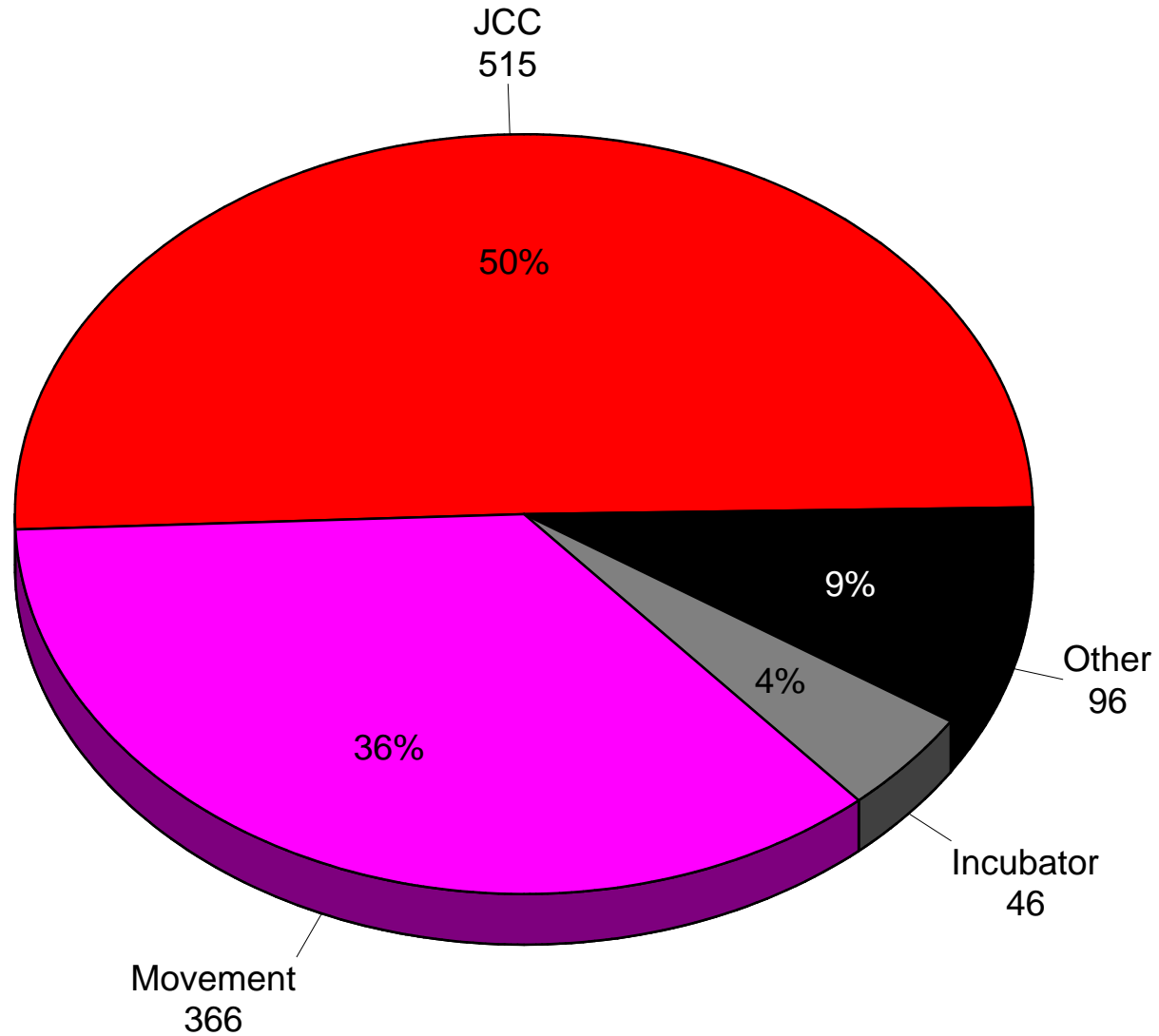

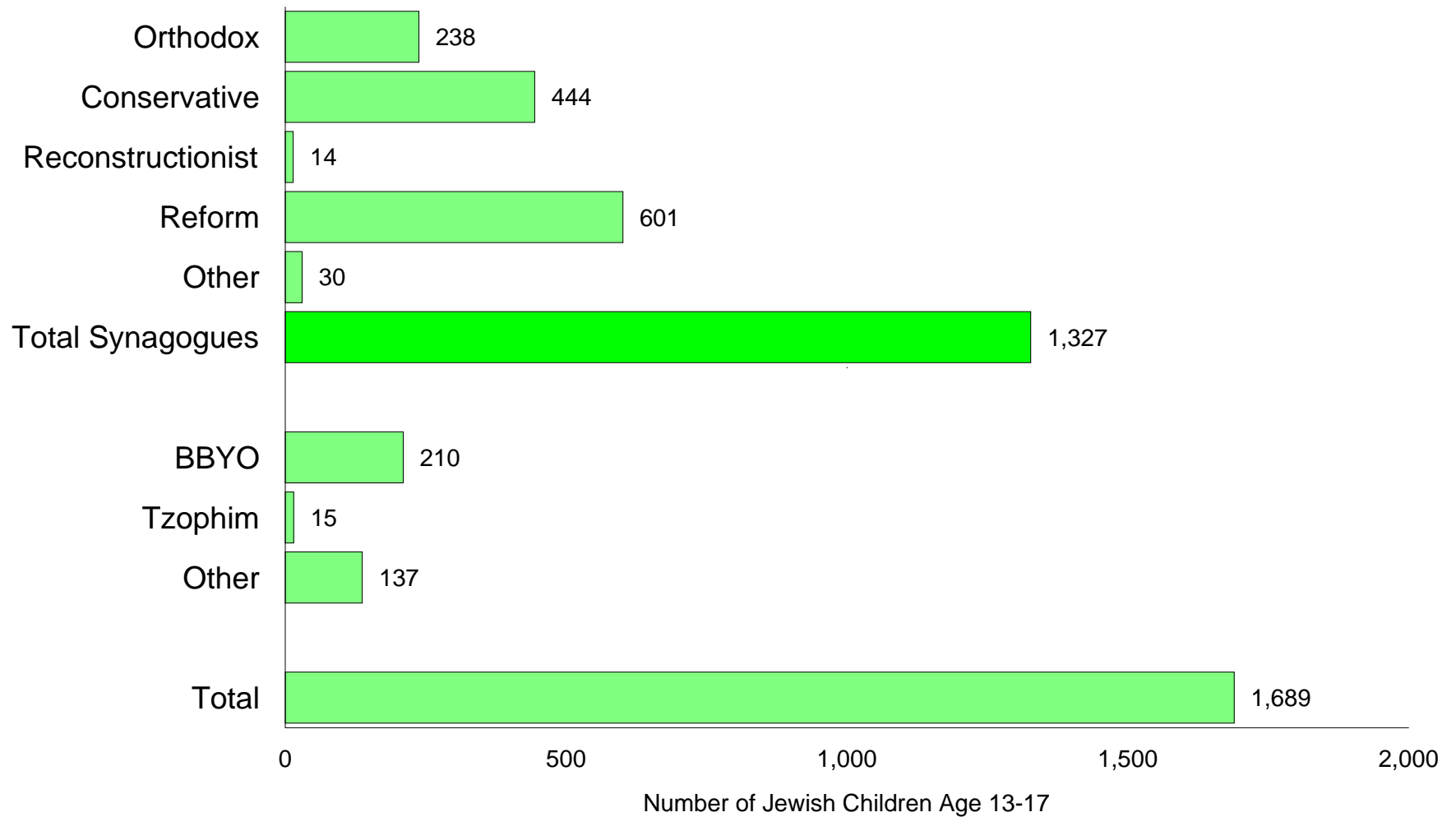

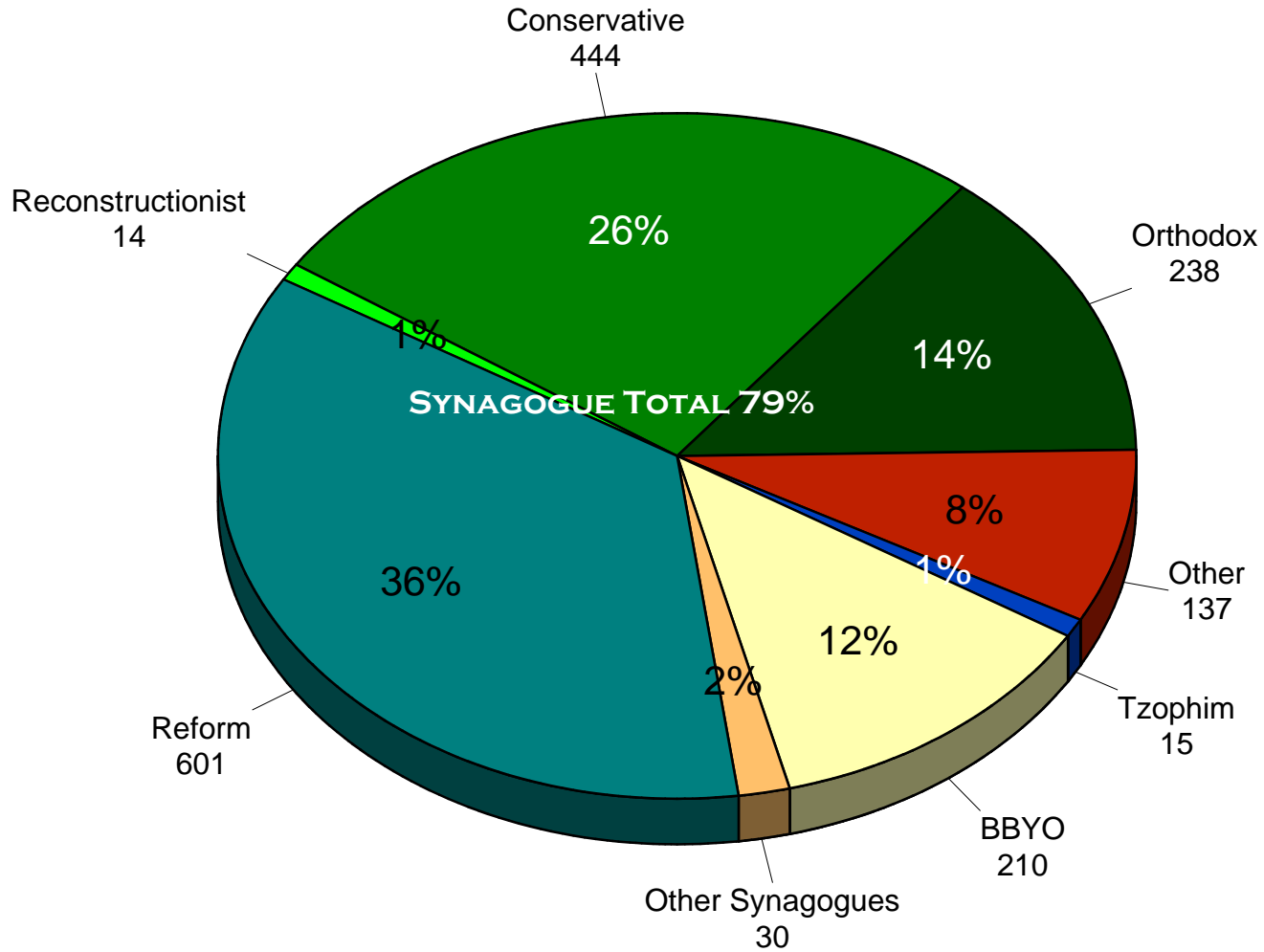
REGULAR PARTICIPANTS IN A JEWISH TEENAGE YOUTH GROUP 2012

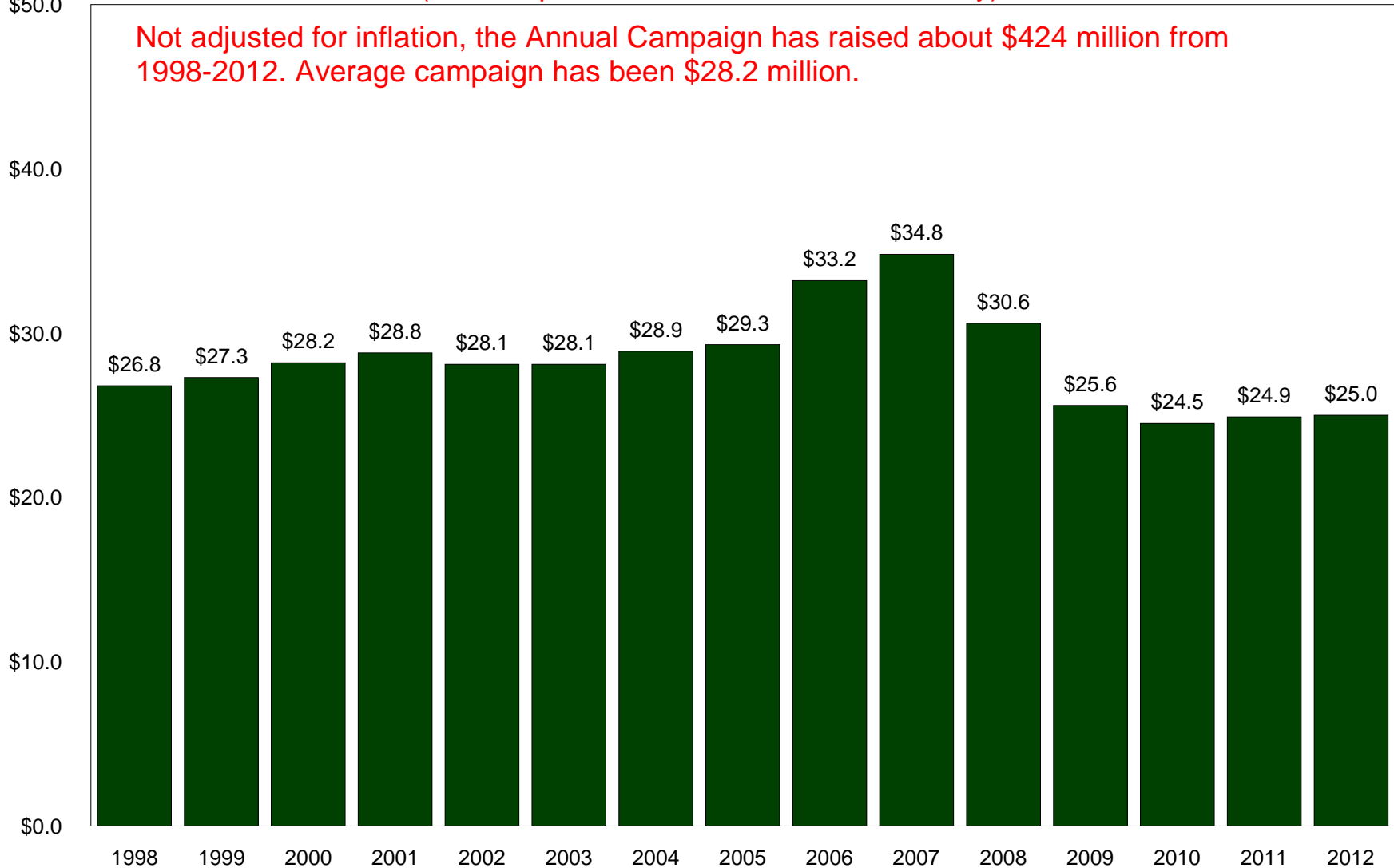
JFGMW ANNUAL CAMPAIGN

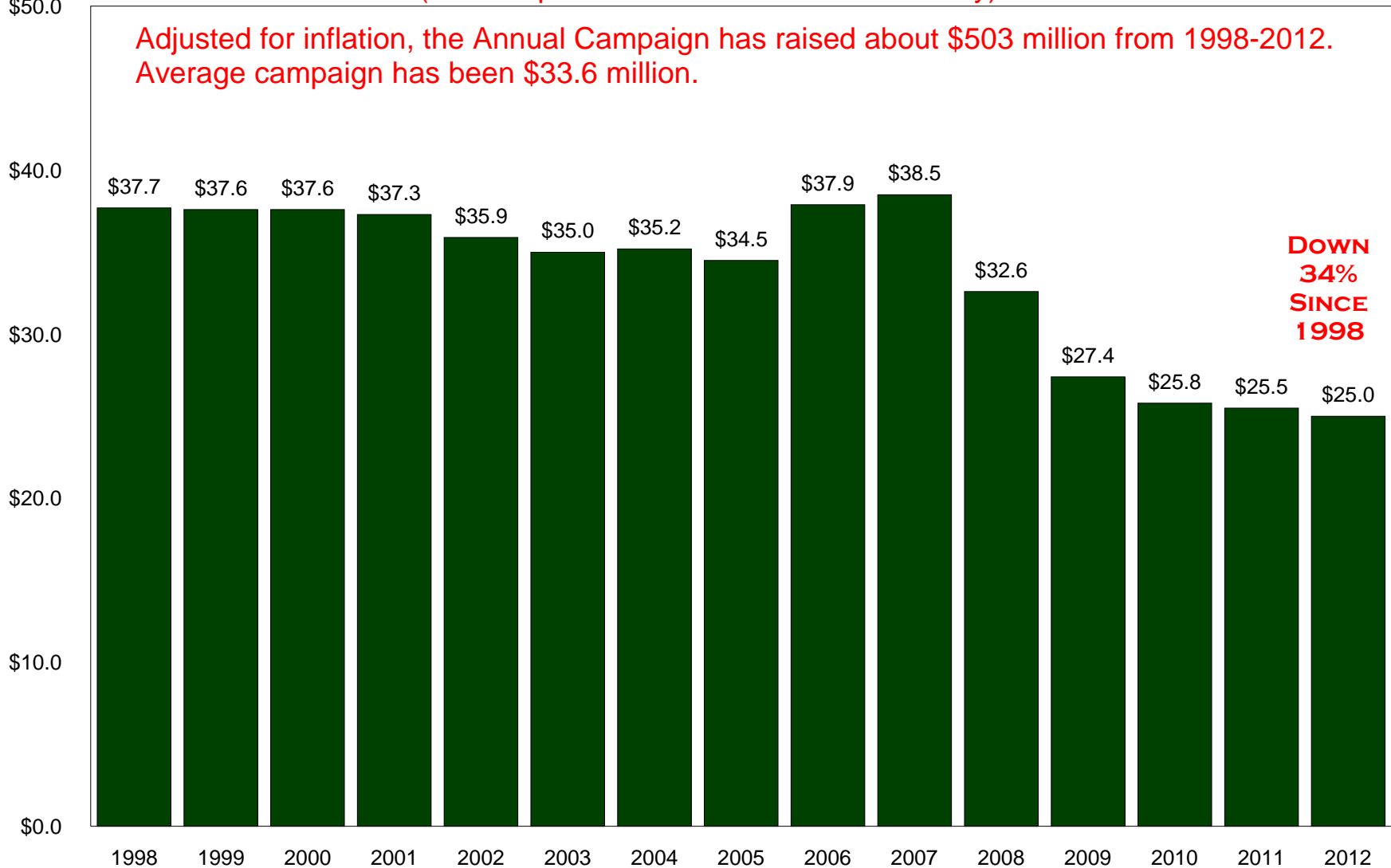


JFGMW ANNUAL CAMPAIGN

(Adjusted for Inflation to 2012 Dollars)

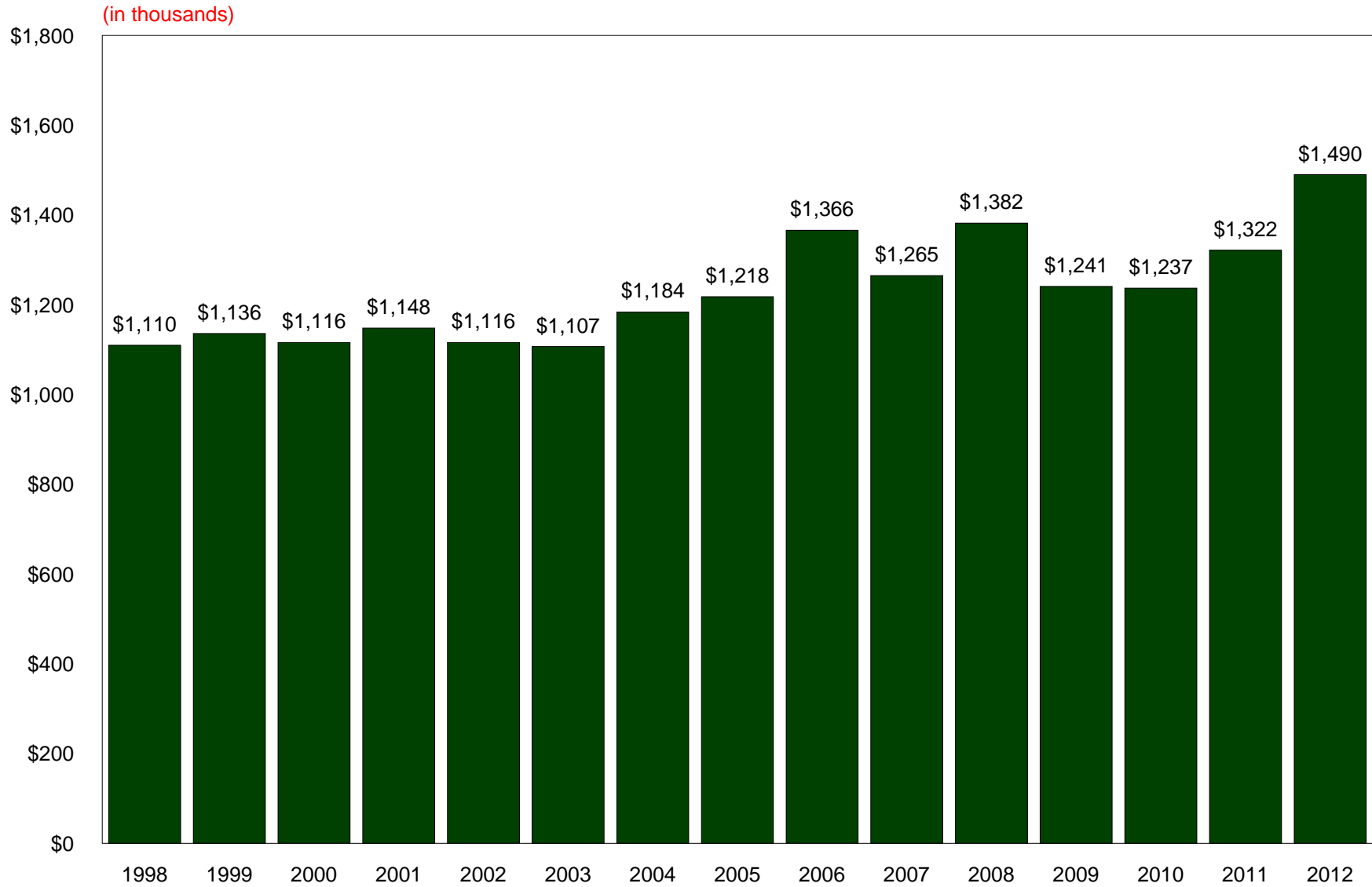

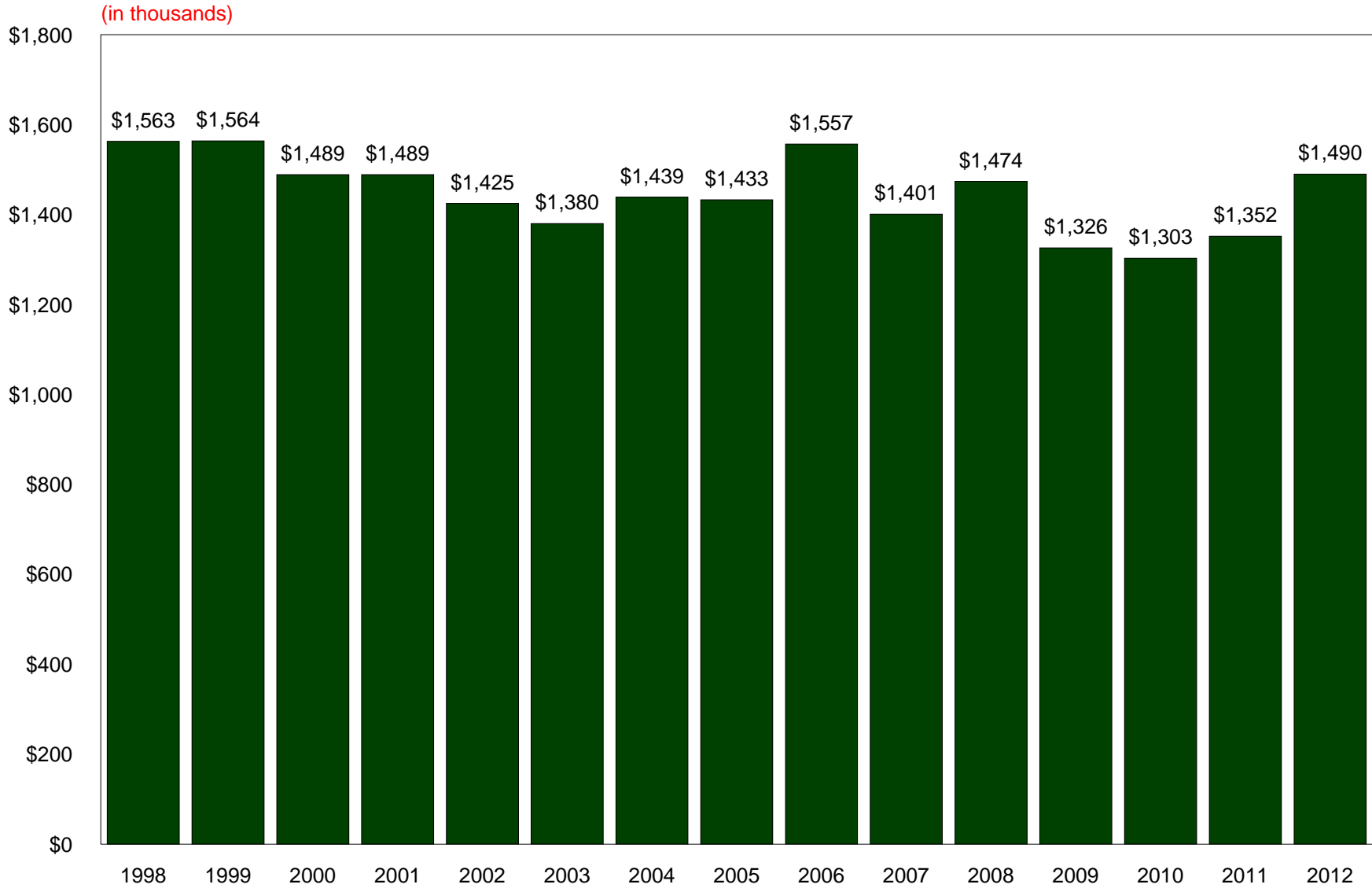
JFGMW AVERAGE DONATION

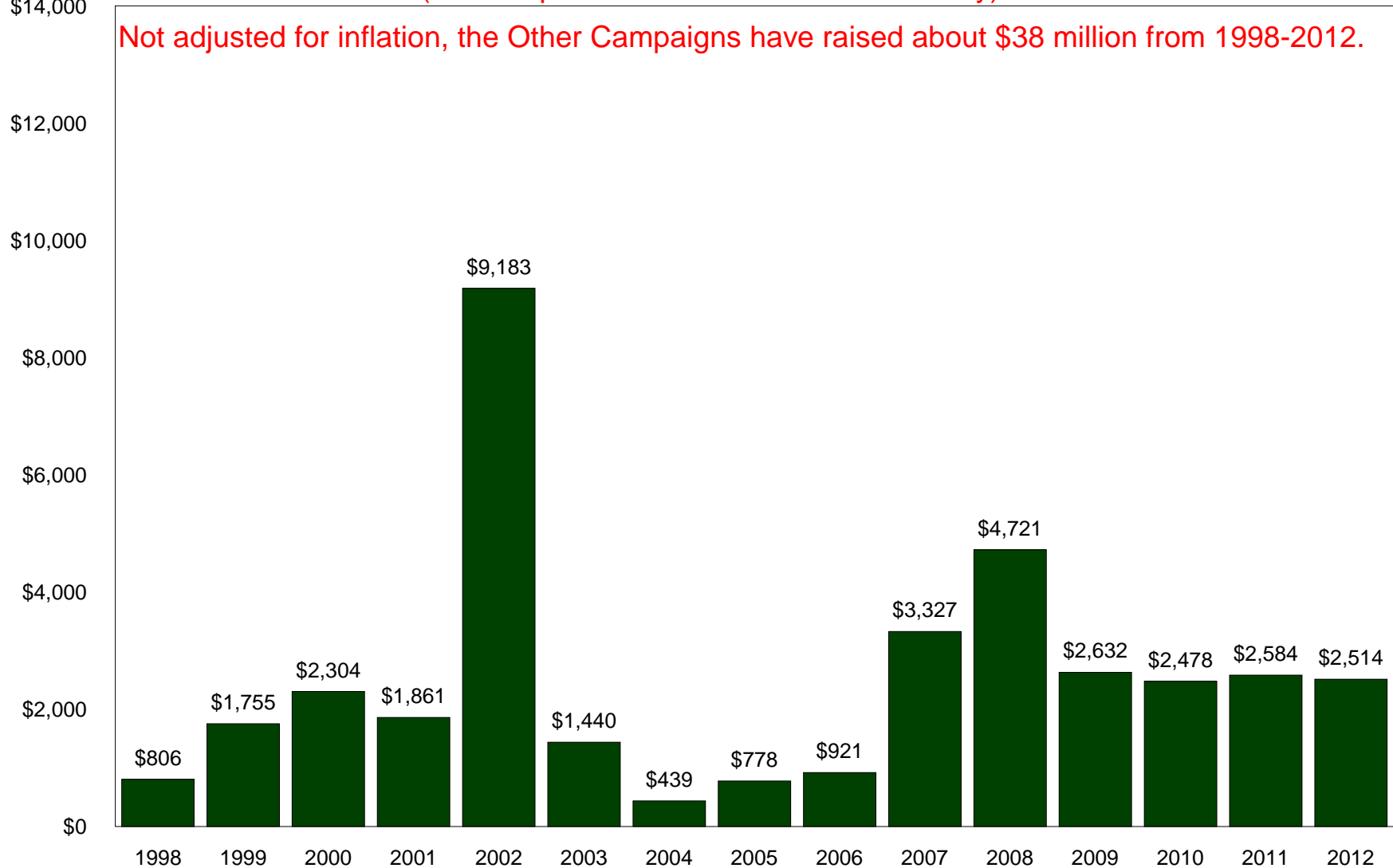

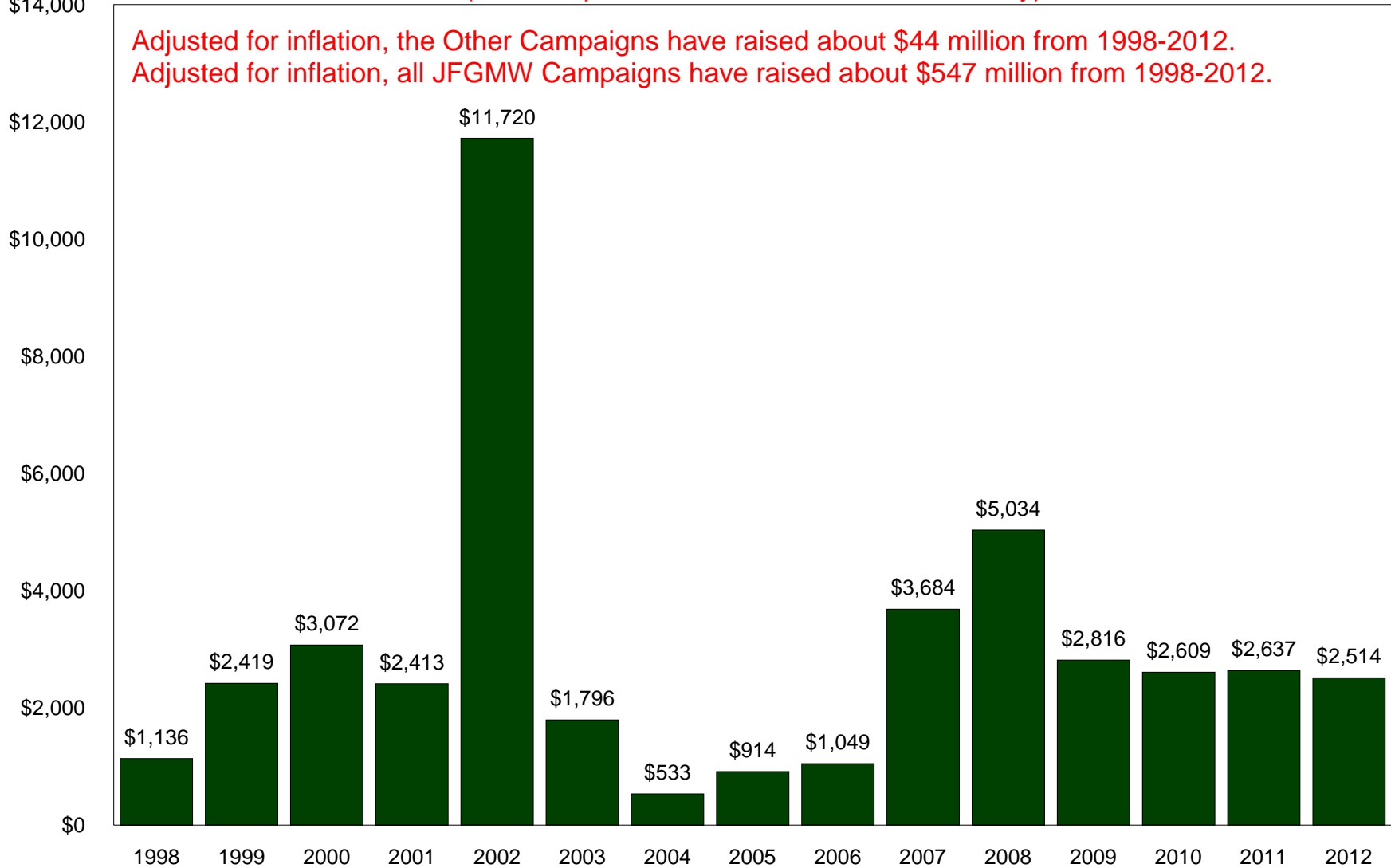

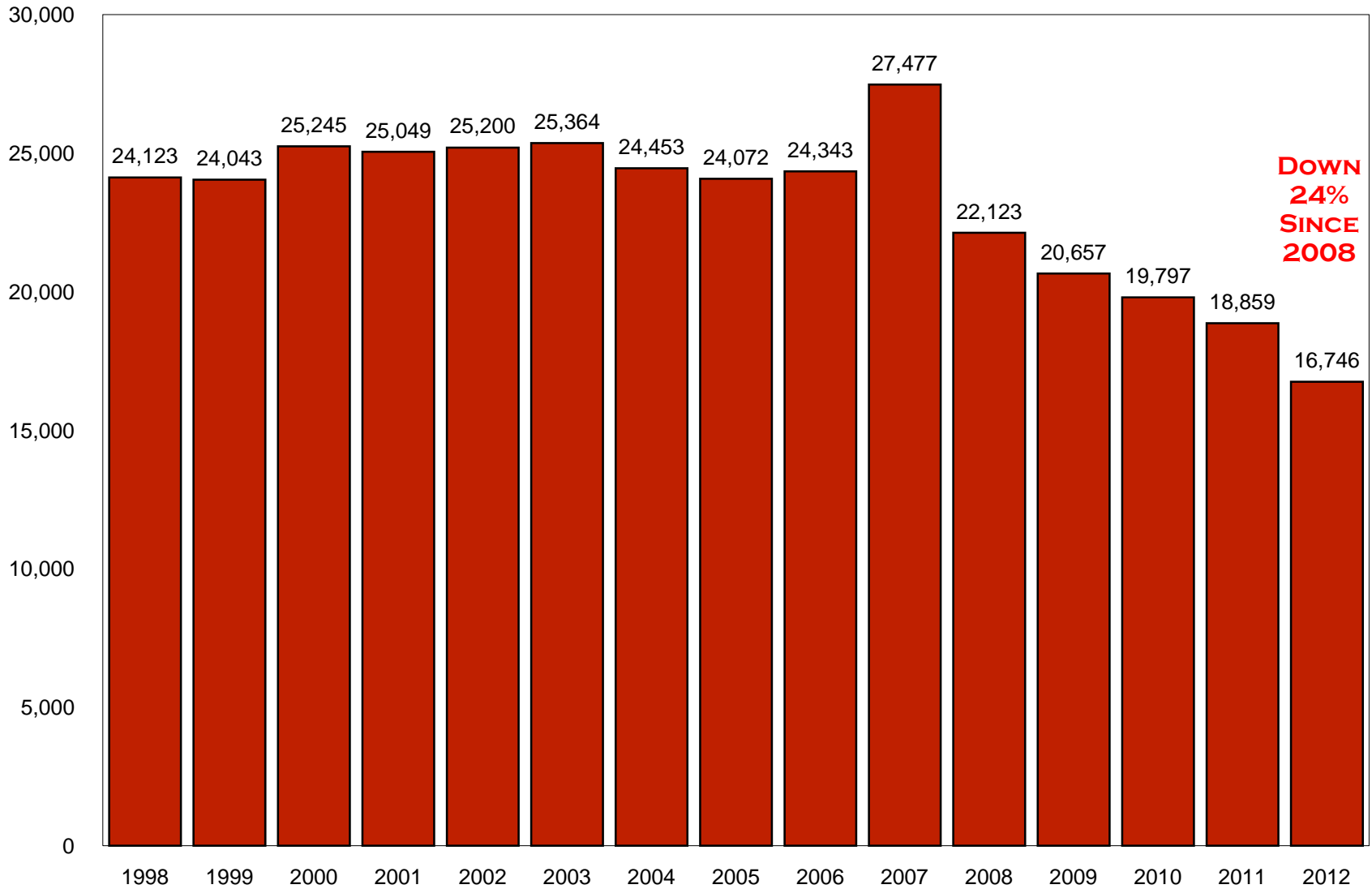

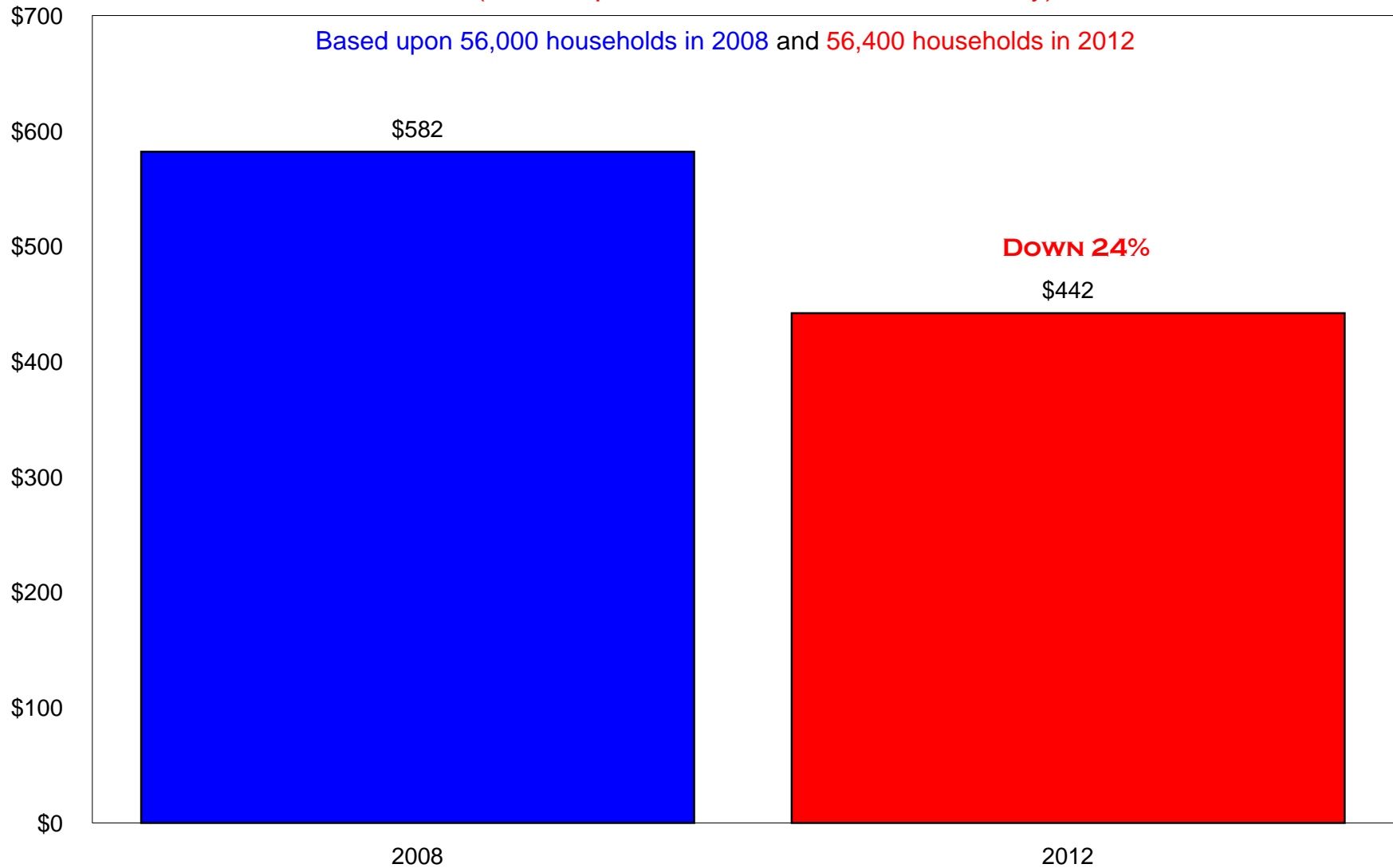
NUMBER OF DONATIONS TO THE JFGMW ANNUAL CAMPAIGN

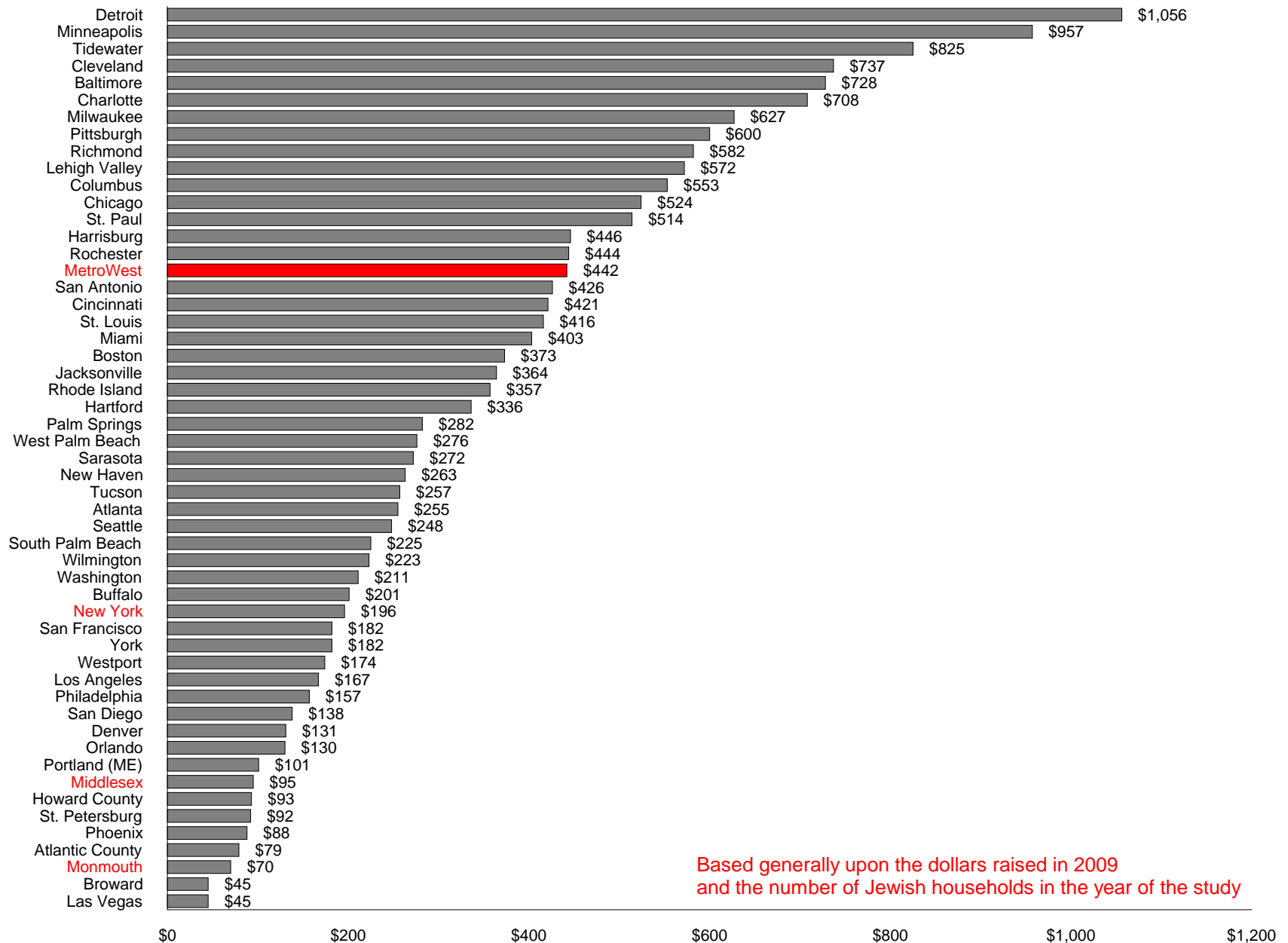


AVERAGE DONATION TO JFGMW PER JEWISH HOUSEHOLD

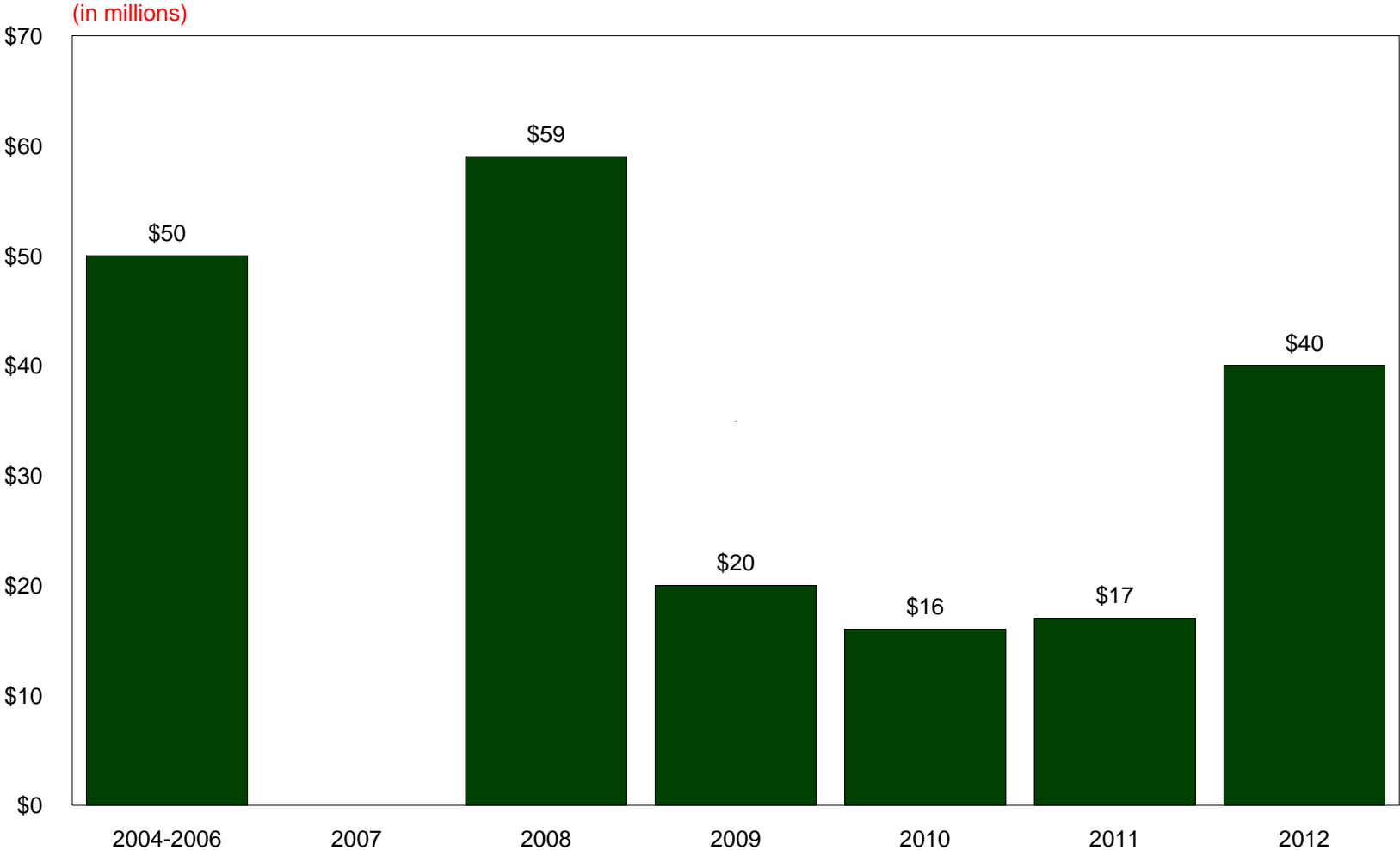

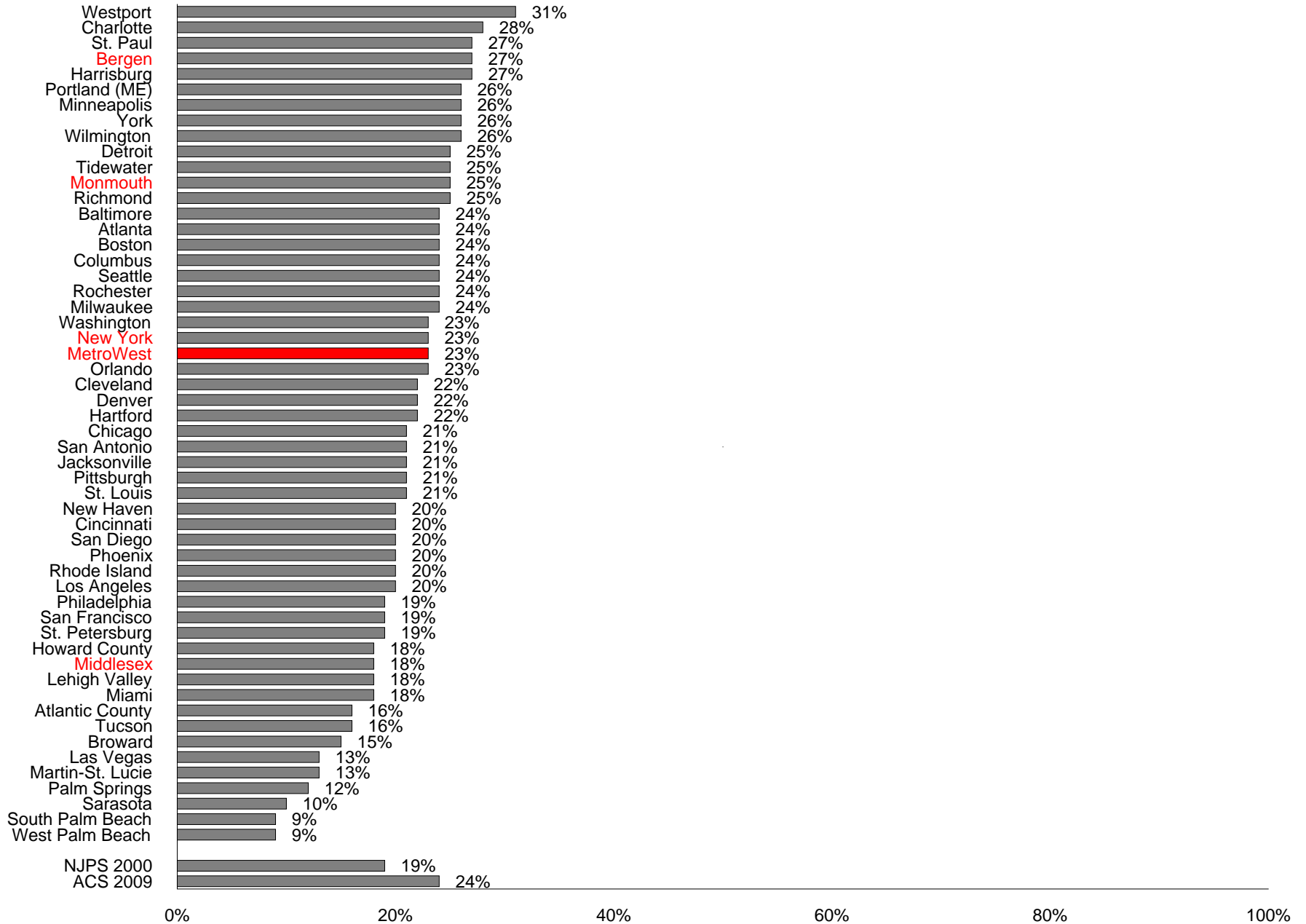

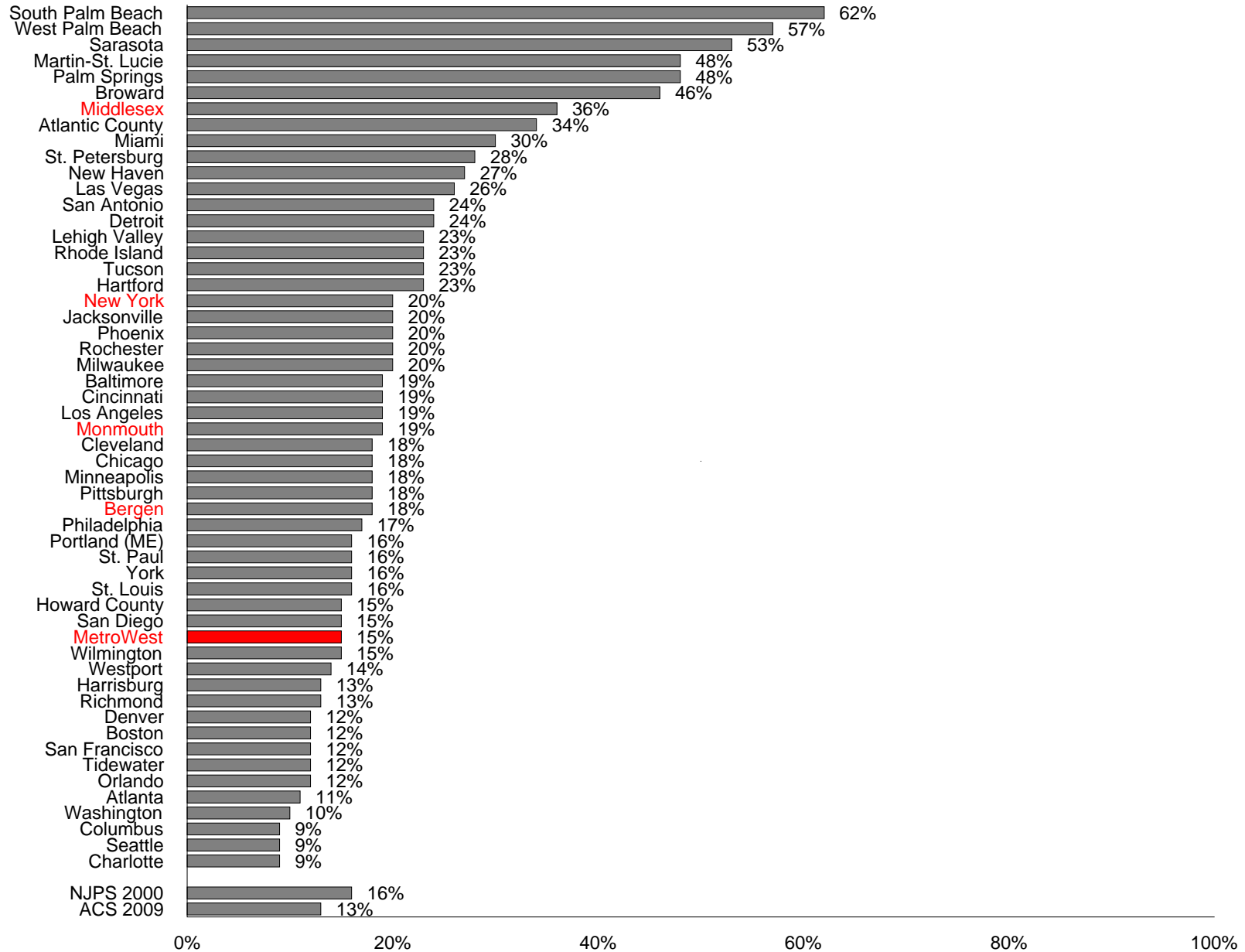

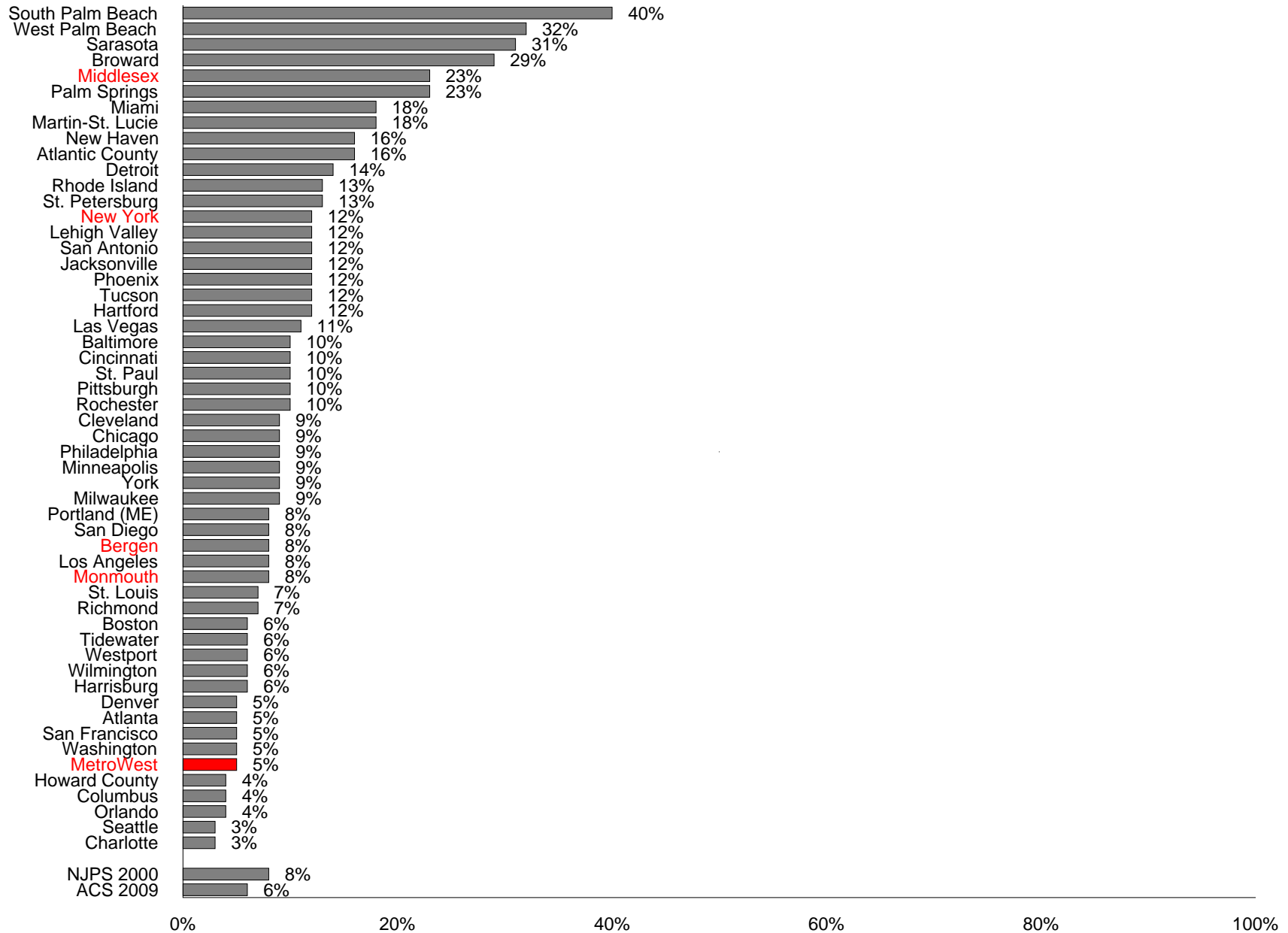

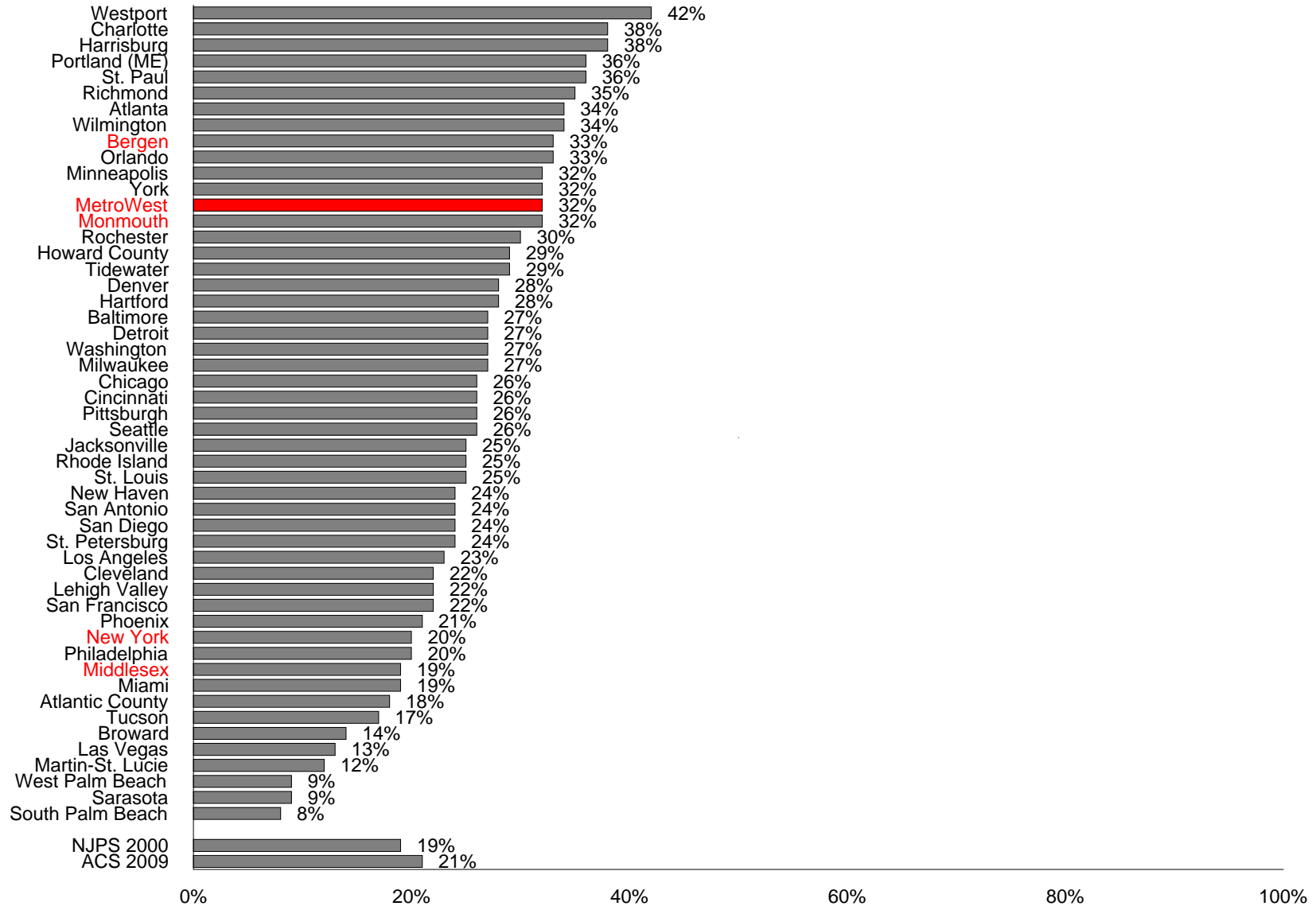

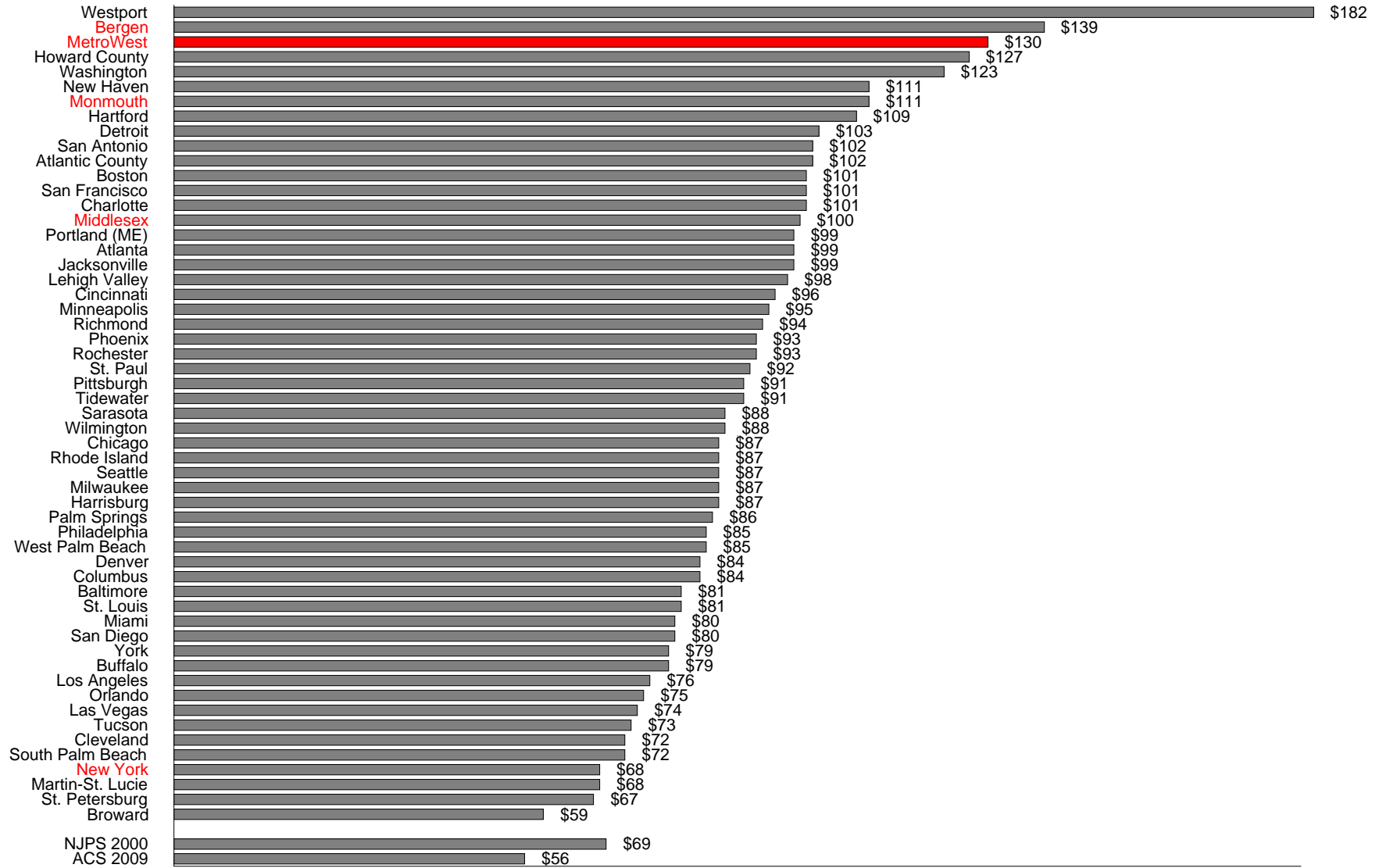
MARRIED HOUSEHOLDS WITH CHILDREN AGE 0-17 AT HOME (Jewish Households)

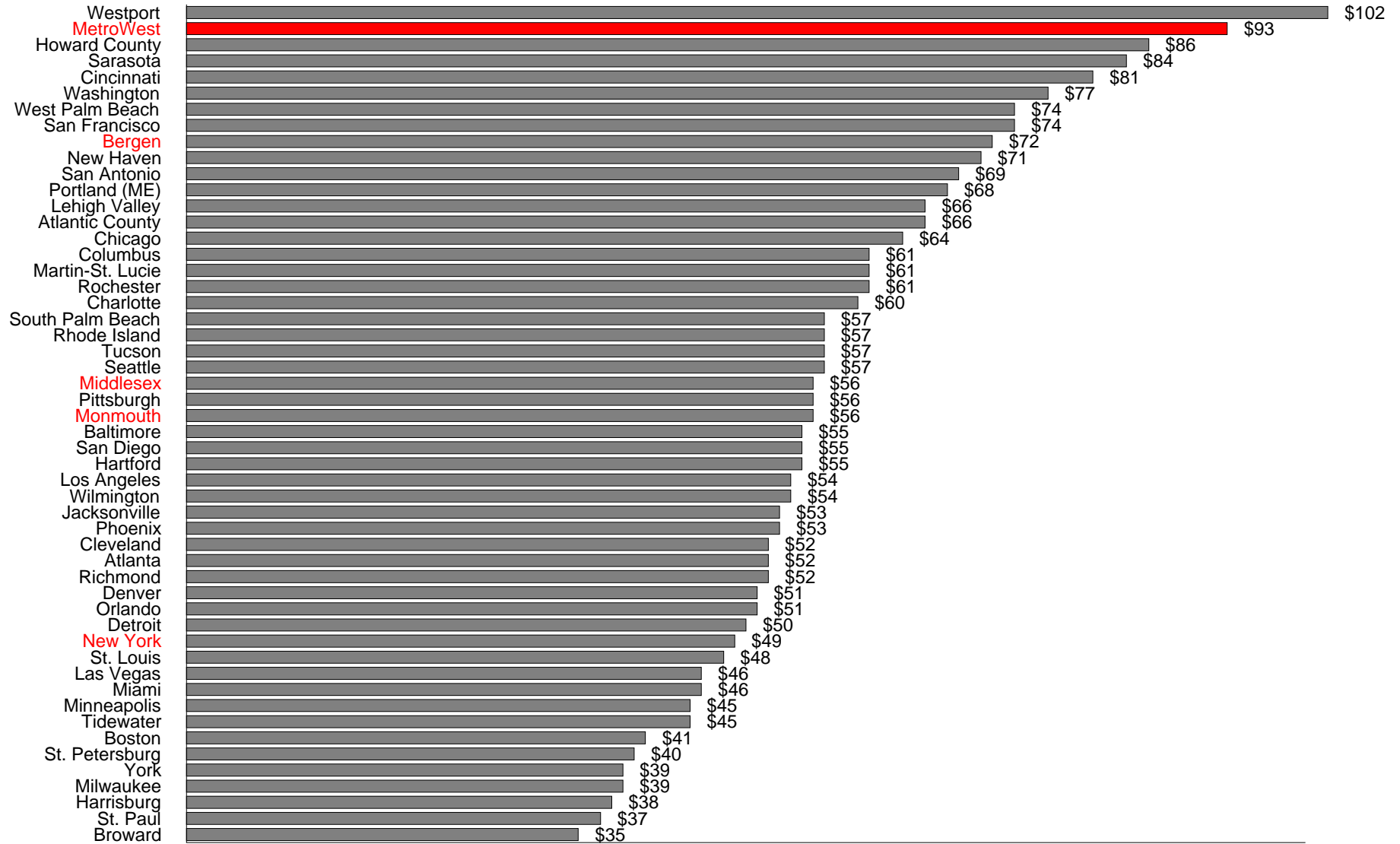

(Jewish Households with Persons Age 65 and Over)

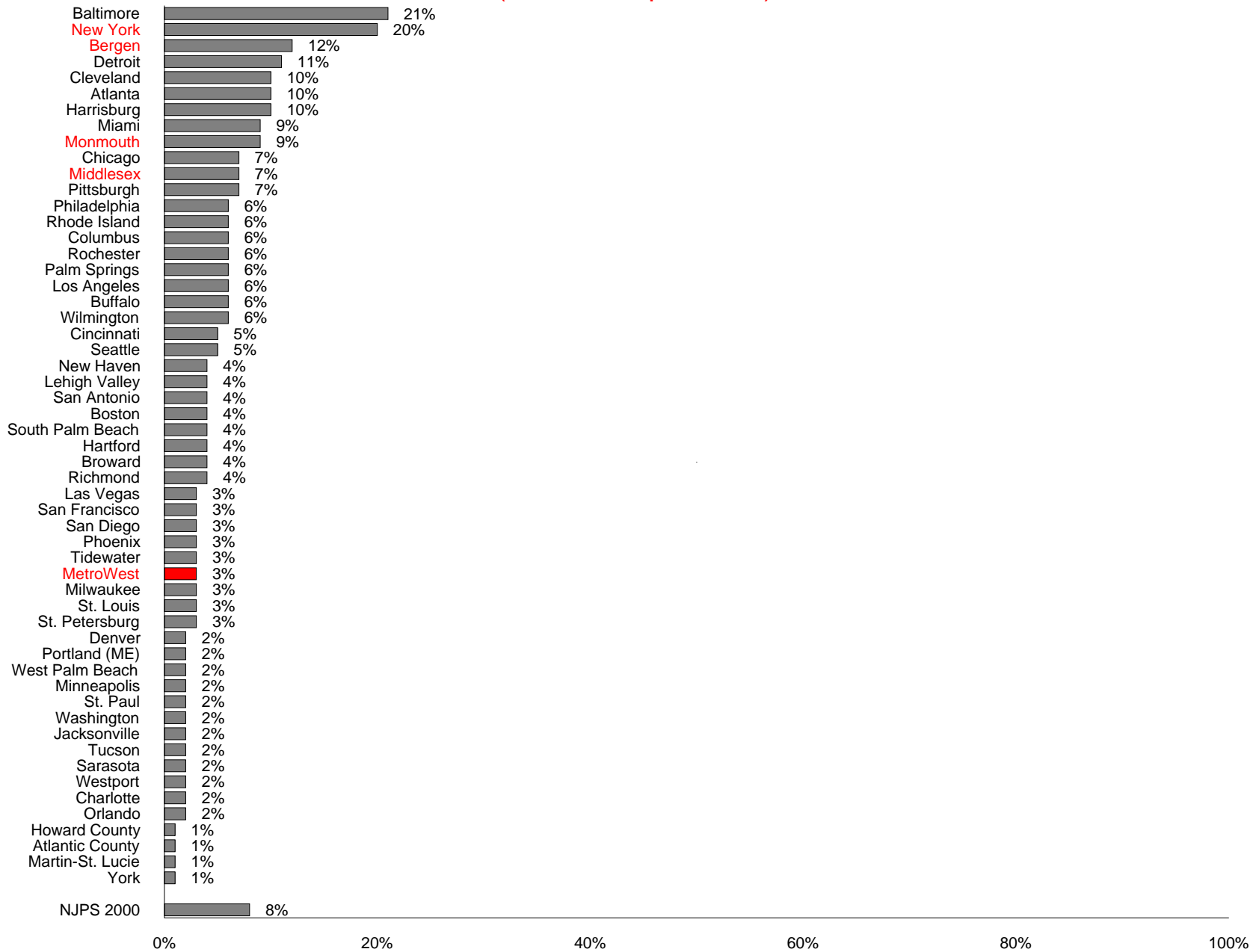

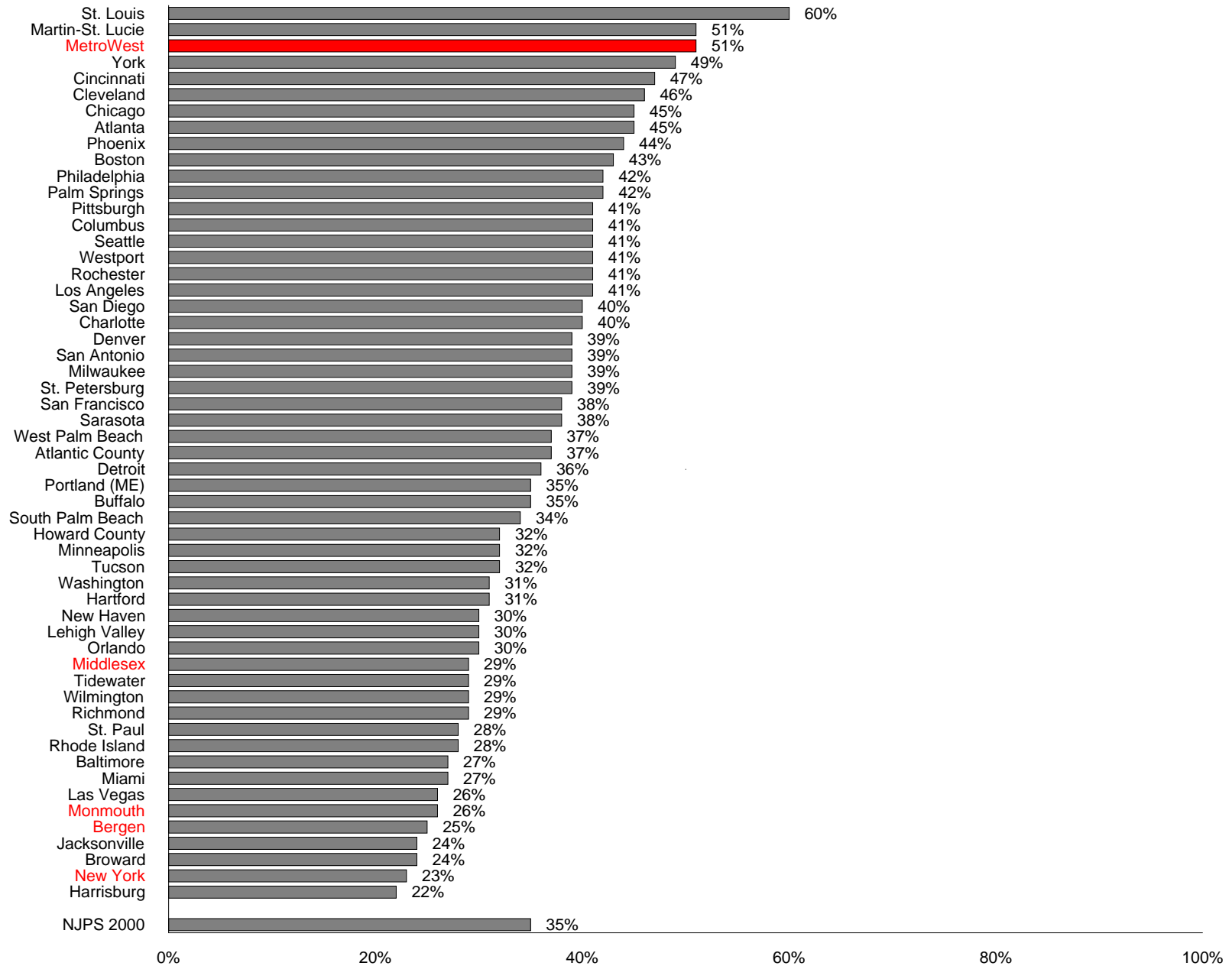

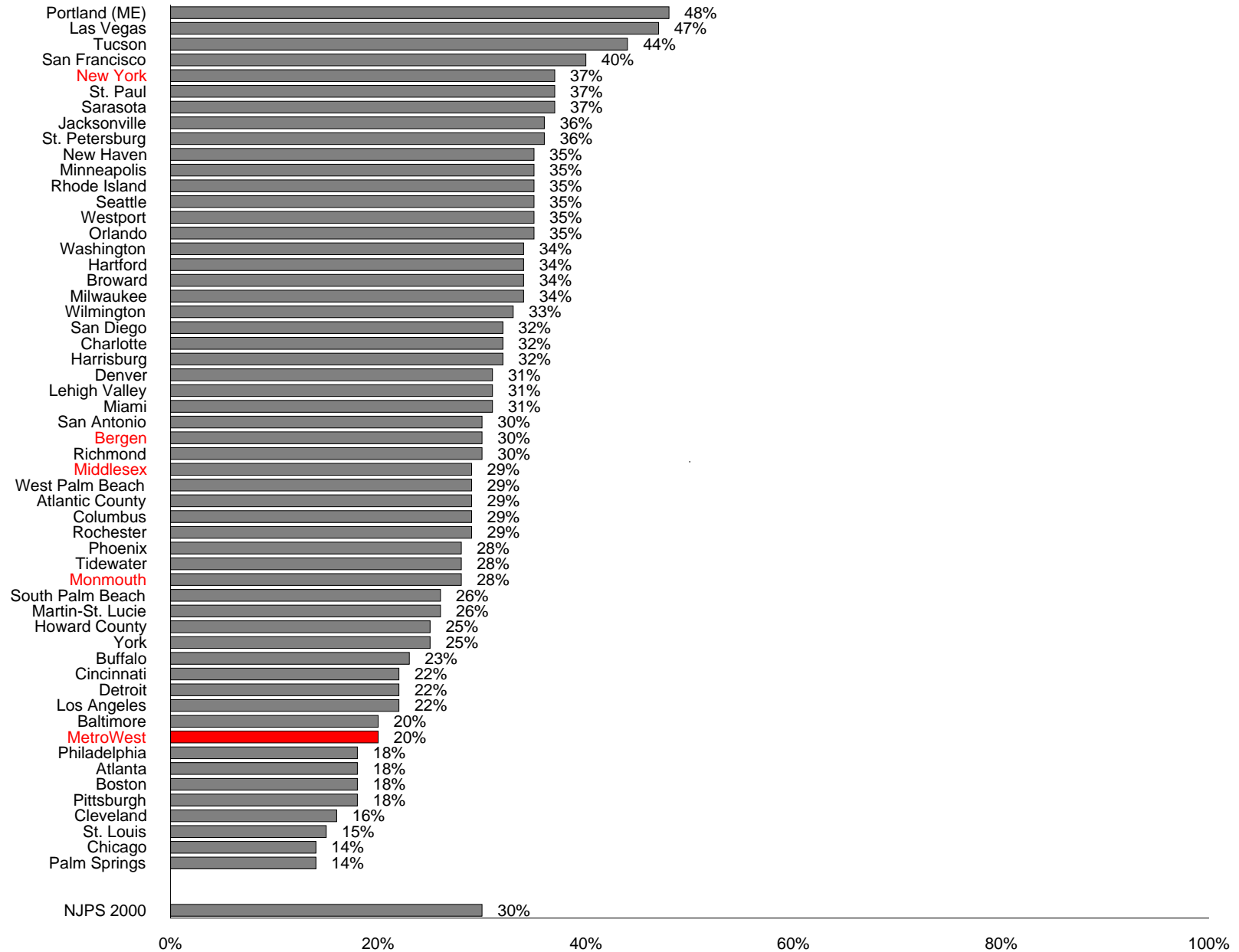
CONSERVATIVE IDENTIFICATION (Jewish Respondents)

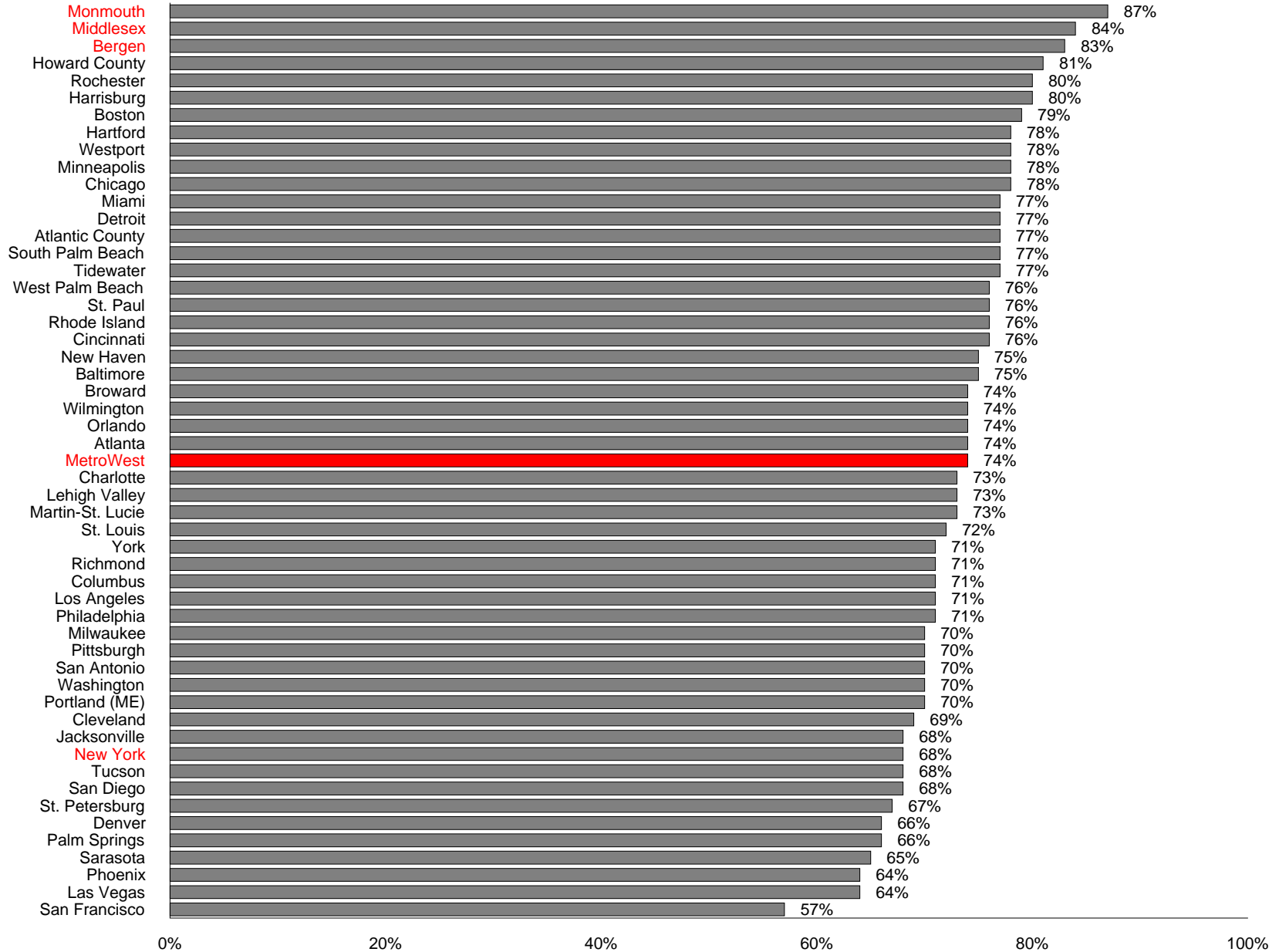

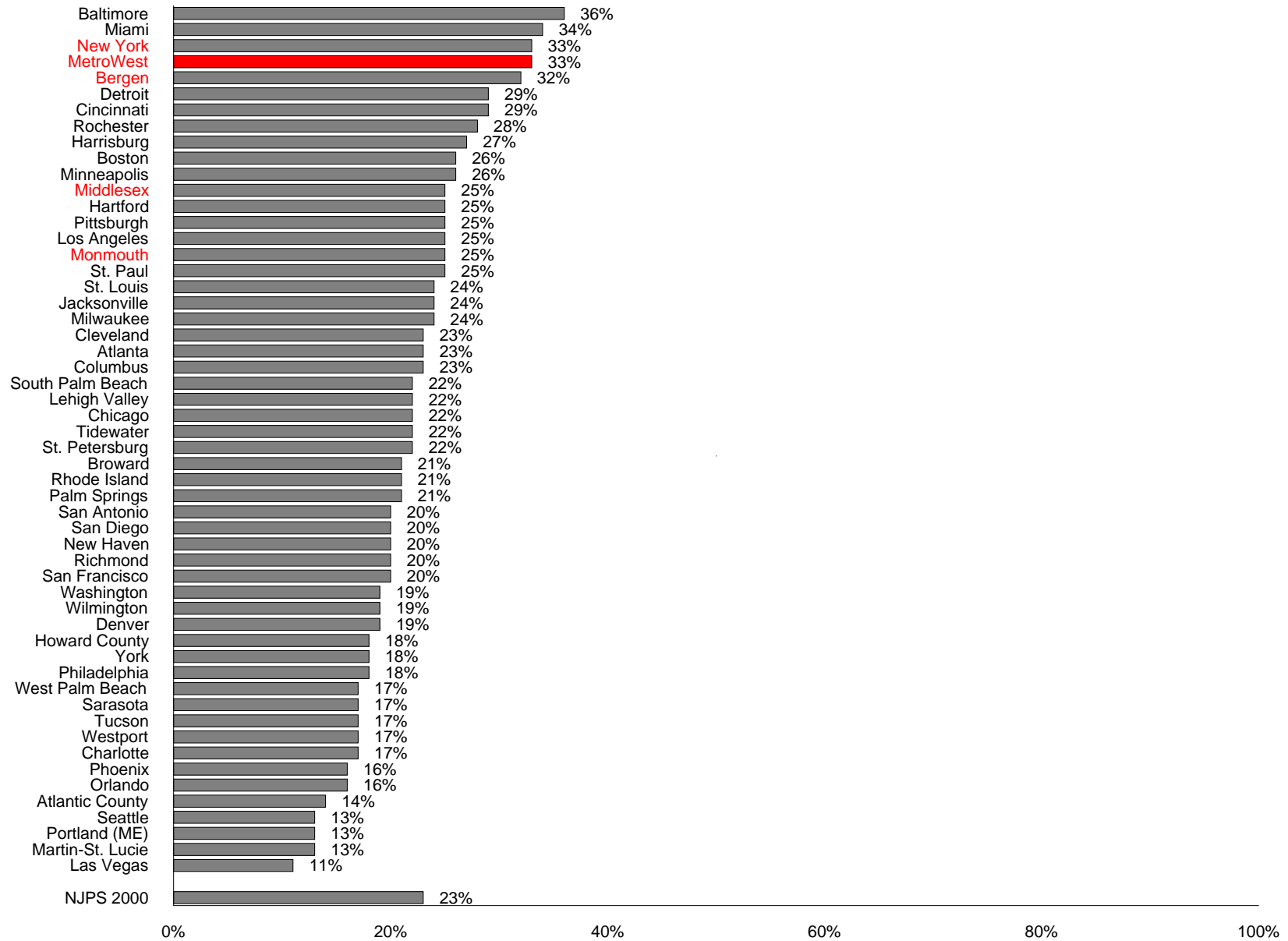

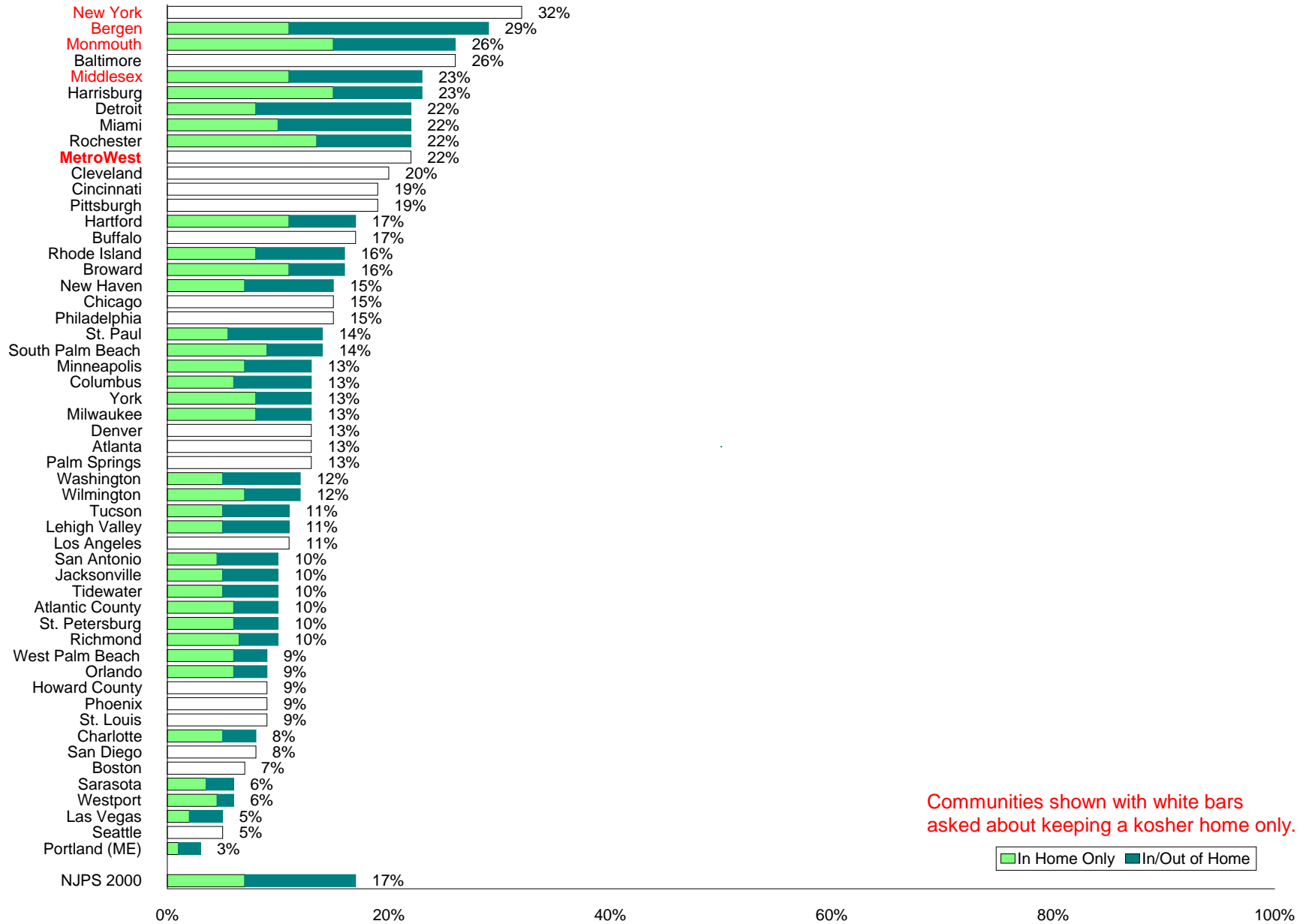

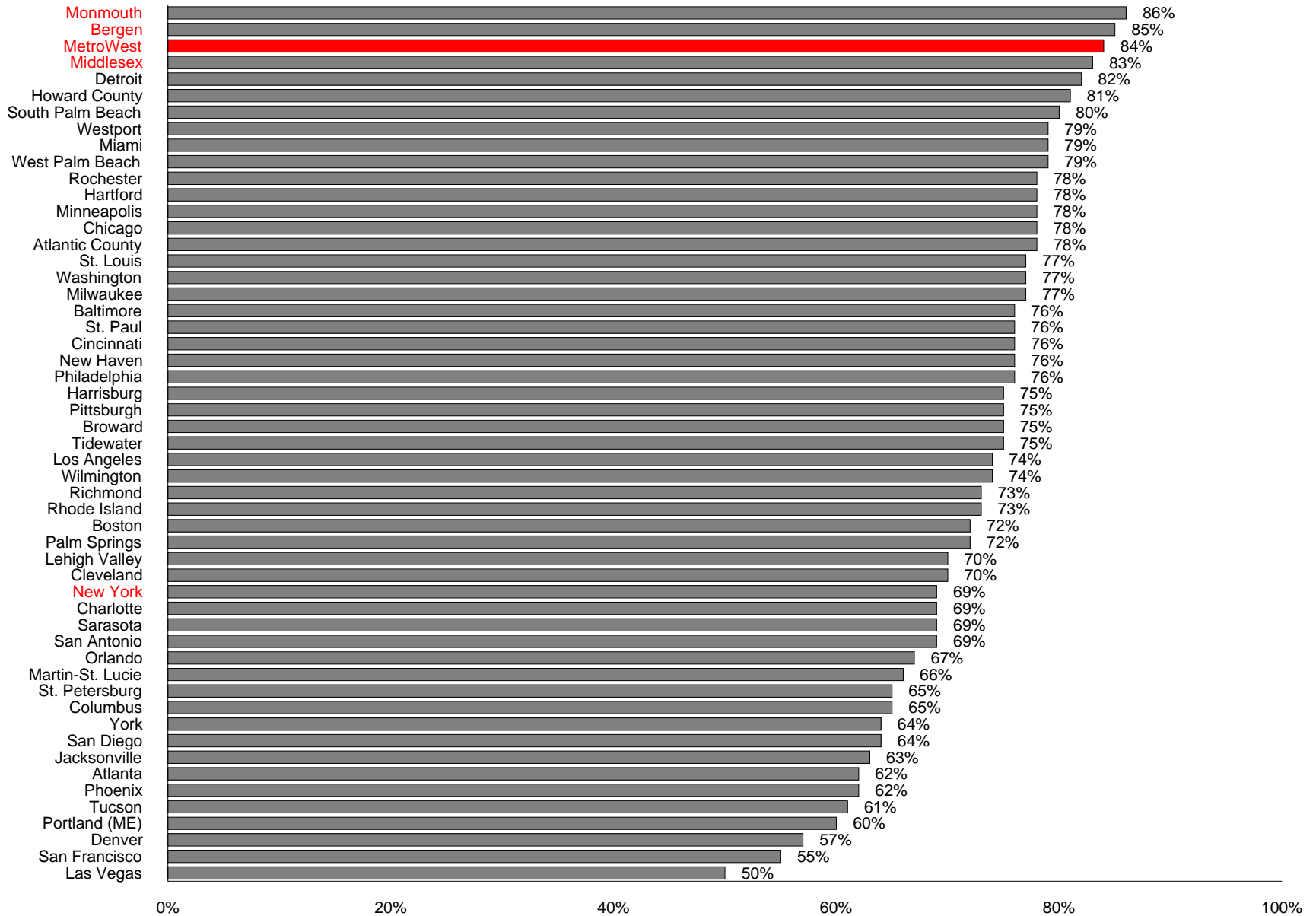

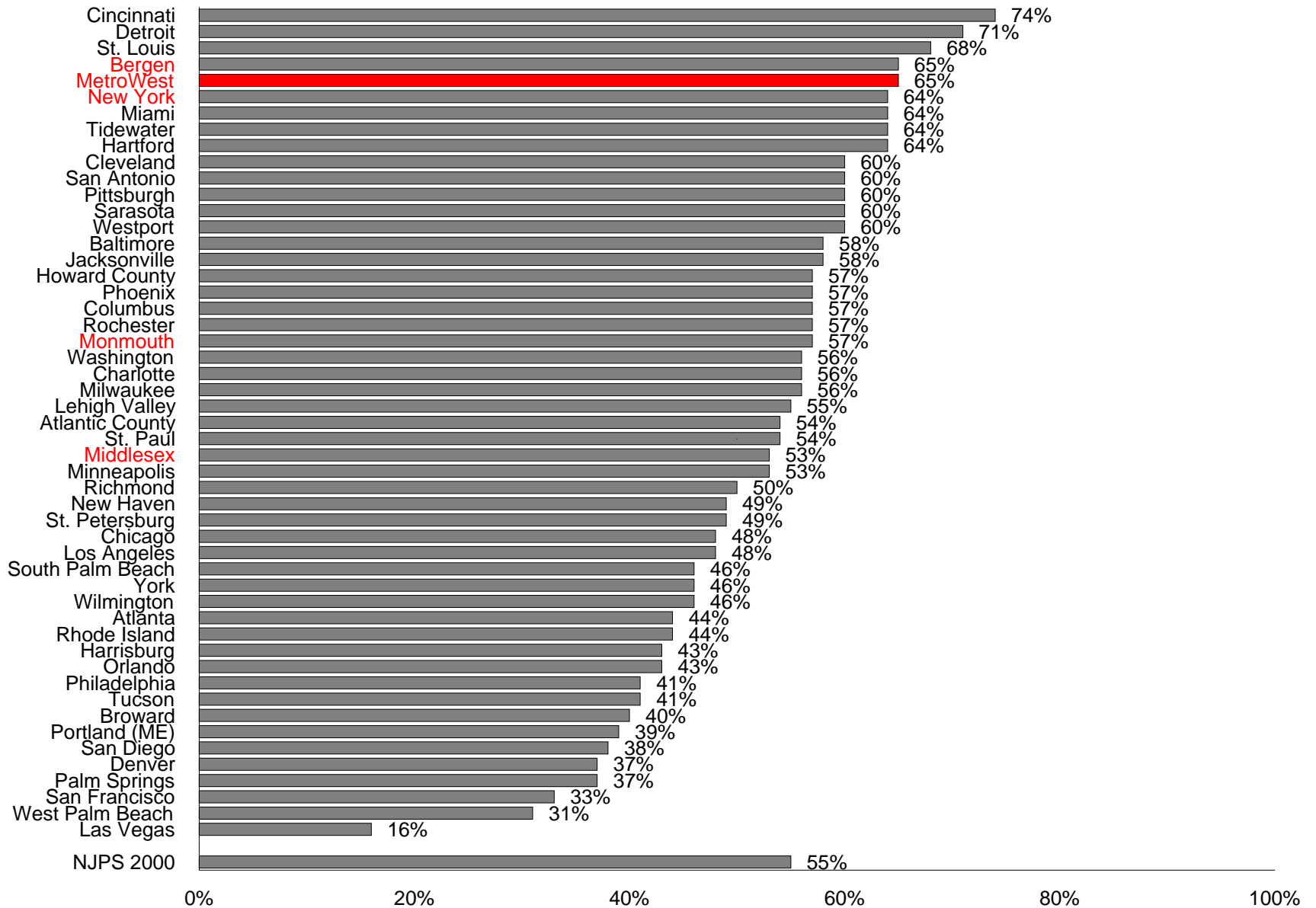

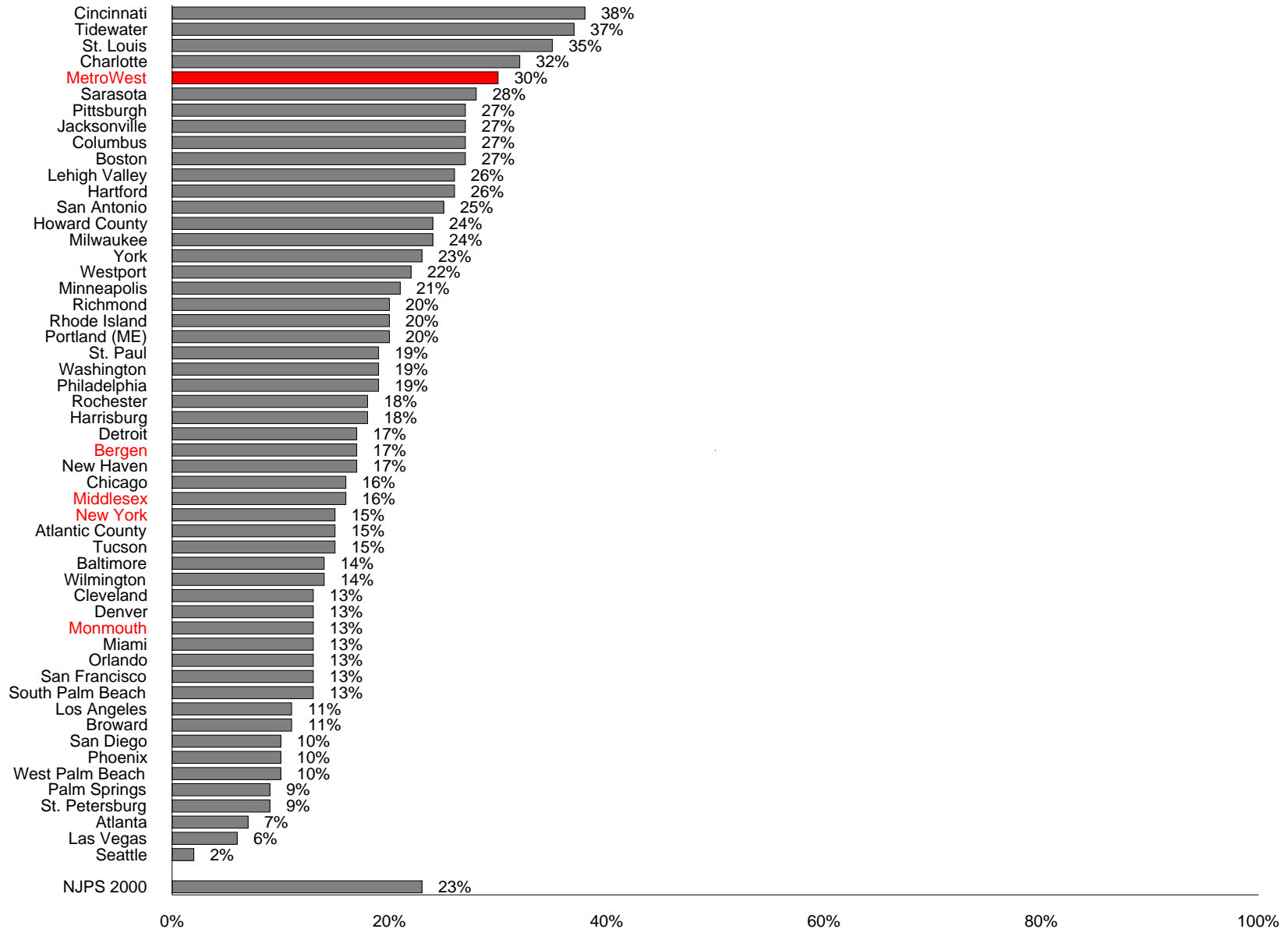

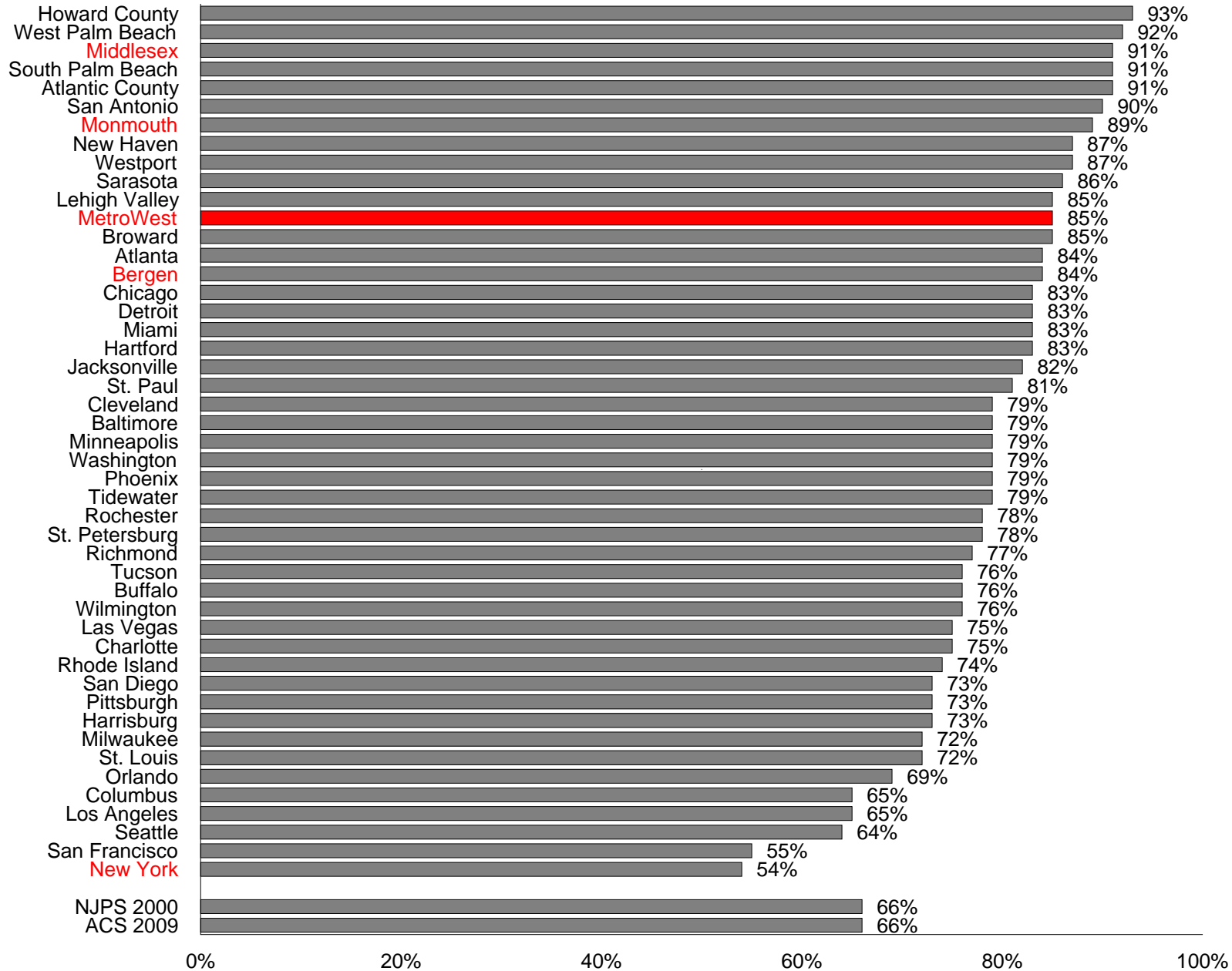

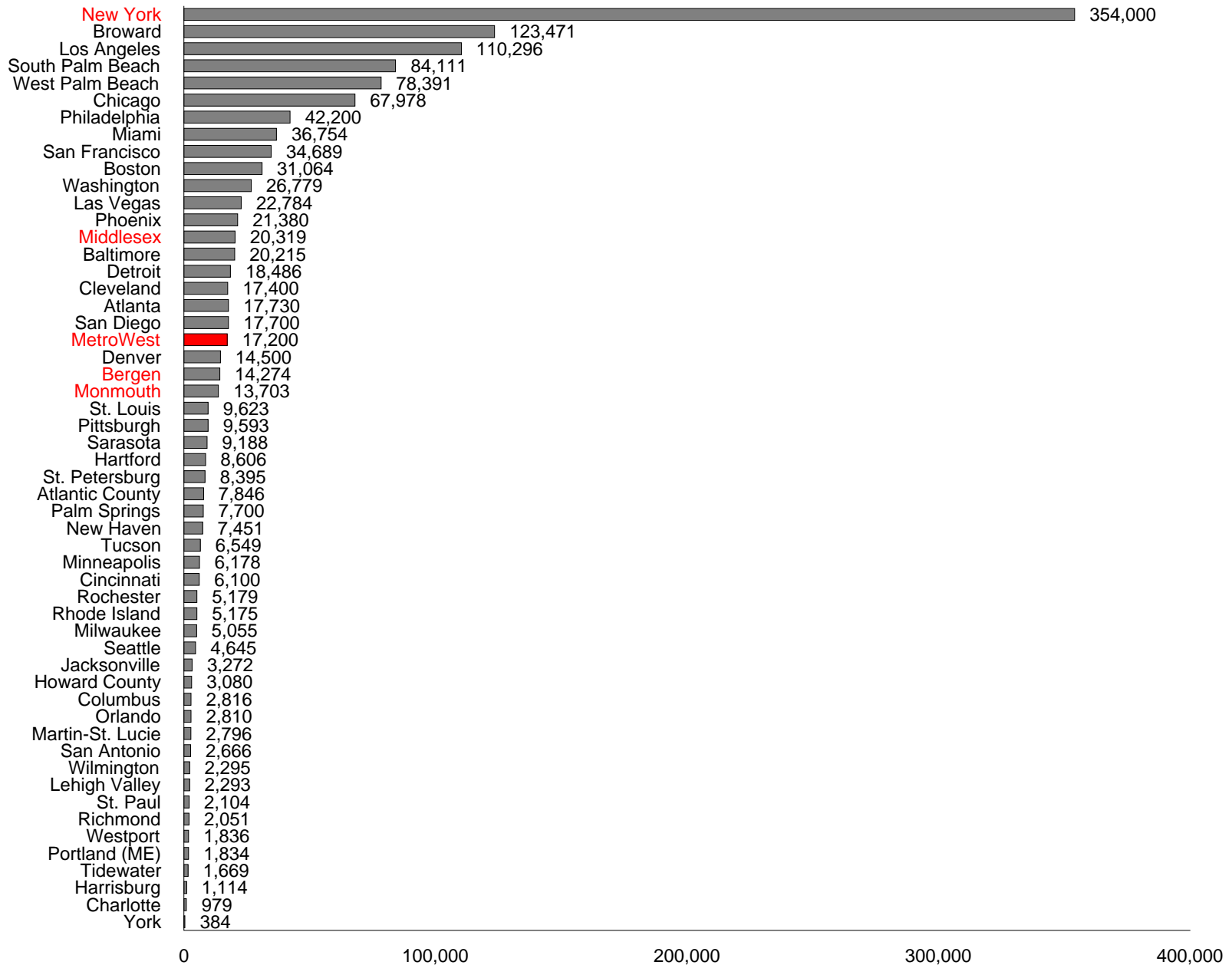

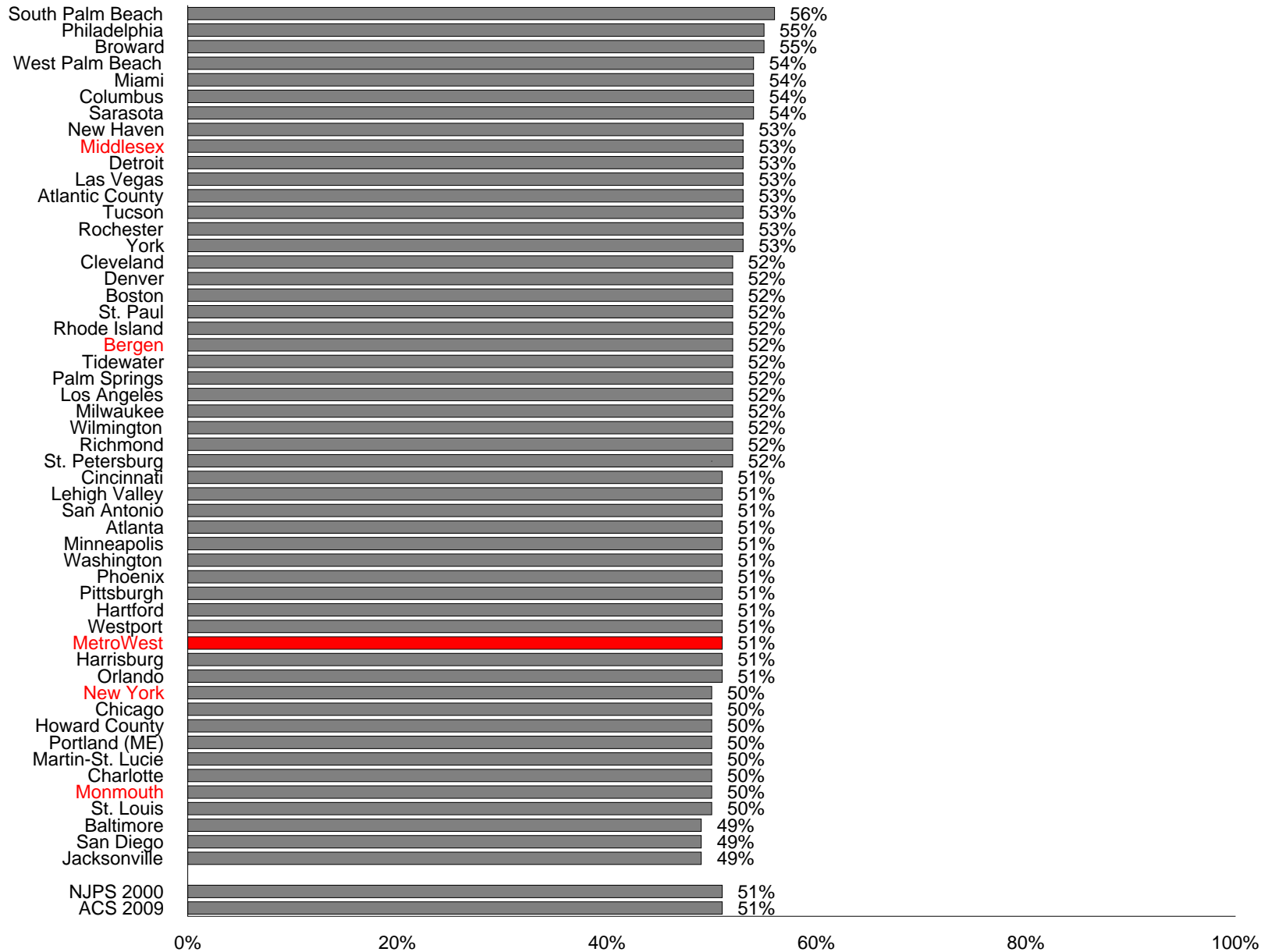
NUMBER OF PERSONS AGE 65 AND OVER

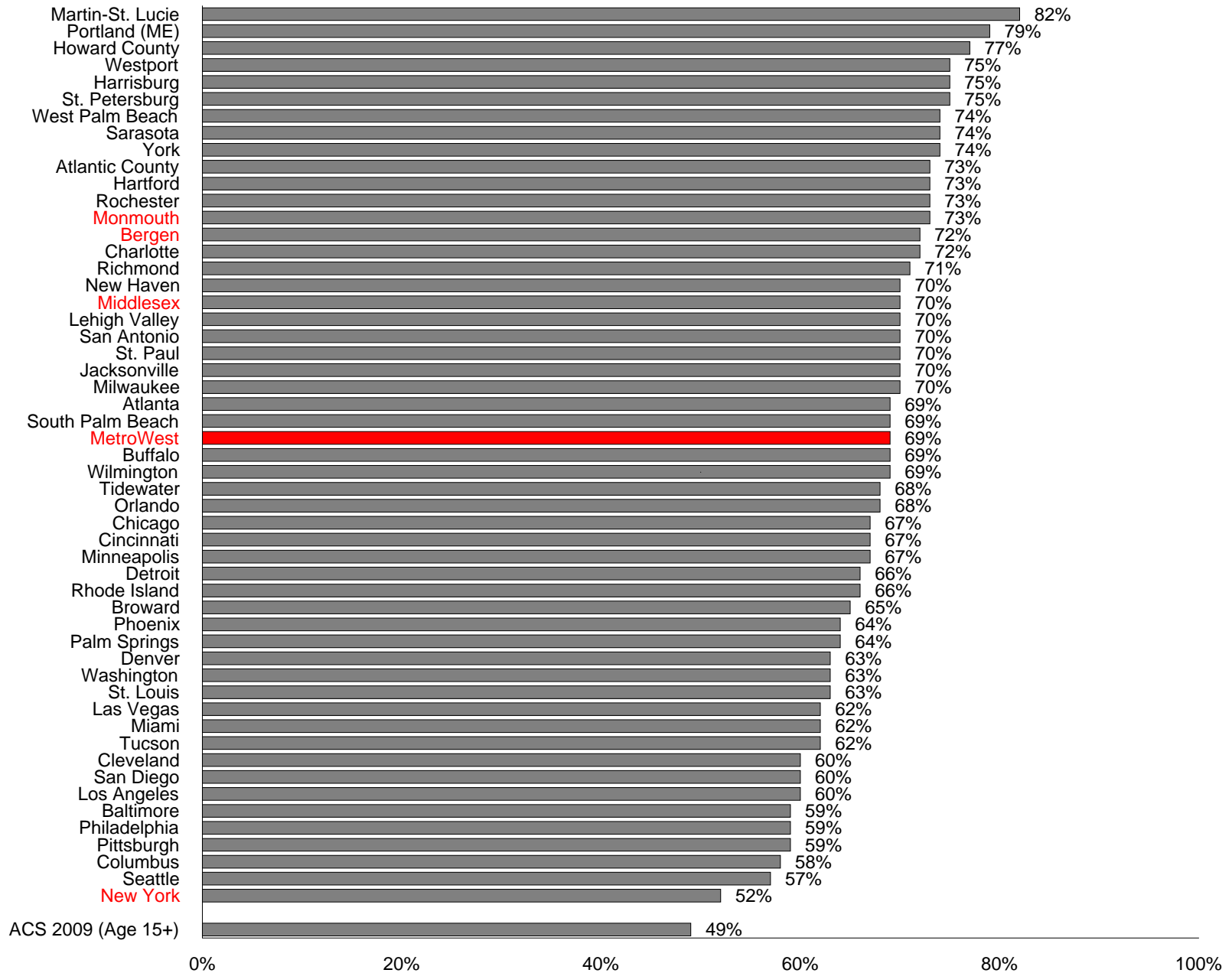

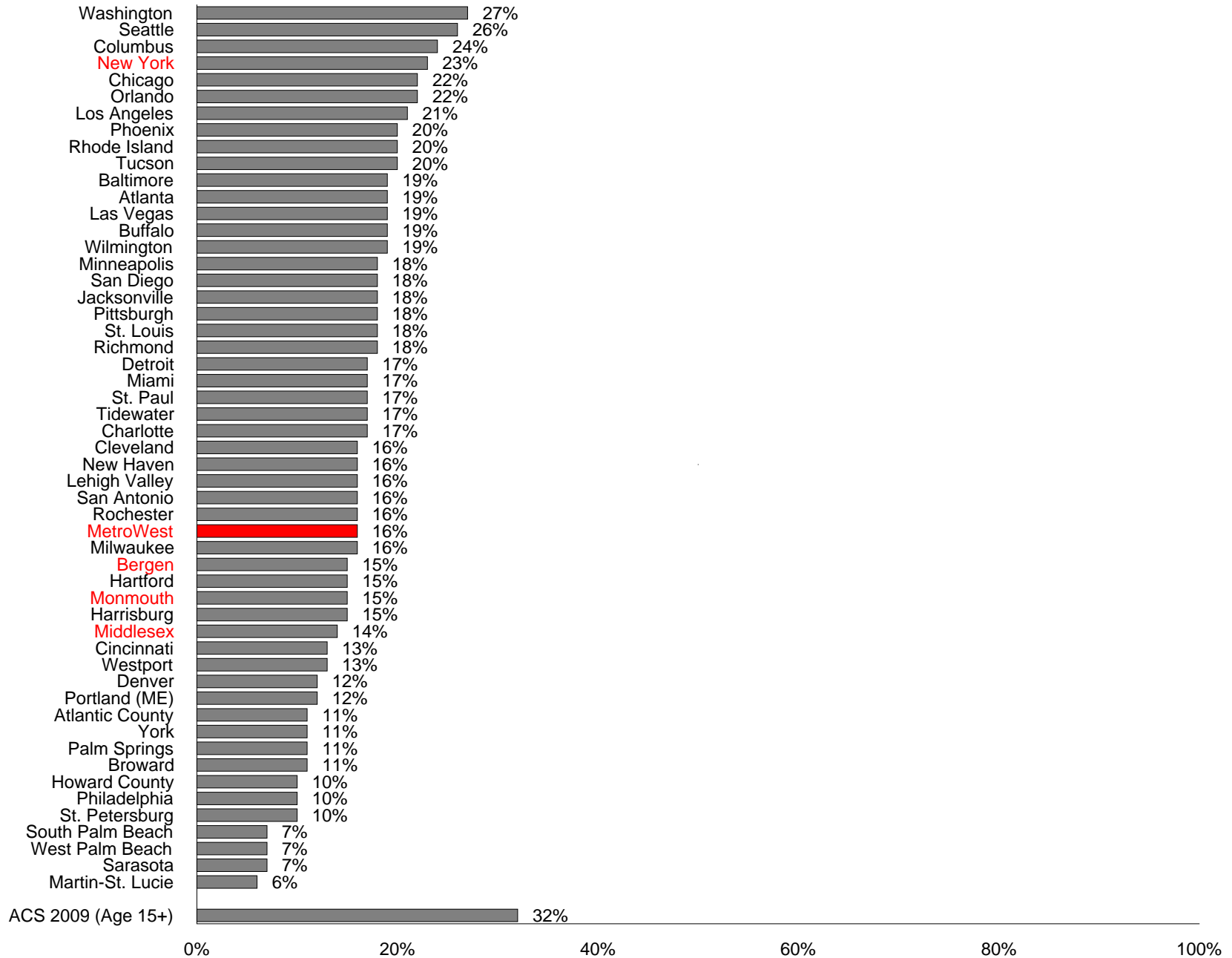

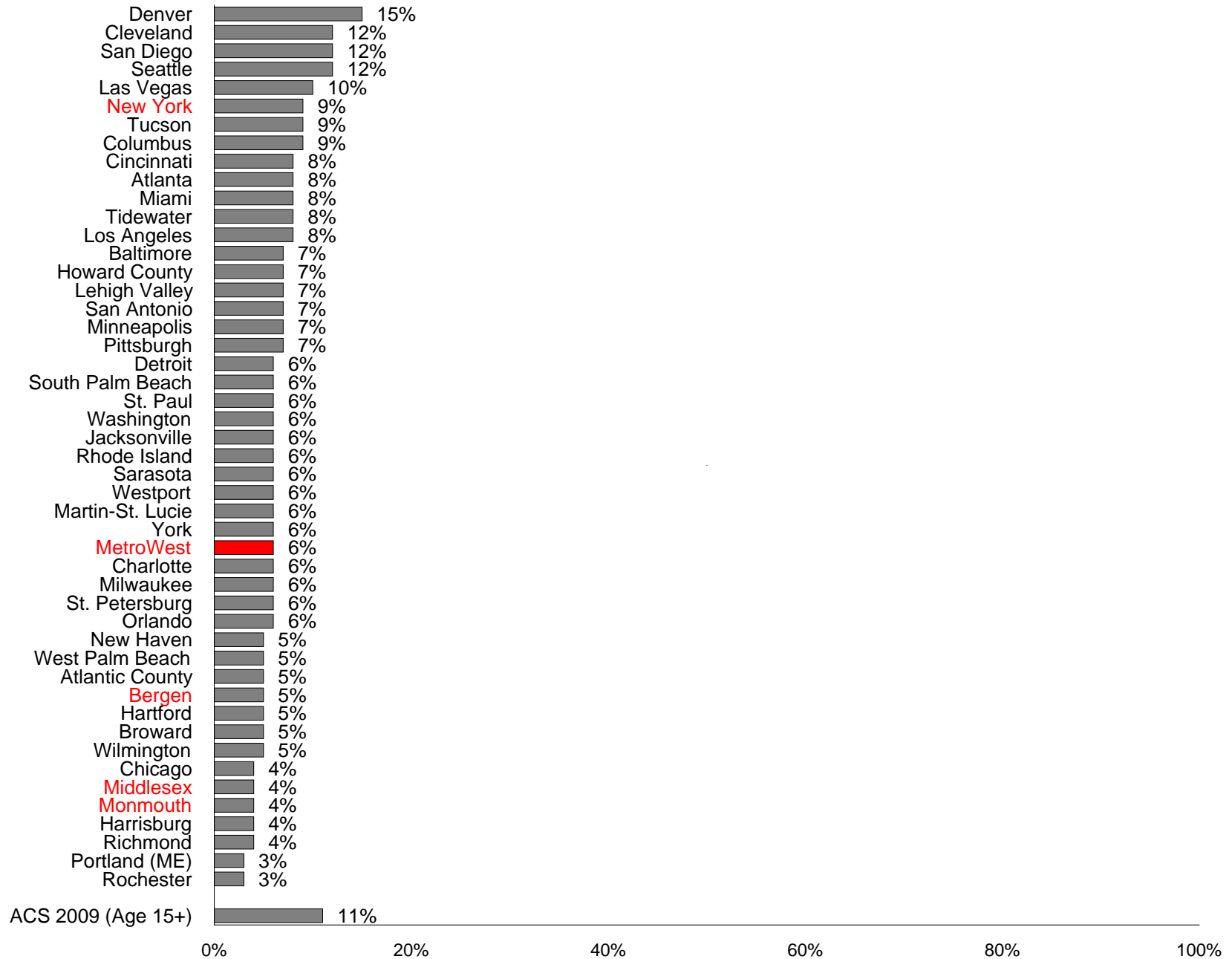

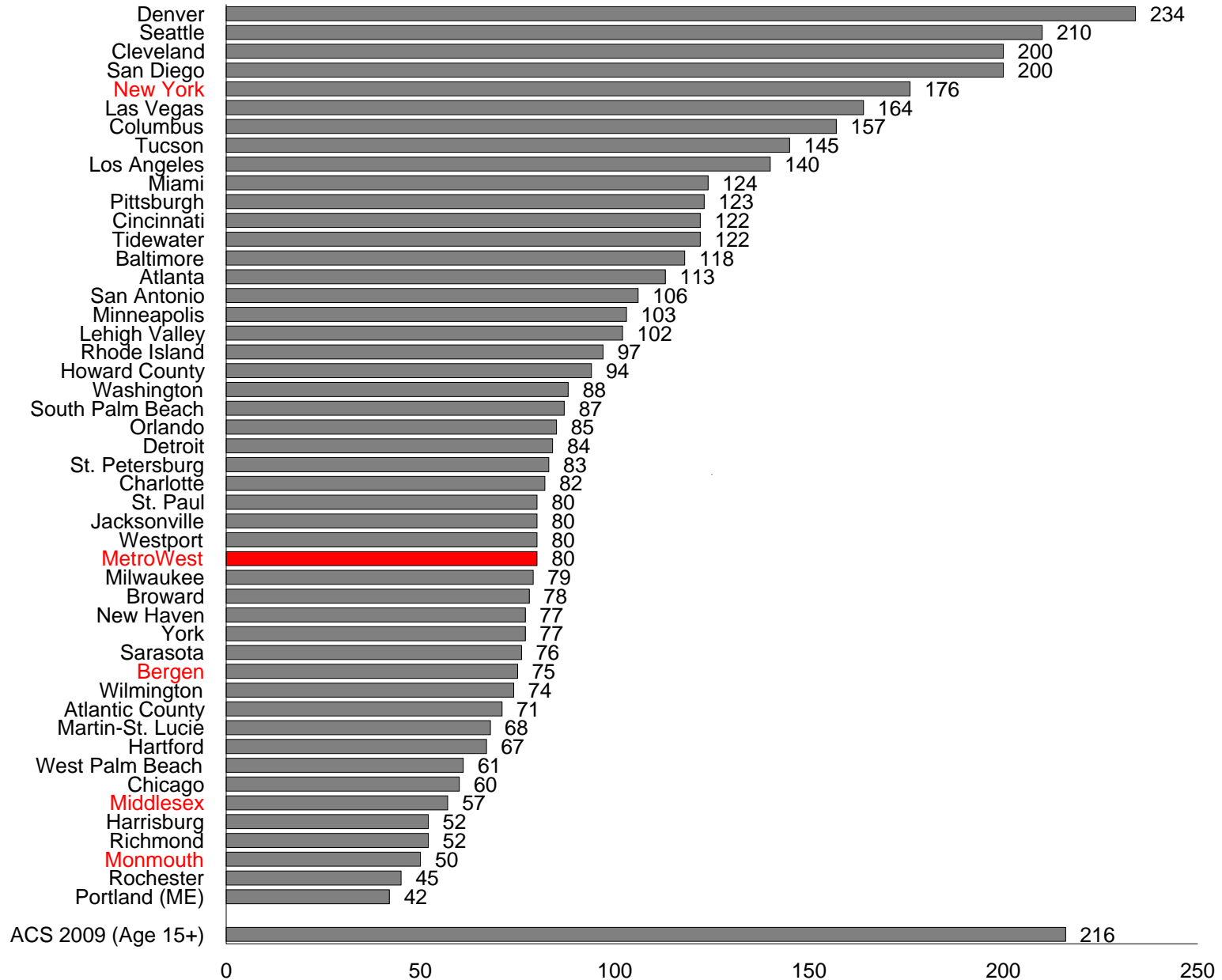

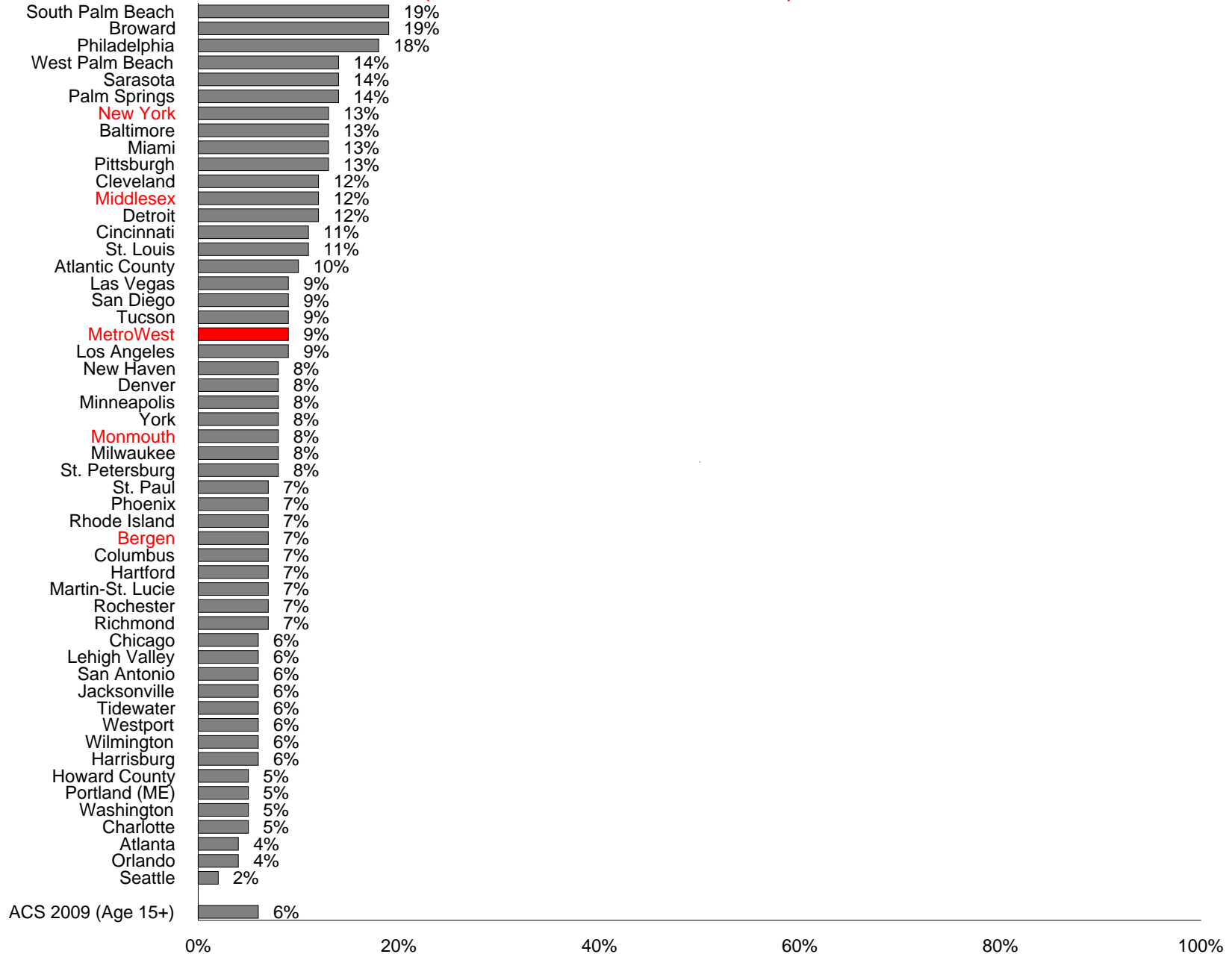
DIVORCE RATE

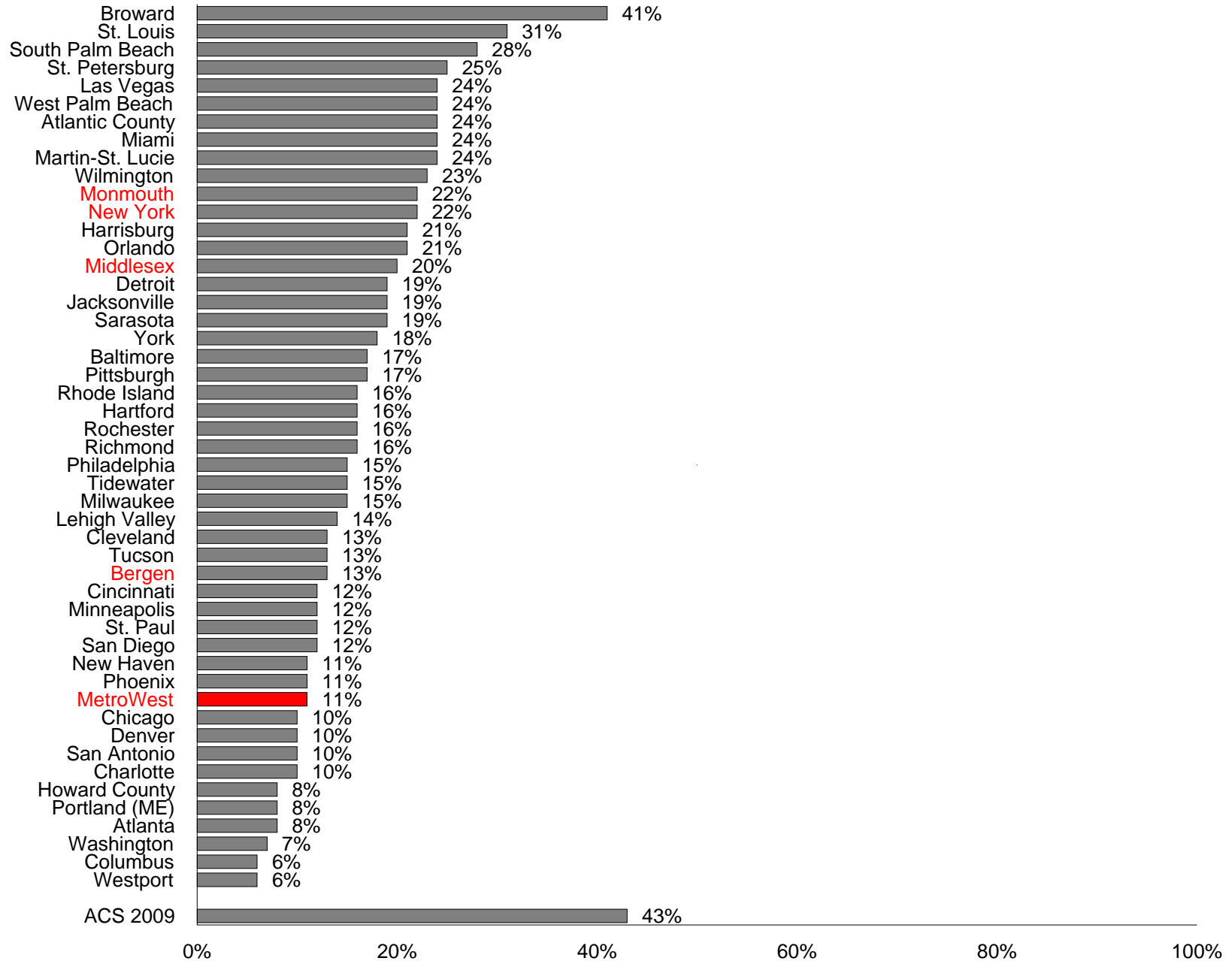

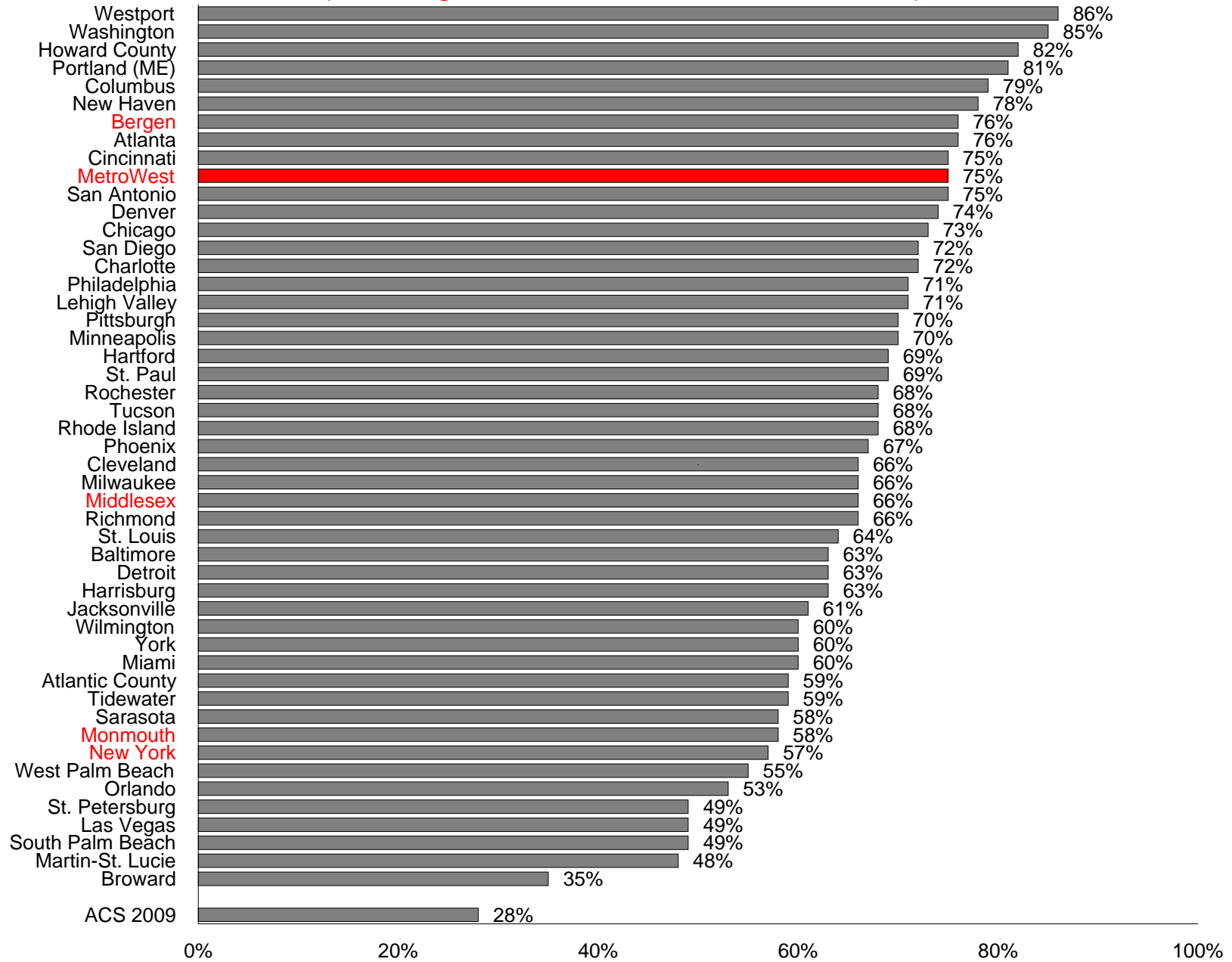

(Adults Age 25 and Over in Jewish Households)



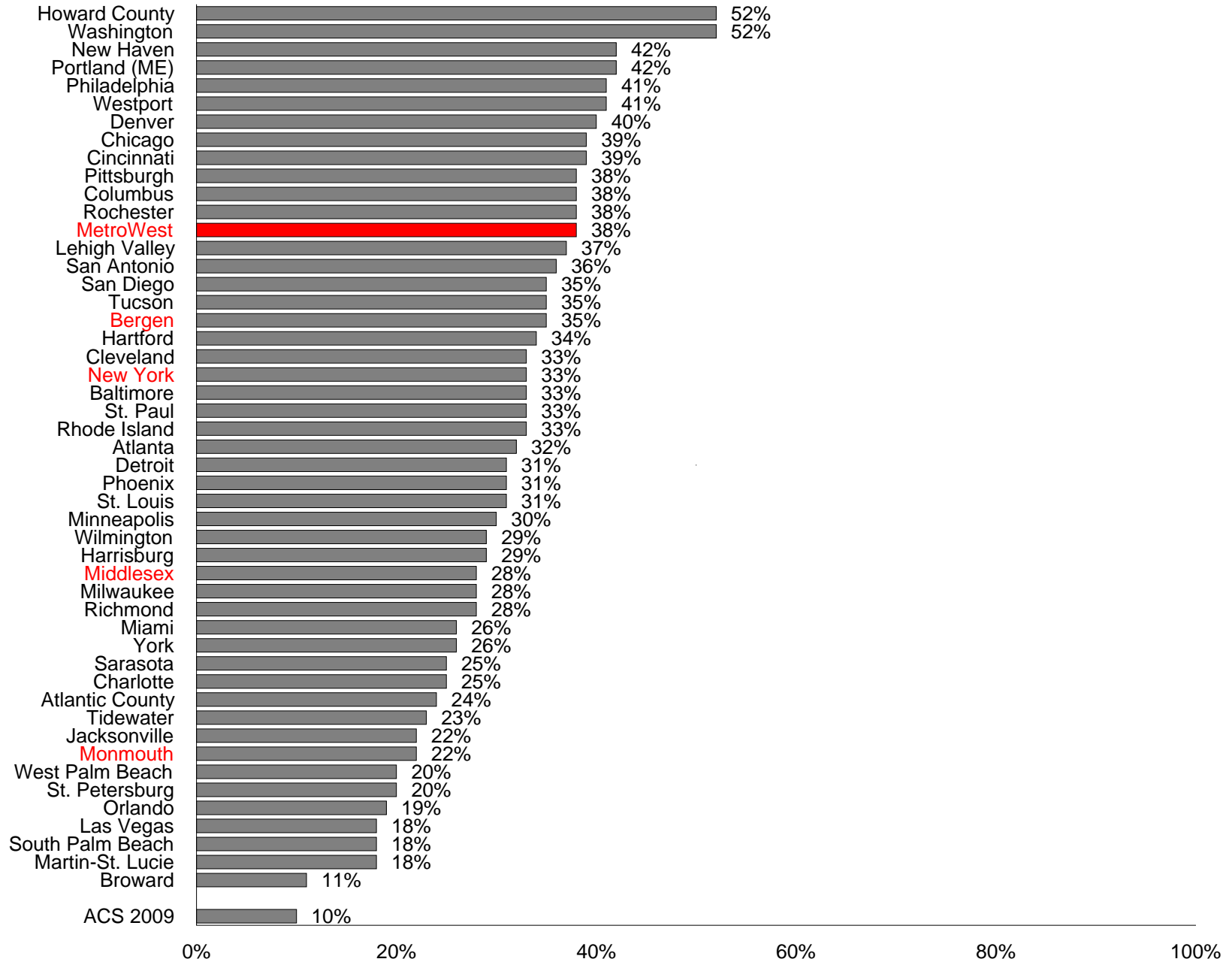

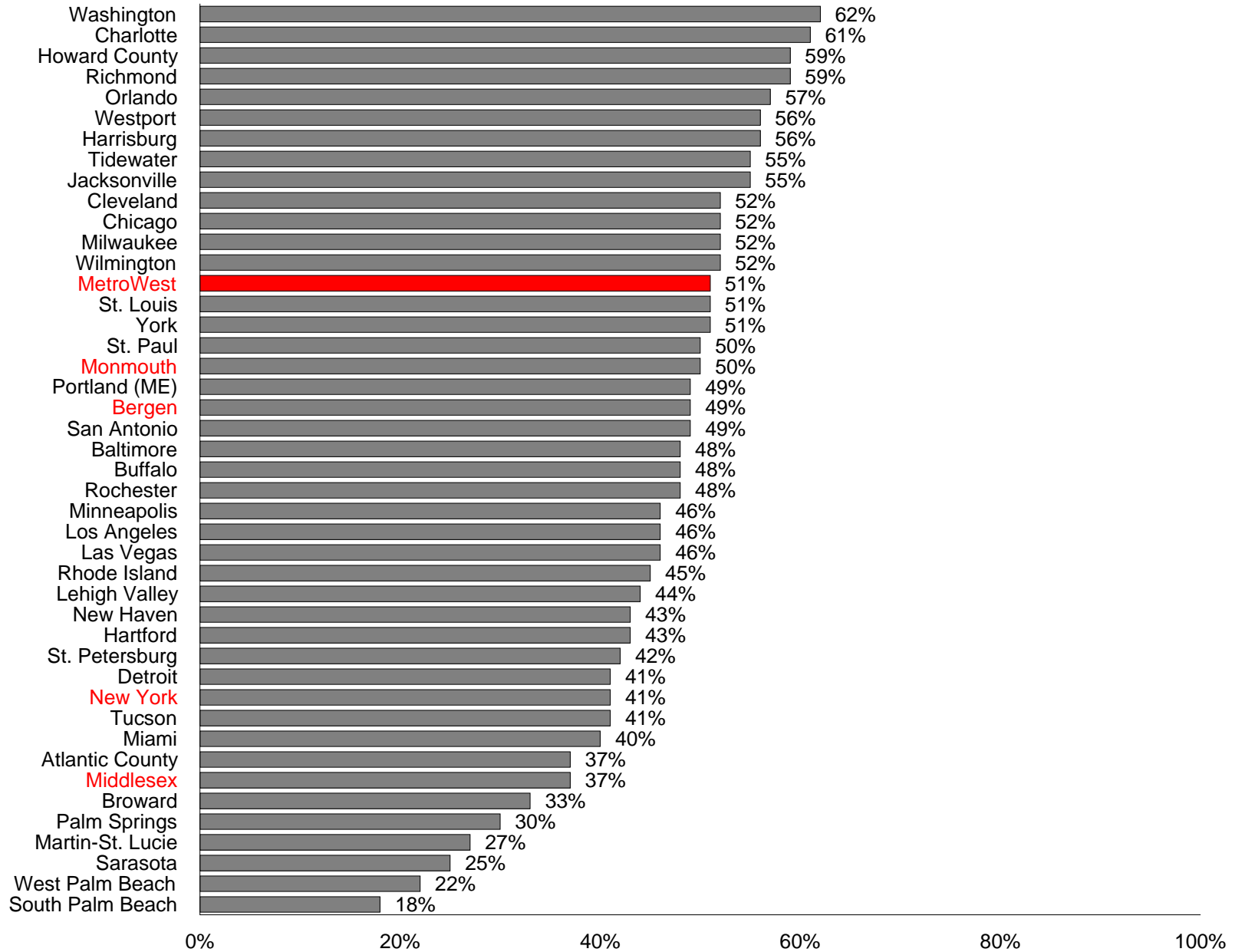

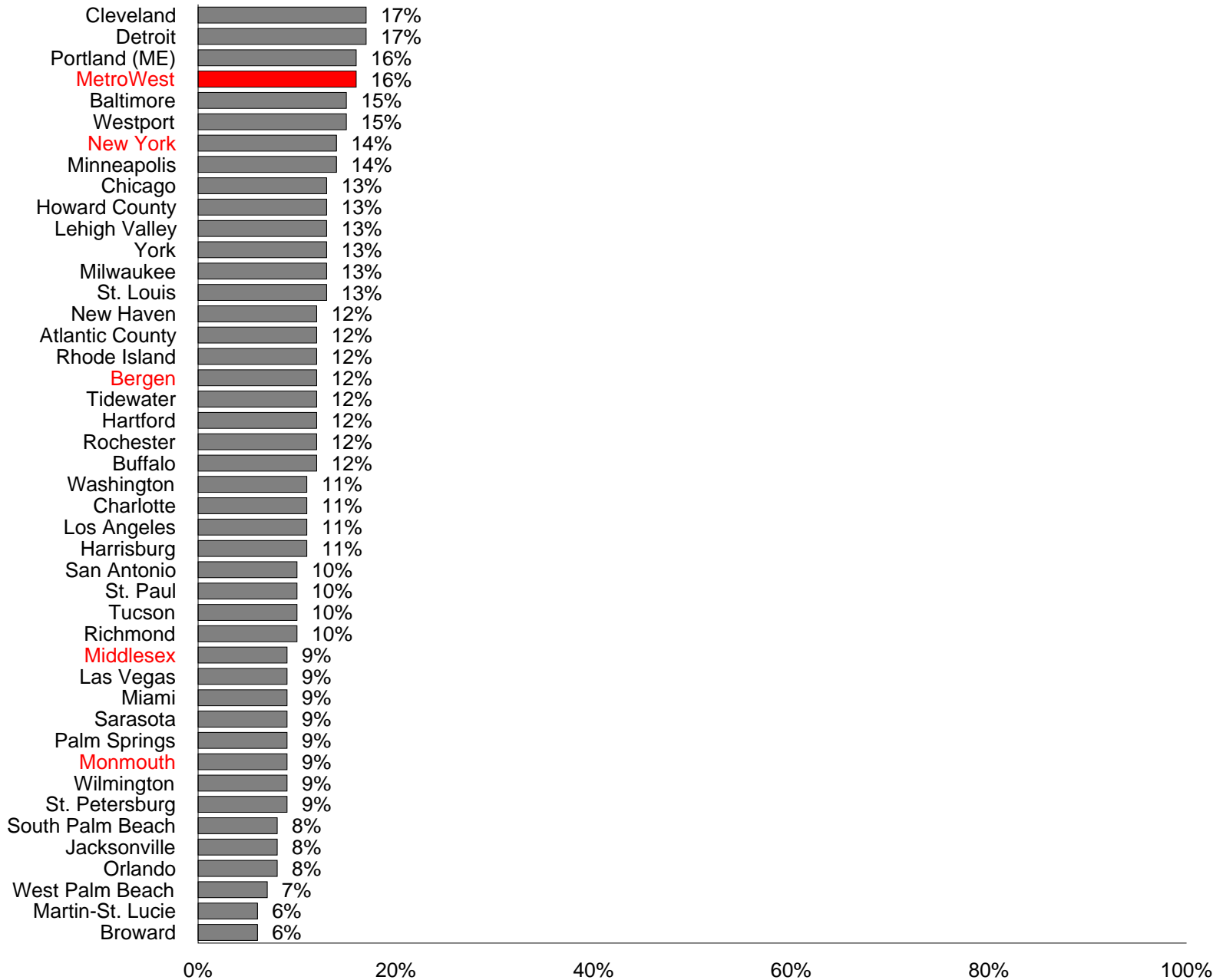

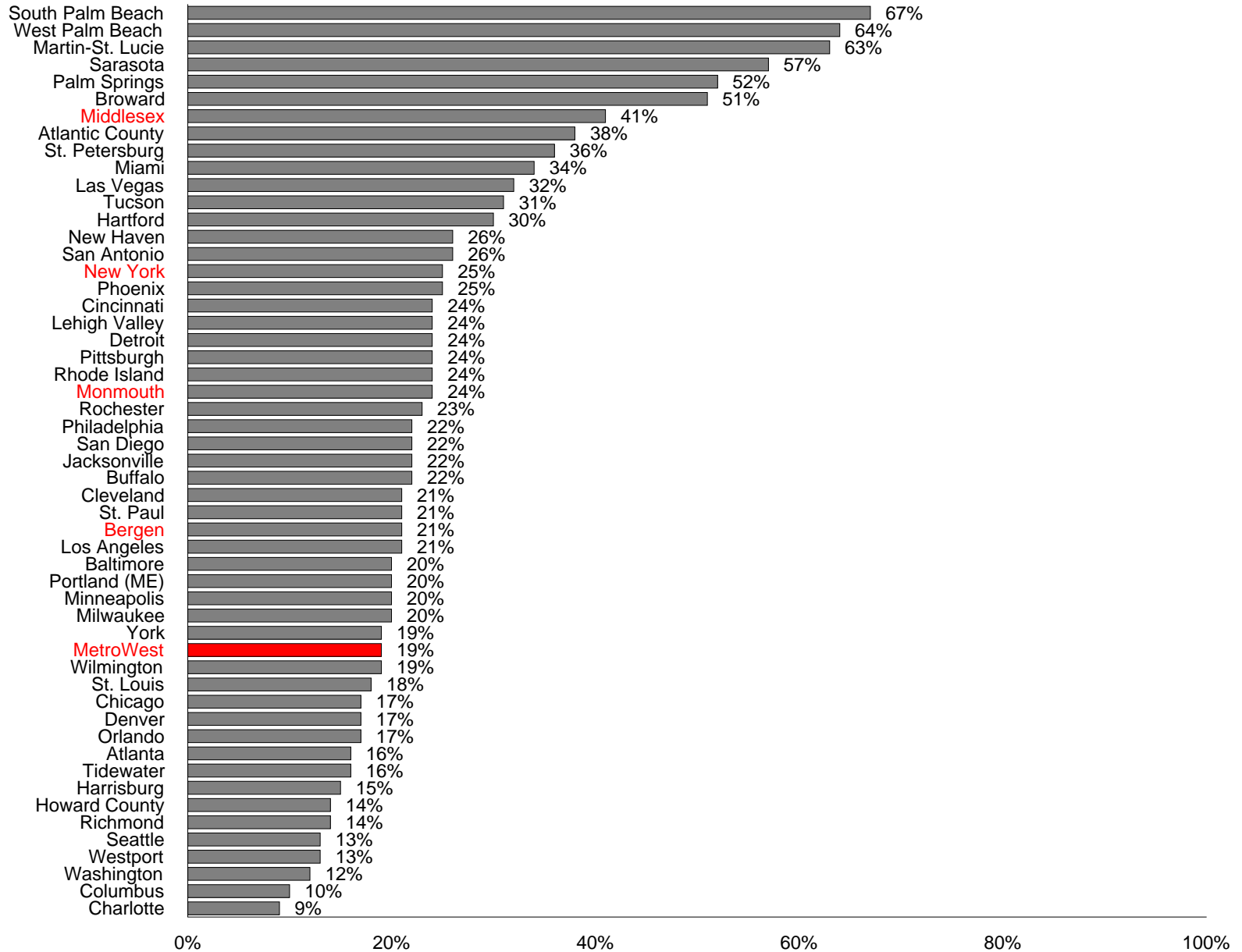

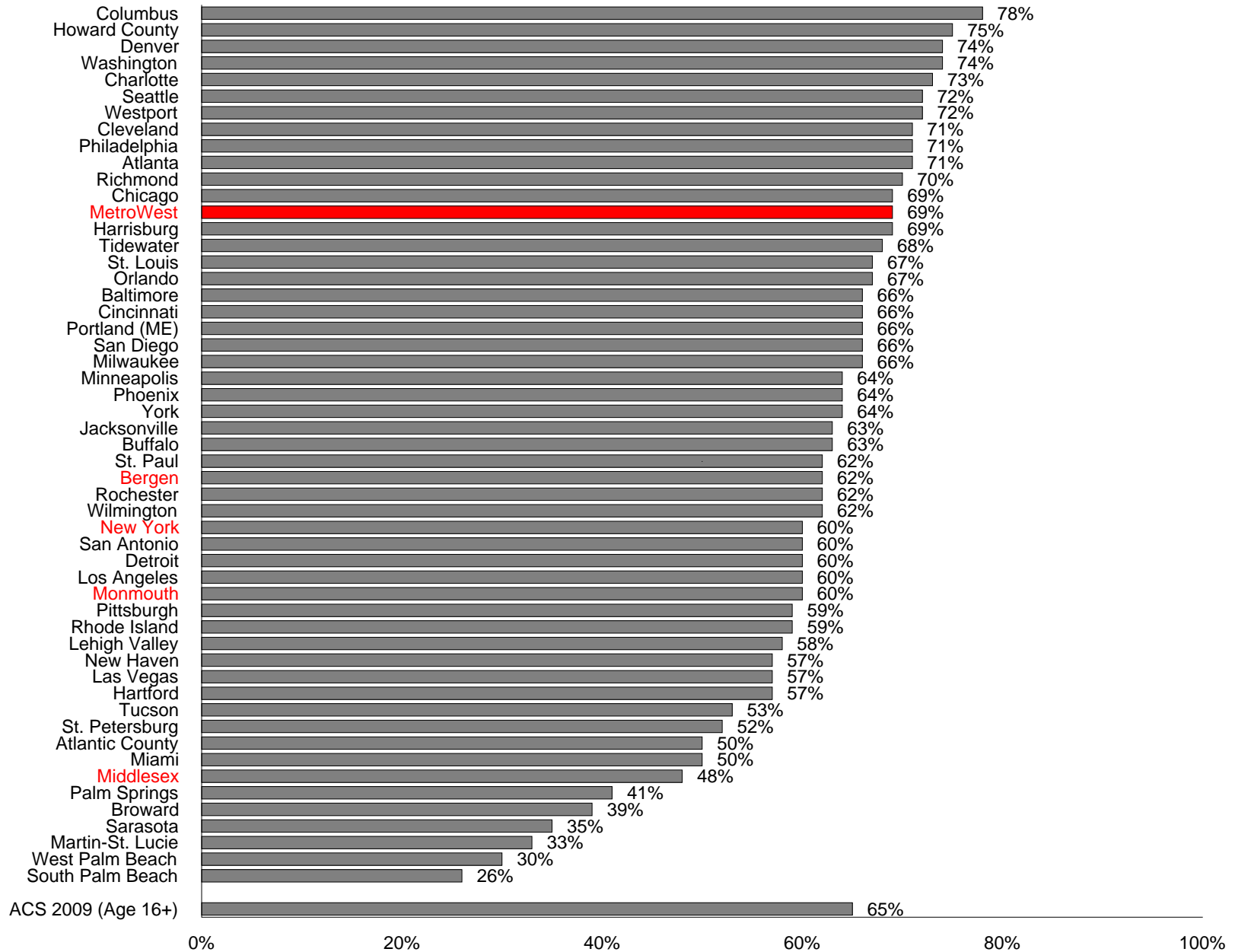

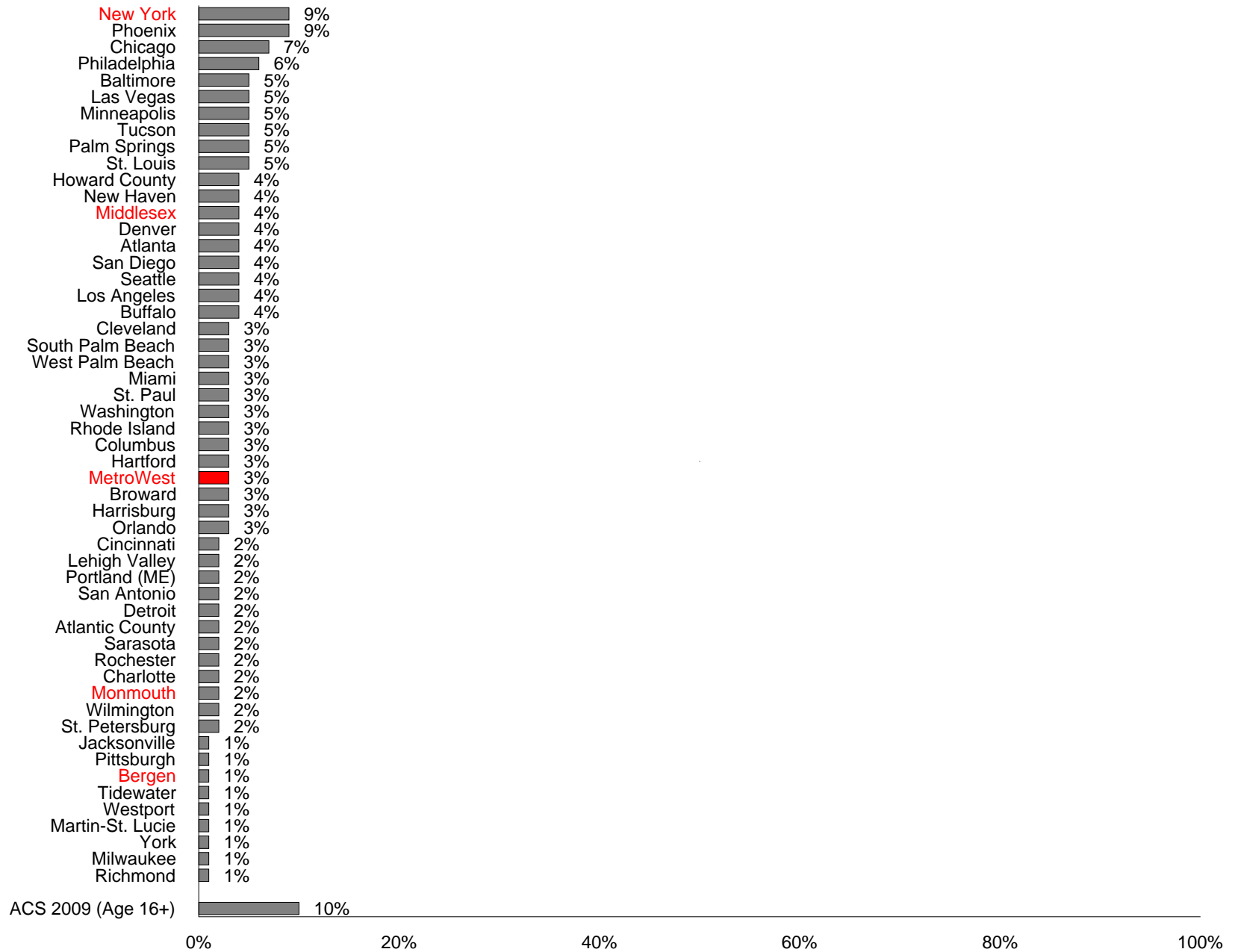

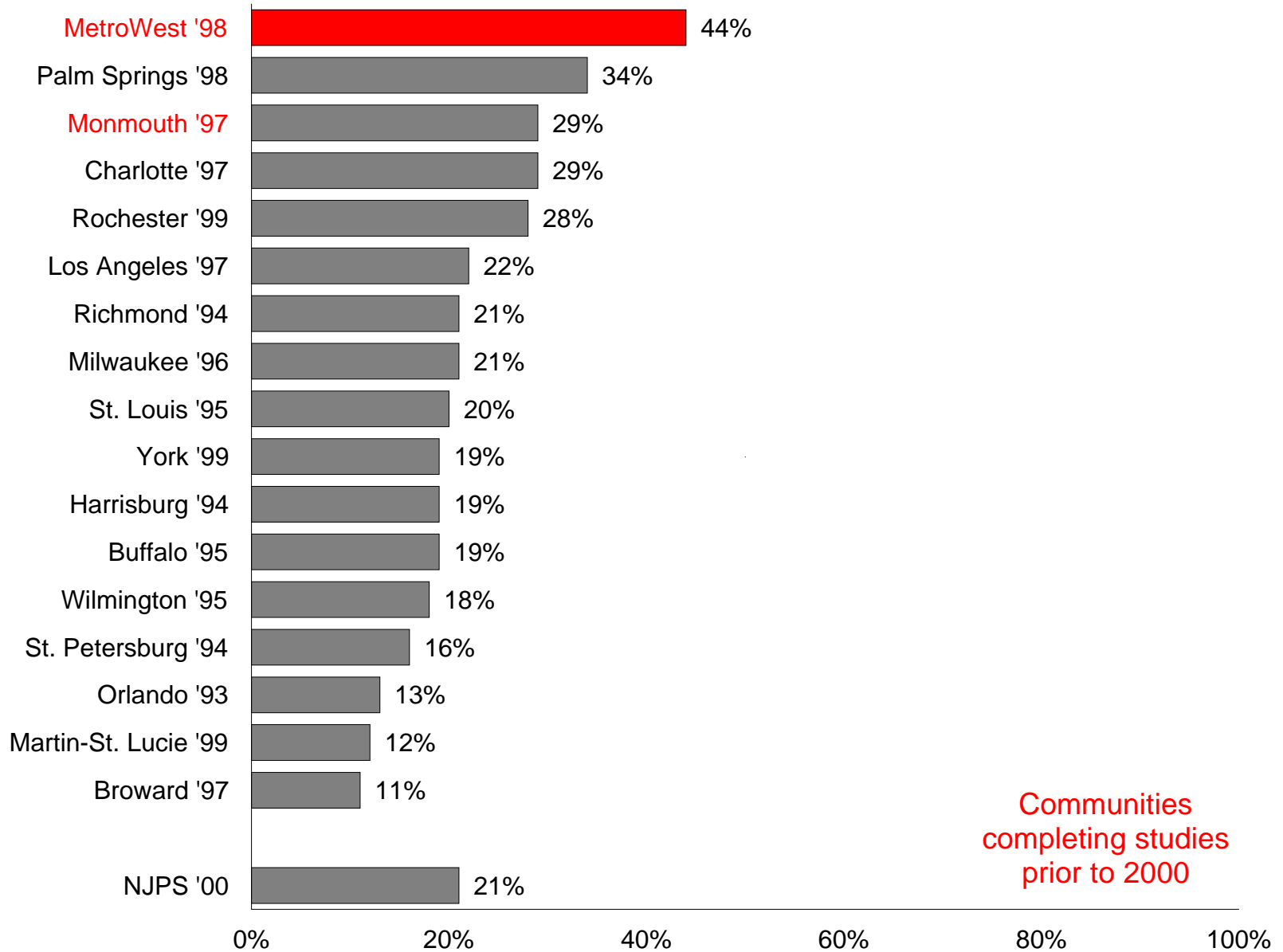

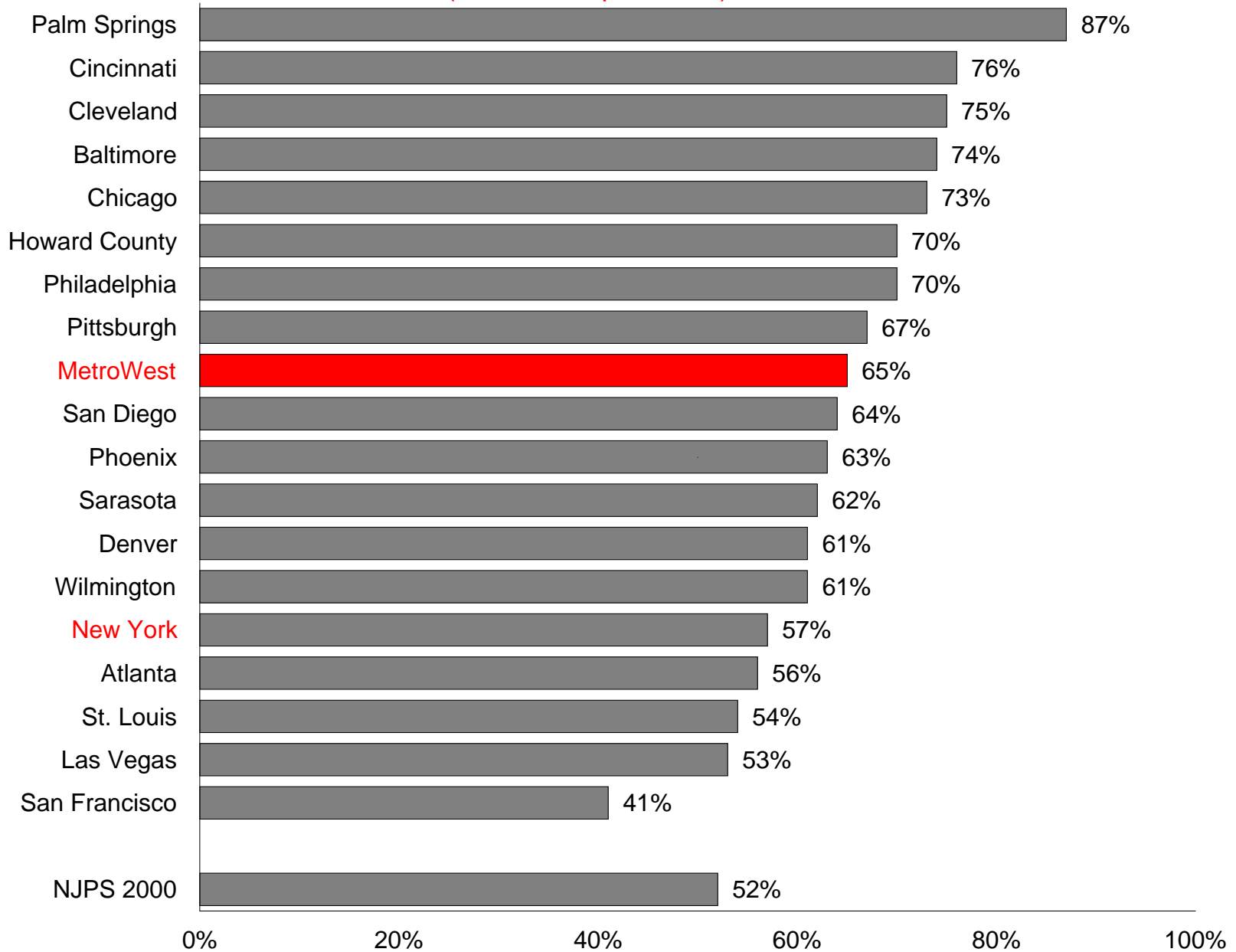

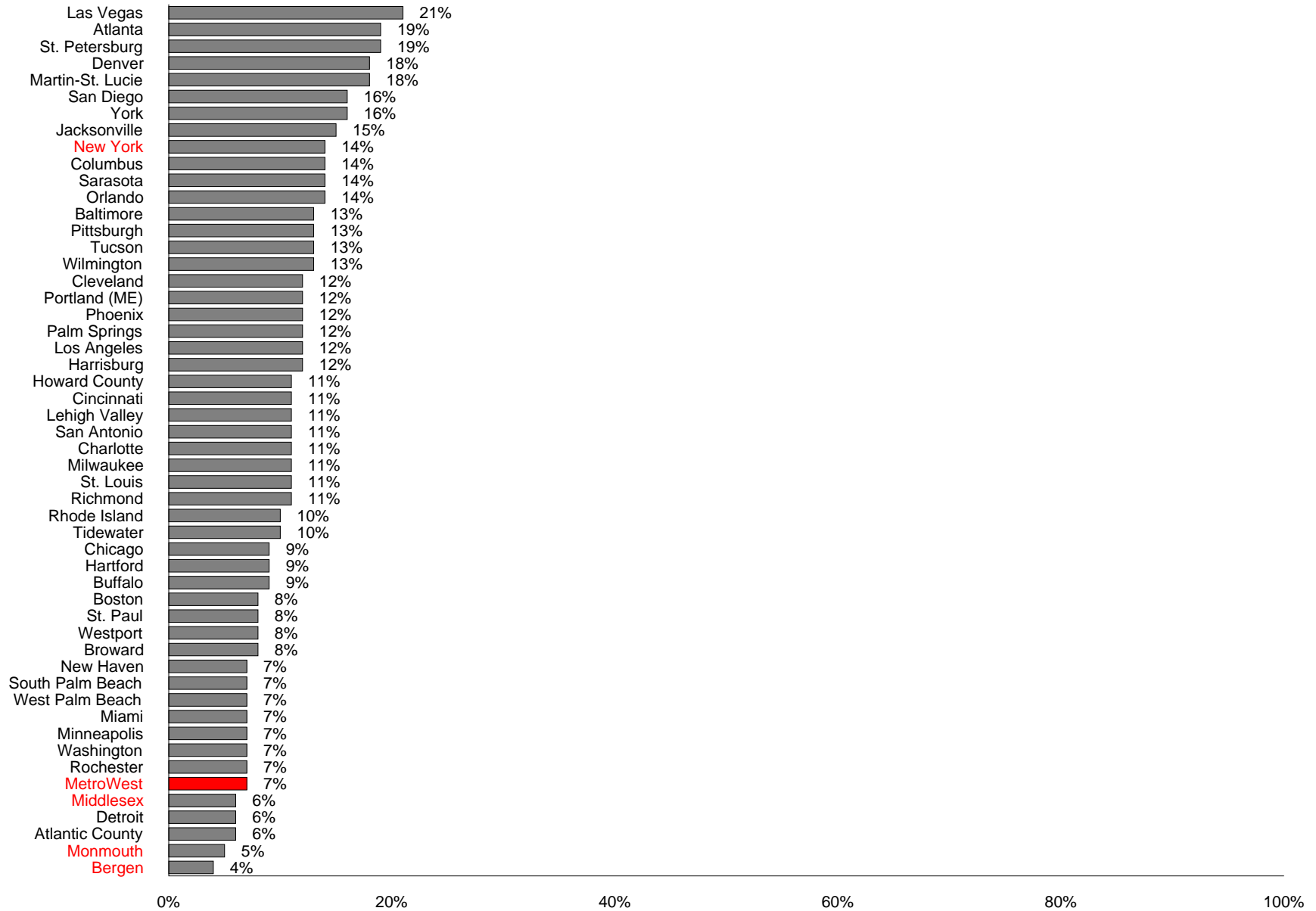

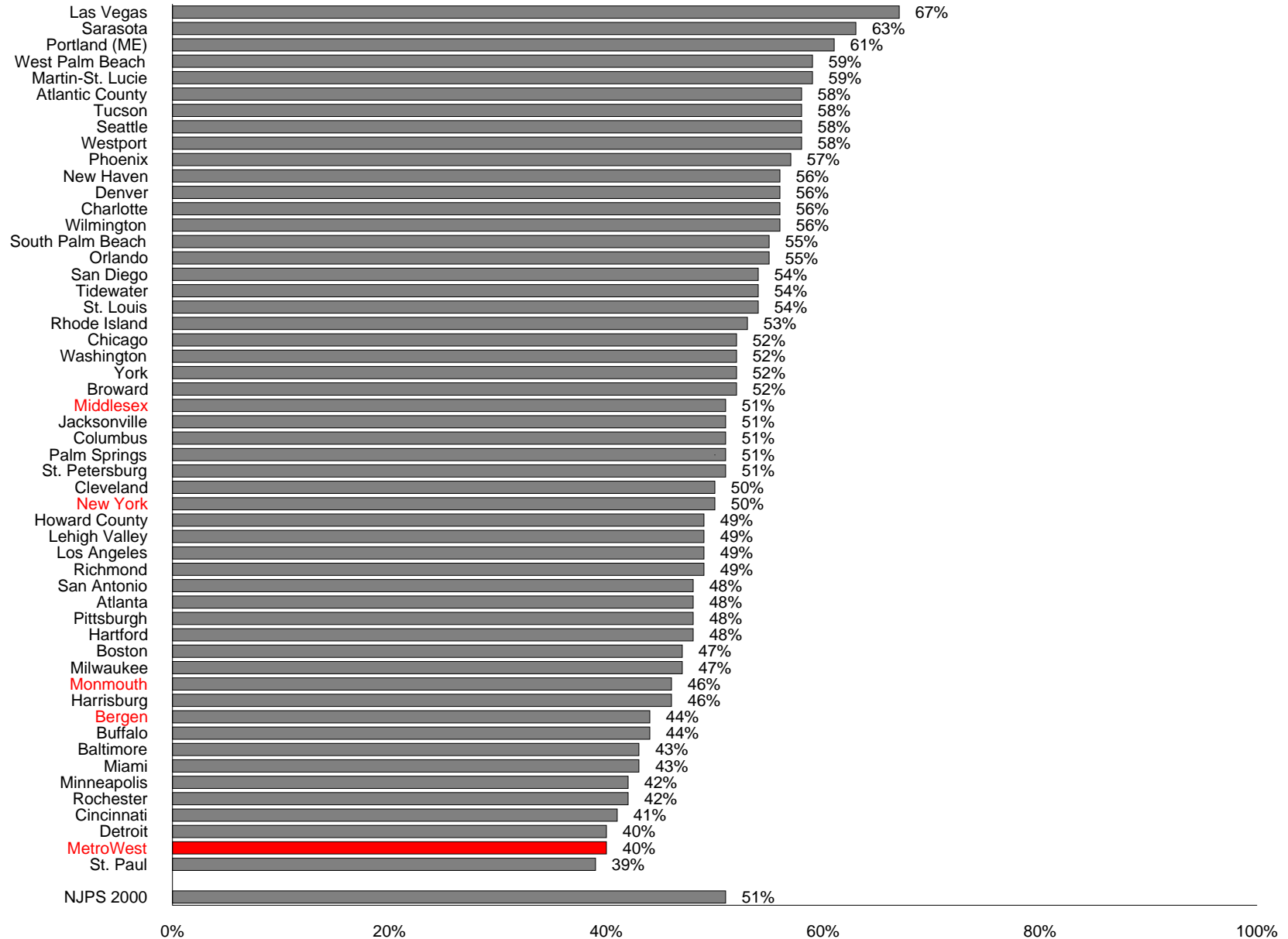

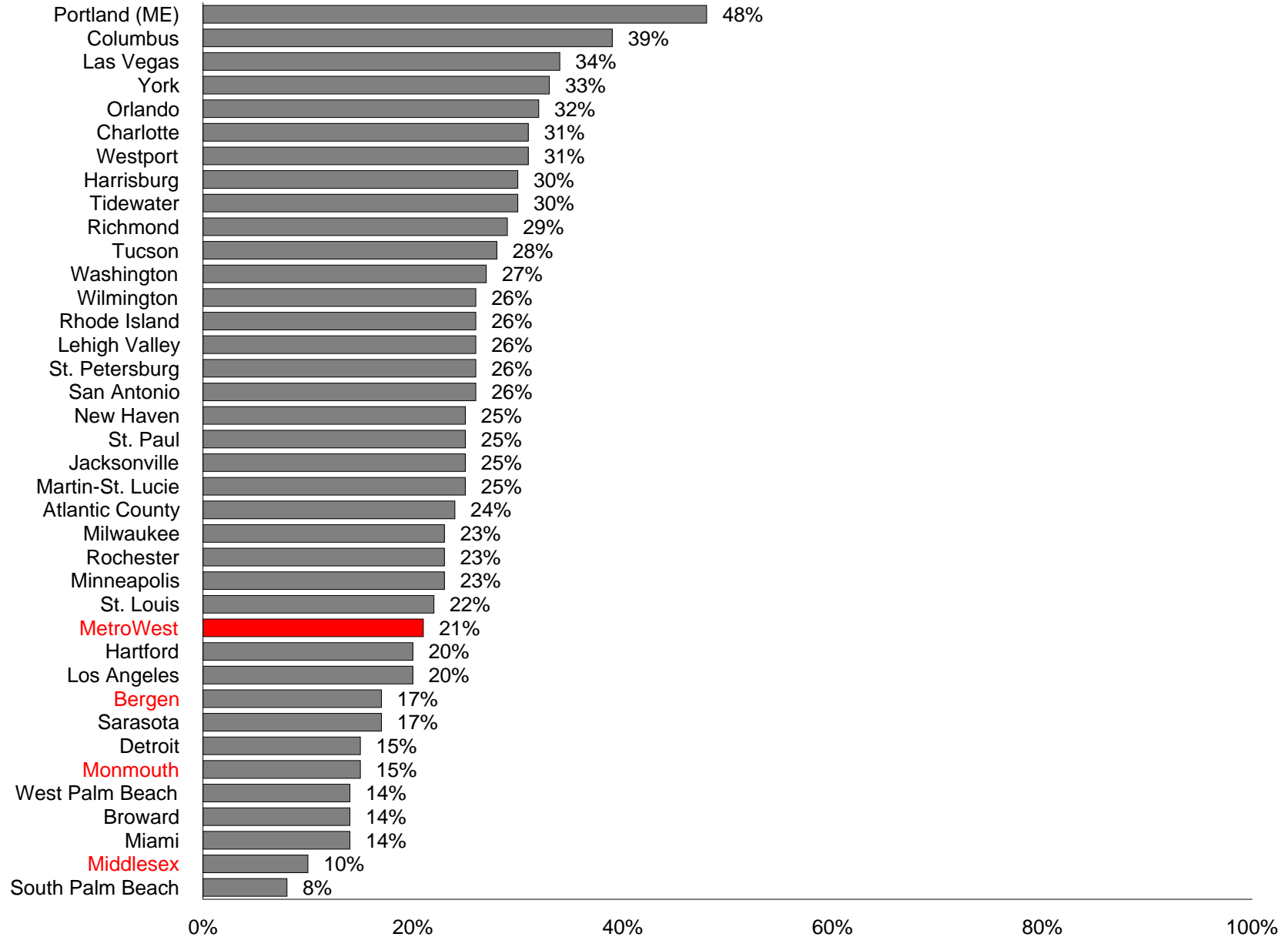

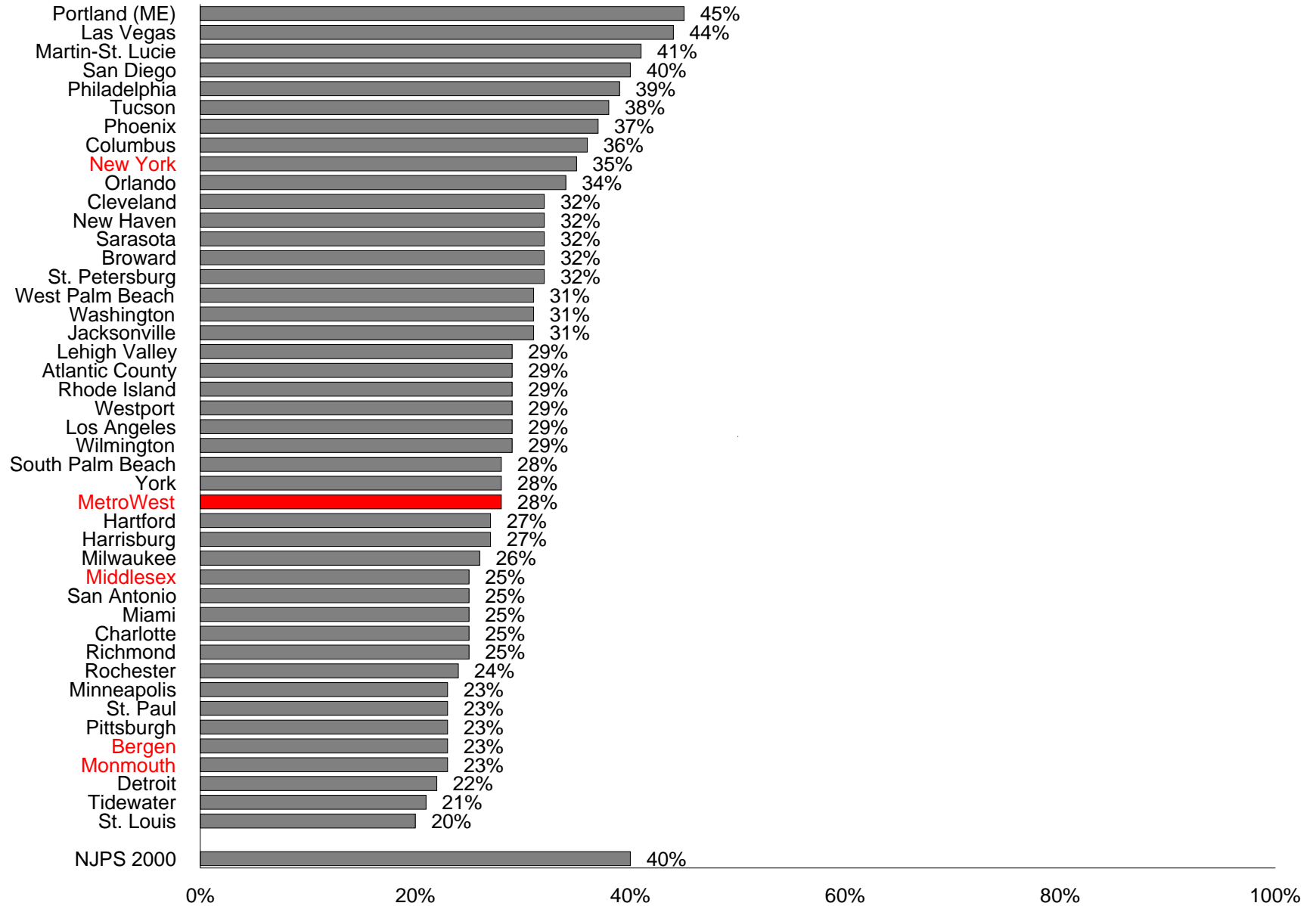

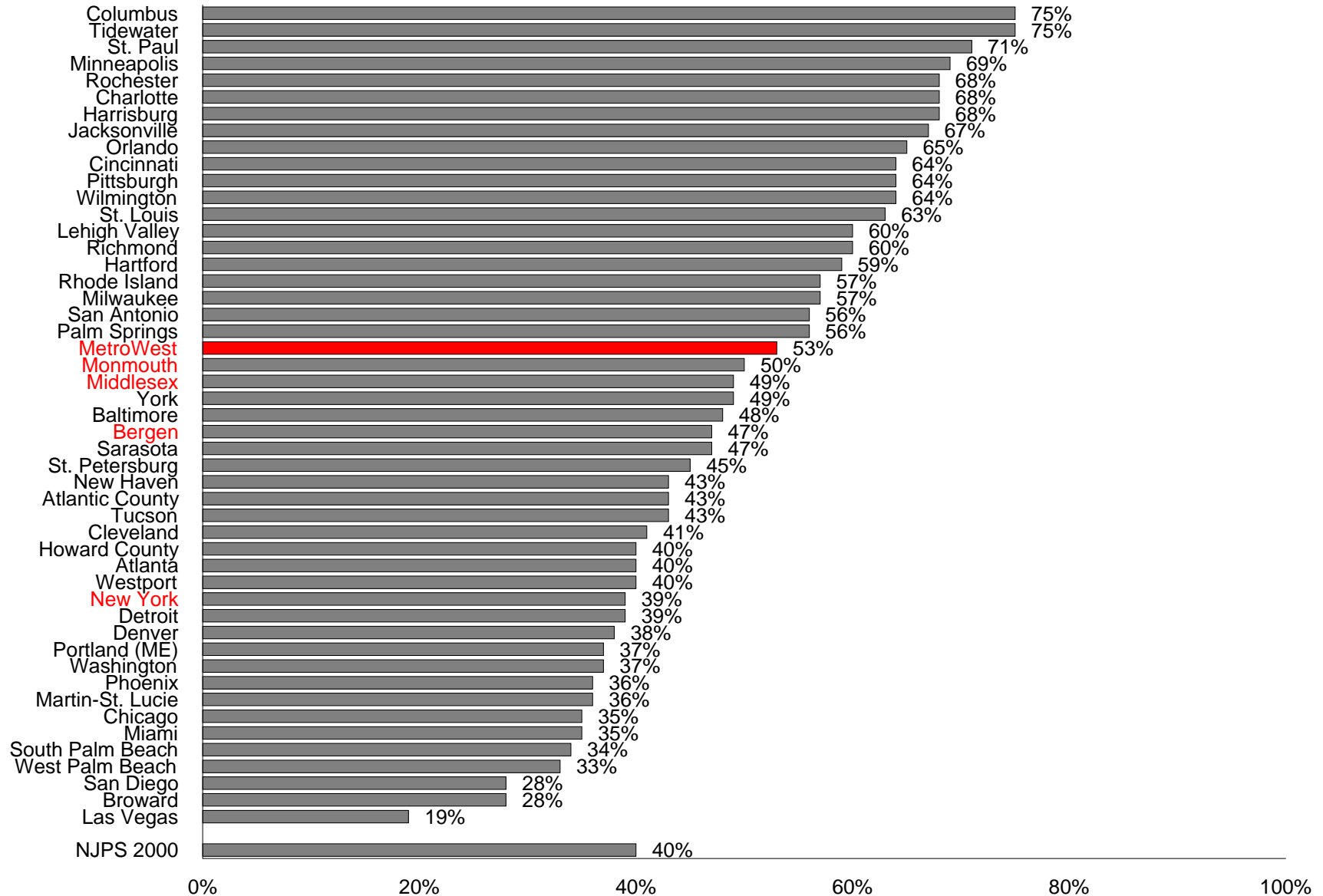

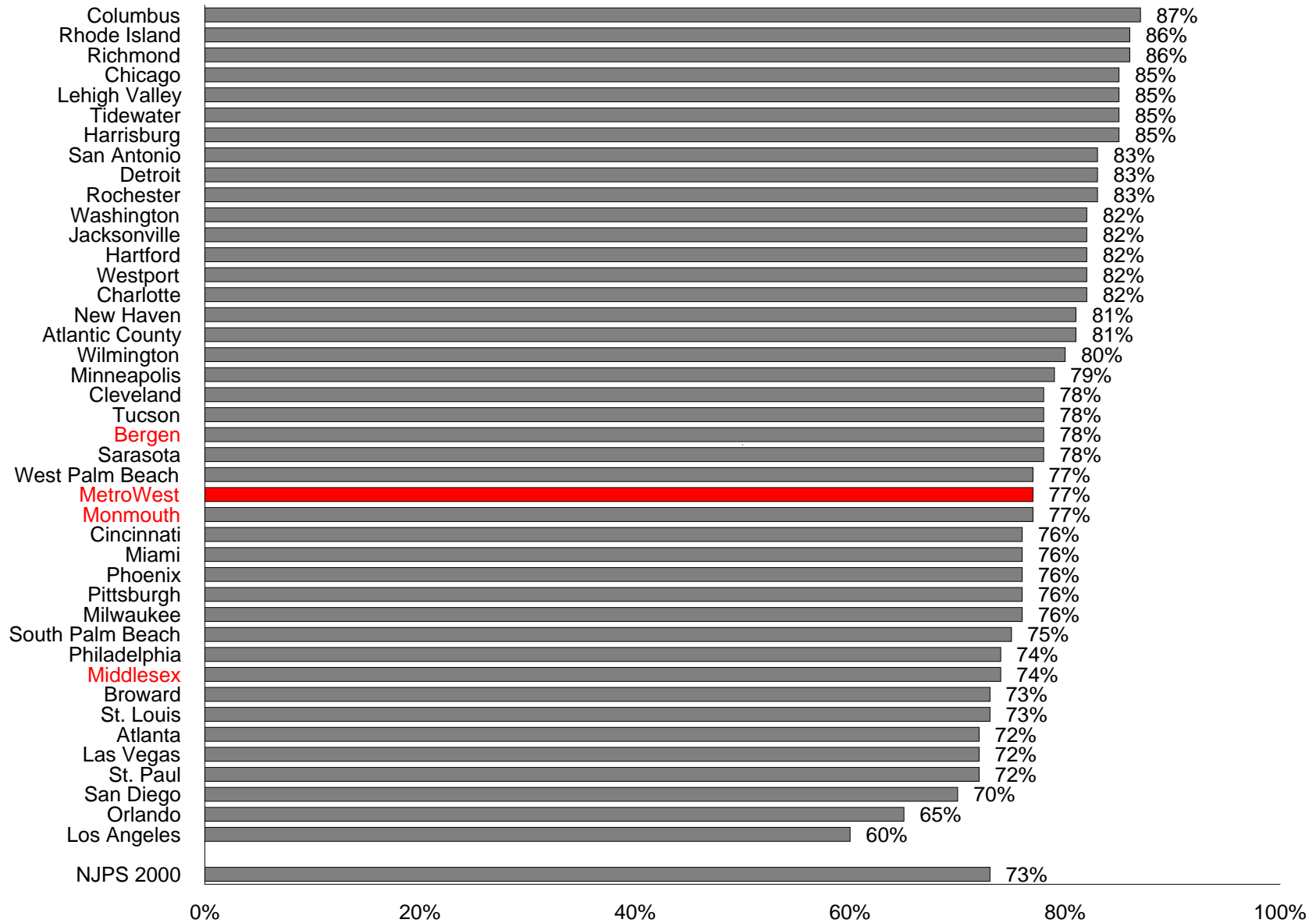

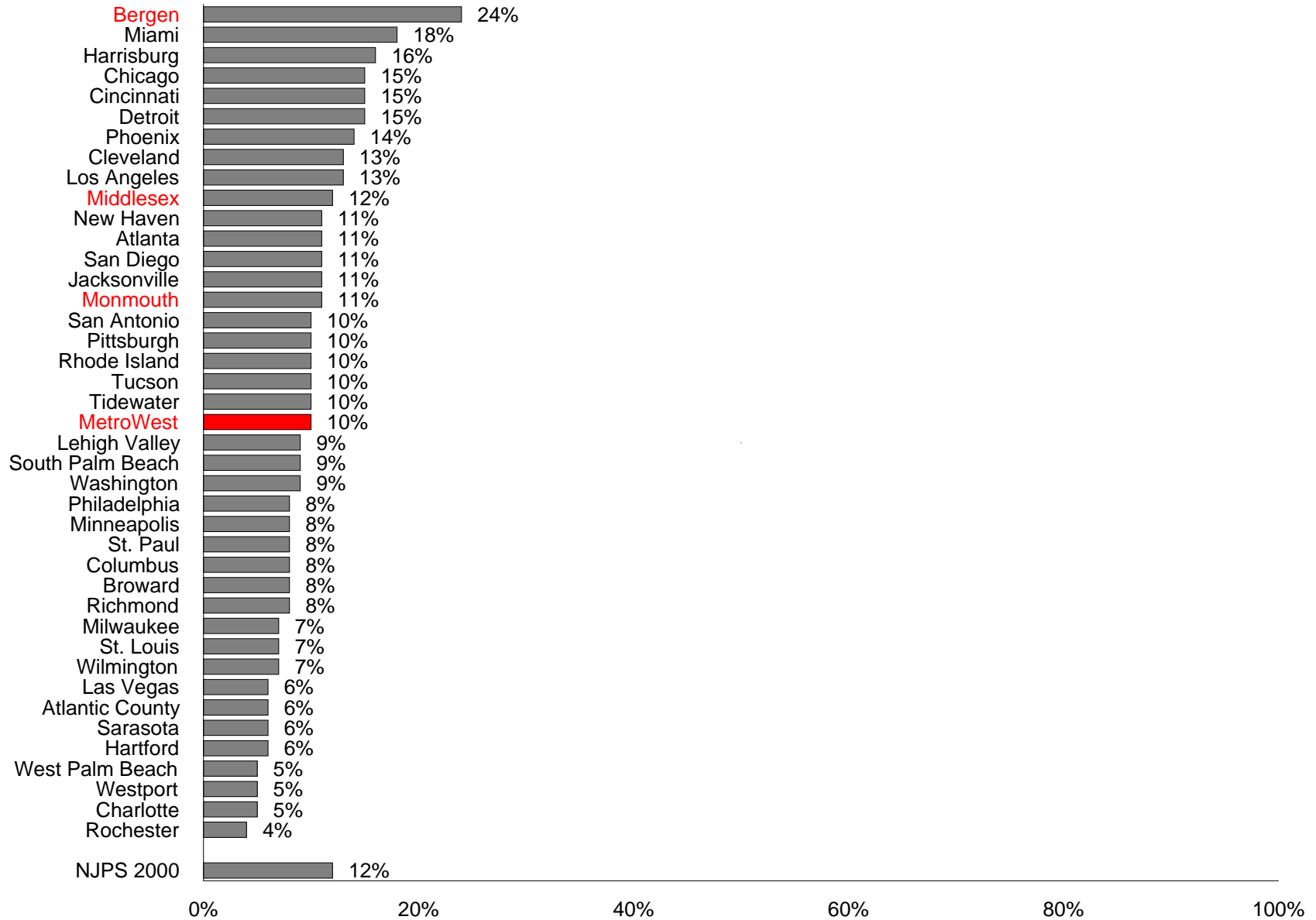

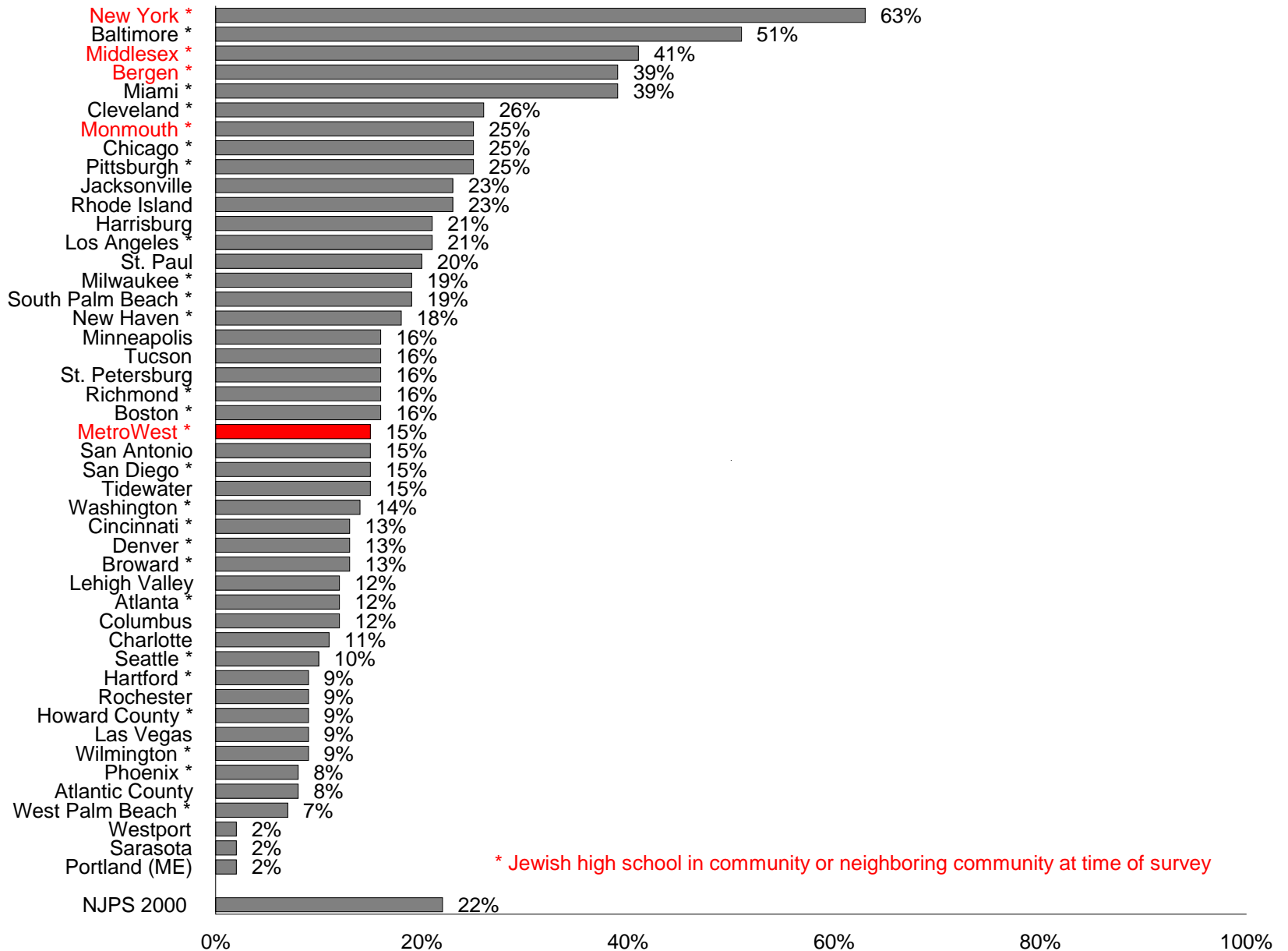

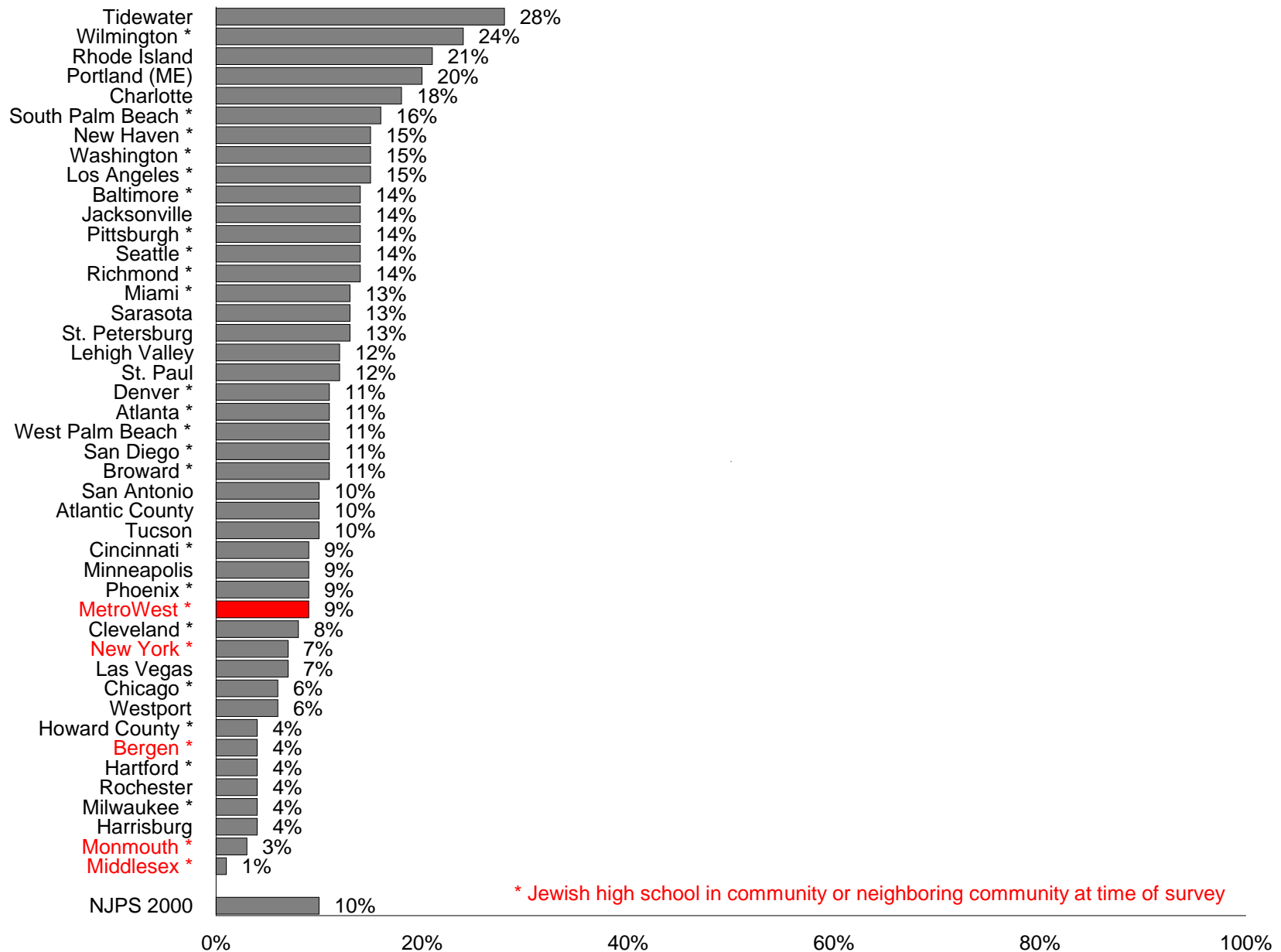

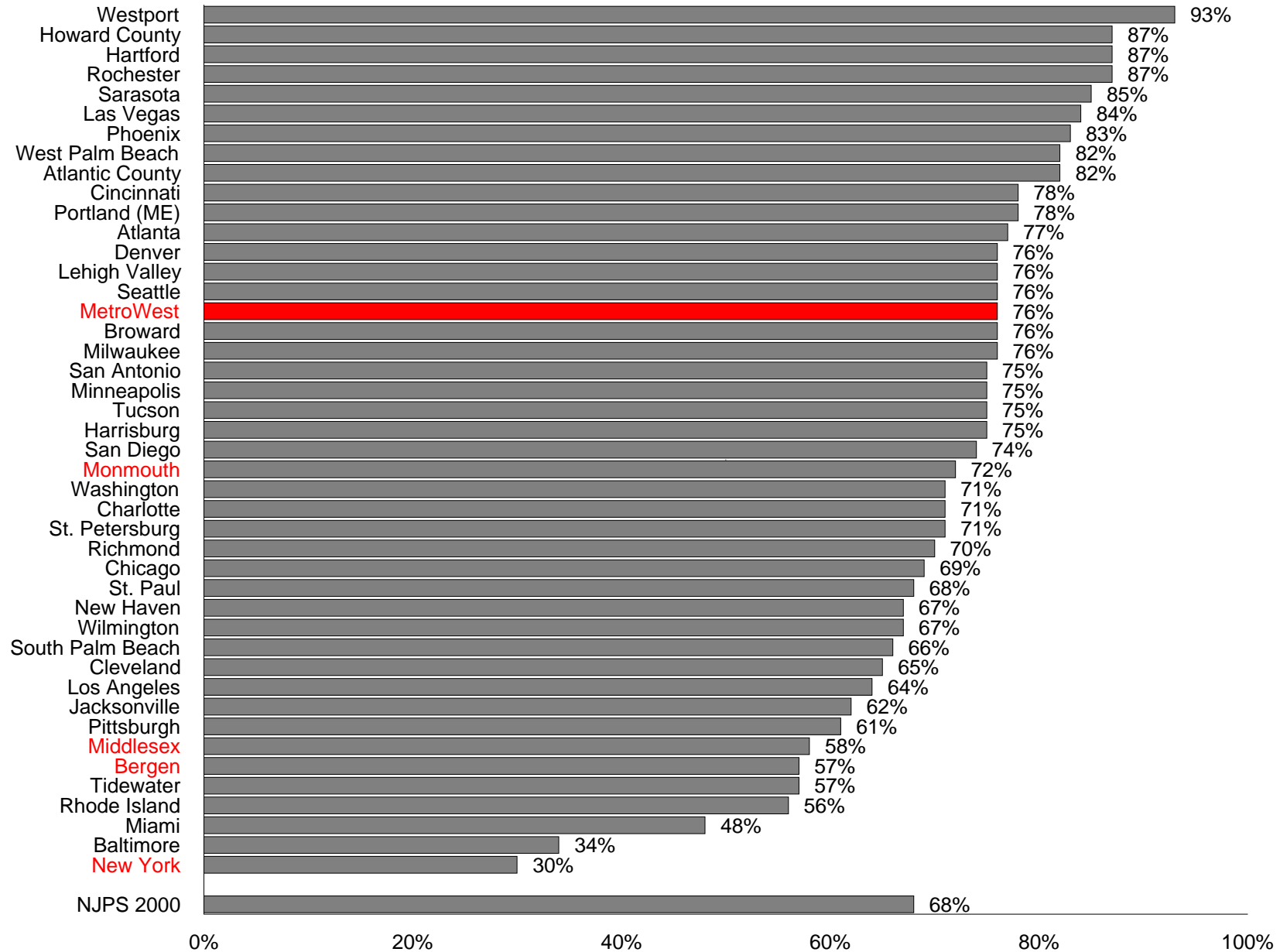

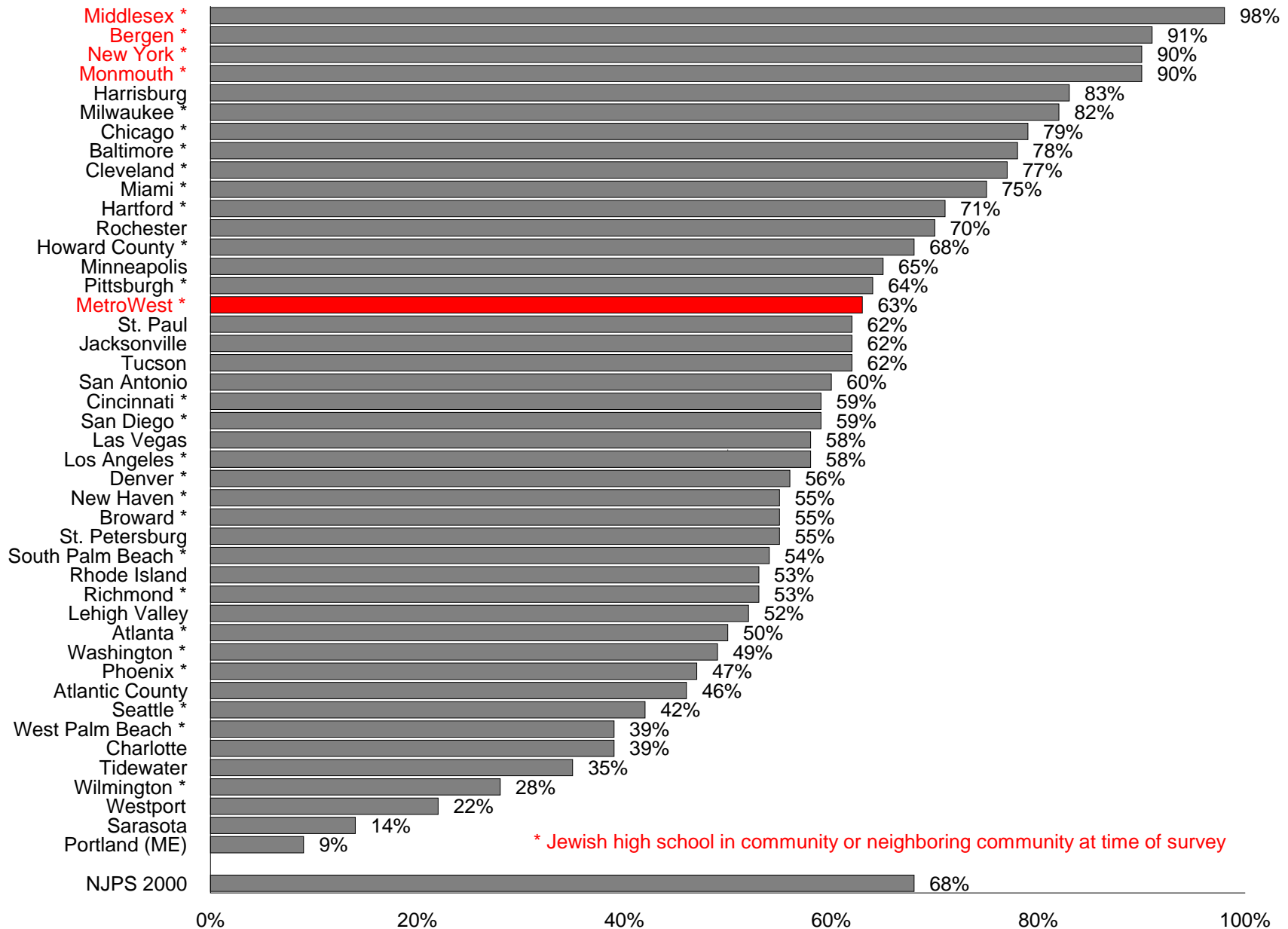

MARKET SHARE FOR JEWISH DAY SCHOOL

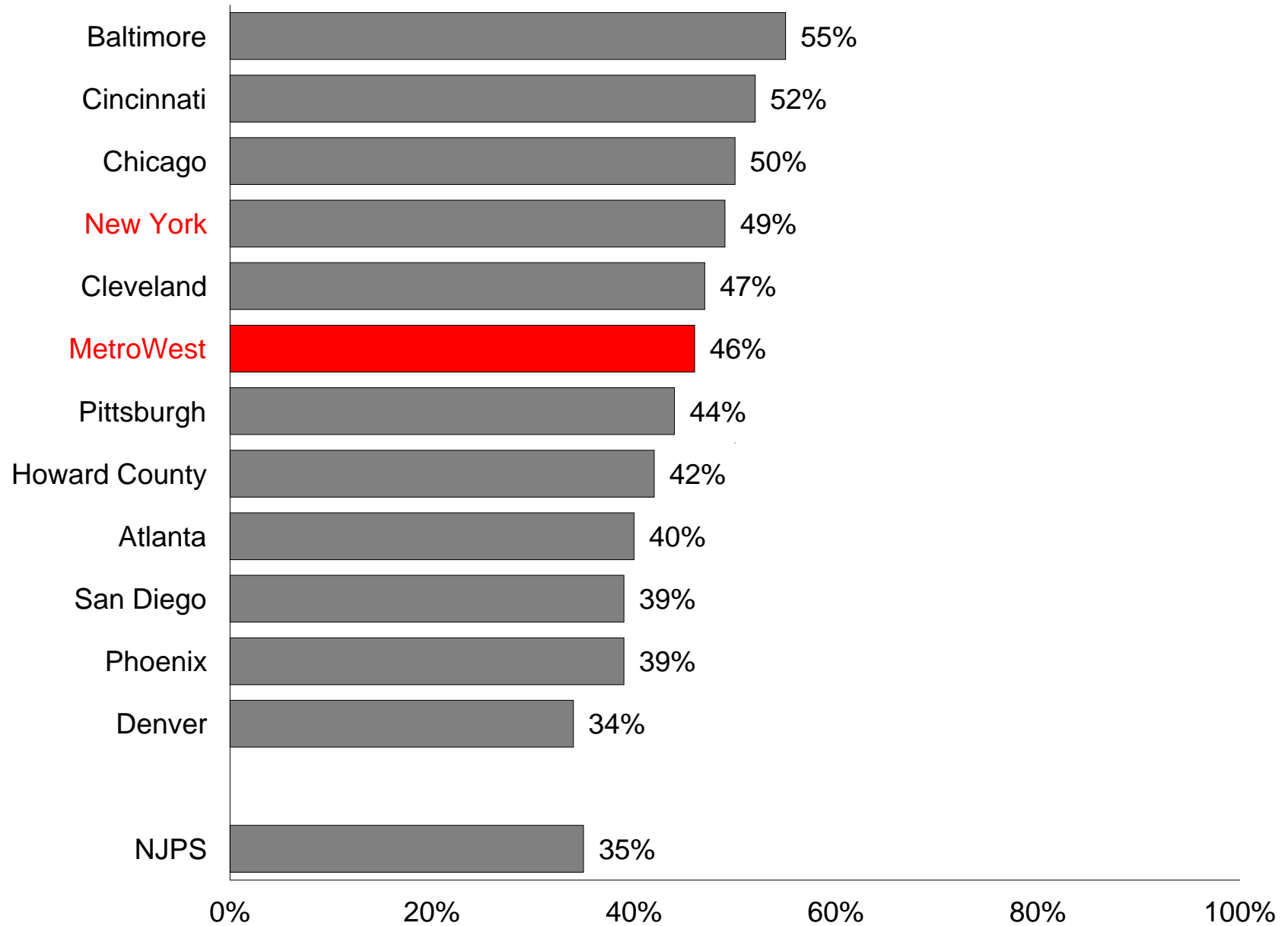

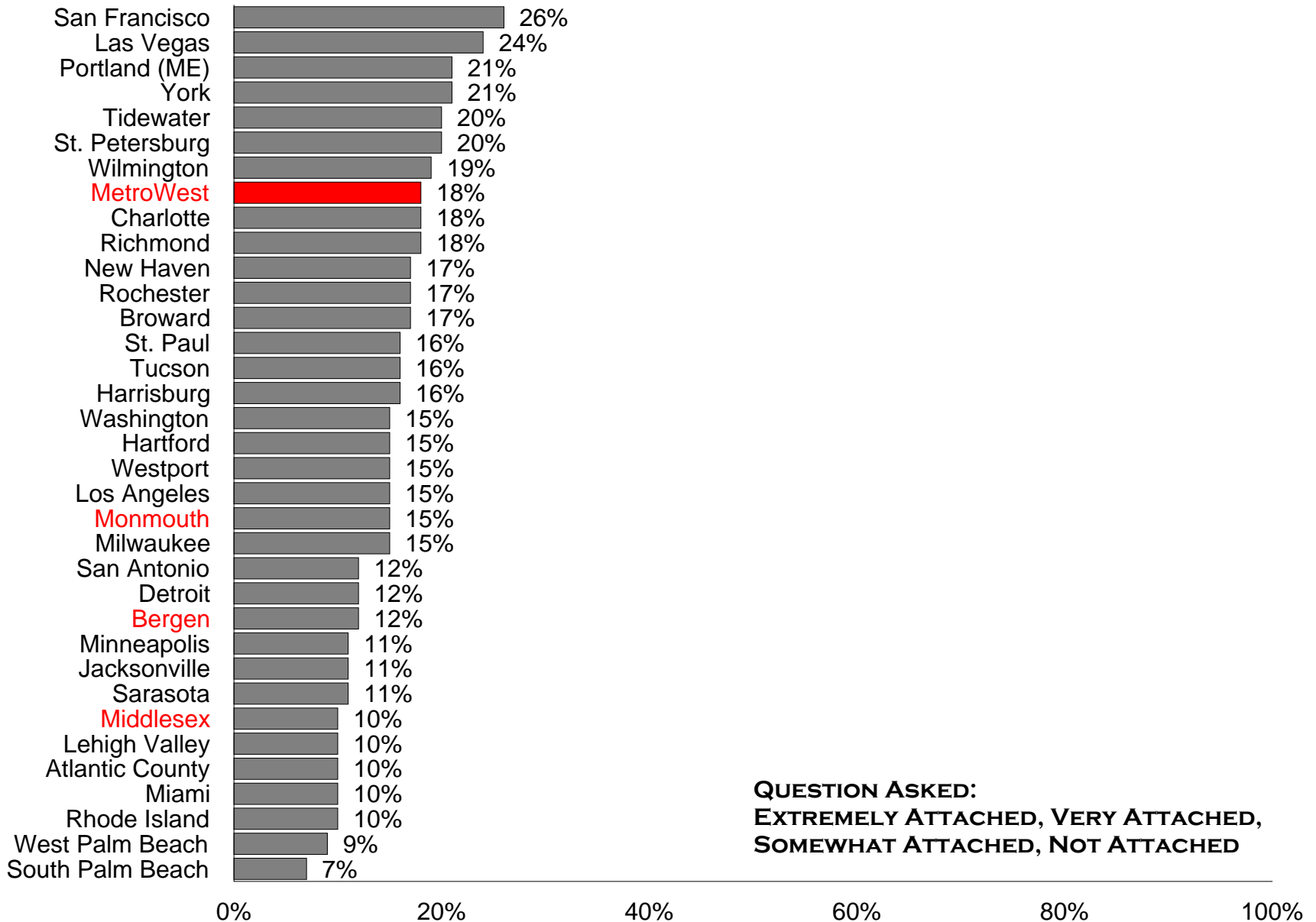

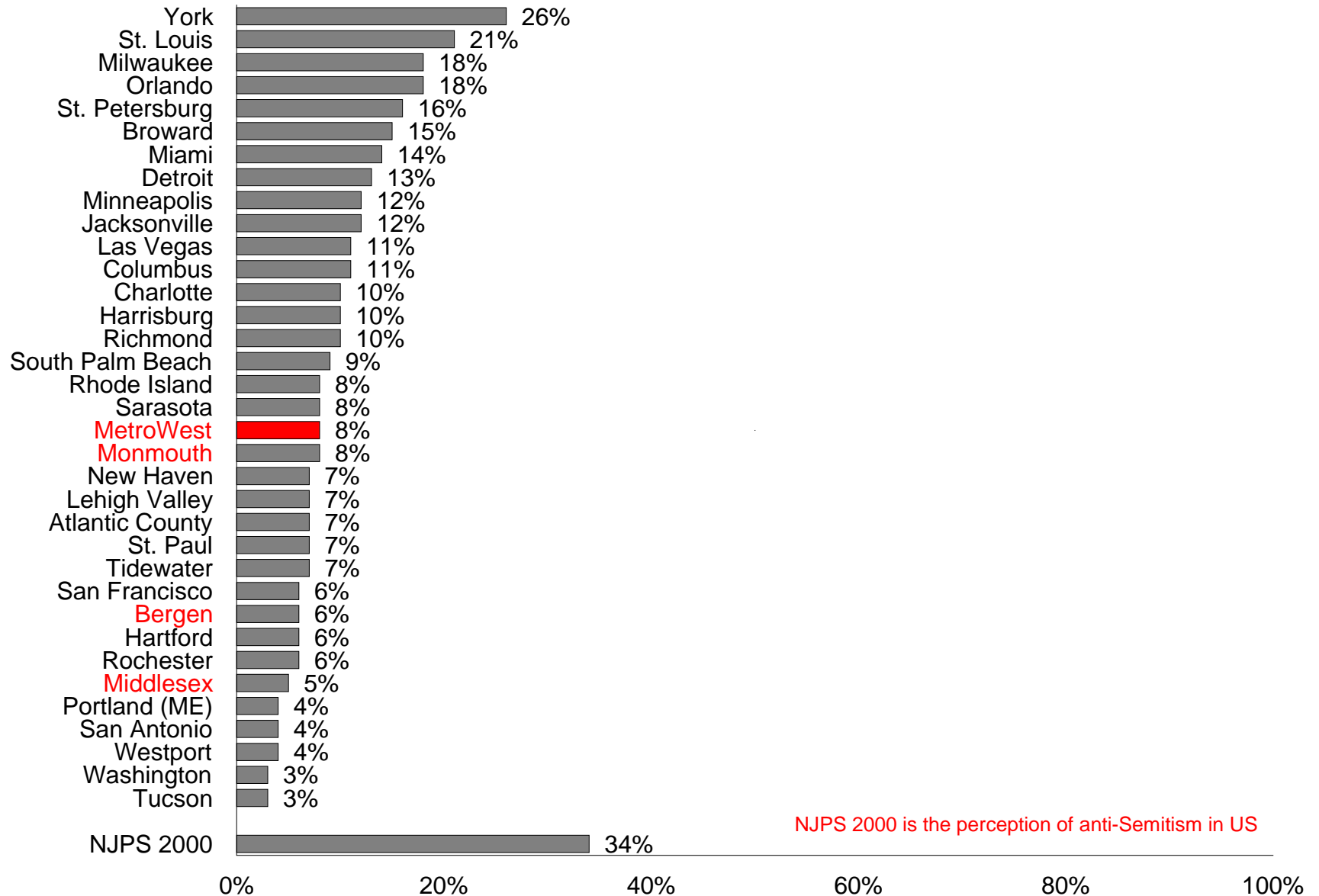

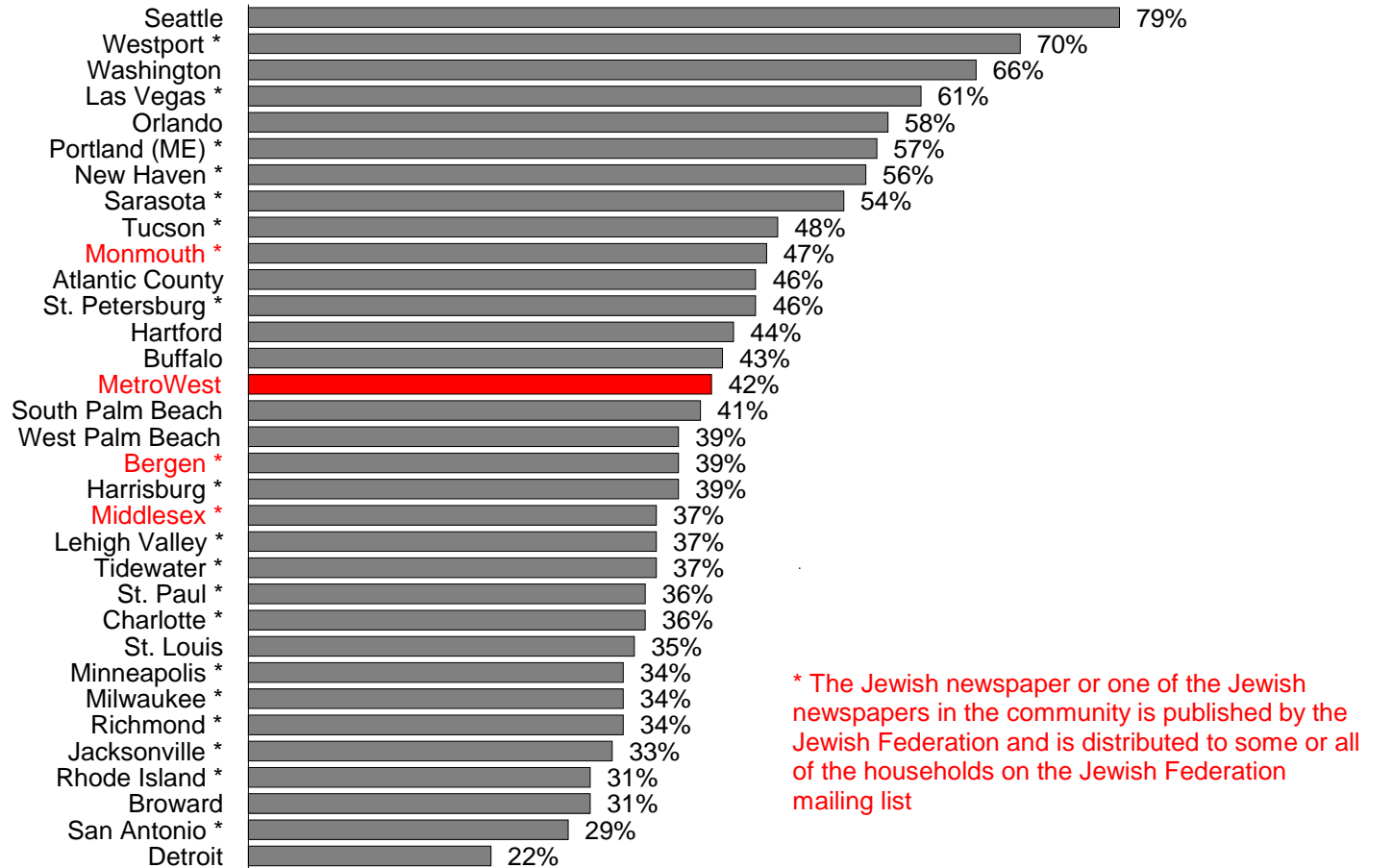

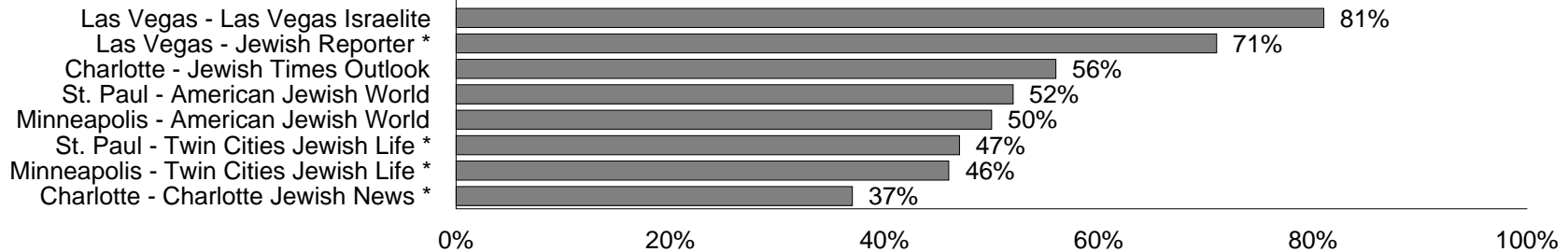
